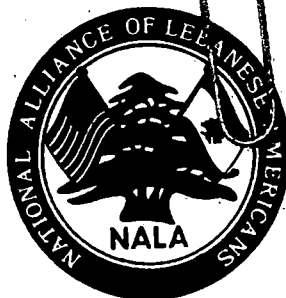

Dear Governor Sununu:

Thank you again for meeting with Representative Lee Daniels and Assemblyman Jim Tallon on the 6th of February.

In response to your request that NCSL develop a reply to the President's block grant proposal, a special meeting of the Steering Committee of the NCSL State-Federal Assembly was convened on February 22nd. Following close consultation with the National Governors' Association, the matter was taken up by the NCSL Executive Committee. As a result of this, we can report to you that a strong consensus has emerged in favor of pursuing legislation granting states more responsibility and authority over state-federal programs by block grant consolidation and regulatory relief.

At its meeting of March 9th, the NCSL executive committee unanimously adopted a policy statement endorsing the concept embodied in the President's budget statement, with some qualifications.

The policy adopted sets forth a set of principles which we believe should govern discussion of block grant consolidation. We believe these principles provide a basis for proceeding to actual development of specific proposals. Our position embraces five salient points:

1. **Program consolidation should be accomplished by the creation of several new block grants to the states.** Block grants should be developed by the consolidation of programs within a broadly defined area, encompassing some commonality of purpose, type of service provided, or clientele served.
2. **The legislation must reduce and streamline existing regulations** (statutory and administrative) associated with the grant programs to be replaced. The block grant must not become encumbered with new regulations and restrictions, and it must be free from earmarks.
3. **The legislation must ensure stable funding** for the new block grant programs created. Future funding should be secured by providing for an automatic adjustment for inflation, and the new block grants must be set outside of the discretionary spending caps.

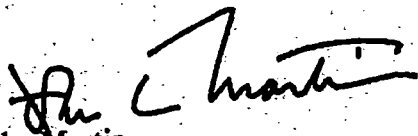
Each consolidation should ensure distributive neutrality among the states. In other words, the new block grants individual states should be "held harmless."

Program selection should be confined to those which are primarily state-federal programs, or those for which states are the primary beneficiaries. Those programs which primarily fund local governments should be excluded from consideration. Pursuant to these principles, NCSL staff has been instructed to work closely with the officers of the relevant committees and with their NGA counterparts to develop individual block grant proposals. To this point, staff has been working to develop 8-10 proposals in the areas of Child Development, Education and Training; Energy and Environment; Agriculture; Transportation; and Criminal Justice. On the basis of the initial staff work, we expect that these programs would total some \$15 to \$20 billion.

We believe that proceeding on the basis of the above principles will be most likely to secure the support of those in the state and local government community, advocacy groups, and, most importantly, among members of Congress that will be necessary to achieve legislative success.

We would like to meet with you to discuss this further, at your earliest possible convenience.

Dear Governor Sununu:

A great deal of water has passed under the bridge since we last spoke in Concord outside your old office in the Executive Council chambers. You've moved on the Washington, and I have to Pennsylvania. The purpose in my writing is to let you know of my support of the administrations' position opposing H.R. 5 and S. 55, legislation which would limit the use of replacement workers during an union strike.

Having been a Personnel Manager for over seven years, and with the experience of a six week strike under my belt, I am very concerned that passage of this bill will disrupt the delicate management/labor balance that exists today in the collective bargaining process. In this process, after numerous negotiating sessions management will submit the best offer it can afford. The union then must decide whether to call a strike so as to gain leverage at the bargaining table. Management's decision to seek replacement workers in that event is a counterbalance, putting teeth in its' final offer. There is substantial risk associated with the outcomes of either decision.

The choice to seek replacement workers does not come easy for management. One must weigh the impact of lost customer base due to the inability to supply product; profitability; the cost of locating suitable replacements as well as the cost of their training and lower productivity incurred during the learning curve; the cost of lost job knowledge in those being replaced; and the intangibles associated with the loss of friendships with co-workers. Very rarely does management seek immediate replacement of strikers. Most often an extended period of time passes before this option is chosen, and it is only after numerous attempts to reach an accord between the parties. President Reagan's quick action in the PATCO strike is not the norm.

Studies by the G.A.O. have shown that only 4% of those involved in recent strike situations have been permanently replaced. And, we must keep in mind that once settlement is reached the strikers do have first recall rights to jobs as they open up.

The option to use replacement workers has been a long standing practice carved out by years of both case law and administrative law decisions, being affirmed by the courts and National Labor Relations Board. Let's not tinker with that now.

In my opinion passage of this legislation would have the following outcomes:

- a.) Management will find it difficult to locate suitable temporary replacements (which will be allowed under the proposal) as they will not be able to guarantee the replacements permanent employment after a settlement is reached. There is no incentive for anyone to seek employment as a replacement;
- b.) There will be no incentive (or counterbalance) for the union to end a strike until they have had their demands fully satisfied or management chooses to close up shop for good;
- c.) There will be a greater propensity for unions to call a strike to force management's hand in collective bargaining.

Whether management succumbs to a strike threat or elects to replace workers temporarily it will result in higher labor costs. In some business segments even the slightest increase in labor cost will render U.S. businesses uncompetitive in worldwide markets. Passage of this bill should serve, in the long term, only to increase the numbers in the ranks of unemployed.

In the event that these bills are adopted into law, the give-and-take process of collective bargaining will be forever out of balance, strictly providing unions with an unfair advantage at the negotiating table. Again, I support your opposition the provisions of this legislation. I look forward to hearing your comments and concerns.

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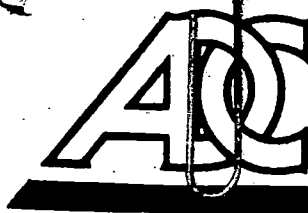

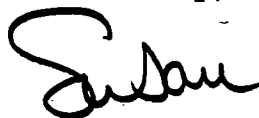
Dear Governor Sununu:

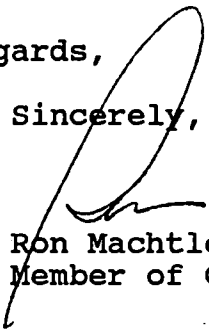

I am writing to request that you call EPA Administrator William Reilly to direct EPA to continue discussions with the wood-preserving industry on a regulation affecting it. I hope that these discussions will achieve a more cost-effective regulation that meets the President's FY 1992 Budget goals, and provide adequate compliance time.

On December 6, 1990, EPA promulgated a final rule for the industry which the President's Budget has identified as the least cost-effective regulation in over 20 years. The regulation's cost per premature death averted, according to the Budget, is \$5.7 trillion. EPA and the industry are currently discussing the implementation issues raised by the final rule, including unreasonable compliance deadlines. It will simply be impossible for most wood-preserving facilities, particularly the many Mom and Pop-size businesses in my state, to meet a June 6, 1991 deadline.

In 1989 and 1990, I was among 150 Members of Congress who strongly urged EPA to regulate the wood preserving industry using an integrated, multi-statute approach. EPA has ignored these Congressional requests and has promulgated a cost-ineffective, RCRA-only regulation that is no more protective of human health and the environment than alternatives proposed by the industry and rejected by the EPA.

Industry-wide capital expenditures for the EPA regulation could be as high as \$5 billion, easily exceeding more than twice the estimated net value of the industry. Most wood preserving businesses have insufficient capital to meet the EPA regulation's costs. EPA's final rule will force a significant number of plant closings within the industry.

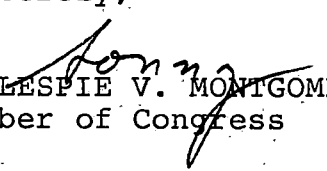

But EPA ignored these requests and came up with a cost-ineffective, RCRA-only regulation. It is no more protective of human health and the environment than alternatives proposed by the industry and rejected by EPA.

Most wood preserving companies don't have the funds to meet the EPA regulation's cost. This final rule, if not changed, will force a large number of plant closings within the industry. All we are asking is for EPA Administrator William Reilly to direct his agency to continue talking to the wood preserving industry with the hope that a more workable regulation can be developed.

Dear Mr. Sununu:

As Members of Congress representing areas where livestock grazing on federal lands is a mainstay of the economy, we are always concerned about legislation that might affect this important activity.

The grazing fee formula established by the Public Rangelands Improvement Act of 1978 (PRIA) adjusts grazing fees upward or downward according to livestock prices, forage values and production costs. When these economic conditions are favorable, the fee goes up. When profitability declines, the fee moves accordingly.

Continuing the current PRIA grazing formula is crucial to maintaining the vitality of western livestock operators and the economies of rural western communities.

The Reagan Administration was a strong defender of the PRIA Formula. In fact, President Reagan signed an Executive Order on February 14, 1986, which reestablished the PRIA Formula.

Unfortunately, the PRIA Formula is consistently under attack by Democrats in Congress outside the West. In fact, the House Subcommittee on National Parks and Public Lands will hold a hearing on grazing fee bills by Congressmen Darden and Synar that would be quite disruptive to western livestock communities by dramatically increasing grazing fees.

The Departments of Agriculture and Interior have both been requested to testify at that hearing and their testimony will be greatly affecting our ability to defend the PRIA Formula during the 102nd Congress.

Although both Departments were solidly in favor of our position on similar bills at a House hearing on April 11, 1989, their position was greatly weakened after it was reviewed by OMB. Needless to say, this was a great disappointment to Western Republicans, like us, who have been among the strongest supporters of the Administration's legislative agenda.

It's been some time since we talked last. Now, instead of a long overdue congratulations for being selected as Chief of Staff, I can't resist offering congratulations for the spectacular performance from the White House on every front. I know you must be riding high with how the President and you guys have come through this Iraq crisis.

With the release of DOE's National Energy Strategy, silly season for energy weanies is under way. Thought you might find the attached report we've just finished of interest and possible help. I have created a new word, "ecowatts" to counter that hoary Lovins term "negawatts." My friend Peter Huber covered the notion in his *Forbes* column I had forwarded to Nick Calio last month.

This report concludes something I know you are familiar with -- using more electricity will save energy and cut pollution. I focused on carbon dioxide, without prejudice towards my jaundiced opinion of global warming, frankly to grab attention. The report really speaks to the leveraged role that technology progress (which is electrically biased) has on improving the economy and the environment. Among the tidbits from the Executive Summary:

- U.S. coal consumption is 380 million tons/yr higher today compared to 1973, while carbon dioxide emissions per \$GNP have dropped from 4 pounds to 2.3 pounds;
- The above happened largely because of electrification; nuclear power and auto fuel efficiency account for only 12% and 11% respectively of the improved energy/carbon efficiency since 1973.

As the debate is engaged on the NES, I would be happy to find constructive ways to help the Administration.

Meanwhile, it would give me pleasure to get caught up with you over lunch or breakfast sometime.

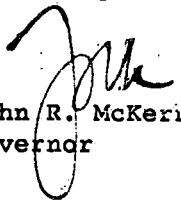

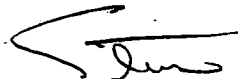

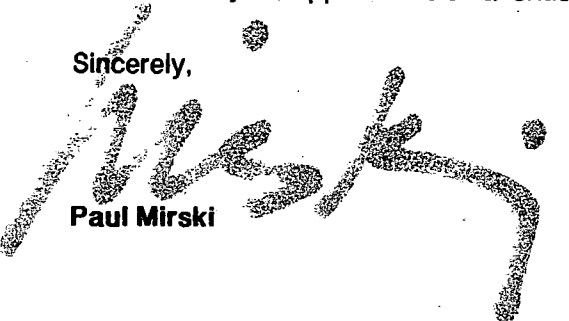
The U.S. Corps of engineers is persently soliciting design contractors to provide reconstruction design services in Kuwait. The threshold size for firm involvement is 110 employees. This effectively means that virtually no design firm in Northern New England, not to mention any other moderately populated part of the country, will have the opportunity to offer services for this effort - regardless of skill or ability to perform.

Restoration and rehabilitation services are typically provided by highly specialized smaller firms which typically have very small staffs. Even large firms usually only have a few rehabilitation specialists on staff because the majority of architects usually prefer to build new rather than rehabilitate.

At any rate, the U.S. may find that the current Corps policy, by its' exclusion of the majority of U.S. rehabilitation specialists, will not serve the interests of the people of Kuwait very well. Because so many billions of dollars are involved, the Corps policy of focusing the financial benefit of the work on just a handful of U.S. consultants has the potential to result in the charge that the policy is politically motivated and corrupt. Media pundits will soon begin wonder if the war was fought primarily for Bechtel's benefit and for the benefit of large consulting firms. Since the construction industry has, in general, a worse record of corruption than the aerospace industry, hyperbole and speculation has the potential to run rampant.

The work which needs to be done must be initiated quickly. It will require a coordinating unbrella. It is however in the State of Kuwait's interest and in the interest of the U.S. to see that the best skills available are applied in the most efficient way possible. It would be a shame to see the benefits of this great victory diminished by the appearance of favoritism and scandal.

As chairman of the Western Governors' Association, I want to express our appreciation for the willingness of the Bush Administration to work with the western states on critical waste management issues.

I need not tell you about the increasing conflict which exists between western states and the federal government over such issues as the cleanup of federal facilities in the region, high level radioactive waste siting, compensation to states for hosting facilities, and generally poor communication and coordination among governors and cabinet secretaries. I believe the meeting and discussions three other western governors and I had with Administrator Reilly and White House and OMB officials last September were a positive step toward formalizing a western states/federal agency dialogue and resolving our differences on critical issues.

In order to continue this dialogue, I propose a meeting with you, other appropriate federal officials and the WGA waste management task force on May 20 or 21, 1991, in Washington, D.C. The WGA task force (now consisting of Governors Norm Bangerter, Bob Miller, Bruce King, Booth Gardner, Roy Romer, Barbara Roberts, Cecil Andrus, and myself) can be an effective mechanism in resolving policy issues, executing agreements in principal, setting priorities for federal actions in the West, and reviewing federal/state progress.

I have followed with great interest and regret, the recent developments concerning federal facility cleanup and federal waste storage in Washington, California, Colorado, New Mexico, and Idaho. It is clear that current negotiated agreements are not being implemented in a satisfactory manner due to technological problems, regulatory obstacles, or federal budget realities. Thus, I propose as the first and primary order of business at our May at

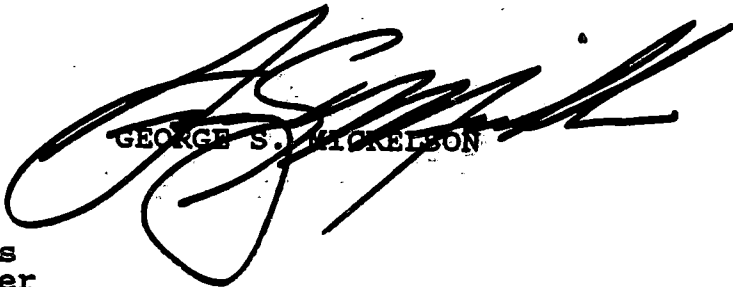
meeting that we address the issues of making state agreements with federal agencies more workable, including the issues of state oversight of federal cleanup efforts and enforcement accountability provisions.

Clearly, we must design a basic structure for those agreements such that they are comprehensive, realistic in terms of setting priorities, enforceable, and well funded. I don't know if that is possible within the executive branch alone, but I am determined to try because the rewards for the states, not to mention the federal agencies, would be significant.

I believe the issue of negotiated agreements is a timely one. Other issues we will want to discuss relate to Resource Conservation and Recovery Act reauthorization--state authority to levy higher fees for managing out-of-state waste and mining waste regulations. We will invite Department of Defense Secretary Cheney (if available), Nuclear Regulatory Commission Chairman Kenneth Carr, Environmental Protection Agency Administrator Bill Reilly, as well as selected White House and Office of Management and Budget officials. Our staffs could begin to prepare for the meeting, immediately, if you and your colleagues agree.

I will have my staff contact your office, soon, to confirm the meeting date and our agenda. Together, I believe we can continue to make progress on resolving our waste management problems, and appreciate your cooperation.

I also feel that Gary Blumenthal can be of assistance in causing that type of situation to be avoided.

Should he be selected for this job, and should I be confirmed as the Secretary of Agriculture, it would be helpful to me if Gary could remain at the Department for a period of time sufficient to assist us in an orderly transition.

Knowing the demands on your time, I will keep this brief and will add only that I think this is a very professional and well qualified young man.

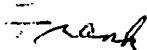
Wish I had been able to contact you while you were in this area. Called your Salem residence but you had already left for Pease Air Base.

I am writing to bring to your attention a matter of which I was just recently made aware; one in which I am hopeful you will be able to provide some assistance.

As you may know, General Alfred M. Gray, Commandant of the Marine Corps, is scheduled to retire on June 30, 1991. Several of my colleagues and I have written letters to the President on behalf of General Gray asking that he reconsider this retirement and reappoint General Gray to serve as Commandant of the Marine Corps for an additional two year term or for any period of time that he believed to be most appropriate and necessary. We felt this to be an important request as General Gray's retirement at such a critical juncture in our involvement in Operation Desert Storm would be both damaging to the morale of our troops and detrimental to the effective resolution of this conflict.

Unfortunately, the only response that we have received from the White House has been a form letter from Fred McClure at the Office of Legislative Affairs. I have enclosed a copy of this letter for your information. As you may ascertain from reading this letter, Mr. McClure has not referred our letters to the President but rather deferred them to the Secretary of Defense.

I am in no way questioning the abilities of the Secretary of Defense in relation to this matter; in this I have the utmost confidence. However, I am troubled by the fact that our letters may have never reached the President or even been brought to his attention.

John, I understand that the President is unable to see every letter addressed to him, even those from Members of Congress. However, the final decision as to the appointment and reappointment of the Commandant does lie in his hands. I have no doubt that the President will heed the advice of both yourself and Dick Cheney on this matter, but in the end, it is the President's final decision and I believe it is very important that he is aware of our profound interest and concern in this matter.

Dear John:

The BALTIC REPUBLIC LEGAL CONFERENCE concluded in Dallas today. The group (29 of them) will be here until next week. We were happy to have Mavriks Vulfson here to address the group. He talked quite a long time with Vid Beldavz of the Hudson Institute (Indianapolis) and is taking much material back to Mr. Gorbachev concerning plans formulated to get the Baltic Republics off on the right foot. Plans for a BALTIC REPUBLIC SUMMIT meeting in Dallas for Sept. or Oct. 1991 are progressing. The final plan will be announced in Dallas, then the group is scheduled to go to Moscow.

I had a very unhappy experience with the Secret Service in Dallas. Three of the gentlemen from Latvia wanted some information as to how to go about protecting government officials. I naturally thought that the Secret Service would be the ones to ask. This was a very sudden and unplanned item since it did not involve law. I called the Secret Service in Dallas and talked with an agent who said his name was O'Neal. He said that they "didn't do anything like that since it was like taking someone in from off the street". The head of the Dallas Police Department Intelligence unit listened to my story. He asked me to call back the next morning and he would have it scheduled. I have no doubts that he did some thorough checking in the meantime. We not only had a very fine meeting, they were asked to come back next week and they would be shown the tactical and riot units, vans and equipment etc.. The guests were delighted. The three guests were:

Peteris Bormane, husband of one of the attorneys, who is active in organizing the police dept. in Latvia along lines of those in the free world. His wife is helping draft the Constitution for Latvia. also the laws.

Gvido Romeiko, attorney, Tax Law and Joint Venture Registration . Latvian Republic Ministry of Finance. We are in almost daily contact with his wife, who is also an attorney.

She is the one who informed us about the assassination attempt on the life of Boris Yeltsin last January 14th. She, in turn, is in daily contact with the other two Baltic States.

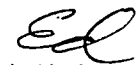
Ronalds Vansovics: Justice, Supreme Court of Latvia.

John, we have always been very supportive of the Secret Service. We have met with many of those who have been assigned to George Jr.'s house at 6029 Northwood. Steve, my son who sold his house at 6106 Northwood in order to go to Latvia to teach law at the University, even offered the Secret Service men who were sitting in a car in the driveway next door the key to his house so if nature called the facilities would not be very far from the post. And we gave the agent the license plate numbers of vehicles that would be frequenting the area (two cars had New Jersey license plates for a time). This was done to make their job easier. Then to be told that we were "somewhat like people coming off the street" is insulting and idiotic on the part of the Secret Service. The guy didn't have one lick of common sense.

~~I hope you will let the agent in charge of the Dallas office know how I feel about it. I have not told anyone else about the situation because the Dallas Police Department has handled it with dispatch and with efficiency. I refuse to have less respect for the Secret Service because of one entoproctous agent. A "HAMAAR" as we say in Lebanese.~~

In the meantime, if you are interested in getting reports from time to time about the Baltics I would be happy to oblige. Otherwise I won't clutter up your mail.

P.S. Mavriks Vulfson, a Holocaust survivor and a member of both the Soviet and Latvian Parliaments has become an avid voice for Latvian independence, even though he has been a Communist for 50 years. By now the President has received the proclamation from the City Council of the City of Dallas in regards to getting Gorbachev to return Latvia (and the Baltics) to the 1938 status. I was the one who put the 1938 date in there. I did it to preclude any doubt as to which status we wanted. It also states this to be done by negotiation, which is precisely what Vulfson wants. The Baltics should have been set free at the same time that Eastern Europe regained it's freedom.

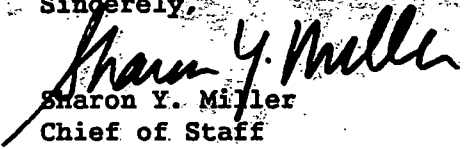

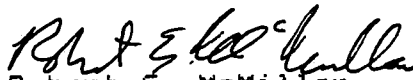
Subject: Locating Human Occupied Bunkers, one thought

This is an amplification of one point in a letter mailed to you on 13 February, 1991: BUNKERS MUST EXHALE. Exiting ventilation air will be enriched with human produced CO_2 and H_2O , plus any additional such products from cooking or other processes which may occur in the living spaces. It is possible that the cool nights may permit the water vapor to condense as liquid, which might encourage the growth of desert plants. Such plants may also be able to extract water from the air. Given that many of these installations have been in place for up to six months, is it possible that a small patch of flora would be observable near such exits?

If patches of vegetation occur, if they can be detected, and if they can be distinguished from other naturally occurring vegetation in recon photos, bunker location and neutralization can proceed.

It has occurred to this writer that he may be addressing an already solved problem, and that for reasons of security this fact should not be revealed to him. Please bear with these submissions. Alas, he is not yet out of comments on the subject of bunker location which may turn out to be a problem for our soldiers.

Keep reading about you and wonder, at times, if this is the same guy that I know. The press has always been very impartial, in their opinion.

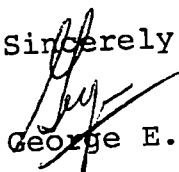

With no further introductory remarks or apology:

1. Continuing from item (6) of ref. (1) (interpreting explosive wave refraction/reflection as modified by Bunkers), quick and dirty techniques could include sequencing explosive charges (by artillery or air) in a line behind suspected Bunkers. A line of buried microphones may be able to detect diminished transmission from one or more of the explosions thus providing lines-of-position of obstructions: Cavities, etc. This presumes deep-down sand will be packed enough to transmit sufficient sound.

2. BUNKERS MUST EXHALE

Any non-sealed cavity will inhale and exhale with changing atmospheric pressure. If humans are present, it is also necessary to exhale human metabolic end products such as CO_2 , H_2O , CH_4 , NH_3 , NH_4OH , and perhaps some phosphorus compounds. This will increase the total volume of exhaust. Each human consumes about 0.8 Cu. Ft. of air each hour, being furnished with approximately 4 cu. ft. of air. a similar exit volume will contain about 1 cu ft of combined carbon dioxide and water vapor per man.

A. For human Occupancy:

There may be many ways to detect a bubble or stream of carbon dioxide, water, etc. Atmospheric scientists are very interested in low concentrations of methane and carbon dioxide, hence they may have a useful input. Without their input let us pursue carbon dioxide as a detectable substance. CO_2 lasers can produce tight beams of very high energy radiation at a wavelength of 10.5 microns. if this powerful beam can stimulate the escaping CO_2 to re-radiate this frequency it can perhaps be remotely detected from air, satellite or elevated

Dear John:

I recently noticed that the Comptroller of the Currency, as well as the Federal Reserve, may be in charge of the financial affairs for all institutions down-the-road. First and foremost, your mandate is my mandate, and the President's mandate is my mandate -- I will support both of you. But quite frankly, let me give you my opinion regarding the Comptroller of the Currency.

John, about three years ago, the General Accounting Office did not rate the Comptroller's office very highly regarding the total overall operation of the agency; therefore, I do think that when these new laws are enacted (and some of them certainly have merit regarding bank changes) we must have an overall look at the entire procedure and treat it like a double-edged sword. By that I mean, if we are to enact laws and regulations, then we must have the best people in government regulating these various inputs. When you were chosen Chief of Staff, I thought that was wonderful because you have the education and intelligence to deal with this position. Now what we have to do is foster that same program all the way through government and get the top people involved.

I am behind the Comptroller of the Currency, although I do not like him, only because my dear friend, President Bush, is promoting him for another five-year term. I have always said that this administration's mandate is my mandate because I am a team player-- but, honestly, the Comptroller of the Currency, Mr. Clarke, is inept for this job; therefore, with fundamental changes in the banking system, we need fundamental changes within the regulatory system by our government. We must seek the best possible people. I have been in the banking business for thirty years and there is not one person in the Comptroller's office that I would hire. This is not "sour grapes". This year our bank is the leader in the industry for earnings on equity of 37%, and earnings on assets of 2.41%. Compare these figures with other banks and you will see we are at the top of the earning spectrum of all banks in this great country -- so, I believe I speak with some authority. It is not because of me. We have outstanding individuals working at this institution. We need the same thing in government. We need more banking changes, but we also need some changes on the other side of the sword. We need bright, intelligent people regulating the industry, focusing on the betterment of the industry for the future.

The Comptroller's office is surly, uninformed, and ignorant -- everything rolled up into one that is bad. In my opinion this has to be condoned from the top down -- not from the bottom up.

I swore I would never give the White House bad information, or anything other than "thumbs up" -- and I will not from here on in -- but I have to rely on you to get the message out that the Comptroller's office will be unable to cope with these sweeping changes. Believe me, if it were not true, I would not put it in writing.

John, I could have gone before either the Senate or Congressional Banking Committee, but I would not do that because of my loyalty to the President. If I were to let loose on the Comptroller's Office, it would make headlines. I would never do that to this administration. Anyway, I think you should watch this office very closely.

Before I close, let me say that I wish we could have included 20 or 30 of the large bonding companies as a safety net with the FDIC insurance. In other words, the government could have taken on 50% of the liabilities and the large bonding companies could have taken on the other 50%, limiting out to \$200,000.00. But I will support whatever this administration wants to do. I am a very small player in the overall field, but I have had experience -- and good experience in banking. I just want my President to fare well and be re-elected.

In the meantime, take care. I think you are great! We need about 250 more JOHN SUNUNUS in high places in government. It goes without saying, if I can be of service to you in any way, do not hesitate to let me know.

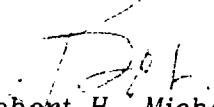
Dear John:

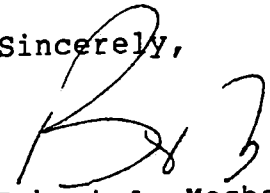

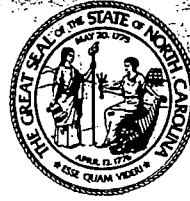
