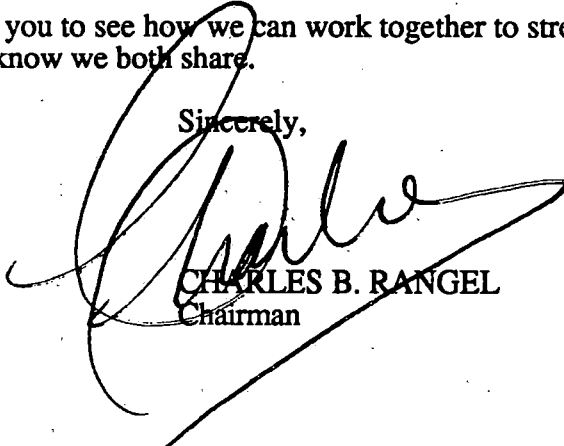
Dear Governor Sununu:

The Select Committee on Narcotics Abuse and Control will be holding hearings with members of the President's cabinet to review the implementation of the National Drug Control Strategy. Our goal in holding these hearings is to find out the anti-drug policies and programs being pursued by each of the cabinet heads with key responsibility for conducting our nation's war on drugs. Later this year, after our sessions with cabinet officials, the committee will have a formal hearing with Drug Policy Director Bob Martinez. Hopefully, the earlier sessions with the cabinet will let us know exactly what it is that Mr. Martinez, as drug policy coordinator, is supposed to be coordinating.

As Chairman of the House Narcotics Committee, I would appreciate the opportunity to meet privately with you to share with you the direction I will be taking with the committee over the course of the next several months. I would also like to talk about ways we might work together to improve cooperation between the Congress and the Executive Branch on anti-drug policy. The President has made clear on several occasions that he places a top priority on fighting drugs. But frankly, from my perspective, I have not seen that same level of personal attention and leadership on this issue from members of his cabinet. I have not been able to find anyone in the Administration who has been riding the point on our anti-drug efforts on the President's behalf. As a legislator, what I really want to know is who I can work with in the Administration when it comes to our national drug strategy. I am not necessarily talking about just spending more money on drug prevention and control. I am talking about the Federal Government's leadership in making drugs a top priority on our national agenda.

I look forward to meeting with you to see how we can work together to strengthen our national anti-drug efforts, a goal I know we both share.

Through the magic of satellite cable T.V. --the C Span Channel-- we were able to see in Puerto Rico the dinner reception in which you were honored by the Manchester Republican Committee of New Hampshire.

Although one of the early speakers tried to make a joke --that came out flat-- about the supposed fact that now a days the people of New Hampshire see more of you, on television from Washington, than when you were Governor of New Hampshire, I have to confess that, although I had read a lot about you, this was the first time that I have seen you for an extended period of time on television.

Allow me to say Governor Sununu that it was an extremely pleasant experience. We, of course, had read quite a bit about you in Puerto Rico. The impressive high I.Q., the alleged arrogance, the high handed, and hard fisted, method of negotiating, etc.

During the speech you gave at the aforementioned reception, however, other qualities became obvious: an absolute loyalty to the President, a genuine and humble sense of accomplishment, and a mastery of the facts needed to solve any given situation, came across as a pleasant surprise to the viewers. Competence, knowledge and great savy came pouring out from the T.V. set. It is clear and apparent that your presence at the White House is one of the principal reasons why the President has been doing such a good job.

The reason for the letter? Certainly not to praise and eulogize you. The people of Puerto Rico have a need

for that intelligence and savvy. The great majority of us would deeply appreciate if you would dedicate a little of your time and effort to solve our "great tragedy": the limbo in which we remain, in relation to our final destiny, after more than seventy years of being American citizens.

As you must be aware, President Bush supports statehood for Puerto Rico. Other prominent U.S. government officials are of the opinion that either independence or commonwealth is best for us. Every single one of them is, of course, entitled to his own personal opinion.

What constitutes a travesty of justice, however, is the inability of the U.S. Government to provide us with a binding and legal procedural vehicle to decide the issue once and for all. As you know, the U.S. Senate recently "killed" a plebiscite bill introduced by Senator Edward Bennet Johnston that would have solved the "status issue" of Puerto Rico.

It is certainly ironic, to say the least, to see the United States of America promoting self determination for the people of the Baltic region --even to the extent of running the risk of getting involved in an international conflict-- while, at the same time, denying that right at home to fellow American Citizens; citizens who have fought, proudly and valiantly, in all the conflicts and confrontations in which the United States has become involved in the defense of freedom and democracy.

Can you help us in this matter? After watching you on C-Span recently, I have no doubt in my mind that you can be of great assistance to Puerto Rico in the accomplishment of this goal.

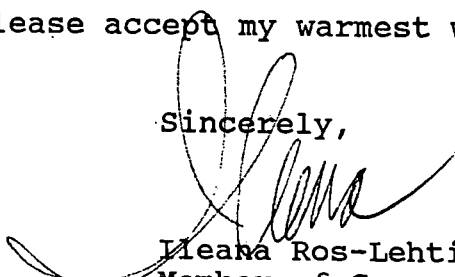

I responded that we must be reading different stories and proceeded to read verbatim that paragraph of her story. There was a long pause. Ms. Devroy said something to the effect of "Oh my, you are absolutely right Senator. I had a paragraph in the story that made it clear as to the circumstances in which the remark was made. The editors left that out. You have every right to be angry and the criticism is justified."

Dear John:

I want to add my voice to those requesting that you call EPA Administrator William Reilly to direct EPA to continue discussions with the wood preserving industry on a regulation affecting it. I hope that these discussions will achieve a regulation that protects health in a more cost effective manner.

As you probably know, on December 6, 1990, EPA promulgated a final rule for the industry which lists as hazardous three categories of wastes from wood preserving operations. EPA and the industry are currently discussing implementation issues raised by the final rule including compliance deadlines. The industry says it will be impossible for most wood preserving facilities to meet the June 6, 1991 deadline. I would urge EPA to stay implementation of the regulation, in particular the drip pad requirements, pending completion of the discussions.

I am concerned that the industry will face severe distress if the regulation becomes effective in June. The impact of EPA's rule would be especially significant in Virginia, which has 29 wood preserving plants employing 520 workers.

I appreciate your concern about this important issue.

I am writing to request that you call EPA Administrator William Reilly to direct the EPA to continue discussions with the wood preserving industry on regarding EPA's decision to regulate all aspects of the wood preserving industry under RCRA.

On December 6, 1990, EPA promulgated this rule which the President's Budget has, in fact, identified as the least cost effective regulation in over 20 years. This regulation's cost per premature death averted is an estimated \$5.7 trillion. Currently, EPA and the industry are discussing implementation issues including an unreasonable compliance deadline, as most facilities will not be able to meet a June 6, 1991 deadline.

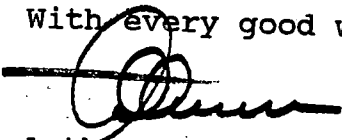
In 1989 and 1990, I was among 150 Members of Congress who strongly urged the EPA to regulate this industry under an integrated multi-statute approach. EPA has not responded to these Congressional requests and has instead promulgated a cost-ineffective, RCRA-only regulation. This system is no more protective of human health or the environment than any proposal made by the industry and rejected by the EPA.

Industry-wide capital expenditures for the EPA regulation could be as high as \$5 billion, easily exceeding more than twice the estimated net value of the industry. Most companies have insufficient capital to meet the EPA regulations costs, and the final rule will force a significant number of plant closings within the industry.

EPA is well aware of the potential economic harm that could result from its actions and has acknowledged that some of the negative effects of this rule were not intended. Therefore, it seems that the EPA should work diligently to address the

industry's substantial and legitimate concerns. John, I'll certainly be appreciative if you'll give this matter your early attention as it is critical to many of my constituents.

We are writing to you about certain exemptions from provisions of the Clean Air Act for clean coal technology projects that were included in Section 415 of Title IV of last year's clean air legislation. We would urge the Administration, through any regulations to be promulgated by the EPA, to facilitate -- and expedite -- the process by which these exemptions are made available to qualifying DOE or EPA-supported clean coal projects.

Through selection to participate in the DOE program, the federal government has recognized already that these projects have the potential to provide significant environmental (as well as economic and/or energy security) benefits. Once selected, it is important that these clean coal projects move forward as expeditiously as possible. Congress sought to facilitate this process of accelerated demonstration by providing for these exemptions to a limited number of clean coal projects for which the Federal government is providing a portion of the project funding. We believe that the EPA should allow for the expedient certification of these government-supported projects to receive the statutory exemptions provided under last year's Clean Air Act Amendments.

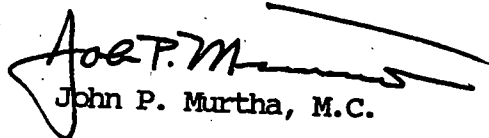
A complicated or lengthy EPA application and review process should not be necessary and could jeopardize the schedule, and possible continuation, of on-going clean coal demonstration projects. Further, we believe that promulgation of regulations for DOE or EPA supported clean coal projects to receive the Clean Air Act statutory exemptions should not be linked to a more lengthy, (and possibly more controversial) regulatory process being addressed in an EPA proposed interpretative ruling to deal with the so-called "WEPCO" issue.

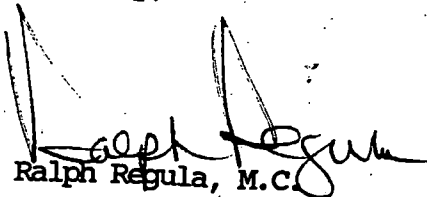
We would appreciate any assistance you can provide in assuring that EPA acts quickly to provide DOE or EPA-supported clean coal projects with the

exemptions from the Clean Air Act that were provided last year. I wrote to you on February 5, 1990 to thank you for your earlier inquiry to the FDA on behalf of some 4 to 5 million Alzheimer's patients and their 16 million family members.

We need you, your staff, and the Administration to help in our continuing battle with the FDA to get the drug THA approved and released to the public. The FDA is now obstructing approval of Warner-Lambert Company's NDA (New Drug Application) for their "Cognex" (THA) product.

The attached correspondence to Congressman John D. Dingell and Senator Sam Nunn, Chairman of the Sub-Committees On FDA Oversight, and to FDA Commissioner David A. Kessler, MD explains the current situation. Also, please note particularly the Wall Street Journal editorial of March 26, 1991 "The Alzheimer's Morass" which I read after writing the enclosed letters. We are in substantial agreement.

Perhaps a phone call to Commissioner David Kessler expressing the Administration's concern in this matter would be helpful to get the following items expeditiously accomplished:

- 1.) Approve Warner-Lambert's NDA request for "Cognex".
- 2.) Remove the restriction on THA imports from Canada so patients and their physicians can get THA as they determine. This is a stop-gap procedure until "Cognex" is publically available.
- 3.) Bring to account the FDA staff who are "dragging their feet" on THA development.

Your efforts on this matter are most warmly appreciated.

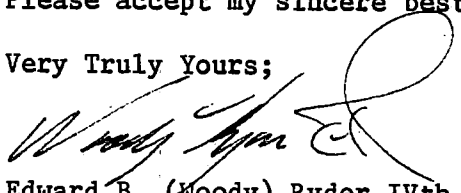

MEMORANDUM FOR GOVERNOR SUNUNU

THE ADMINISTRATOR

SUBJECT: Regulations Affecting the Wood Preserving Industry

On the trip back from Ottawa, you raised with me the issue of recent EPA regulations affecting the wood preserving industry. This memorandum sets out the problem we have been trying to address and the steps we are taking to achieve the environmental objectives without disrupting this industry.

I have heard from others as well. Congressional interest has been encouraged by the American Wood Preservers Institute (AWPI) who asked their members to write you and the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) seeking modifications to the wood preserving rule that was recently promulgated (December 6, 1990) pursuant to the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA).

BACKGROUND

Wood for outside construction, utility poles and railroad ties is treated with one of three wood preservatives. When the wood is removed from the preservative bath, the excess drips for a day or longer. A significant portion of the industry allows the drippage to fall on the ground, making no attempt to collect it. This drippage can contaminate ground water and adjacent surface water to levels posing public health and environmental concerns. In order to prevent such contamination, by a proposal in December 1988 and a final rule in December 1990, EPA determined that this excess preservative and a few other wastes from this industry were "hazardous wastes" subject to Federal regulation.

The December rule was promulgated under court order stemming from a suit filed at the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia on March 25, 1985 by the Environmental Defense Fund and the National Wildlife Federation (No. 85-0974). The 1984 amendments to RCRA had required EPA to determine whether wastes containing dioxins were hazardous wastes. This obligated EPA to make a regulatory decision regarding one of the wood preservatives, pentachlorophenol. EPA also determined that there were environmental concerns with the other preservatives -- creosote and mixtures of inorganic copper, chromium and arsenic. The December 1990 rule required that concrete drip pads be used

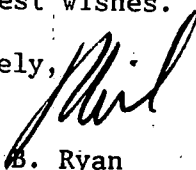

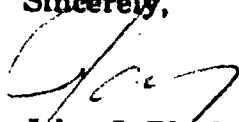
Dear John,

Dear Mr. Sununu,

I am writing about a situation that has recently come to my attention, and that I feel needs to be addressed.

My husband has been serving in the Persian Gulf since October, 1990, on the hospital ship the Comfort. He is employed by the United State Navy as a marine engineer for Military Sealift Command; he has served in the Navy for the past 24 years in both active Navy in Korea and Viet Nam and then in active Navy Reserves, 21st NCR at Davisville, Rhode Island.

We just recently learned that the tax benefits President Bush signed into effect for all military troops serving in Operation Desert Storm will not apply to Military Sealift Command personnel.

As both a Navy and MSC family, we have supported the U.S. position and involvement in this operation from the very beginning. Our sacrifices have been the same as any military family; our stress has been the same, our fears have been the same. My husband's commitment and contribution to the successful end of this operation have been the same as any Navy personnel on board the Comfort with him, even though he wore the uniform of MSC, while his Navy uniforms hung safely here in New Hampshire. His life, or that of any MSC person, is no less valuable or important, nor their jobs no less valuable or important than that of the Navy personnel on the same ship. Yet by excluding them from the same benefits for the same risks and sacrifices, that is the message being sent to them and their families.

I am very proud of the U.S. military leadership and success in the gulf; and I am especially happy that it is over, and all U.S. troops and personnel will be home soon. But this success involved more than military personnel; it also involved many non-military support persons. Most people do not realize that, because these important support people are never mentioned or recognized in any of the media or public speeches from our leaders. Yet, these very same non-military people have been responsible for transporting massive amounts of equipment and supplies to the area, and are now faced with bringing it all back home. In the case of the Comfort, MSC personnel are responsible for providing and

maintaining a combat ready hospital ship environment for Navy medical staff to meet the emergency needs of the personnel in the Gulf area. Everyone on board that ship was off the coast of Kuwait in a hostile environment, not just those in Navy uniforms.

Maybe this absence of media coverage and public awareness of this non-military support role is the reason that MSC personnel do not enjoy this tax benefit, as well as the support and glory, if you will, of the returning victors. Maybe it was just an executive oversight. Whatever the reason, it seems poor policy not to acknowledge them and not to provide them with all the same praise and benefits. They have worked right alongside Navy personnel, as I have said, risking their lives in support of U.S. involvement.

I ask for your support on this issue, and that you look into the matter and do whatever you have to do to bring Military Sealift Command personnel home with the same sense of pride, praise, recognition and benefits of the military; all of whom were part of the success of Operation Desert Storm.

I have enclosed a copy of the letter that I had written to President Bush, subsequent to writing this one, but mailed before this one. It has also been published in a local N.H. paper. The resulting response is just as I had thought. The public was totally unaware of MSC and the non-military support personnel in the area. Given this information, they agree with my position entirely. I would hope that you would agree and do what you can to change this situation. I appreciate your time and effort in this matter.

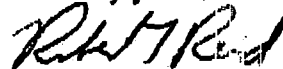

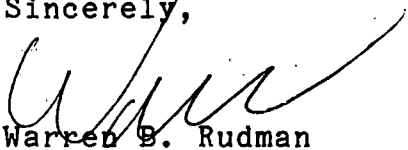
Dear John:

Dear John:

As ever, I apologize for intruding. The people in Hanover have been dealing with the White House scheduling office concerning the possible appearance of the President at the dedication of the new Hitchcock Medical Center complex. The event would likely take place between September 14-21, at any date the White House selects. So far there has been no definite response.

This is an extraordinary project - \$250 million. Outside of Seabrook (you remember Seabrook) this is the largest single construction project in the history of New Hampshire. The facility is really the most state of the art medical resource north of Boston. It will provide several thousand jobs - it combines healthcare, teaching and research. It is a genuine regional jewel.

The date contemplated is sufficiently close to February, 1992 to have its own ancillary political benefits. Equally it could be adjusted to mesh with a Kennebunk visit.

I know all these considerations have been given some weight inside your scheduling operation. I guess what they need is some sort of definitive answer. Everyone understands how much of a long shot getting a Presidential visit is but they would still like to pursue the chance. If, however, it is not to be, they would clearly like to have someone of stature and therefore should begin efforts in that direction soon.

Dear Governor Sununu:

I respectfully request that you contact EPA Administrator William Reilly about new regulations affecting the wood preserving industry. I hope that continued discussion will result in a more cost effective regulation that meets the President's FY92 budget goals and provides adequate compliance time.

The December 6, 1990, rule for the industry has been identified in the President's budget as the least cost effective regulation in over twenty years. The Office of Management and Budget outlined these concerns in a letter to Mr. Reilly last fall. The EPA is aware that the final rule as written will force a number of closings within the industry, and has conceded that some of the rule's negative effects were not intended.

The wood preserving industry's most immediate concern is the new rule's compliance deadlines. Wood preserving companies have been given only six months to implement a final rule which took years to develop, without any technical assistance from the EPA. It will simply be impossible for most wood preserving facilities in my Congressional District to meet the June 6 deadline.

I appreciate your immediate attention to this issue which affects so many of my constituents.

Dear Governor:

I recently made a private trip to El Salvador upon the invitation of Roberto Bukele, a prominent businessman who also has business interests in the United States. During my stay, Roberto and I met with several Salvadorian government officials as well as with the American Ambassador. I want to share with you some of my impressions of El Salvador, albeit the results of a first visit.

In the first instance, I was quite impressed with the progress in the conduct of the economy and the fabric of the local society I observed. Notwithstanding the many reports of violence we so often read about in the press, I never felt threatened or in any danger. It is true that security precautions are advisable and practiced, but I found the atmosphere quite pleasant and relatively relaxed.

In my various meetings, it appeared that the one weak element in El Salvador is its judicial system. Our American Ambassador tended to confirm this as well.

Given the extensive amount of U.S. aid that pours into El Salvador, it seems fundamental that we should insist on a pristine and trustworthy judiciary. A strong judicial system is essential to the protection not only to the Salvadorian People, but to our own interests as well.

Incidentally, through Roberto, I was able to meet many local members of the Salvadorian-Arab community. They are a very successful group of people, highly respected for their achievements, and of course quite interested in the corresponding achievements of their "compadres" in the United States.

I stand ready to assist you and U.S. policy in the region in anyway I can to further American goals in El Salvador.

Dear John:

Thank you for your letter advising me that, after discussing the matter with the President, it has been decided that it will not be possible for him to address the Council of the Americas Annual Washington Conference this year. While we are disappointed, it is reassuring to note that he would be pleased to have a "raincheck." You may be sure that this will be forthcoming next year!

In view of the lobbying efforts now being made by labor, protectionist groups, such as textiles and certain environmentalist groups, against the proposed Mexico-U.S. Free Trade Agreement in the Congress, I believe that strong affirmative support at this time is essential. The Council of the Americas is mounting an aggressive campaign of support both for the Mexico-U.S. Free Trade Agreement and the President's Enterprise for the Americas Initiative. I, myself, am spending one day this week and one day next week calling on key members of Congress. I believe that the Washington Conference of the Council of the Americas will also be useful in providing a further focus of support.

For this reason, inasmuch as the President is unable to speak at the meeting this year himself, we are very hopeful that the Vice President will address the group. To this end, I have written the Vice President a letter, a copy of which I attach.

If you agree with me that the Vice President's involvement in the Conference following up on his own extensive travels in Latin America would be useful, I hope you might put in a good word with him on our behalf.

The spectacular successes which have been achieved, both the diplomatic front and the battlefield in the Gulf, have given a tremendous boost to morale in this country. I feel that the President fully deserves the outburst of public support he is receiving, but it is clear that this has been a team effort and that he has had magnificent support in the White House, the State Department, the Defense Department and our Armed Forces. What a great moment it is to be an American!

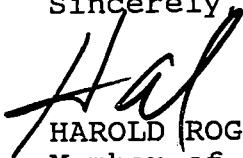

The American Forest Resource Alliance represents approximately 250 member companies and several thousand individuals concerned with our nation's timber supply situation. Our membership is deeply concerned with the Federal Manual for Identifying and Delineating Jurisdictional Wetlands.

A credible and legally defensible Manual for delineating jurisdictional wetlands is essential in order to build public support for the goal of "no overall net loss of wetlands", especially since the original Manual was developed with no opportunity for public review and comment. Until appropriate corrections to the Manual are made, the wetlands issue will be one of confrontation rather than cooperation toward achieving this goal.

It is estimated that there are approximately 105 million acres of existing wetlands in the nation today. The forest products industry, which includes not only large forest products companies but also tens of thousands of tree farmers (woodland owners), manages approximately 50-60 million acres of forested wetlands. These forested wetlands provide wildlife and fisheries habitat, recreation, clean water, and flood control, while also producing a valuable supply of timber and fiber needed to meet the nation's growing demand for wood and paper products. Therefore, our industry has a direct and substantial interest in laws and regulations affecting our wetlands resources.

The recent draft revisions to the Manual continue to delineate as wetlands many areas that are only temporarily wet and exhibit few, if any, functions of true wetlands defined in Environmental Protection Agency and Corps of Engineers regulations as "swamps, bogs, marshes, and similar areas". Last year, industry

Representatives submitted a number of technical comments and suggestions at the public hearings held on the Manual. We would like to bring your attention two specific changes which we believe would help focus the Manual on its proper purpose of identifying true wetlands.

First, the hydrology criterion in the Manual for delineating a wetland is based on the concept of water table at some depth below the surface. Inundation or water at the surface would make the hydrology criterion a much more meaningful and positive indicator of true wetlands in the field and would be consistent with the recent Regulatory Guidance issued by the Corps on "prior converted wetlands."

Second, the growing season for Thermic Soils is identified in the Manual as February through October. A more precise definition of the "growing season" would specify plant hardiness zones based on the period between the average date of the last frost in Spring and the average date of the first frost in Autumn.

The forest products industry nationwide is facing a serious timber supply crisis. Allowing the Manual in its present form to go forward will only further exacerbate the national supply problem. While the above suggestions will help, there remain other serious technical problems with the Manual which need to be addressed in order to more accurately identify true wetlands. We urge you and the relevant agencies to consider these comments to assure that revisions to the Federal Manual for Delineating Jurisdictional Wetland provide greater consistency and accuracy in delineating a true wetland.

Dear Governor Sununu,

I am writing this letter as a co-owner of an oil and gas royalty company with holdings in Texas, Oklahoma, Colorado, Florida, Arkansas and Mississippi. As I listened to the State of the Union Address the other night, the President spoke about the need for all of us individually to do the "hard work of freedom" in the nation. I felt it was a wonderful way to address the need for individual responsibility and service to others.

Even though I make a large portion of my living in the oil and gas business, I am very concerned about the new proposed U.S. Energy Policy and its failure to address to any great extent the area of energy efficiency and conservation. Many of us in the oil and gas business, while recognizing the need to develop several new domestic sources, are also very concerned about the long-term ramifications of the lack of a strong conservation philosophy at the national level. We are worried about the continued rapid depletion of our natural resources, including the possible jeopardy of some of our wilderness areas.

I ask you to continue to call for an aggressive program requiring automobiles to be more fuel efficient as well as a long-term thrust toward alternative and cleaner burning energy sources, including strong incentives for their production and development. Given the right economic incentives, most of the oil companies, many of whom are already involved in alternative energy research and development, would be happy to move toward energy diversification.

If we continue on our present course, consuming close to one-third of all the world's energy, I fear for our future, both in terms of national security and in terms of the environment. I hope that we as a nation during this time of war, in addition to recognizing our overdependence on foreign oil, also recognize that many of our problems are due in large part to our overconsumption and dependence on one energy source. Now is the time to be planning 20 to 30 years down the road.

At a time when there is great national support in all sectors of the economy for energy efficiency, I urge you to please consider an aggressive conservation and alternative energy source program as an integral part of our national energy policy.

Dear Governor Sununu:

My wife and I are new to New Hampshire, but have long been admirers of your strong pro-life convictions. Thank you for your unwavering opposition to abortion on demand in this country.

Our private non-profit national center, the Institute for Abortion Recovery & Research was founded by my wife, Dr. Susan Stanford-Rue, and me last summer. Susan and I have been treating individuals traumatized by abortion for a combined total of 30 years. The Institute has just commenced its fundraising program and we would greatly appreciate any recommendations and/or suggestions you might have as to funding sources. As we approach conservative foundations for assistance, the endorsement of yourself and/or the President would be deeply appreciated.

As a national educational, research and treatment center, the Institute's mission is twofold: (1) through research and training, to provide accurate scientific information on the psychological effects of abortion and (2) to assist those individuals seeking recovery from their abortion trauma by providing a clearinghouse for information and referral as well as offering specialized intensive treatment. The need is great. While the estimates vary widely, present research indicates that 18 - 50% of women are traumatized by their abortion experience.

As an example of the educational offerings we have conducted, over the years Susan and I have been active in training parish priests and counselors from Catholic Charities around the country and Europe in the Project Rachel series. This special program in the Catholic Church is dedicated to helping women and men find healing after their abortions and return to the Sacraments. It is now available in some 60 dioceses. We helped pioneer this program.

Additionally, we actively consult with crisis pregnancy centers around the country by offering either clinical supervision and/or training. Our focus is on helping counselors assist their clients in resolving traumatic abortion experiences. We also conduct research in the aftereffects of abortion,

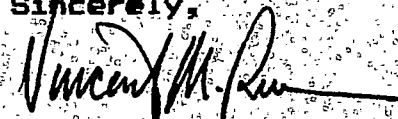

particularly, how abortion affects self image, relationships and family life. We are already making available a number of monographs in this area. In addition, we also provide innovative and intensive treatment for the psychological scarring resulting from abortion. Our therapeutic intervention model integrates both the psychological and the spiritual dimensions of grief, loss and recovery. To our knowledge, the Institute is the only such center in the nation exclusively dedicated to this mission.

While the national debate on abortion continues, this Institute strives to make a unique contribution. The need for a sensitive and scientific examination of the psychological health risks of abortion has been neglected. Those in favor of abortion have known for some time and expertly used the weight of scientific authority to buttress their exclamations minimizing the psychological health risks of abortion. The Institute's purposes then are essentially preventive and rehabilitative providing a compassionate and professional center dedicated to the study and treatment of post abortion trauma. To further explain our work, I am enclosing a funding proposal and narrative, executive summary of research I conducted for Dr. Koop, curriculum vitae, and list of publications available from the Institute.

To commence this Institute in a professional way, we would deeply appreciate your endorsement of our efforts. I would be happy to discuss this further with you by phone or in person. Thank you for your commitment to protecting human life and furthering traditional family values both in this state and in the nation. We pray that you will be able to help us in our embryonic stage of development and that God will continue to bless you and the President in your deliberations. Thank you for your kind assistance.
