The delay in writing this letter is attributable to an extended trip to Eastern Europe, from which I have just returned.

As you may have noted, the June 28 issue of *USA Today* contained a small photograph of me, inset alongside a picture of the President, in which I was quoted as saying, "The [office of the] presidency, as a way to manage a business, is rather sorry." I was extremely disturbed at this highly inaccurate quote as well as its implication that I was criticizing the President. Any such notion is completely contrary to my strong respect and admiration for President Bush and his accomplishments.

I arranged for the reporter who authored the quote to receive a copy of the actual transcript of my remarks, taken from a C-SPAN video tape. Speaking on the subject of management defense procurement, I clearly said, "Our system of checks and balances among the three branches of government has certainly served us very well over the years in political matters but as a way to manage a business it's frankly a rather sorry approach -- and in truth what we're managing here is more akin to a business."

On July 12, *USA Today* ran a clarification of their misquote, not featured as prominently as their original story, not a simple statement of the correct quote (above), but rather a paraphrased statement which merely added further confusion.

You are well aware of the frustrations occasioned by misquotes. Yet, I feel so strongly about this error that I wanted to be absolutely certain that you and others in the White House knew exactly what I had said.

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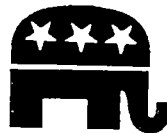

Senator Steve Symms told me about his conversation with you and suggested that I write to you directly concerning our efforts to bring high-speed rail to the United States. As you know, Morrison Knudsen Corporation is leading the effort to bring the French TGV system to Texas. We are attempting to finance the project entirely from the private sector and during the last several months, I have met with leading U.S. and European bankers in an effort to line up the first stages of the more than \$1 billion of private equity funding that must be raised.

During my discussions with the leading financial institutions involved in the project, one thing has been made crystal clear: the necessary equity for the project cannot be raised unless tax-exempt bond financing is available to the project. The single most expensive component of the \$6 billion cost of the system is not land acquisition, construction costs or train sets. It is the financing costs. Without the advantageous interest rates available through the use of tax-exempt debt, our bankers say the project cannot be financed in today's markets.

Although the 1988 amendments to the Internal Revenue Code were intended to put high-speed rail on substantially the same footing as airports, wharves and mass commuting facilities, it hasn't worked out that way. Under the existing rules, 25% of the bonds issued for high-speed rail must be authorized under the state volume caps. This means that you either get the 25% authorization and issue 100% of the bonds, or you get less than 25% authorization and you cannot issue any of the bonds. The equity investors are not going to put their money at risk when investors cannot know from one year to the next whether the necessary amount of bonds to fund the project will be authorized.

Enclosed is a short paper I had prepared which will give you a picture of the background to the problem, the solution and revenue impact. As the paper points out, the revenue impact on the government is positive under any view. First, since high-speed rail cannot be built with taxable debt, there can be no revenue loss to the government, i.e., the government cannot lose revenue on bonds that cannot be sold. Moreover, even if the bonds could be sold, the unavailability of depreciation on property financed with tax-exempt debt more than offsets the loss of tax on the interest paid on taxable debt. But more importantly, the construction of high-speed rail will create thousands of jobs and hundreds of millions of dollars in additional income tax revenues for the government.

High-speed rail is an essential part of the National Transportation Policy and the National Energy Strategy. The United States has the opportunity today to introduce high-speed rail in this country if tax-exempt bond financing is made available. If it is not made available, it is very likely that by the turn of the century the United States will be the only major industrialized country in the world that does not have a high-speed rail system in operation.

I sincerely hope that the Administration will support this private sector initiative by removing the existing barriers to tax-exempt financing for high-speed rail and I would be pleased to discuss this with you personally.

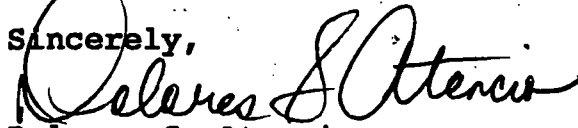

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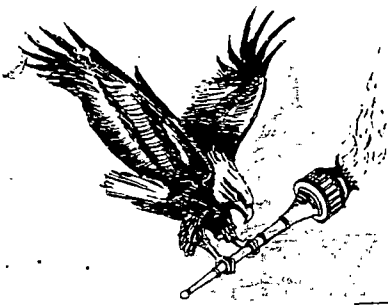

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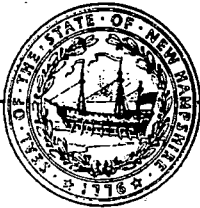

Two months ago I received a call from the White House Personnel Office concerning possible appointment to the National Commission on Library and Information Science. I sent my resume as requested. Thanks for your recommendation.

Last week I had the privilege of serving as a delegate-at-large at the White House Conference on Libraries and Information Services and it became very apparent to me that the National Commission could use some professional librarians as they are concerned with national policy for all types of libraries.

Many of us are enthusiastic about the President's initiative America 2000 and wish to make libraries a strong supporting group for this plan to improve our schools. As you know, I firmly believe that "the days of the status quo are over" and "there will be no renaissance without revolution." In addition, the third item says "For those of us already out of school and in the work force, we must keep learning if we are to live and work successfully in today's world. A 'Nation at Risk' must become a 'Nation of Students.'" This part speaks to the New Hampshire perspective of bookstrap improvement. The revolution must be engendered from the grassroots up; the community initiatives are imperative.

This year the New Hampshire State Library was successful in bringing in grants of almost \$100,000 to support our literacy programs. In our public libraries and communities we are working with families and children teaching them to read together. We are also using hundreds of volunteers to tutor one-on-one. 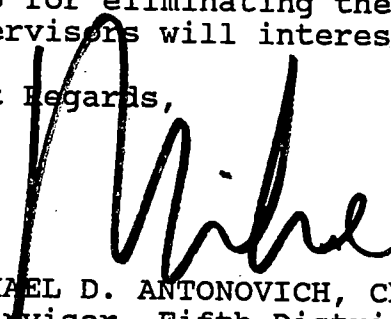

Dear Governor:

I enclose for you a copy of the final draft of "Windows of Opportunity: Joint Program for Western Cooperation in the Soviet Transformation to Democracy and the Market Economy." As you know, Grigory Yavlinsky and I have presented this Joint Program to Soviet leaders as well as to leaders of the G-7 countries over the past few weeks.

Because press discussion of the work we were trying to complete got ahead of the product, there has been a great deal of interpretation, some of it willful. The metaphor of a "Grand Bargain" was coined by my colleague Bob Blackwill and me in our article on American stakes in the Soviet future that appears in the current Foreign Affairs. The central concept of the "Grand Bargain" is long-term, strategic interaction and support by the West on a step-by-step and strictly conditional basis, occurring if, and only if, the Soviet Union and its participating republics take practical and tangible steps towards democracy and a market economy.

It may be worth outlining at the outset what the program is not:

- It is not a giveaway of anything to anybody: of our money to them or their soul to us. Rather if they for their own reasons choose decisively the road to democracy and a market economy, it calls for our engagement and support in return for specific, concrete actions that serve not only their interests but our own.
- It is not a "big bang" to use Secretary Baker's apt phrase.
- It is not billions up front to the Soviet Union on the faint hope or vague promise of reform.
- It is not a program to prop up a tottering, corrupt Communist system. That system cannot be reformed. It must be replaced.
- It is not a Western bailout, bribe, or blackmail.
- It is not an attempt to subsidize Soviet inefficiencies or substitute our resources for theirs. In the transformation to democracy and a market economy, Soviet resources, Soviet courage, and Soviet determination will be the most important factors. They have to want to transform their own system for their reasons, not ours.
- It is not pro-Gorbachev versus Yeltsin or any other personality; or pro-center versus the republics. It is *pro* the process of democratization and rapid movement to a market economy. The Soviet participants in any viable deal will consist of powerful republics acting in intense and sustained cooperation with a new union they voluntarily join and whose powers are delegated voluntarily by the republics.
- It is not unconditional. Assistance is strictly contingent upon the objective conditions for success that will be explicit in mutually-agreed-on measurable tasks that apply at each step of a step-by-step process.
- It is not a "cosmic contract" for life, or even for the next few years.

I belabor the point since many critics insist on wrestling only with straw men. There are arguments against the proposed Joint Program. But they don't include arguments about the above.

In the Joint Program attached, we don't even use the term "Grand Bargain." Rather, our argument is this:

- With the end of the Cold War, leaders of the major governments must confront a fundamental question: What about the Soviet future? How will leaders of the Soviet Union and republics choose to reconstruct their nation? What are the West's stakes in alternative Soviet futures and what can we do to effect our interests?
- The accelerating economic decline in the Soviet Union today brings Soviet leaders to a fateful fork in the road. Continuing down the current path means free-falling deterioration that will lead to disintegration of the Soviet Union. The likelihood is that this will be violent, perhaps leading to a collapse into chaos and civil war. The consequences of this scenario for them and for us are frightening to contemplate. Alternatively, the Soviets today have a window of opportunity in which they could choose decisively for a market economy and democracy.

If Soviet leaders make the choice in favor of democracy and a market economy, leaders of the Western nations will face a fateful choice. To engage or not to engage -- that will be the question. And if to engage, whether to stretch to a level of engagement that maximizes the likelihood of success.

In this process of engagement, money is not the beginning of the matter nor the end nor the most important factor. Moral, intellectual, and technical engagement are vital. But we should also recognize that if the Soviet leadership decides to transform the Soviet Union into a market economy, the path it can reasonably hope to travel will be critically affected by the degree of Western cooperation, including the scale of financial assistance. International financial institutions should take the lead in working with the government of the Soviet Union and the republics to refine a program for transformation worthy of Western assistance and investment.

Our Joint Program outlines specific steps the Soviet Union could take to move rapidly to a market economy. It reviews the types and sources of Western assistance -- not only from the governments of the industrial democracies but also from the international financial institutions. Our report provides no magic number. Specific calculations about financial needs should be made by the international agencies and departments of government in the course of designing and executing the program. But our own estimates suggest that the levels of assistance required would be roughly equivalent to external financial assistance committed to the Soviet Union over the past two years. The difference between the program we propose, and what is now happening pell mell, is that rather than providing government-guaranteed credits for grain purchases here and a loan on sales of products from Italy or Korea there, Western assistance would be married to a strategy for transforming the Soviet Union. Over the last two years, Western governments have committed some \$50 billion to efforts to patch up a system that is fatally flawed. This essentially postpones the fundamental choices Soviet leaders must ultimately make. The Joint Program proposed here would be strictly contingent upon Soviet decisions to transform the current system into a market economy that would serve as a foundation for sustainable democracy.

Our purpose in preparing this paper was to present a concept of strategic interaction and outline a program that we believe to be deeply in the interests of both the Soviet Union and the West. Our hope was to have the responsible leaders in the various governments engage the issue. It's right that such issues of magnitude provoke struggle. We trust that leaders will confront the evidence and analysis, and think about their nations' real long-term interests.

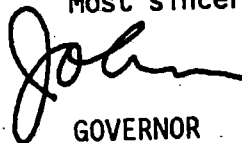

On behalf of the nation's airlines, and millions of air travelers, I am writing to ask your assistance regarding a serious and rapidly growing problem at our international airport gateways. We have been unable to get any meaningful response from the Immigration and Naturalization Service or the Department of Justice on the matter.

International air travelers, who currently pay \$5.00 each for Customs and Immigration inspections, respectively, will face airport delays of from two to five hours again this summer because the INS is failing to make effective use of the money it collects from passengers. Already, many incoming passengers are suffering long delays, in some cases not even being allowed to disembark from their aircraft for as much as 90 minutes because the INS has too few inspectors to handle the current arrivals, much less those arriving when the summer season is in full swing in July and August.

The airline industry last year supported the extension of the \$5.00 user fee to Canada, Mexico and the Caribbean, bringing in an additional \$75 million, in the belief that INS would make good on their part of the agreement to hire a sufficient number of inspectors. Gambling that the Gulf War would have a continued depressing effect on international air travel, the INS neglected to hire enough inspectors. The number hired and trained were far too little, too late.

To make matters worse, the INS then abandoned the Citizen Bypass procedure, in place through much of the 1980s. By abolishing Citizen Bypass, INS has doubled its workload. Bypass speeded up service for all incoming travelers. Now, the United States is the only major country that does not expedite inspection for its own citizens.

We understand that President and Mrs. Bush recently participated in a travel promotion video inviting the people of the world to come visit America in an attempt to increase inbound international tourism with its accompanying economic benefits. How unfortunate it would be if these new travelers to our shores encountered the two- or three-hour delays that were a matter of course last summer. Any additional visitors would worsen an already critical problem at our nation's gateways.

The airline industry has suffered extremely difficult times since the Gulf crisis erupted last year. At a time when travel to the USA is showing renewed strength, inefficient clearance by INS at major U.S. airports will severely interfere with this recovery.

We would appreciate it if you might find the time in your busy schedule to meet with me and several international airline CEOs to discuss this serious matter before the heavy summer travel season is upon us.

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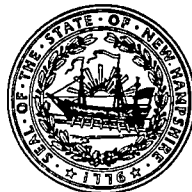

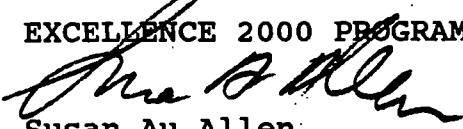
One message that was particularly evident from the honorees' comments was that they are grateful for the support of their families, thankful of the community's recognition, and proud to be Americans making real the American dream.

Dear John:

I am sorry the schedule of the Missouri legislature prevented me from meeting with you recently regarding the 1991-92 NGA chairman's initiative. I am happy to report that the Missouri legislature has passed and sent to the people a comprehensive education reform and funding package that includes many of the ideas from the President's America 2000 Plan--school choice, accountability through school reporting, more time for learning, alternative teacher certification, and smaller class sizes. Negotiations over this package kept me tied to Jefferson City during the last week of the session. I have enclosed a summary of the package for your review.

Also attached is a preliminary document outlining my NGA proposal. I would be grateful for your insights and comments as the Association moves forward on this education theme. Your thoughts on how our efforts might complement the President's America 2000 strategy would be especially helpful.

I am proposing that NGA focus on accelerating actual implementation of education restructuring at all levels of the system. Our efforts will concentrate on a well-organized removal of impediments to free up our students, parents, schools and institutions to be effective in reaching the nation's goals in education. By stimulating and promoting performance changes for all players in education, from students to state policy makers, the nation will be empowered to meet the highest standards of achievement.

The 1991-92 initiative will center on state action at all levels of our education system and be organized around three NGA Governors' working groups:

- Action Agenda for School Readiness
- Action Agenda for the School Years
- Action Agenda for the After-School Years (this will include workforce, literacy, and higher education issues)

Governors' working group will include 8-12 Governors and 2-3 business
This initiative is based on the assumption that we need to move forward
select number of states to spur action in all the states. Governors will
be selected as working group members on the basis of their commitment to take
the lead in their states to develop and implement state action agendas.

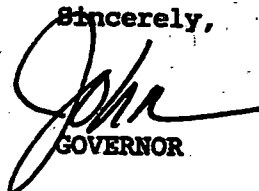
The Governors who serve as chairman and vice-chairman of each of the three
working groups, along with some CEOs, will form a Leadership Group with the
Chairman and Vice-Chairman of NGA. That group will ensure that the strategies
developed and lessons learned by each of the states on the working groups are
shared with all Governors. The Leadership Group will also be charged with
coordinating NGA contributions to ongoing efforts to develop national, state &
local public opinion campaigns.

We are not looking for more reports or studies. We want to share results of
action. We expect the following outcomes:

- State actions that shift policy, budget and organizational
priorities away from process monitoring and toward accountability on
the basis of student and school performance.
- Specific examples of changes that are needed in each segment of our
education system to improve teaching and learning at all levels.
- An experience base that other states can draw on in developing their
own action plans.
- Increased understanding and support by the public for the changes
that are needed to achieve the national education goals.

I continue to be grateful for your service to the nation and particularly your
leadership on education issues. I look forward to your comments and advice in
shaping these action agendas.

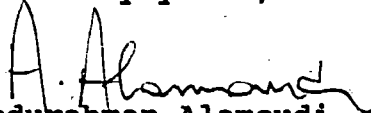

We are writing to you regarding the new Township concept that we had expressed an interest in developing within the Military bases that have been targeted for closing. Our initial inquiry considered the possibility of using Pease Air Force base for the first Township.

In our last letter to you, we indicated that Pease did not lend itself to the type of layout suitable to our Township concept. Also, that the Bechtel Group had already been awarded the contract for the redevelopment of Pease.

Since that time, we have moved into an alternative direction, one that we have been planning for some time, in soliciting the industrial sector to assist us in a joint cooperative effort, to develop the first of several such Townships. We are currently in process of finalizing our marketing portfolio that we intend to submit to some 2,000 companies throughout the country.

It is also our intent to invite appropriate agencies within HEW, EPA, and HUD to participate in this project, and assist in the role of observers to provide the necessary Federal inputs that may be required.

The overall ramifications of this project are such that they can produce immediate and far-reaching beneficial results for our nation well into the next century — restructuring not only our socioeconomic standards but, also, resolving many of our environmental/ecological problems.

I have enclosed for your interest the initial working document from which we plan to form the Township Working Group to develop the first Township. However, in order for you to have a more comprehensive evaluation of what is really involved, I strongly recommend that I be allowed to visit with you and present, in greater detail, the overall scope of the total project.

I feel certain that you will find the results of such a meeting not only quite fascinating but, more so, the precise program that both the President and our nation need at this critical juncture.
