My dear John:

As one of your friends and admirers, I am appalled at the attacks being made upon you by persons of expediency in politics and in the press.

Here is a suggestion, John, if I may be presumptuous enough to offer these thoughts:

- 1) The President should issue another statement that it is absolutely essential that his Chief of Staff have access to secured telephone service, no matter where he is at any time.
- 2) Please consider departing from use of a Gulfstream 3, and using one of the military's Sabre '65's.

With the Sabre jet there is still passenger space for nine persons and there is no government requirement of a cabin attendant, saving that expense. More importantly, a Sabre jet consumes 230 gallons of fuel per hour, whereas the Gulfstream requires 466 gallons over the same time. Further, the Sabre jet costs about \$5 million versus \$11-15 million for the Gulfstream. Also, it costs \$1,393 an hour to operate the Gulfstream and only one-half of that amount for the Sabre jet. While the range of the Sabre is not as great as the 3,500 miles of the Gulfstream, certainly 2,300 nautical miles is sufficient for your purposes.

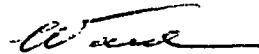

Dear Governor Sununu:

I hope that by the time this letter reaches you, the press will be taking a breather or have found something else to write about. I have spoken to Tom Corcoran several times to see what we could do (or not do) to bring things to a conclusion.

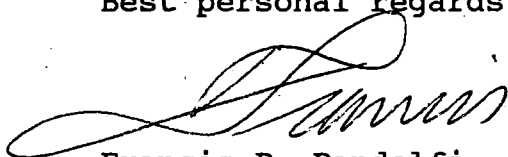

I also discussed with you a program we were creating to contribute funds to environmental educational efforts. You recommended that we not focus 100% on contributing to government programs and we have also followed that advice. During the first year, we will put 50% of our funds into the National Environmental Education and Training Foundation and the other 50% into some university programs which have impressed us. We will evaluate the effectiveness of the Foundation after one year.

With respect to our quarterly environmental editorials which run in our full 10 million print run, I'm enclosing the latest which was written in part by Michael Deland. The next editorial will be in the July issues and recommends reader support for the President's environmental and recreational initiatives in the 1992 budget.

Joyce and I had a nice week with our family in Beaver Creek in March. Great snow! We hope to ski with you, Nancy, Tom and Daphne again in December, perhaps in a low visibility situation!

Dear John:

The February trade statistics recently announced by the Commerce Department are encouraging. The significant overall trade imbalance that the U.S. has had with the rest of the world is gradually being reduced.

Unfortunately, progress on the trade deficit reduction is agonizingly slow and the Japanese continue to exploit the U.S. market while frustrating access to their populace.

There has been some confusion regarding the Japanese trade performance in the automotive sector. It is important to note that, while the VRA/VER has dealt largely with cars, the combined Japanese car and truck volume exported to the United States generally has exceeded the Japanese voluntary export restraints. The addition of the Japanese transplant units, which have high levels of Japanese content, further aggravates the trade imbalance between the two countries (Attachment I).

The dollar value of Japanese exports of automobiles and parts to the United States remains high (Attachment II) because the Japanese have only slightly reduced their vehicle shipments to the U.S. in spite of significant Japanese vehicle assembly in this country; have substantially increased parts shipments to the U.S. to service their assembly plants here; and have sourced the

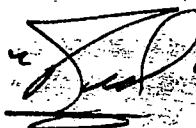

assembly of the lower value, small cars and trucks to the U.S. while retaining assembly of the high content vehicles in Japan. Their substantial automotive exports are not offset by vehicle or parts imports into Japan, resulting in an automotive trade deficit about equivalent to the value of their exports.

The Japanese have utilized and continue to utilize their automotive industry as one of the major engines of their economic growth. They are exporting to the rest of the world about one-half of their automobile production and have frustrated access to their market by the non-Japanese producers of the world. The automotive trade asymmetry that the Japanese have created is startling and not confined to the U.S. While they sell significant volume outside of Japan, non-Japanese producers sell a small volume of units in the Japanese market (Attachment III).

I continue to believe that the Japanese must assume a larger burden in maintaining a healthy world trade system. That obligation should extend to rectifying and preventing significant and chronic trade imbalances such as have existed between the U.S. and Japan. We should hold the Japanese to a commitment to cooperate with the United States to reduce quickly and progressively the U.S./Japan trade imbalance. I would suggest a \$5-10 billion deficit with Japan would be a good interim target. We only have a \$7.5 billion deficit with our largest trading partner, Canada, and we run a trade surplus with Western Europe.

Dear John:

Should we cut the Social Security tax? Yes...but only if we *save and invest the refund*.

Senator Daniel Patrick Moynihan's plan to cut the tax and prevent the Congress from squandering the Social Security Trust Fund reserves is a step in the right direction. I've proposed a better solution: cut the Social Security tax, but refund this cut into individual retirement accounts for every American worker.

Under legislation I've introduced (H.R. 1647), workers would continue to be paid the same as they are now, but a portion of their Social Security taxes (1% each from the worker and the employer), instead of being sent to the Social Security Trust Fund, would be paid into the workers' individual investment accounts similar to IRAs. I call them Individual Social Security Retirement Accounts (ISSRAs), and as you may recall, we had an opportunity to meet and discuss a similar proposal I made last year which garnered widespread support both from media and investment professionals.

I have enclosed materials that explain my proposal in greater detail, including a copy of H.R. 1647 and an op-ed that will soon run in the *Chicago Tribune*.

John, I hope to gain the Administration's support for H.R. 1647, and would appreciate your review of this legislation. I believe that the ISSRA plan is superior to Sen. Moynihan's proposal, and is also superior to proposals which call for simply cutting the payroll tax without making any provision for savings. The millions of ISSRAs which would be created not only compliments the President's goal of increasing national savings, but would also help end our dependence on foreign capital.

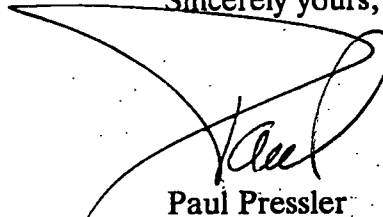

Dear Mr. Sununu:

The International Trade Commission has recommended that the import quota on raw peanuts be increased. The Commissioners had widely varying opinions, with one not favoring any imports.

The request for this increase in import quota was filed last fall by the Peanut Butter and Nut Salters Association. This is an association whose members manufacture approximately 20% of the peanut products in the United States. The large peanut product manufacturers have not supported the increase in import quota, and, in fact, even the petitioning association has members who oppose the petition.

Since the petition was filed and even since the hearing by the International Trade Commission, the United States peanut supply/demand picture as well as the 1990 crop data has become much clearer. The crop is larger than originally thought. The supply in the hands of manufacturers, shellers, and the Commodity Credit Corporation is larger than some thought, and the demand is lower. All of these statements can and have been verified in data we have submitted to the Department of Agriculture. Of course, that data is available to you if you want it.

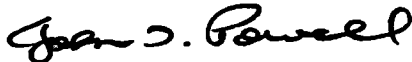
Because there is no shortage of peanuts in the United States, imports will displace U.S. peanuts causing significant loss to the Commodity Credit Corporation. We estimate a cost of \$28,000,000 per 100,000,000 pounds of imports. For the last eight years, the peanut program has cost the government virtually nothing. Allowing imports would change that dramatically.

It is not possible to adequately identify the country of original origin of imported peanuts. Consequently, if large quantities of imports are allowed, it is highly likely that peanuts from prohibited origins will be relabeled and will enter the United States. The consequence would be to introduce diseases from these prohibited countries that have been successfully kept out of the United States in the past.

We respectfully urge you to keep the import quota on peanuts at its present level. Increases are clearly not needed and significant imports will increase government costs and contaminate the United States seed supply.

I am writing to request that you call EPA Administrator William Reilly to direct EPA to continue to discuss with the wood preserving industry a regulation affecting it. I hope that these discussions will achieve a more cost effective regulation that meets the President's FY 1992 Budget goals and provide adequate compliance time.

On December 6, 1990, EPA promulgated a final rule for the industry which the President's Budget has identified as the least cost effective regulation promulgated in over 20 years. The regulation's cost per premature death averted, according to the Budget, is \$5.7 trillion. EPA and the industry are currently discussing implementation issues raised by the final rule including unreasonable compliance deadlines. It will simply be impossible for most wood preserving facilities to meet a June 6, 1991 deadline.

In 1989 and 1990, I was among 150 Members of Congress who strongly urged EPA to regulate the wood preserving industry using an integrated, multi-statute approach. EPA has ignored these Congressional requests and has promulgated a cost-ineffective, RCRA-only regulation that is no more protective of human health and the environment than alternatives proposed by the industry and rejected by EPA.

Industry-wide capital expenditures for the EPA regulation could be as high as \$5 billion, easily exceeding more than twice the estimated net value of the industry. Most wood preserving companies have insufficient capital to meet the EPA regulation's costs. EPA's final rule will force a significant number of plant closings within the industry.

EPA has been made keenly aware of the potential economic harm that could result from its actions and has acknowledged

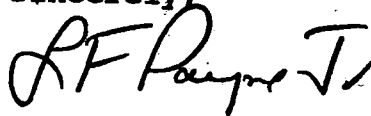

I was pleased to attend the media briefing by The Points of Light Foundation at the White House on Tuesday, March 19. It is a marvelous, well planned effort of immense national significance and our group of stations, located in the small towns of America's heartland, intend to join in this effort and make a difference. I am attaching a memo which went out to our stations today.

I hope you will not think me an opportunist, however, if I bring to your attention the problems our stations are having in continuing our public service role.

As network affiliates in our communities, we have always taken our obligations as licensees, and more importantly, as responsible American businessmen very, very seriously. I guess that's typical of those of us who live in small towns. We fly flags, tie ribbons on trees, and go to church on Sundays. And we run our television stations the same way. We don't hesitate to cancel our most lucrative commercial programs to welcome home a 747 full of troops landing at Fort Benning, or to carry a Presidential address in prime time, which means our late news is going to get pushed back past bedtime in our towns. People in government have come to expect that we will always be there when we're needed for a "Points of Light" campaign or whatever comes next.

But I want to tell you, Governor, that if the forces affecting free, over-the-air network broadcasters continue as they are now heading, that's not the way it's going to be. The local cable company picks up our programs for free and sells them to my local viewers and then uses those subscriber fees to buy the rights to better programs to attract more of my viewers. The PBS station runs its best movie when we have a state of the Union address, with assurance that the FCC makes allowances for that. The local independent station does not carry the President's speech, nor any news or public affairs. He's an "emerging industry" and so the FCC lowers the standard for him. I can't even fuss at our networks about the poor programs they send us. It's pretty hard to be mad with a man who just reported a \$150 million loss for the fourth quarter. Congress wants political ads on a "first class seat at coach fare" basis; the FCC is so enamored with Hollywood that protecting their financial interest seems more important than a communications policy which makes sense; and Ray Chambers needs us to help with a very important and worthwhile effort.

He's going to get our cooperation, all we can do, with enthusiasm and vigor. I just hope that when the next initiative comes, there will still be an effective television system out here to help.

Please don't think me unappreciative of the opportunity to do something good. But please don't let the Administration overlook the serious trouble in which the television industry now finds itself.

Dear Governor Sununu:

On December 6, 1990, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) published a final regulation in the Federal Register governing how the wood preserving industry handles hazardous wastes from its operations.

I note that the regulation in question has been identified in the President's own budget as the least cost-effective regulation of those listed. The regulation's cost is more than \$5 trillion per premature death prevented (for regulating wood preserving chemicals as hazardous wastes). I have enclosed the relevant table from the President's FY92 budget setting forth the risks and cost-effectiveness of selected agency regulations, including those associated with the regulation imposed on the wood preserving industry (highlighted).

The industry points out that most wood preserving companies have insufficient capital to meet the costs of complying with the EPA regulation by the June 1991 compliance deadline and that, as a result, the regulation will force a significant number of plant closings within the industry.

In an attempt to forestall such a scenario, representatives of the wood preserving industry have been meeting with EPA officials to negotiate a more reasonable and cost-effective regulation, but to no avail.

It is outrageous, when the Administration's own budget analysts show the regulation costs so exceed the benefits, that the EPA has thus far been unwilling to resolve this in a manner which is not only consistent with our environmental goals but also takes into account legitimate industry concerns.

I urge you to encourage EPA to work diligently with representatives of the wood preserving industry to arrive at a more cost-effective regulation with adequate compliance time.

Thank you for your attention to this matter.

Dear Governor Sununu:

I am writing you about a new Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) regulation affecting the wood preserving industry.

On December 6, 1990, the EPA promulgated a final rule listing as hazardous three categories of waste from wood preserving operations. As I understand it, your fiscal year 1992 budget estimates that the regulation's cost per premature death averted is \$5.7 trillion, making it the least cost-effective regulation issued in at least twenty years. The EPA has set a compliance deadline of June 6, 1991.

With the high cost of compliance, many small wood preservers are going to be forced out of business if required to meet the new standards in only six months. In fact, EPA has estimated that 25% of the industry will shut down as a result of the new listing, in which case most of these businesses would qualify as Superfund sites.

I support efforts to protect the environment and ensure good public health. Given the high cost and low health risk associated with this regulation, however, I believe that an extension of the compliance deadline is warranted in this case and could lead to a more reasonable and effective standard. I hope that you will work with EPA Administrator Reilly on this matter and that you will give every consideration to a possible extension.

Dear Governor Sununu:

I am writing to request that you contact the Administrator of the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), William K. Reilly to urge the EPA to continue discussions with the wood preserving industry on a regulation affecting it. I hope that these discussions will achieve a more cost effective regulation that will meet the President's FY 1992 budget goals and provide adequate compliance time.

On December 6, 1990, EPA promulgated a final rule for the wood preserving industry which the President's budget has identified as the least cost effective regulation. The regulation's cost per premature death averted, according to the budget, is \$5.7 trillion. EPA and the industry are currently discussing implementation issues raised by the final rule including unreasonable compliance deadlines. It will simply be impossible for most wood preserving facilities to meet a June 6, 1991, deadline.

In 1989 and 1990, I was among 150 members of Congress who strongly urged EPA to regulate the wood preserving industry using an integrated, multi-statute approach. EPA has ignored these requests and has promulgated a cost-ineffective, RCRA-only regulation that is no more protective of human health and the environment than alternatives by the industry that were rejected by EPA.

Industry-wide capital expenditures for the EPA regulation could be as high as \$5 billion, easily exceeding more than twice the estimated net value of the industry. Most wood preserving companies have insufficient capital to meet the EPA regulation's costs. EPA's final rule will force a significant number of plant closings within the industry.

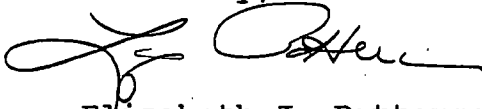
EPA has been told of the potential economic harm that could result in its actions and has acknowledged that some of the

rule's negative effects were not intended. In this vein, EPA should work diligently to address the wood preserving industry's legitimate concerns.

Again, I appreciate your immediate attention to this issue which affects many of my constituents.

Dear Dr. Sununu:

I would like to invite you to participate in the National Academy of Sciences Colloquium on Industrial Ecology. The colloquium will be held on May 20 and 21, 1991, at the National Academy of Sciences building in Washington, DC. Attendance will be by invitation only, and will be limited to about 70 people.

Let me tell you what we are trying to accomplish, so you can see where your expertise fits in and why we very much hope that you will attend.

We believe that *Industrial Ecology* is an emerging concept and is likely to become a new field of scientific endeavor in this decade. Industrial Ecology is a systems view of industrial operations in which the total materials cycle — from virgin material, to finished material, to component, to product, to waste product, and to ultimate disposal — is optimized. In Industrial Ecology an industrial system is viewed not in isolation from its surrounding systems, but in concert with them. Industrial Ecology is a proactive, rather than reactive, approach to the environment.

The purpose of this colloquium is (1) to define the field of Industrial Ecology; (2) to delineate important issues and problems that need to be addressed; (3) to identify leaders and to coalesce thinking in the field; (4) to understand the disciplines encompassed by this field; and (5) to determine what further action is warranted by academia and industry to ensure that this nascent field prospers.

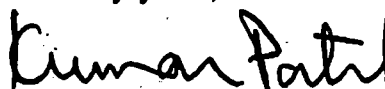
This Colloquium on Industrial Ecology is the first in a new series of symposia held under the aegis of the National Academy of Sciences. The format we envision includes about fifteen 30-minute talks and ample periods of discussion. We are counting on the invited attendees to contribute greatly to the discussion periods. I have enclosed a preliminary program so you can get a feel for the areas we are trying to address.

The 70 participants have been selected to provide balanced representation from academia, industry, and government. We feel that it is essential that high-level technical people (ecologists, chemists, materials scientists) be brought together with environmental economists, regulators, and lawyers, and that senior educators also be involved.

In hopes that you will be able to attend the Conference, I have enclosed registration material. Please plan to register as soon as possible, and certainly before April 1, 1991.

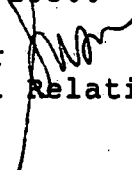

I am contacting you relative to implementation of an EPA regulation that will devastate the wood preserving industry. On December 6, 1990, EPA promulgated a final rule for the industry which the President's budget has identified as the least cost effective regulation in over 20 years. The regulation's cost per premature death averted, according to the budget, is \$5.7 trillion. Furthermore, it will simply be impossible for most wood preserving facilities to meet the required June 6, 1991 deadline. EPA and the industry are currently discussing implementation issues raised by this final rule including the unreasonable compliance deadlines.

I would appreciate you contacting Secretary William Reilly directing EPA to continue discussions with the industry. It is my hope that such discussions may achieve a more cost effective regulation that meets the President's FY 1992 budget goals while providing adequate time for compliance. This is an important industry in my district, a district that lost nearly 6,000 jobs in January alone. We cannot afford the negative impact of this rule.

In 1989 and 1990, I was among 150 Members of Congress who strongly urged EPA to regulate the wood preserving industry using an integrated, multi-statute approach. EPA has ignored these Congressional requests and has promulgated a cost ineffective, RCRA-only regulation that is no more protective of human health and the environment than are alternatives proposed by the industry and which EPA has rejected.

Industry wide capital expenditures for the EPA regulation could be as high as \$5 billion. This is twice the net value of the industry and will effectively shut it down. As most wood preserving plants have insufficient capital to meet the costs of the EPA regulation, a significant number of plants will have no option but to close. This impact is hardly in

line with the President's expressed objectives of American economic expansion and enhanced competitive strength.

Thank you for taking the time to meet with us. Since we met, a number of encouraging things have happened. Most important is the successful conclusion of the Gulf war. Congratulations on a well-planned, well-executed campaign. It was a first-class effort that resulted in a renewed self-confidence for America and deserves all of our thanks.

Also, we are encouraged by Administration actions in a number of areas that we discussed, including the actions of federal banking regulators to reduce the reluctance of banks to lend, NHTSA Administrator Curry's strong CAFE statement at the Senate Energy Committee hearing and a recent meeting called by EPA officials to discuss industry concerns about Clean Air Act implementation. We appreciate the Administration's support on these issues and your interest in the state of the auto industry.

I continue to be concerned about the U.S.-Japan bilateral trade deficit. The 1990 U.S.-Japan trade imbalance of \$41 billion represents 40 percent of the total U.S. trade deficit and about 70 percent is automotive. This is not in the best interest of the United States, Japan or the global trading system.

Japanese producers seem insensitive to U.S. market conditions, which for autos are at their lowest point since 1982. The number of foreign cars at U.S. ports is running at twice normal levels. Japanese transplant facilities have continued to produce thousands of cars for which there are no present buyers. For example, press reports indicate that Toyota has nearly 5,000 cars stored at its Georgetown, Kentucky facility. Also, the transplants plan to increase North American assembly capacity more than 20 percent by 1992.

By contrast, the Japanese government recently asked vehicle producers to exercise restraint in shipments to Western Europe because of the sensitivity of negotiations on access to the European market.

Meanwhile, the Japanese domestic car and truck market remains essentially closed to outsiders. It provides a sanctuary for Japanese companies that assures a profitable volume market and protects them from the full force of competition. Regulatory and administrative practices also have been used as barriers to entry. The Japanese also have capitalized on all export trade opportunities to foster economic growth with minimal domestic disruption. The consistently undervalued yen has supported these policies.

I'd like to offer a personal perspective based on years of extensive business dealings with major Japanese companies. During those dealings, I have observed that Japanese institutions continually test the people they are negotiating with to assess just how important an issue is to the other party. Unless you are clear and insistent about your position, they assume they have a "green light" to pursue their goals. However, when we have been firm in our position, the Japanese respect it and eventually work toward that end.

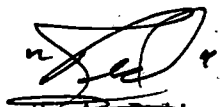
Also, our experience indicates that the Japanese respond best to firm signals rather than ultimatums. They prefer that less-senior officials privately work out basic positions to avoid any loss of face at the senior level.

As you suggested, we plan to carefully consider actions the auto industry can take under U.S. trade law. But absent a strong signal that the United States will no longer tolerate a chronically-high bilateral deficit, Japan will continue to expand exports to the United States while restricting market access for imports.

I believe the United States should adopt a long range results-oriented trade policy to address the chronic U.S.-Japan bilateral trade deficit. I would recommend privately and informally giving the Japanese a specific timetable -- perhaps five years -- for reducing the trade deficit to a reasonable level and then maintaining it within \$5 to \$10 billion either way on an ongoing basis. Benchmarks should be established for measuring progress along the way. The Japanese can then make their own decisions regarding how to achieve this goal -- whether by importing more U.S. goods or exporting less Japanese goods to the United States -- and in which sectors they wish to take action.

Thank you again for the time you spent with us. Please let me know whether there is additional information that could be of help to your policy deliberations.

It is our understanding that President Bush is in the process of sending to Congress a bill that will have a significant effect on our industry, Commercial Fleet Leasing.

As we understand the bill in its current form, we believe it reaches far beyond the arduously negotiated alternate fuel/fleet provisions in the 1990 Clean Air Act and can be extremely harmful to our industry.

I am attaching a comparison of the NESA and the Clean Air Act alternate fuel/fleet provisions to illustrate the differences.

While we support our nation's policies to improve both clean air and fuel and energy independence, we urge you that the fleet industry not be singled out as the answer to most of the problems. It might be useful in the preparation and negotiations of policies that representatives from our industry be solicited for their input.

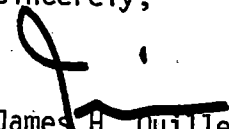
I want to register my strong opposition to the proposed Executive Order drafted by HHS and being circulated by OMB which would ban smoking in all work space occupied by Federal employees.

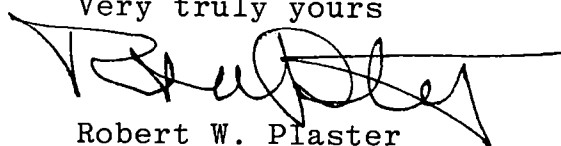
Dear Mr. Sununu:

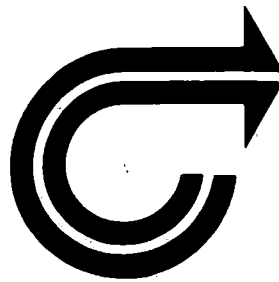
