Dear John:

I really enjoyed our lunch and our conversation. It was good of you to conclude my visit by bringing me into the Oval Office to meet with President Bush. I think he knows and I hope you know that I really admire and like him.

We have a history of having served together in Congress and continued our friendship when he became Director of the CIA. I think he will go down in history as a seminal figure because of his courage in marshaling the world and the United States in support of a military strike against Iraq, and I have said so in my columns.

I am pursuing my efforts to assist the administration in defeating H.R.1. I am convinced we will prevail.

On your advice, I will also be pursuing with Brent Skowcraft my suggestion on the United States strategy in settling the Arab-Israeli disputes. I would like to reiterate those suggestions here and ask if you think it appropriate that you convey them to the President. I thought it would be an abuse on my part to raise them when you gave me the opportunity to meet with him yesterday. If you do bring my comments to his attention, I would be grateful.

The position of Israeli strategists like General Ariel Sharon, now Minister in the Israeli cabinet, is that Israel should retain the West Bank not for religious reasons or the Covenant with God referred to in the Bible but because of its military strategic importance. Minister Sharon has said to me that Israel needs to have under its control the road from Tel Aviv to the Jordan River with Israeli settlements protecting both sides of that road on the high ground, in order to defend against invasion of Israel itself. From a military point of view, it is difficult to dispute his analysis.

Israel's giving up the Arab-occupied parts of the West Bank makes sense only if Israel can be certain that once that occurs it will not find itself at war with the Arab states, and without the security of the 70-mile defensive area which the West Bank represents. However, I believe it would be reasonable for the United States to propose a quid pro quo arrangement between the Arabs and the Israelis: If an action is taken on the part of one side in advance of a permanent peace settlement, there would have to be a simultaneous action on the part of the other side.

The United States did not accept unilateral disarmament vis-a-vis the Soviet Union, which was advocated by some, and I always supported President Reagan's hardline on that issue. He was right. He, along with then Vice President Bush, must be given credit for the ultimate break up of the Soviet empire. It would not have happened had there been unilateral disarmament on our part.

Therefore, I think it fair to propose that Secretary of State Jim Baker publicly advocate that the United States favors the following measures: That Israel pending a final peace settlement give up creating new settlements on the West Bank because they constitute an obstacle to peace. Parenthetically, let me reiterate that it has been and I hope still is the policy of the United States that settlements on the West Bank by Israel are not illegal but are perceived to be obstacles to peace. Simultaneously, the Arab states would end their boycott of the state of Israel, preferably the total boycott but at the very least the secondary boycott.

If that were the United States' public policy -- and you conveyed to me that, in fact, it had been a position privately proposed by Secretary of State Baker -- I believe that most Israelis and supporters of Israel in the United States, irrespective of Prime Minister Shamir's position, would think that was fair and should be supported.

What gives the supporters of the State of Israel pause when considering Secretary of State Baker's public position is his acceptance of the Saudi Arabian government's rejection of participating in direct peace negotiations, then offering the

lame excuse that it has no common border with Israel. What do they think the Red Sea is? And haven't they financed every war against the State of Israel since its inception? Why do we allow the Saudi Arabians to make such a statement without Secretary Baker rejecting it -- out of hand -- as an obstacle to peace? He has never hesitated being critical of Israel. Why is there such hesitancy in being critical of Saudi Arabia? These are the things that give American supporters of Israel great concern.

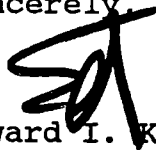

We also discussed crime and the President's approach. Enclosed is a copy of a speech that I delivered on the subject to judges in New York on Law Day, May 1, 1991. You will find that I support the administration's position.

We are not always going to be in accord, but I do want you to know that I have great respect for you. Let's stay in touch. I'd like to take you to a good Italian restaurant the next time you are in New York City. If that interests you, give me a call. I have no objection to your coming by military plane; I will greet you at the airport if you'd like!

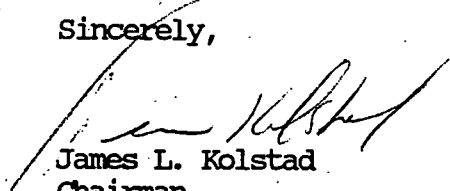

As a follow up to our recent conversation, I want to again emphasize that EEOC's Uniform Guidelines on Employee Selection Procedures present a virtually unsurmountable legal obstacle to any employer's use of either educational credentials or tests of job-related competency and as such present a substantial Federal obstacle to the President's education goals.

The 1978 Uniform Guidelines represented a four agency consensus defining an employer's "business necessity" burden of proof for any selection procedure with "disparate impact." The consequence of this burden was to make it virtually impossible for most employers to use objective selection procedures such as educational credentials. The resulting lack of signals to students from employers that academic achievement counts removed the most basic incentive for a student to take school seriously.

If the America 2000: An Education Strategy is to realize the President's goal that "every school in America will ensure that all students learn to use their minds well, so they may be prepared for...productive employment in our modern economy," the Uniform Guidelines must be revised. Because of the need to get all four agencies focused on achieving the President's educational goals, the imperative to revise the Uniform Guidelines must come from the White House.

The need to encourage academic achievement by removing the certainty of Title VII litigation for using educational credentials or tests of job-related competency was made by Cornell University labor economist John H. Bishop last month in testimony before the House Education Labor Committee:

Numerous educational leaders are coming to realize that if the labor market were to begin rewarding learning in school, high school students would respond by studying harder and local voters would be willing to pay higher taxes so as to have better local schools. Al Shanker has asked businessmen to 'Provide clear and early rewards for those students who work hard and learn the most.' The Secretary of Labor's Commission on Workforce Quality and Labor Market Efficiency also advocates such a change:

The business community should...show through their hiring and promotion decisions that academic achievements will be rewarded.

Employers are enthusiastic about the reform agenda...But when one asks them to give greater weight to academic achievement in their own hiring, they say they will need to talk to their lawyers first.

The threat of litigation brought under the 1971 Griggs interpretation of Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 deterred many employers from using tests measuring competence in reading and mathematics and grades in high school to help select new employees. This is one of the important reasons why youth do not on average receive significantly higher wage rates when they learn more English, science and mathematics in high school...

In order for a policy of considering grades and academic achievement test scores when making hiring selections to generate incentives to learn, students, parents and teachers must be aware that local employers are using tests and high school GPA for selection and what kind of material is included on these tests. Unfortunately, the fear of litigation has caused many employers to give only limited publicity to their use of indicators of competence in reading and mathematics. This is another reason why employers need to be told by people in authority that they are acting in the national interest when they seek out and reward those who have higher level academic skills (emphasis added).

EEOC has Lead Agency Authority Under Executive Order 12067.

Section 1-2 of Executive Order 12067, "Responsibilities of Equal Employment Opportunity Commission" states:

The Honorable John H. Sununu

Page 3

1-201. The Equal Employment Opportunity Commission shall provide leadership and coordination to the efforts of Federal departments and agencies to enforce all Federal statutes, Executive orders, regulations, and policies which require equal employment opportunity without regard to race, color, religion, sex, national origin, age or handicap...

1-203. All Federal departments and agencies shall cooperate with and assist the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission in the performance of its functions under this order and shall furnish the Commission such reports and information as it may request (emphasis added).

There are three other agencies who have signed off on the Uniform Guidelines: Labor, Justice and the Office of Personnel Management. I am recommending that you call the heads of all four agencies together and the Secretary of Education and advise them that in light of the President's America 2000 goals, the agencies take immediate steps to begin Uniform Guidelines revision compatible with the President's Education Strategy goals.

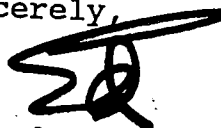

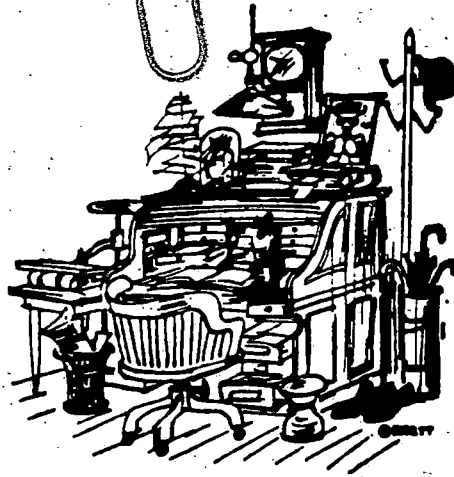

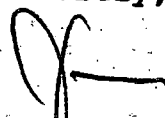

Dear Governor Sununu:

I think the principal reason why savings and loans and banks have failed in Texas and elsewhere in the nation is the abrupt change in the tax law, which occurred in the 1986 Tax Reform Act, eliminating passive losses on real estate. This resulted in a 25% to 50% reduction in the value of real estate, not only in raw land, but buildings, apartments and similar type ventures.

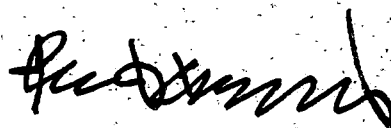
What was even more hideous was the fact that the Congress did it retroactively, thus not giving either the thrifts, banks or investors an opportunity to do anything but absorb the losses. As a result of this, the government has spent literally billions of dollars of taxpayer money bailing out financial institutions. It appears to me that vast sums of this money could have been saved if the Congress had been wise enough to restore passive losses or at least grandfathered those in effect in 1986. Of course, I know the President has tried hard to get a cut in the capital gains tax which would also help alleviate these problems.

I have written and discussed the matter with former Secretary Don Regan, Senators Gramm and Bentsen, and recently written to Secretary Brady, all without success to date. It seems that the government is more concerned with who gets the tax deductions than they are with the overall economy of the country. I write to you as a last resort because your reputation is that of a man of grit and determination and I

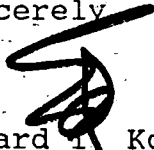

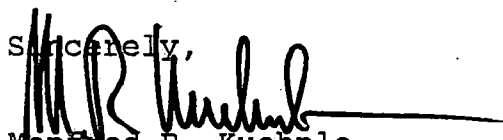

I am very concerned about the Navy's SEAWOLF program and its effect on the future of Electric Boat in Connecticut. As you know, New England is experiencing a devastating economic downturn, and the potential loss of some 27,00 jobs at Electric Boat by 1997 is another body blow that is both unfair and unnecessary.

The New England Council, as the nation's oldest regional business coalition, has worked for many years to forge a strong alliance between the public and private sectors, and to act in a responsible, productive manner on issues affecting our regional economy.

I understand that the Navy is considering building its new SEAWOLF Class ships at two different shipyards, Electric Boat in Connecticut and Newport News Shipyard in Virginia, rather than selecting one location and taking advantage of the potential cost-savings associated with worker learning curves.

Given the current budgetary climate, it only makes sense that the Navy's acquisition plans should represent the most cost-effective strategy for continuing this vital program. Dual-sourcing is not the most cost-effective way to build these ships.

One Seawolf takes 1,500 workers approximately four years to build and, for a shipyard to be efficient, it is necessary to have boats in certain stages of construction at all times so that production and learned efficiencies can be passed along.

Experience tells us that building all the SEAWOLF ships at one yard will save taxpayers hundreds of millions of dollars. With a stable workforce, the learning curve of workers will be significantly reduced and scheduling will be predictable. Electric Boat's performance in building the TRIDENT ships makes this clear - the last TRIDENT built took only 55 percent as much time as the first, saving taxpayers more than \$300 million.

Electric Boat has already identified significant savings that can be achieved by continuing SEAWOLF production in Connecticut through fiscal year 1991. On the other hand, awarding the FY '91 SEAWOLF contract to Newport News would result in severe, unnecessary, cost increases to the taxpayer, and jeopardize the future of Electric Boat.

Dual-sourcing does not make economic sense, and ignores the huge negative impact such a program would have on Electric Boat, the state of Connecticut and the New England economy. Simply put New England and Electric Boat need the SEAWOLF contract, Newport News does not.

The full impact of this situation becomes evident when viewed in the context of current construction backlogs at the two yards:

Electric Boat: Seven Tridents, seven SSN688's, and the lead ship of the SEAWOLF Class. Total value - \$5.6 billion.

Newport News: Ten SSN688's, three Carriers (equal to the work of nine Tridents,) and rehabilitation of the Carrier Enterprise. Total value - \$8.6 billion, more than 50 percent greater Electric Boat.

Newport News President Edward Campbell has stated that with its current backlog, he expects "no layoffs for the next three years." With procurement of an aircraft carrier planned for FY '95, the continuation of nuclear carrier overhaul and repair, and the ability to compete for other surface ship production, both commercial and Navy, it is clear that the future well-being of Newport News does not depend on additional SEAWOLF production.

The same cannot be said of Electric Boat. The future of Electric Boat, and its highly-skilled workforce, depend on the SEAWOLF program. With its current backlog, Electric Boat's workforce of 22,000 will be cut in half by 1994 and lost in its entirety by 1997. Even under optimistic conditions of one SEAWOLF per year awarded to Electric Boat, the workforce will have to be reduced by 50 percent during the next several years.

Taking into account subcontractors, manufacturers and service providers, the closing of Electric Boat could mean a direct loss of some 27,000 jobs by 1997. In addition, another 1,150 Connecticut businesses employing 45,000 people, and 450 vendors and suppliers in Rhode Island would also be affected.

Perhaps of greater long-term impact, such a loss of jobs would severely erode New England's defense industrial base, an extremely important component of our regional economy.

the very least, and in the interests of fairness, the SEAWOLF program should be awarded by the results of competitive bids. The regional impact of a direct award to Virginia is staggering for New England, which has already seen a double-digit reduction of defense procurement contracts from 1989 levels, while Virginia's share of such contracts increased 34 percent above 1989 levels.

I strongly urge the Administration to consider carefully the full impact of a directed award of the FY '91 SEAWOLF to Newport News and the consequences of this decision on the continuation of this program, the maintenance of the nation's defense industrial base and the economic health of New England.

Because of your Lebanese heritage, your personal intercession would be most meaningful.

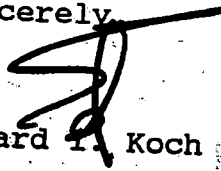

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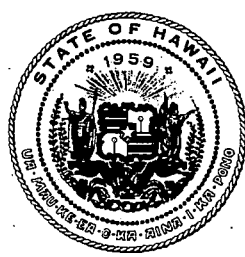

At present this school is recognized by several of the leading Christian Colleges, Seminaries and Graduate Schools on the mainland. Both their graduate and undergraduate credits and degrees are accepted by these institutions. They desire to pursue accreditation but there is no single Christian accrediting agency that can examine this school on both levels. Transnational Association of Christian Schools (TRACS) could examine this school on all levels at once if they (TRACS) were approved by the United States Department of Education.

International College is an associate member of Transnational Association of Christian Schools and would like to continue this process with one accrediting agency like TRACS rather than with two different unrelated agencies as would be required currently. With the approval of TRACS by the United States Department of Education only one agency would need to be dealt with, saving countless manhours and dollars.

If accredited, in addition to training pastors, christian educators, missionaries, and church staff members; International could train chaplain candidates for the armed forces. No such training now exists and as a result the armed forces has continuous vacancies that go unfilled. If International were accredited,

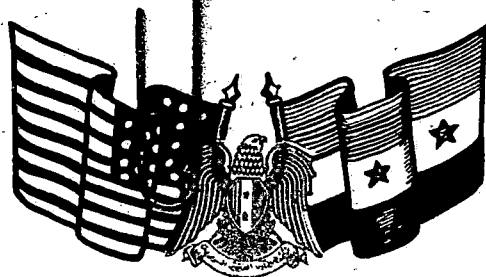

I was pleased to see that the President discussed the SDI program briefly in his state of the Union speech, and that he referred to a more concrete plan for future deployment of a limited global system of anti-missile defenses. This opening was a good first step on the way to getting his SDI program funded and pushed through Congress.

The next key opportunity for the President to exert positive public leadership on behalf of SDI is fast approaching, namely, March 23rd, the anniversary of President Reagan's announcement of the SDI program. This date is very timely for increasing public interest and for building Congressional support for the SDI budget and plan.

We urge that you recommend the President use this day to highlight the technological progress in the program, despite Congressional budget slashing, and to unveil specifics of the Bush Plan for the Global Protection Against Limited Strikes (GPALS) system now being developed at the Pentagon.

SDIO Director Henry Cooper and Pentagon spokesman Pete Williams have already publicly fleshed out the basic details of GPALS, but the President is the only one who can successfully bring this promising plan to the attention of the American people and rally their support to it.

The Iraqi SCUD missile attacks on our troops and on Israeli cities-- along with the success of our Patriot "SCUD busters"--has highlighted the growing future need for anti-missile defenses to protect against emerging third world threats and future instability in the Soviet Union. They have also sparked the interest of the American people in such defenses for America.

In the speech the President could describe to the American people our new anti-missile technology which is far more effective than our old Patriot interceptors, and effective against far more threatening missiles than the old Soviet SCUDS.

It would also be very desirable from a political, as well as a security standpoint, for the President to propose the goal of having this defensive system deployed by the year 2000. In addition, it would be useful to point out that the U.S. will seek a new treaty with the Soviets for mutual deployment of strategic defenses, but is prepared to withdraw unilaterally from the ABM Treaty if necessary to provide adequate security for the American people.

By making such a major speech focused on SDI on March 23rd, President Bush can build considerable public momentum for his SDI program, and favorably frame the future debate on the issue. I strongly urge that you encourage him to do so.

We will follow up by doing what we are able to help promote the President's SDI plan.

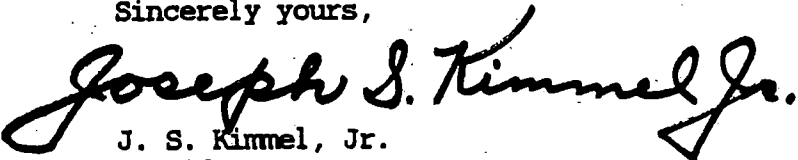

Dear John:

I wanted to follow up in writing on our phone conversation today concerning the concept of a North American summit meeting. Quite simply, the objective would be to provide a timely and well-publicized opportunity for a trilateral reaffirmation of the economic and political importance for all three countries of a North American Free Trade Agreement. Keeping in mind both that the key votes are likely to occur in May and that the President must respond to the Bentsen-Rostenkowski letter by May 1, I would suggest a one day meeting at the end of April or the beginning of May.

I would envision that the theme of the summit could be the future of the North American economy, with specific topics including the free trade agreement in general, energy issues in the post-Persian Gulf crisis era, a review of cooperative efforts in drug interdiction, and initiatives in the areas of environment, workers' rights, and health and safety standards in the workplace. Possible outcomes might include a joint communique announcing an environmental work program and a trilateral working group to examine labor rights and work place standards. There could also be an explanation of the substantial cooperation and progress with respect to narcotic trafficking. We could also consider seeking permission for both President Salinas and Prime Minister Mulroney to address a joint session of Congress.

As you are aware, the fight in Congress on NAFTA will be a difficult one. Yet, I am optimistic that we can win if we focus national attention on the importance of a free trade accord with Canada and Mexico. The summit will do just that.

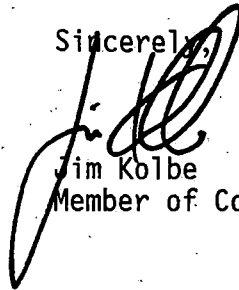

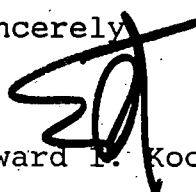

Dear Governor Sununu:

The Association on American Indian Affairs, Inc. (AAIA) is a national non-profit citizens' organization, headquartered in New York City, dedicated to the preservation and the enhancement of the rights and culture of American Indians and Alaska Natives. The policies of AAIA are formulated by a Board of Directors, a majority of whom are Native Americans.

We are greatly concerned that the President's block grant proposal will have a negative impact upon Indian people and tribes unless it is altered to reflect the unique status of Indian tribes. Indian tribes have a government-to-government relationship with the Federal government, a relationship clearly recognized by the Reagan-Bush Administration in its Indian policy statement. Tribes are not subdivisions of the states. While some states and tribes have cooperative relationships, others are in conflict over jurisdictional and other issues. To require tribes to petition states for access to this Federal money is not only philosophically incorrect, but will cause tribes and Indian people in many states to receive less than their fair share (if they receive any money at all).

Tribal governments have the direct responsibility for serving their communities and in general have proven to be the most effective service providers for their people -- when they have resources available which is often not the case.

Increasingly, it has been recognized that tribal allocations must be included in Federal funding programs targeted to States. Thus, tribes receive direct allocations in such acts as the Vocational Rehabilitation Act, Library Services and Construction Act (slated for inclusion in the President's block grant), Clean Water Act and Child Care and Development Block Grant. However, there are many other acts, such as the Title XX Block Grant, which do not specifically include tribes. The experience pursuant to Title XX is instructive. Our information indicates that only 4 or 5 states pass along any money to tribal governments within their borders notwithstanding the great need for such services on Indian reservations. We have in fact supported legislation to provide for a tribal allocation from Title XX (as did President Reagan in his 1983 Indian policy statement).

We have not had an opportunity to review the President's proposal in detail. However, there are some important general principles that we urge you to consider as this proposal is being refined:

1. There must be consultation with tribes in the development of this proposal.
2. There must be a tribal allocation from the block grant.
3. Programs which directly or indirectly target Indian people should not be included in the Block Grant because many states are likely to reallocate at least part of the money to their non-Indian constituents, notwithstanding the needs of the Indian community. At least one program mentioned in the broad descriptive materials that we have seen pertaining to the President's proposal falls into this category. The "impact aid" program provides Federal money to public schools which have an inadequate tax base to support those schools because of the "Federal impact" upon their districts (generally non-taxable military bases and Indian reservations). Approximately 30% of the \$740 million appropriation under "impact aid" goes to public schools educating Indian children. Allowing this program to be "lost" in the larger block grant is likely to lead to diminishing resources for these schools, contrary to Federal goals pertaining to the education of Indian children.

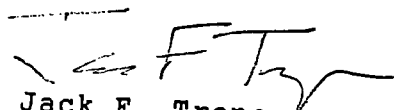

I am very concerned and want to protest Canadian fortification of beer trade barriers during the pendency of a GATT proceeding requested by the United States as part of an investigation undertaken following the filing of 301 Petitions.

As of January 1, 1991, the Province of British Columbia has adopted a "cost of service fee" which is discriminately applied against American brewed beers in a manner which significantly raises their cost to Canadian consumers. This action will severely impact the sales of brands exported by Blitz-Weinhard Brewing Company, resident brewer in the State of Oregon. I understand that a similar "cost of service fee" was earlier established in the Province of Ontario and that the sale of American brewed beers were virtually halted by the consumer price increase.

It is inconceivable to me that Canadian Liquor authorities can act so cavalierly during the course of our investigation. I further note that for the most recent reported year (1989), Canada exported nearly 30 million cases of beer to the United States and the United States exported only six million cases of beer to Canada (Beer Institute, Brewers Almanac, 1990).

The Omnibus Trade and Competitiveness Act of 1988 amended the United States Trade Act to mandate action by the United States where its international legal rights are violated. Dear Governor Sununu:

It was a pleasure to see you again at The Business Roundtable luncheon on February 6, and chat with you regarding our thoughts on the merits of some current environmental initiatives.

I have been particularly concerned that by focusing our efforts on controlling emissions from mobile sources, particularly exhaust emissions, we are overlooking areas where that may be more fruitful and more cost/effective.

For instance, we have estimated that for a city like Dallas in the year 1995, only about 4% of the hydrocarbon emissions would be exhaust emissions from gasoline cars, with the remaining 96% from biogenic sources (25%); stationary sources (50%) and other mobile (21%). Exhibit I graphically illustrates the hydrocarbon emission inventory for Dallas in 1995 using primarily Mobile 4 EPA Model projections. We have chosen an elephant to emphasize the size of the problem.

The early results of the Auto/Oil Research Program show that the best reformulated gasolines can only modestly reduce exhaust hydrocarbon (about 13%). For Dallas, in 1995, this would only reduce total hydrocarbons by about one-half of one percent. This is shown graphically in Exhibit II, where just the tip of the elephant's tail has been affected.

The cost to remove this small amount of hydrocarbon is estimated at greater than \$200,000 per ton of hydrocarbon removed; far more, by orders of magnitude, than historic control methods for reducing hydrocarbons. Exhibit III shows the cost/effectiveness of various conventional control methods compared with our estimates for gasoline reformulation and promising advanced catalytic devices such as the Electrically Heated Catalysts (EHC). This device is

under development by catalyst companies and under study in a Petroleum Environmental Research Forum program. Exhibits IV and V show the effectiveness of such a device in reducing hydrocarbons and carbon monoxide on two 1990 Caprices retrofitted and tested by Texaco. Exhibit VI shows the catalyst configuration being evaluated by Texaco. Other groups' experiences with EHC cars are similar.

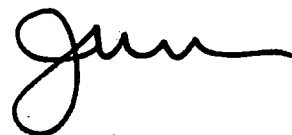
Based on our preliminary analysis, we see the cost/effective relationships falling into three categories: (1) \$10,000 or less, (2) between \$10,000 - \$100,000, and (3) greater than \$100,000. Control measures such as RVP, Stage II, Canisters, and Inspection and Maintenance programs fall in category (1), which is a level the public has been accustomed to paying; measures such as advanced hardware emission systems, low sulfur fuels and oxygenate fuels fall in category (2), which is a level the public may have to accept if significant additional improvement is to be achieved; and extensive reformulation of gasoline by reducing aromatics, olefins, and T90 falls into the very expensive category (3), which the public should avoid if possible. These control method costs are depicted in Exhibit VII.

In summary, I feel that there are many cost/effective methods to control hydrocarbon emissions other than extensive gasoline component reformulations and that the best solution will involve technical innovation by the automotive and oil industries, governmental leadership and societal acceptance of the increased costs associated with cleaner air.

Dear John,

Congratulations on your well-performed surgical removal of the earth's most recent cancerous tumor. I hope you don't have to kill Saddam Hussein. He should be left alive as an object lesson to others who have similar ambitions.

Yes, I am the outgrowth of the naive little freshman you tied up in the Blue Room of the Phi Sigma Kappa House in the winter of 1958. Hopefully a little less naive, certainly still as hopeful about the future of mankind. Thank you for taking some measure of responsibility for that future.

I have some very strange-sounding suggestions to make. I hope you can, at least momentarily, suppress the hilarity that they will undoubtedly evoke, and consider them. Here they are:

Please ask the President to consider gradually eliminating all foreign aid to Israel and linking its elimination to an offer of free relocation to the United States for all Israelis who wish to relocate. The saving in military and foreign aid expenditures would be enormous, and the major irritant in the Middle East would be neutralized. We would also do well to acknowledge our role in creating the irritation and apologize to the Arab states involved.

Please ask the President to consider withdrawing recognition of the People's Republic of China and restoring recognition to the Republic of China if events on the mainland take another nasty turn. As a local government official in coastal Georgia, I am very concerned about the ongoing dialogue regarding the national wetlands policy. Coastal Georgia has been an active participant in the activities of the White House Office of Policy Development project to evaluate and possibly revise the Wetlands program, and we would like to express our support for a number of specific reform measures.

The January 28, 1991 letter sent to you by the Chairman of our Coastal Georgia Regional Development Center, representing eight local counties and 26 coastal Georgia cities, outlines our strongly supported statement of concerns and recommendations. As outlined in the letter, we feel that erosion of our tax base and the inability to perform essential government functions will likely result from continuing application of unrealistic wetland guidelines.

I am also concerned that very legitimate environmental programs may suffer from the backlash of public response against the unfounded provisions of the current Section 404 program. The inappropriate "taking" of private property in the name of environmental interests will only further polarize resource management issues; thereby threatening the political viability of sound, well-conceived programs, both existing and proposed.

We call for immediate specific changes to the wetlands definition and the permit process, as outlined in that letter.

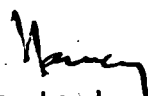

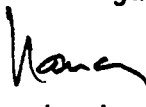
