Dear John:

You recently received a letter from me regarding several things EPA could do to make it easier for Ohio utilities to comply with the acid rain provisions of the Clear Air Act.

I want to emphasize my bottom line -- EPA has got to issue rules on the distribution of Phase I extension allowances immediately, and those rules have got to include a provision for pro-rata. Resolving the confusion that exists over the WEPCO issue and providing flexibility in the regulations for Title V operating permits are both important -- but the allowance question has got to be settled right away.

If it isn't, our utilities, which are considering installing scrubbers and continuing to use at least some Ohio coal, may decide not to. They will blame the Administration, saying that the reason scrubbers were not an option is that the Administration would not give them an answer as to how allowances were to be distributed. Few people in Ohio will disagree with this line of reasoning.

I would like to announce that we requested the Administration to make an early determination on the allowance question, and that the White House and EPA listened to us. The economic equation is pretty simple -- if all the utilities that use Ohio coal switch to western coal, Ohio loses jobs in addition to the higher utility rates its citizens will face anyway.

John, I need your help.

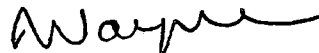

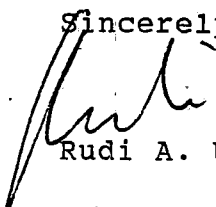
Dear John:

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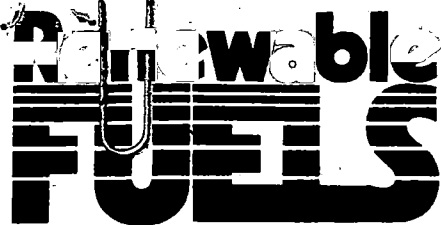

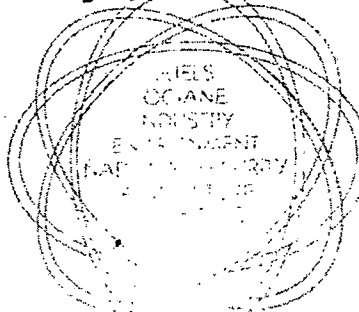
Dear Governor Sununu:

On Wednesday, May 8, the Renewable Fuels Association is hosting a reception in honor of the Members of Alcohol Fuels Caucus and the Congressional Rural Caucus whose commitment to the development of the domestic fuel ethanol industry has helped make ethanol the most promising liquid fuel alternative of the '90's.

Throughout the past ten years, ethanol blended fuels have provided American motorists with over 900 billion trouble free miles of high quality performance. Today, ethanol represents the most effective pollution reduction strategy available, helping to reduce emissions of carbon monoxide, hydrocarbons and ozone. In addition, because ethanol is produced from agricultural feedstocks, it is the only alternative fuel which has a carbon dioxide benefit, helping to reduce the threat of global warming.

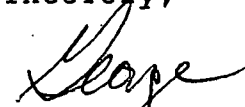
Dear John:

Ohio has six members on the ARAC Committee which is going to make recommendations to the U.S. EPA regulations on acid rain compliance. I asked them to come together with three or four recommendations to help make it easier for our Ohio utilities to comply with the acid rain provisions of the Clean Air Act. Even though they represent different constituencies, I was delighted they have come back with three recommendations. I've enclosed my letter to Bill Reilly detailing each suggestion.

John, I need your help in assuring these recommendations are implemented through the U.S. EPA regulations. As you know, I sincerely believe Ohio has not been treated fairly in the legislation which was passed. Implementing the acid rain provisions of the Clean Air Act will substantially increase the cost of doing business in Ohio and drive up rates for our average citizen. It is important for our utilities to have the universe, in terms of options to comply with the act, so they can come back with a compliance plan to save Ohio coal jobs and limit the negative impact on our utility rates.

Your help in getting this done is absolutely essential if we are going to limit the negative impact on Ohio's voters. I believe our request should be given serious consideration. What we are asking for is consistent with the substance and spirit of the federal legislation.

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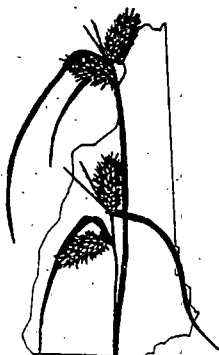

Dear John Sununu;

I am writing to you on behalf of the Board of Directors of the New Hampshire Association of Wetlands Scientists. Our organization was created in 1989 with the express purpose of promoting the field of wetland science among professional practitioners, state agency personnel, municipal officers, environmental organizations and other interested citizens. We have over 90 members from four New England states and continue to provide training, regulatory assistance and collegial support among wetland practitioners region-wide. As individuals, we have tracked the growth and recognition of wetland science in New Hampshire and in neighboring states for over 15 years, and have worked hard to coordinate our efforts with the sound management and regulation of this invaluable resource within the state.

It has come to our attention through several events over the past few months that there is a movement afoot that would seriously undermine the current progress federal agencies have made in standardizing the delineation of wetland boundaries. After a long and patient deliberation and review of the first Federal Manual for Identifying and Delineating Jurisdictional Wetlands (Interagency Cooperative Publication, January, 1989), it appears that the second draft is about to radically alter the scope and tenure of the "three parameter" approach. As a professional organization we have ardently supported the concept since its inception, and after years of dealing with "three lines on the ground", where both lengthy and costly explanations of the different wetland boundaries were becoming overburdensome for our clients, we were all relieved to have a commonly accepted definition of a wetland boundary. As it turned out, the Federal Manual did a very good job in correlating soil, plant and hydrologic indicators of "wetlandness" and managed to reduce the regulatory nightmare in a cost-effective way.

However, it is our understanding that the very underpinnings of this three parameter approach is being threatened by the current revision efforts of the Interagency Committee on Wetland Delineation, the National Technical Committee on Hydric Soils and the President's Domestic Policy Council. Definitions of those plants that are hydrophytic, depth to hydric soil indicators and wetland drainage class definitions have all received proposals for major changes. *The net effect would be to lower the wetland boundary so far downslope that only those areas currently recognized as having very poorly drained soils would be considered wetland.* The resultant chaos that would arise among practitioners, developers, farmers as well as state and local government officials *would be intolerable!* As an interdisciplinary board that is committed to the concise and scientifically accurate delineation of wetland areas and the functional values they contain, such a reduction in the regulation of those lands that cover more than 12% of our state *is unthinkable!*

Recommendations of the National No-Net-Loss Policy Forum, procedural definitions of Section 404 of the Clean water Act, and mitigation sequa outlined in the EPA / US Army Corps of Engineers Memorandum of Agreement all rely upon the comprehensive inclusion of *all* wetland areas that serve the currently recognized functional values. Furthermore, it is anticipated that within one month's time, the *state of New Hampshire* will have adopted *new wetland rules* that reflect the three parameter approach outlined in the 1989 version of the Federal Manual. And, many of our municipalities have already followed suit by promulgating local ordinances and wetland conservation zones based upon these definitions. A reversion back to a "one-parameter" approach under section 404 would return us to an *inordinate* amount of regulatory duplication!

Recent efforts by the Soil Conservation Service to redefine the 'positive indicators of wetland hydrology' used in the manual have been met by considerable skepticism within our association as well as by several experienced soil scientists throughout the state. Most importantly, it reflects an effort to radically redefine jurisdictional wetland boundaries outside the due process of public comment and review. Other revisions by the Interagency Council will likely follow in similar fashion, and again, would largely undermine the former interagency efforts that to date have been quite receptive to professional and private review.

It is therefore our opinion, as a not-for-profit agency committed to the wise and careful management of our national wetland heritage, that:

- 1) the Interagency Council reconsider its proposed definitional changes in light of scientifically justifiable functional values that the poorly drained wetlands are known to contain;
- 2) the EPA and Army Corps representatives consider the drafting and implementation of a *wetlands impact assessment technique* to more accurately regulate those 'marginal wetlands' that would be jurisdictionally "out" according to the proposed definitions; and
- 3) any actions taken by the aforementioned committee be subject to the *strictist scrutiny* of the scientific community, the professional sector of wetland scientists, state and regional regulatory agencies, as well as those private affiliations of individuals who would be severely impacted by any decisions arising from national wetlands policy action.

In good conscience we cannot act alone in matters with such significant impact to our natural resource base. Our association demands that you relinquish this threat to our most productively valuable natural resource and that you give the public and private sector a chance for a complete and thorough review of any reconsideration of jurisdictional wetlands.

Today the Coalition for Open Markets and Expanded Trade (COMET), of which I am Executive Director, met with Carla Hills to generate support for the North American Free Trade Agreement and the President's fast track negotiating authority. The members were pleased to hear the Ambassador's strong message. Her appeal almost certainly stimulated them to increase their efforts.

COMET fully supports the President's fast track authority, and recently sent a letter to the House Ways and Means and Senate Finance Committees (see attached). I propose to work this coalition just as hard as we worked on lobbying for the President's authority to use force in the Persian Gulf. In fact, we are even making some of the same generic arguments.

COMET has also offered to conduct a seminar to generate press support for the President. I sent the enclosed letter to Carla last week and am awaiting her response. I would propose doing this event in early May and doing some portion of it at the White House for maximum impact.

Dear Mr. Sununu:

Enclosed is a copy of a letter I sent to the Deputy Director of the Kuwait Emergency and Recovery Program Office on Monday. I am writing to you to request your assistance in procuring such a contract for providing necessary housing to Kuwait.

Besides being able to provide modular homes that are manufactured in New Hampshire and Pennsylvania, I have at my disposal a 14,000 square foot facility which is located one and a half hours from either Portsmouth or Portland. This building formerly housed Chick's Lumber in Center Ossipee, New Hampshire. With some slight modifications this facility could be utilized to produce panelized homes (panelized wall units, floor units, roofing systems, etc.) in a matter of weeks, thus enabling me to deliver homes completely built in New Hampshire, with New Hampshire materials and by New Hampshire tradesmen. These panelized homes could be shipped far more economically than modular homes as they would fit in a smaller area. I will be writing to the Kuwait Emergency and Recovery Program Office next week to advise them of this possibility.

I have discussed the need for rebuilding Kuwait with a number of New Hampshire tradesmen and I must tell you that many of these highly trained and vital people are now looking to relocate for a period of time to Kuwait. This would, of course, not help the economy of New Hampshire (and not provide taxes for the state or federal government). My proposal would provide jobs (not only for those building the homes but for those transporting them, providing the raw materials, etc.), town taxes, state business profits taxes, federal income taxes, etc., etc. We do not need to have our tradespeople relocate to Kuwait for two or three or more years - we need jobs here in New Hampshire!

Please take the time to read my proposal and see if you can provide any assistance. It is not only I who need your assistance, it is New Hampshire who badly requires your assistance.

Dear Mr. Sununu:

I understand you will be making a decision in the near future regarding the selection of the permanent Director of the Bureau of Justice Assistance at the Department of Justice. I would like to communicate my strong support for the Acting Director, Gerald Paul Regier.

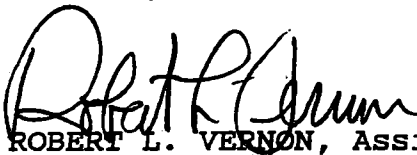

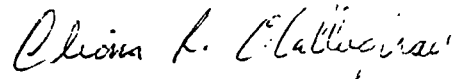
