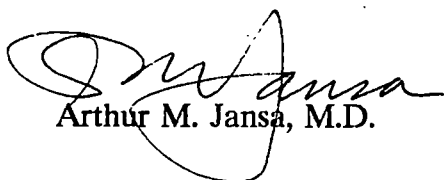

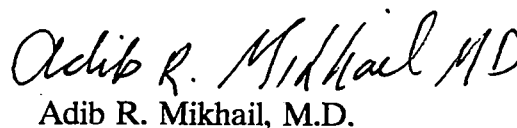

Dear Governor Sununu:

During our meeting last week on the "fast track" legislation, you asked me to raise with you any major export policy issues where your personal attention would help sort things out and ensure that U.S. export interests were not shoved aside. I would like to take you up on this offer and bring to your attention two critical issues remaining in the COCOM Core List exercise. While several industry groups are generally quite pleased with the results of the effort, the two largest industry sectors affected by export controls--computers and telecommunications--are still facing major problems that if left unresolved could seriously undermine the basic goals set forth by the President when he announced the Core List initiative last summer. I believe your personal intervention will be necessary to resolve the current impasse.

One of the remaining critical issues is the treatment of computer systems with networking functions. These networking functions are now used in both computer and telecommunications applications. The Core List proposes to control computers on the basis of these networking functions which are widely available, routinely included in all major vendors' software packages, and part of internationally accepted standards and protocols. This proposal constitutes a major rollback or recontrol for computers and attempts to distinguish between computer and telecommunications equipment, an increasingly impossible task given the convergence of these modern technologies. This would have a devastating effect on American computer companies.

Our NAM Core List Working Group met with Allan Wendt of the State Department recently to discuss the only viable solution to this problem--elimination from all Core List categories of these networking functions as control criteria. He agreed, and indicated his intent to pursue this solution. We are concerned, however, with ensuring that this position is adopted in the interagency process. It is clear that there is no compromise solution that would solve the problem without discriminating between computer companies or unfairly burdening telecommunications manufacturers. We hope that you can help to ensure this outcome.

In the area of telecommunications, the U.S. and the COCOM allies have been deadlocked for months. Industry has provided the Administration with specific recommendations, generally forming a middle ground between original U.S. proposals and the more liberal European positions. Specifically, we would like to see the removal of all remaining COCOM approval

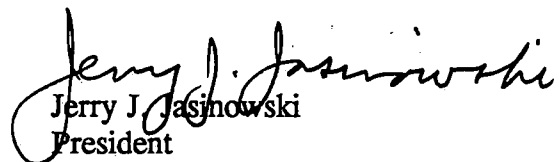

requirements for telecommunications equipment exported to Poland, Hungary, and Czechoslovakia. For the Soviet Union, the most difficult issue has been with optical fiber transmission systems. To address the problem, we proposed following the precedent of "phased decontrol" as used in China years ago. This approach would permit higher-speed fiber systems only in urban "intra-city" applications, and on civilian international gateway links. In other technologies such as common channel signalling and microwave radio, industry supports similar proposals for phased decontrol.

We believe that our Western European allies are in basic agreement with the positions outlined above. A serious effort by the United States Government to move in this direction, therefore, is necessary to reach agreement in COCOM and to help ensure that the President's original goals for the Core List are achieved.

We would be happy to discuss these issues in greater detail at your convenience.

Perhaps the enclosed might be of interest:

- 1) A Study: How Much Damage Is the World Bank Doing to the American Economy and American Banking System?
- 2) Letter to Lewis Preston on the need to move the Bank into much larger debt reduction efforts.

We have been talking with the Appropriation Committees over the past months about the need to push the World Bank on all fours into serious debt reduction, that goes far beyond the Brady plan.

Debt reduction is a much more profitable program for the American taxpayer as well as the developing nations, bringing routinely 50 percent or greater economic rate of returns, compared to 14 to 16 percent returns for World Bank projects, which probably cannot pay the debt service.

It appears to be in the self-interests of the United States for the World Bank to become at least debt-neutral in its program - which would require spending at least half of its budget each year for finance of debt repurchases on the open secondary market or debt-for-nature or social service swaps.

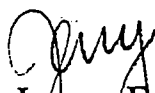

Subject: Fuels Surtax

I know that there has been considerable discussion of a dramatic gasoline tax increase and that it has been rejected for many reasons, many of them political.

I am prepared to argue this subject vigorously within "the family." Data developed by our Pace Consultants group indicates that such a tax can be a powerful budget balancing tool and can probably be made politically palatable. Here are the essential features:

1. We need a "consumption" tax badly to take the heat off taxes on income. The tax wall has been breached and the Democrats are already on the prowl in the name of demagogic "fairness" -- see attached letter I sent to Senator Mitchell last year.
2. Collection of this surtax is effortless compared to a VAT which will require a vast new bureaucracy.
3. The surtax would be sequestered, i.e., would not be accounted for as income -- a key point in keeping Congress's hands off the funds.
4. The tax program adopted in 1990 would remain as is.
5. The surtax would have a sunset feature -- for six years used only for debt reduction and nine years used only for capital investment in infrastructure such as roads, bridges, airports, high speed rail, etc.
6. The regressive feature would be eliminated or minimized by refunds to low income wage earners.
7. It should be bipartisan and Congress could not invade the fund for any operating funds for the federal budget.
8. Recommend a substantial surtax -- though temporarily inflationary, it would so improve fiscal soundness that beneficial effects would override very quickly.

The details of the proposal are attached.

Recently I leaned hard on George Mitchell in support of this concept. He objected on the basis of regressivity. I countered by telling him how many hidden repressive taxes we had, but that I proposed a feature to minimize direct regressivity. He said "Okay, but you'll never sell it to the Administration." I said I was going to try. He said, "If you can, I'll go along." I know that's contrary to his public statements and may not have been a deeply considered reply, but it's there as a starting point.

Lod Cook has recently come out publicly for such a surtax and so has Dick Stegemeier, CEO of Unocal. Many other thoughtful businessmen support this.

Lod would like to add other features such as floor prices on crude imports, etc. which are good, but for the moment I want to confine my advocacy to the simplest one.

Will you give me a chance to argue my point?

The only update would be that the nursing/paramedic education plan would cost less than two million dollars over a two year period.

It would also be timely to begin psychological warfare with the Hizbollah kidnapers. There exists a photograph of Imad Mughniyya, the kidnap leader, that could be used for a wanted poster. Mughniyya's fingerprints were found on TWA847 and he was one of my kidnapers. Leaflets offering a reward for Mughniyya could easily be distributed in Lebanon. The panic in the terrorist group would be real. Perhaps Iran and Hizbollah would want to separate themselves from him.

I apologize for being such a pest on the hostage issue. Although I have been free for four years, I am still a hostage on furlough until Anderson, Sutherland and Cicippio come home too.

My staff has informed me that the Corps of Engineers is about to issue its revisions to the Federal Manual for Identifying and Delineating Wetlands. I would like to share my thoughts with you on wetlands preservation and this manual.

I support efforts to develop a comprehensive federal policy for preventing further destruction of wetlands. I believe that wetlands are among the most valuable resources in this nation. From hosting a myriad of species to providing a source for groundwater recharge, their benefits are invaluable.

Because of the great value associated with wetlands, we must do all we can to promote careful planning on the part of the states and localities as they seek to establish environmentally sound growth. The definition of wetlands has created problems in Vermont, even though, I believe Vermont is well ahead of much of the country in land preservation.

Some areas of Vermont are being timbered for development. The clearing or partial clearing of land and trees and other vegetative cover causes the groundwater level to rise in these and adjacent areas so as to potentially create many areas which may fit the proposed definition of wetlands. Replacing marshes and bogs in the path of development is a difficult issue. By defining areas with shallow groundwater as wetlands could allow developers to claim to have created such new wetlands, when in fact, they have not. Property owners adjacent to timbered areas may also discover that their woods have become wetlands because of the actions of a neighbor.

Finally, some of this previously timbered land is going back to forest land and due to the absorption of moisture will in a decade or two no longer fit the "wetlands" definition. Current regulations may make it difficult to use the land in the interim if such lands are classified as wetlands. Is there a federal

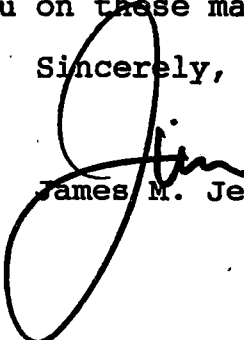

Dear Governor Sununu:

On behalf of Gabe Phillips, Adeeb Sadd, and myself, I would like to thank you for taking time to meet with us on Friday, February 22, 1991.

We all feel that the meeting was positive and constructive. Hopefully, it will lead to a continuing dialogue between the National Association of Arab Americans (NAAA) and your office.

In addition, I am happy to inform you that our Board of Directors, which met in Washington, D.C., on February 23, 1991, decided unanimously to reiterate its unequivocal support for the Bush Administration, and in particular the objectives outlined early in the Gulf crisis: the unconditional withdrawal of Iraq from Kuwait, the restoration of the legitimate Kuwaiti government, and the reestablishment of peace and stability in the Gulf region. In addition, we are gratified at President Bush's leadership in efforts to keep civilian casualties in the conflict to an absolute minimum.

The Board also discussed the challenges that will face the United States and our allies in the Middle East in the post-Gulf war era. It stressed that the greatest challenge will be the attainment of a stable post-war Gulf region and the reconstruction and rehabilitation of both Kuwait and Iraq. NAAA agrees with your advice that our legislative agenda and overall lobbying efforts should focus on the nature of our post-war policies in the Middle East. With the guidelines adopted by the Board, we seek to encourage trends toward political liberalization and economic reform throughout the Middle East.

We believe that the war in the Arabian Gulf has clearly demonstrated that protracted conflicts in the Middle East, including the Israeli-Palestinian conflict and the conflict in Lebanon, must be addressed

promptly and solved expeditiously if peace and stability in the region are to be achieved. As the Gulf war concludes, we urge that the full attention of the U.S. government be devoted toward establishing a viable and fruitful peace process that will equitably balance Israeli security interests and Palestinian national rights. NAAA also urges the Administration to undertake an initiative immediately following the conclusion of the Gulf war that will promote movement toward democratic political reform, withdrawal of all foreign forces, and economic reconstruction in Lebanon.

We are pleased to have restored close and mutually beneficial ties with you. We look forward to maintaining and expanding that relationship and stand ready to offer our assistance, particularly on Capitol Hill, on any matter in which we can be of service.

Dear Governor Sununu:

During our meeting with you on January 4, David O'Steen, Darla St. Martin, and I spoke to you of our high regard for Martin J. (Marty) Dannenfelser, and encouraged you to keep him in mind if a suitable position opened up on the White House staff.

Now we understand that several vacancies will soon occur in the White House Office of Legislative Affairs. Marty is an ideal candidate for House liaison work.

I have worked with Marty closely for nearly 10 years on pro-life issues. During that time there have been many pro-life victories in the House, and I would be hard pressed to think of one in which Marty was not a key player. Indeed, he has been the key strategist on many of our most successful initiatives.

Marty is a savvy, hard-working legislative/political technician who plays to win. His personal manner, however, is exceptionally genial, modest, and reasonable. He knows how to be firm without raising hackles. While Marty does not pull his punches in a political or legislative battle, he is personally non-vindictive, and I cannot recall ever meeting anyone who didn't like him-- even among those with whom he has butted heads on policy matters. Marty has many friends-- indeed, I know of no one who has as extensive a network of contacts among Republican staff as Marty. This network has proven critical to successful legislative outcomes on many occasions.

Of course, Marty's political and legislative experience goes far beyond the pro-life issue. I am sure that my friend Chris Smith would be the first to acknowledge the prominent role which Marty has played in Chris's legislative and electoral successes, including Chris's first re-election campaign, in 1982. In elections, as in legislative battles, Marty has a terrific facility for "framing" issues in the manner most likely to bring success.

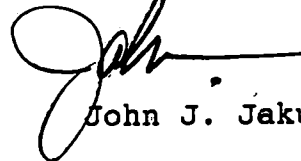
Happy New Year. I hope you and your family are fine. It is encouraging to see the wide-spread support for the President's Gulf policies.
