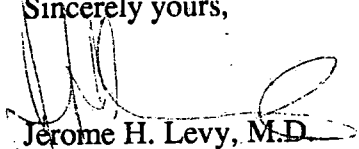
Once again, your support is needed to maintain quality ophthalmic care despite a myriad of budget cuts.

As of January 1, 1991, Medicare reimbursement for assistants at cataract surgery was cut from 20 per cent to 16 per cent of the surgeon's fee. According to the Physician Payment Review Commission (PPRC), current reimbursement levels are now below the cost of providing the service and physicians like myself will have trouble recruiting assistants. To rectify the situation, the PPRC recommends that until relative work values can be determined, Medicare should revert back to the 20 per cent reimbursement rate which was in effect prior to January 1, 1991.

You can understand that it is not only imperative for physicians to be reimbursed at a level that covers their costs it is also clearly logical. Especially since cataract surgery has undergone drastic cuts in virtually all other areas of reimbursement in the last few years. We must start drawing the line somewhere.

Please support the PPRC recommendation to revert back the 20 per cent Medicare reimbursement level for assistants at cataract surgery.

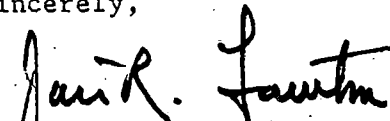

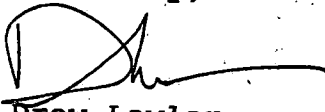

Dear Governor:

I am writing on behalf of wood preserving industry to request that you work with EPA Administrator William Reilly to continue discussions between the EPA and the wood preserving industry on a regulation affecting the industry. I hope that these discussions will achieve a more cost effective regulation that meets the President's FY 1992 Budget goals and provides adequate compliance time.

On December 6, 1990, EPA promulgated a final rule for the industry which the President's Budget has identified as the least cost effective regulation in over 20 years. The regulation's cost per premature death averted, according to the Budget, is \$5.7 trillion. EPA and the industry are currently discussing implementation issues raised by the final rule including compliance deadlines. It will simply be impossible for some wood preserving facilities to meet a June 6, 1991 deadline.

In 1989 and 1990, I was among 150 Members of Congress who strongly urged EPA to regulate the wood preserving industry using an integrated multi-statute approach. EPA has promulgated a cost-ineffective, RCRA-only regulation that the industry contends is no more protective of human health and the environment than alternatives proposed by the industry and rejected by EPA.

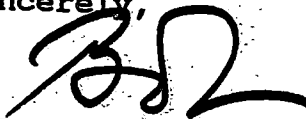
Industry-wide capital expenditures for the EPA regulation could be as high as \$5 billion, easily exceeding more than twice the estimated net value of the industry. Many wood preserving companies have insufficient capital to meet the EPA regulation's costs. EPA's final rule will force a significant number of plant closings within the industry.

EPA has been told of the potential economic harm that could result from its actions and has acknowledged that some of the rule's negative effects were not intended. In this vein, EPA should work diligently to address industry's legitimate concerns.

Dear Mr. Sununu,

My daughter Rowan, a college sophomore majoring in science, is piloting a science and math program called SMART in an inner city school in New Haven. I am writing to see if you might support SMART, given your interest in the science and math education issues facing the nation. We think SMART could have a major impact on these issues if it could be expanded nation-wide with support from the White House.

SMART stands for the Science and Math Achiever Teaming program and was developed by Rowan and myself in response to the President's pledge to make the U.S. the world leader in science and math education within the next decade. SMART pairs junior high and high school pupils with college student volunteers, supported by industry and college resource persons and the local industries and colleges involved, to motivate them in science and mathematics through achievement in long term projects. It draws on Rowan's experiences as a Yale science student, a Westinghouse winner and an Illinois Mathematics and Science Academy graduate, and my own familiarity with technology transfer in international business and thus with the industrial challenges facing the U.S. We think it is a uniquely American response to Mr. Bush's challenge in its reliance on a practical combination of youthful enthusiasm, volunteerism, academic resource and business funding and smarts to generate national - not just local - momentum quickly in science and math.

Rowan's pilot project involves working with inner city junior high schoolers in New Haven, along with other Yale student volunteers, with support from the Yale Dean's office, through Dean Judith Hackman, and with funding from a Hughes Foundation grant. Based on progress so far in New Haven, and a franchise formula drawn from the experience of Junior Achievement, we believe that SMART can be a truly effective national volunteer program that will help in math and science education, regardless of the progress of reform in the schools.

We are not alone in our excitement about SMART. In February, we met with 'Fortune' publisher, Mr. James B. Hayes, to discuss an article on SMART we had submitted for publication. It was Mr. Hayes who suggested that the White House, in particular the Points of Light Foundation, might be interested in SMART. As he saw it, SMART meets the nation's three major needs for a volunteer science program: it motivates both school pupils and college students, it taps into the best and largest pool of volunteers possible to reach the school kids who need to be reached and it draws on a proven formula for speedy national expansion.

Rowan has written to the President as well as Dr. Allan Bromley, members of the Science Advisers Council, and Mr. Petersmeyer in the past month. To interest industry, she has written Mr. Akers and other industry leaders prominent in education and we have both written Mr. Kearns. I have written to Mr. Alexander and met with staff in Dr. Bromley's office and Mrs. Ann Taylor at the Points of Light Foundation.

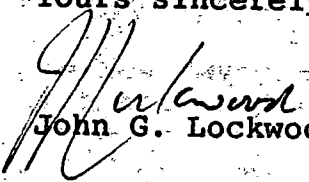
Rowan was at the STS 50th. Anniversary last month when the President spoke and has reported that SMART met with a good reception there and she has been invited to participate in an expense-paid seminar in July at the Center for Talented Youth at Johns Hopkins on innovation in scientific education. In Illinois, she has met with the state JETS coordinator at the U. of I. who is interested in SMART for inner-city youth, and wants to arrange for her to make a presentation to Motorola in May. We want to follow this up by forming SMARTeams at the U. of Chicago and other inner city campuses in Chicago and St. Louis.

We think SMART would be very interesting to the President and would like to bring it to his attention. White House recognition of SMART as a volunteer program and as an example of a private initiative effective in aiding U.S. science and math education is essential if we are to recruit the school and college participation we need to expand nation-wide and the industry support to form a non-profit national association, while tracking with the timetable the President has set.

I enclose a summary of SMART, a proposal on our planned association called the SMART League, a 'Yale Daily News' article on the SMART pilot project, an information sheet Rowan uses for recruiting on-campus, a copy of our article on SMART and a copy of her resume.

Rowan and I would welcome discussing SMART further with you. My office number is 815/226-7913 and my home number, 815/397-0584, and Rowan can be reached through me. Thank you very much for your time and interest.

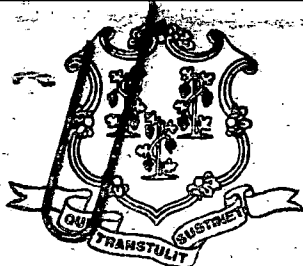

We are writing you on a matter of great concern and economic importance to the citizens of Connecticut, Rhode Island and New England at-large.

As you are aware, the Secretary of the Navy shortly will authorize the awarding of the FY91 SEAWOLF contract to one of two shipyards in this country with nuclear submarine capability. We strongly urge you to use your good office in support of a decision to award this SEAWOLF contract to the Electric Boat Division of General Dynamics in Groton, Connecticut.

Electric boat is Connecticut's second largest private employer and the largest in Rhode Island. Approximately 17,000 workers in both states are dedicated to the design, construction and support of the U.S. Navy's nuclear submarine force. Without the award of the FY91 SEAWOLF to Electric Boat, it will become economically impossible for the Groton, Connecticut shipyard and the Quonset Point Rhode Island manufacturing and outfitting facility to remain open past the completion of their current vessel inventory.

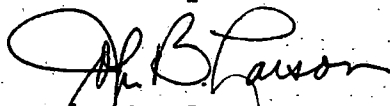
The regional economic impact of Electric Boat's failure would be staggering. The annual payroll for Electric Boat employees is over \$475,000,000. In addition, the company pays approximately \$20,000,000 annually in state and local taxes and purchases goods and services which add more than \$70,000,000 to our regional economy on an annual basis. The loss of the FY91 SEAWOLF contract would send the states of Connecticut and Rhode Island into a calamitous economic tailspin and would further contribute to a decline that has already devastated thousands of businesses and individuals in our area.

I am gratified that the UN ceasefire resolution contains the two basic measures that I had proposed in my letter to you of February 21---a requirement that Iraq turn over its weapons-usable uranium to the IAEA and that Iraq submit to special inspections conducted by the Agency. The challenge now is to ensure that the IAEA has the financial and technical backing to do these jobs effectively. I continue to be deeply concerned that Iraq may claim the bomb-grade fuel has been "completely destroyed" (this was the term used by Iraq concerning "relevant installations" in its letter to the UN accepting the terms of the resolution).

The basis for my concern is found in the attached technical paper prepared for us by Carson Mark, which I had promised, in my letter of February 18, to forward to you as soon as it was completed. As you will see, Dr. Mark concludes that a "fairly large and competent" team could design, fabricate and assemble a single implosion device weighing only a ton, or so, capable of realizing a yield on the order of 10 kilotons, if limited to the 12 kilograms of 93% enriched French material, or of 20 kilotons, if this material were combined with the 80% enriched Soviet material.

No effort should be spared in recovering Iraq's bomb-grade uranium. Also, an important lesson of this whole experience is the importance of redoubling the U.S. effort to complete, and implement fully, the RERTR (Reduced Enrichment for Test and Research Reactor) Program and thereby eliminate commerce in this weapons-usable material.

Dear Governor Sununu:

As per your request, I am enclosing the Long Island Power Authority's (LIPA's) study of converting Shoreham to a gas-fired plant. The study considered three different conversion options, all of which use natural gas as the primary fuel. The study concluded that "the conversion of Shoreham to natural gas fired power plant is technically feasible, economic, practical and environmentally compatible".

I also separately obtained an interoffice memorandum from the New York State Public Service Commission (PSC). The memo was written by the PSC staff to Peter Bradford, who was appointed by Governor Cuomo to be the PSC's Chairman.

The staff memo is interesting because it points out several problems with LIPA's study, such as the availability of natural gas from the Iroquois pipeline and the cost-effectiveness of converting a nuclear facility the size of Shoreham.

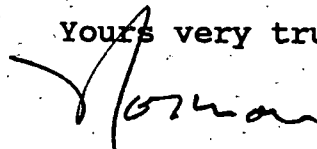

On behalf of 44,000 members of the Society for Human Resource Management, I am writing to thank you for the Administration's strong opposition to anti-striker replacement legislation (H.R. 5 and S. 55). As you know, the legislation would expand the current permanent replacement prohibition to apply not only to unfair labor practice situations, but in any instance where employees strike or walk off the job to seek enhanced pay or benefits. The new prohibition would apply to economic disputes in both unionized and non-union settings.

Needless to say, the legislation would dramatically change -- and upset -- the balance of power in labor management relations. From the human resource practitioner's perspective, the hiring of temporary employees is extremely difficult and often impractical. Even if replacements with the necessary skills and training can be found, it is often impossible to find workers willing to cross a picket line in potentially violent situations. Relegating employers to the right of hiring temporary replacements whenever employees demand increased wages or benefits is essentially denying employers the right to operate during a strike.

We also believe that since the bill is fundamentally flawed, any attempt to modify the proposal or limit the bill to unionized situations would be in vain. No doubt the courts would treat non-union employers as it would union employers and subsequently prohibit the non-union employer from hiring replacement workers. Regardless, non-union firms would continue to be affected by the legislation with respect to recognition strikes as well as by a ripple effect as the operations of mutually dependent employers, distributors and suppliers are effected.

A Concerned Women for America staff attorney, Mark N. Troobnick, attended the last hearing for the Transnational Association of Christian Schools ("TRACS") to be recognized as an accrediting agency by the Department of Education. He was concerned by the disparaging and unfair treatment which was levelled at TRACS and its Director, Dr. J. Gordon Henry.

At that hearing it became evident that there was an inherent liberal educator's bias on the part of the accrediting board against the fundamentalist Christian beliefs of TRACS. Some members of the board expressed the opinion that a student in a TRACS accredited school would not be able to transfer into another accredited program or proceed on to higher education because he or she would be taught that the Scriptures are inerrant. Needless to say, many great Americans have been taught that the Bible is inerrant and have not become dysfunctional adults as a result.

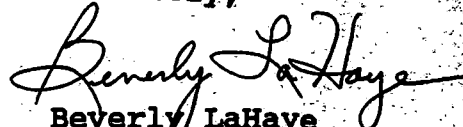
Although TRACS meets 45 of 46 criteria for official recognition by the Department, the guise for denial of recognition has been a lack of collegial recognition by potential competing accrediting agencies. The Department has recognized other accrediting agencies that meet far fewer of their criteria.

We understand that there is a possibility that once again TRACS has an opportunity to obtain recognition from the Department of Education. We would appreciate any assistance you could render us by contacting the new Secretary of Education on TRACS' behalf. The last time your office was contacted for help in this matter, a White House staff member telephoned Dr. Henry to say that it was believed to be a breach of ethics for the

staff's office to become involved. CWA attorneys have
searched this area of the law and have found no legal
justification for that representation. Our attorneys would be
more than willing to discuss this with your appropriate staff
members.

The White House and Concerned Women for America have worked
together on a number of issues over the years, and we hope we can
work together on this issue. Dr. Henry's hard work over the last
ten years has gone on long enough. Please help stop the last
discrimination against this organization.

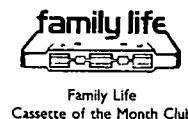

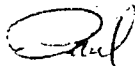

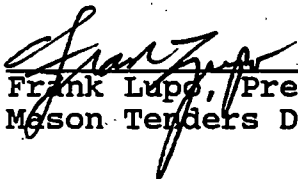

A new regulation, which accounts properly for the minimal risks associated with these wastes, should be developed. The new rule should also provide adequate compliance time for the industry.

In 1989 and 1990, I was among 150 other Members who strongly urged the EPA to regulate the wood preserving industry with an integrated, multi-statute approach. Unfortunately, the rule issued by the agency was based solely on the regulatory structure of the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA).

Estimates are that it will cost as much as \$5 billion, or twice the net value of the industry, to comply with the rule issued by the EPA. We are told that most wood preserving firms lack the capital to meet these costs, and a significant number of plants will be closed as a result.

Your time and attention to this important matter is appreciated.

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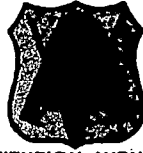

At the February meeting of the AFL-CIO Executive Council a resolution was adopted which is of extreme importance to thousands of timber workers across this nation. The resolution, which now becomes official policy of the AFL-CIO, addresses the issue of timber harvesting on public lands. It urges a policy designed to preserve jobs in the timber and logging industries.

This resolution is particularly timely in view of the fact that legislation is now before Congress to impose severe new limitations on timber harvesting. According to leading forest economists, such legislation, if enacted, would eliminate over 100,000 jobs in the timber industry. The regions in the Pacific Northwest most directly affected by such legislation -- Washington, Oregon and California -- stand to lose as much as \$3.8 billion of their total annual income.

On February 6, Rep. Jim Jontz (D-IN) introduced H.R. 842, the Ancient Forest Protection Act which purports to resolve the timber issue. We do not feel this bill would assure the continuing viability of the timber industry. Nor do we believe that creating a new bureaucracy of federal departments and agencies to regulate timber harvesting is the answer. Rather, the solution lies in finding a fair and reasonable balance between the needs of our economy and those of the environment, as is highlighted in the AFL-CIO resolution.

Enclosed is a copy of the resolution. On behalf of the United Brotherhood of Carpenters and Joiners of America and the 600,000 workers we represent, I hope you will help us in our efforts to resolve this crisis.

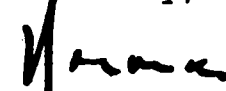

We thought that you might be interested in seeing the enclosed op-ed piece recently published in The Wall Street Journal.

It deals with the post-war arrangements in the Persian Gulf, stressing roles for the United Nations in peacekeeping and in more comprehensive plans for the region. In our view, a UN-led force would have several advantages over alternative plans. It would ensure a global, not just regional, commitment to maintaining the peace. The UN also has years of peacekeeping experience throughout the world upon which to draw. In addition, a UN force would distribute the burdens of political and financial responsibility more equitably among member states.

We also would urge strong US support for roles of the "other United Nations" -- the economic, social, and humanitarian arms of the UN -- in healing the wounds of war. The UN system already is actively involved in coordinating international responses to refugee problems, humanitarian needs, and environmental devastation. UN planners also are beginning to develop a framework for post-war economic reconstruction and rehabilitation.

All of these efforts are crucial to the achievement of the US objective of rebuilding the peace in the Persian Gulf, and will aid the development of a new world order. As in the pre-war period, the post-war reconstruction will offer a special opportunity for US leadership within the UN community.

The UNA-USA is devoting some attention to proposals for further UN involvement in the Persian Gulf. We have enclosed the latest UNA-USA briefing paper to share with you some informal thinking on these matters.

Please call upon us if we can be of assistance. Thanks very much for your attention.

Thanks for your kind letter. I would hate to impose on your time, but I have given some thought to the question of how to bring sanity to the public discussion of scientific issues. While there is no unique solution to such a problem, I suspect that the question of 'scientific spokespersonship' is central.

President Lincoln attempted to deal with this issue by creating the National Academy of Sciences. While this organization is far from perfect, it is about the best we have. Unfortunately, its utility has been reduced almost to zero in recent years. What has happened is that the report writing role of the Academy has moved almost entirely to the National Research Council. While the five officers of National Academies of Science and Engineering (as well as of the very strangely constituted Institute of Medicine) nominally oversee the NRC, the work is almost entirely left to 1100 staffers whose scientific credentials are not notable. The NRC committees involve about 10,000 scientists -- of whom about 5% are Academy members. The staffers are under considerable pressure to solicit work since the associated funding pays their salaries. These considerations also compromise the formation of committees and the preparation of reports. To be sure, NRC reports are subjected to review. However, fewer than 20% of the reviews are prepared by members of the Academy, and the reviewers are selected by the staff of the NRC. The review operation is overseen by the Report Review Committee -- all of whose members are also Academy members. However, the sheer volume of reports precludes careful scrutiny of more than about 10% of the annual production of reports. Moreover, no report committee ever responds to the reviewers themselves. The situation is compounded by the byzantine election rules of the NAS whereby the bulk of the membership has almost no role in the nomination of the officers. Finally, under Frank Press, the NRC staff has almost doubled -- further diluting the explicit influence of the NAS.

How did we reach this state of affairs wherein the possibility of legitimate spokespersonship was essentially demolished? According to the NRC, it was designated as the operating arm of the NAS by two presidential directives -- one from Woodrow Wilson and the second from Dwight David Eisenhower. The NRC fails to mention that the first directive met so much opposition that the Attorney General was called in to overturn it. Eisenhower's directive was a response to the postwar expansion in the role of science, and provoked little opposition until recent years. At present there is a widespread furor in the NAS -- provoked by the growing irrelevancy of the NAS to the NRC coupled with the opposition of many members of the NAS to the content of recent reports. There are internal

the NAS to improve matters, however, the very size of the NRC makes matters. Also, the nature of the NAS constitution and by-laws makes it very difficult for the membership to change matters themselves without the active agreement of the officers.

Given the alleged origin of the situation in the Office of the President, it is clear that a presidential directive returning the role of 'operating arm' to the Academies could make an important difference. However, it is also clear that the Academies could not handle the present volume of reports. The solution to this problem is, I think, simple. The vast bulk of Academy (NRC) reports could be just as well prepared by professional societies, government agencies, think tanks, etc. The present composition of NRC committees differs in neither membership nor quality from committees that would be formed under other auspices. In difficult circumstances, such reports could be submitted to the Academies for legitimate review. Finally, in a few situations, the membership of relevant sections of the Academies could be called on to conduct studies and prepare reports that would represent such authority as might be presumed to pertain to the Academies.

Clearly, the above would not constitute a panacea. However, it might retrieve the issue of legitimate spokesmanship from its present chaotic state. Unfortunately, the above actions would probably take too long to impact the present 'global warming' hysteria. My only suggestion would be a massive campaign of public education that would serve to disentangle this issue from general environmental concerns. Unfortunately, I cannot think of any organizations in a position to tackle such a task. Clearly, my own efforts are no match for the opposition.

Such are my thoughts. I feel that you should know them before I waste any more of your time. If you should still be interested in meeting, I would be honored to meet with you at your convenience.

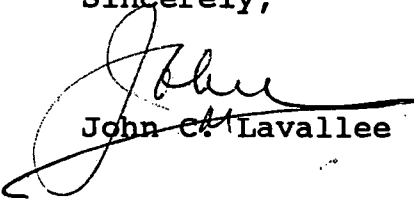

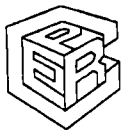

Dear John:

As you will shortly learn, the ballot for officers and councillors for the National Academy of engineering will contain the unusual feature of two candidates for president. One is, of course, Robert White, the current president who, after considerable persuasion by a number of us who know him well, has agreed to stand for a third term. He will not serve beyond this one more term, which would mean a total of twelve years.

It is noteworthy that the president of the National Academy of Sciences also has a maximum term of twelve years (which expires in 1993), so I think this parallel structure is perfectly reasonable and permits an orderly overlap into the next NAS presidency. Bob has performed excellently his share of the leadership of the National Research Council, the operating arm of the National Academies Complex.

Bob has done an excellent job in cementing cordial relations with the NAS during his term in office. As you know, Bob was instrumental in the erection of the Beckman Center of the academies at Irvine, California, and arranging for the NAE to be equal partners in ownership and management. As you undoubtedly also know, I have worked closely with Bob throughout his two terms, and can attest to the fact that he has done an absolutely outstanding job in building the academy's treasury, its recognition, and its stature.

We have been very fortunate that he has been available to us, and I can tell you that it is not easy to find a person for this position who combines his energy, his perception, and his high credibility at all levels of the political, scientific and technical communities.

The second candidate is on the ballot by petition and while I know him very well, I do not hesitate to urge that you support Bob for this one additional term by your vote and by whatever you can say to your colleagues toward the same end.

Dear Governor Sununu:

When Cardinal O'Connor visited with the President, the Secretary of State and yourself on Monday, he mentioned that the President of the episcopal conference of the United States would be leaving on Saturday for a meeting between the Holy Father and all presidents of bishops conferences now at War. This meeting with the Pope begins on Monday of next week and ends on Tuesday.

One of the concerns which I hoped that Archbishop Daniel E. Pilarczyk, our president, might bring to the table at this important meeting is what the Christian Churches of the West might reasonably be expected to do after armistice, now happily in sight. Our response depends in large measure on what our government will allow our humanitarian agencies to do and I understand from Cardinal O'Connor that few restrictions will be placed on them.

It might be helpful to Archbishop Pilarczyk and to the Catholic Church in the United States if he were made aware of the Administration's post-war planning prior to his departure. The Archbishop arrives in Washington tonight and we leave together on Saturday afternoon for Rome.

I know you are busy at this particular time. I called Ms. Kennedy on Monday but have not had a return call. I offer this opportunity for your consideration and assure you of my best wishes.

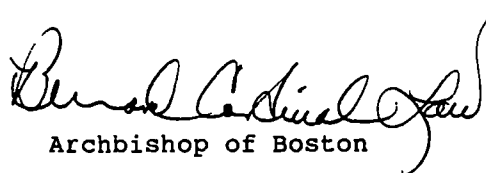
It has come to my attention that Chiara Lubich may be nominated for the Nobel Peace Prize.

Dear John,

The process of electing the next National Academy of Engineering President is underway. My name will appear on the ballot for this office. I am writing to you to explain why I have agreed to be a candidate, and to ask for your support.

I am interested in this office because I feel that the NAE's President, Council, and members could strongly influence the American Agenda. In spite of NAE's twenty-five years of service, the country's technical agenda does not give sufficient weight to engineering. I am convinced that NAE could make an appreciable difference in strengthening America's agenda by focusing on important national issues like those indicated in this letter and Enclosure 1, and by outlining steps to be taken toward their resolution. Reflecting upon these issues, I propose to choose initiatives of the highest priority during my first year in office. Such action could have a beneficial effect on NAE's visibility, its structure, and the American Agenda.

My candidacy offers an alternative to the membership of the NAE. All officers of the NAE, with the exception of the President, can be elected to a maximum of two terms. While the current President has served ably during eight years in office and now is seeking to serve a third term, (a duration of twelve years in office), I believe that the two-term, eight-year limit should apply to *all* elected officers. Since the establishment of the Academy, none of its seven past or acting Presidents has served more than eight years, while the remaining five served no more than four years (see Enclosure 2).

Also, as practiced by many professional groups, NAE members should be given the consideration of at least two (2) candidates for the office of President. Such a choice is healthy and mandatory for any membership's participation in a democratic election process.

My interest in this position is further stimulated by the broad, extensive encouragement and strong support I have received from members representing all three sectors. As a petition candidate, I have received to date twice the number of members' support required by the NAE Bylaws and over ten (10) times that required from their institutions. My interest is also based upon my earlier service as NAE Home Secretary, as Dean of The George Washington School of Engineering and Applied Science, in global scientific and engineering affairs, in government (Office of Naval Research and Department of Defense) and as a consultant to industry. (See Enclosure 3). This experience has involved me in major issues confronting the nation which call for action by the NAE and the engineering communities here and abroad.

On another point, as you may know, when the position of Chairman was established eight and one-half years ago, the NAE's Council felt it was important that a balanced representation from the Academy's sectors--industry, government, and universities--be maintained in the Academy by nominating a person for Chairman from industry with the President representing another sector. NAE has been fortunate over the past eight years to have had three able Chairmen, (see Enclosure 2), serving alongside the incumbent President. However, after eight years, change is needed in the background of the President, as we have had in the past in both the Chairmanship and in the Presidency, to provide for representation from all three sectors--industry, government and universities--as previously desired, so that new initiatives can be addressed by the Academy's evolving needs.

Should I be elected President, I will immediately appoint a Transition Team whose function will be to review and recommend high priority national issues for NAE's attention by July 1, 1991. Since all issues can not be dealt with at once, this will be a multi-phased effort. These issues will be reviewed by a newly established Technical Advisory Council (TAC) which will recommend some for further inquiry. I am proposing that TAC become a permanent body, with the Academy's approval, focusing on technological and research issues representing all phases of engineering. TAC's recommendations will be submitted to the governing NAE Council for approval and implementation by October 1, 1991. The outcome of this will be Action Papers written by NAE members on important national issues. This process will not interfere nor substitute for projects undertaken by the National

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...graphics and data, but should be concise and direct, and in a form which identifies and promotes the action to be taken to ensure a stronger America, hence the name Action Papers. Further, they should be completed in one year or less after their initiation.

For Phase I, I will recommend to the Transition Team four important national issues affecting the creation of the U.S. Technological and Research Infrastructure, such as: 1) technology, research and national security, including energy independence; 2) engineering sciences research; 3) environment and infrastructure; and 4) competitiveness. I am as seriously concerned as many of our members about NAE undertaking a more effective role in influencing the American agenda. It is clear to many of us that NAE must assert its leadership position, particularly on issues which are inherently of engineering nature.

I will ask the NAE's Budget Committee and Council to reprogram funds so that the initial studies could be undertaken. Also, I will seek funding from NAE's Fund for this initiative. In addition, I will obtain other required funding for completing Phase I and later Phase II, starting six months later, i.e. by December 31, 1991.

I will start Phase II by recommending four other areas to be considered by TAC including: 1) health of U.S. engineering colleges; 2) technology, research and balance of trade; 3) health of selected American industries (see Enclosure 1 for examples); and 4) health of in-house capabilities of government laboratories. TAC's recommendations on the Action Papers to be selected for Phase II should be completed by April 1, 1992 for consideration by the governing NAE Council.

In my discussions with many of the NAE members there appeared to be a clear consensus that the NAE and NRC should concentrate on fewer studies so that a greater impact could be made on America's most important issues. A fundamental point arises as to whether or not NAE will serve America best by focusing its energies on fewer but on more important issues. Consequently, another action I will take in my capacity as Vice Chairman of the NRC Governing Council (reserved for the President of NAE) is to recommend that NRC's studies be reduced initially by 5-10%. This will provide NRC with the opportunity to re-evaluate and prioritize its ongoing work.

I will also recommend that we not rely only on the voluntary efforts of our Academy members but rather should allocate funds for their efforts in *special* cases where larger amounts of time are involved. This may occur in 5-10% of the studies. I have spoken to the President of the National Academy of Sciences who has agreed that 5% is something reasonable. We need to experiment with different models of operation in order to obtain optimal results. Reimbursing some Academy members for their time may bring into NRC panels leading authorities who are not now participating.

I will recommend that the NRC Governing Board be expanded by an additional five (5) members, two (2) each from the NAE and the National Academy of Sciences (NAS) and one (1) from the Institute of Medicine (IOM). This action should provide for new talents to contribute to the Academy's emerging challenges.

The original charter establishing NAS indicated that no fixed fee could be charged by NAS for its studies over and above allowable overhead. I have discussed this matter with the President of NAS who concurs with me that it would be advantageous if a fixed fee could be charged to NRC contracts, which presently total about 160 million dollars for this year. He would favor such a request if it did not adversely affect our special relationship with Congress and he would work with us to accomplish this change, which could generate multimillions of dollars for endowment and independent studies.

I plan to lead an energetic technological thrust for the Academy. I will also pursue a new and vigorous fund campaign to finance the completion of these and other initiatives. A new funds campaign will have to address the need of the NAE having its own home in the proximity of the Academy complex. My record shows that I have been very successful in raising funds. This experience should be beneficial to the NAE.

The above efforts will be supplemented by me in reaching out to you on your home ground and having regular scheduled "Divisional Meetings and Roundtables" in various geographic locations throughout the United States so that your input could be realized and satisfactorily assured. Communications will be improved by conducting such periodic interaction with you and by the initiation of a monthly *Flash* letter to NAE members keeping you abreast of NAE activities. With the approval of the Academy, I will also implement procedures so that both NAE members and officers will govern the actions of the Academy jointly. This will include surveying the entire membership on particular Academy issues. It is important to broaden membership involvement.

Research Council and in the Academies.

In confining myself to a few pages, I have only attempted to mention above some examples of efforts which are important to the NAE. Some others are included in Enclosure 1 under the headings of: I - To Strengthen Our Structure; II - To Improve Our Visibility; and III - To Influence the American Agenda. These will be addressed as priorities and degrees of effort are established.

In summary, actions to be taken on the above issues include the following (see Enclosure 1 for a more complete listing):

- a) Ensure that NAE has a stronger influence on America's agenda.
- b) Find effective measures to stop the erosion of the U.S. technological and research infrastructure, and to restudy the possibility of the establishment of a new National Engineering Foundation.
- c) Ask NAE to highlight and intensify its efforts on the problems and consequences of the present declining support for engineering sciences research.
- d) Build up greater ties to Congress and the White House to involve the NAE more in national and international issues.
- e) Continue vigorous fund raising, and increase discretionary funding for enhancement of NAE programs by inviting further participation by foundations. Also, a new fund drive should account for the establishment of a permanent NAE home in the proximity of the Academy complex. In addition, work to change present restrictions on charging a fixed fee on NRC contracts.
- f) Improve interaction with members by conducting periodic meetings on a geographic, divisional, regular basis, and by publishing a new one-page monthly "Flash" letter to NAE members.
- g) Follow-up on talks that I have had with the President of NAS for NAE to be given a more significant and a greater role in the NRC so that there is a new concentration of effort on the most important issues affecting America's agenda.
- h) Ensure NAE takes a leadership role with U.S. accrediting boards and professional societies.
- i) Further streamline the NAE organization, and undertake such projects which will make NAE a more effective and responsive Academy to America's technological and research needs.

I will ask the Academy to amend the Bylaws to limit the President to two terms, consistent with other officers; also ask the Academy to amend the Bylaws to receive at least two (2) candidates' names to be placed on the ballot for each officer's position, including the President, and for each Councilor; ask the Academy to establish procedures for a new joint governance of Academy affairs by NAE members and Council; ask approval of the Academy to bestow the title of Emeritus on our past Presidents; invite them to Council meetings, along with elected representatives of the proposed Technical Advisory Council; also, invite various NAE members on a rotating basis to attend the Council meetings so that more of our members will be provided the opportunity for greater involvement and participation.

These are some of the many issues and opportunities facing the NAE -- beginning with the chance to introduce new leadership. We will have a full agenda, but these are crucial and exciting times. I welcome the opportunity to address these and other issues with you as your President of the Academy. The election ballots should be received by you by March 1, 1991. Your vote is important and will determine the future direction and influence of the Academy.
