Dear Mr. Sununu:

We are asking for your assistance in negotiating an agreement to the current dispute about the use of donations and provider specific taxes in the Medicaid program. Alabama is a poor state and cannot fund the Medicaid mandates of the last five years without the use of donations, intergovernmental transfers, and provider specific taxes. The federally mandated programs for low income children and pregnant women and the nursing home reforms required by OBRA '87 could not survive the Office of Management and Budget proposal. The mandatory Medicaid coverage of low income elderly who are qualified Medicaid beneficiaries is another tremendous expense to the states.

If the Administration does not support these programs, we urge that the disagreements be addressed in another forum. It is unfair to the states to resolve these disagreements through executive action that further limits a state's ability to tax and expend state revenue.

Implementation of the OMB proposal will have a devastating impact on the low-income people of Alabama. We urge that the Administration reconsider this plan.

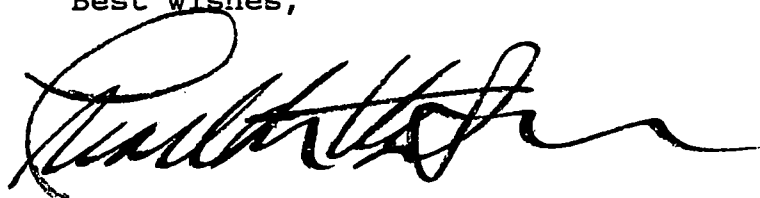

Dear John:

Just a note to tell you that we manufacturers are doing all we can to defeat the Dealer Termination legislation now moving through Congress.

I don't know how he has done it but Senator Metzenbaum has somehow convinced the public that his bill preserves discount stores and cheap televisions. 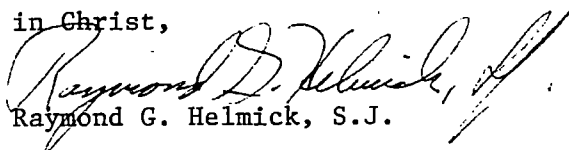
Recently I've been looking over the trial and appeal procedure of all these people who are about to be hanged down in Grenada, and I'm really quite appalled by it all. The case has all sorts of political resonances to it, and the conduct of the courts has been bizarre to an extreme, so much so that it has to be seen as kangaroo court.

I don't really know more about the actual goings on in Grenada before and during the time of our invasion back in 1983 than a newspaper reader can see. What I can see clearly is that the trial proceedings were done in a highly prejudiced way, with the defendants unrepresented, not seeing most of the evidence against them and hence unable to cross-examine witnesses nor present a defense, with a jury impanelled by the prosecutor, its members and even its foreman not only clearly prejudiced but screaming threats and recriminations at the defendants before and during their service as jurors, with many flagrant violations by the trial judge, and the appeal given to a special court of three chosen again by the prosecutor, and the Grenadan constitution manipulated to prevent a more proper appeal to the Queen's Privy Council. The whole thing reeks, and the appearance is given that it is all in deference to American wishes or, as a lot of people seem to think, actually stage-managed by the American authorities who turned out the previous government of Grenada and brought in the present one.

I think our U.S. government ought to intervene, and let these people in the Grenadan government who have so mismanaged the trial, making it so obvious a travesty, that it is us they are embarrassing, not merely themselves, and that we would appreciate their backing off. Otherwise this will be a long-term blot, deserved or not, on our American record in the sight of the Third World peoples, something we can do very well without. In its own right, this is a grave case of injustice, against which our government should be appealing. That it seems to be a tailored political trial at the behest of the U.S., even if nothing of the sort is true, makes it all the more our responsibility.

Dear Governor Sununu:

As we discussed, Alabama is facing a crisis in our Medicaid program. I have enclosed additional information regarding the potential effect of the elimination of provider specific taxes on Alabama. If we lose our ability to collect the provider specific taxes, passed overwhelmingly by the legislature, we will lose \$795 million out of our \$1.6 billion FY 1992 Medicaid budget. This represents a devastating blow to a program that is efficient and effective in providing health care services to the most needy.

At my direction, the health care agencies in this state have worked diligently to maximize every resource to insure a health beginning in life for every Alabama baby and a long, healthy, productive life for our senior citizens. Needless to say, the Federal government has continually placed mandates on states without providing the necessary financial support needed to fully implement them. We have been successful in Alabama in developing the resources needed to implement major changes in the Medicaid program -- many changes commended by national health leaders. We have not supplanted the state's responsibility to finance health care. We have continually and significantly increased the amount of funding for the Medicaid and Public Health budgets. Our provider specific tax package even includes a clause that makes the tax null and void if the Legislature fails to appropriate the current level of funding for Medicaid (\$139 million).

We have not forgotten our role as conservative molders of the future. Our programs emphasize prevention and managed care -- both programs guarantee cost savings in the future. They also guarantee a more efficient health care system. Our Medicaid program operates at less than 3 percent administrative costs -- fully over 97 percent of our dollars go to finance health care services for the most vulnerable in our society. The Secretary of HHS has commented that Alabama's Maternity Waiver should be used as a model for other states.

We are making tremendous progress in Alabama. I recently was delighted to announce a dramatic reduction in our infant mortality

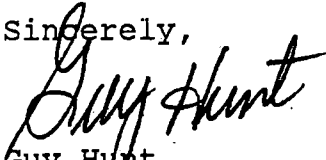
rate -- from 12.1 deaths per 1,000 live births to 10.9. This decline would not have been possible without the Medicaid expansions.

I do not need to tell you the difficulty facing states today. Without the ability to collect provider specific taxes our Medicaid program would be devastated. I see no alternative but to scale back the program dramatically. My Medicaid Commissioner has told me at that point we would not be in compliance with Federal mandates and could not comply with the mandate outlined in the Boren Amendment. We would be faced with the very real decision of closing the Medicaid program all together.

More importantly, I know the President's compassion for those in need. I feel confident that he would support our position. As you may know, there is a growing consensus supporting voluntary contributions/provider specific taxes. I believe there is a median ground that can protect the federal budget from unlimited drains on it while allowing states the flexibility in provider specific taxes we believe are legally ours. I have enclosed suggested options for the Administration. I would recommend Option III as the most viable.

I appreciate your attention to this issue. I have enclosed additional information for your review.

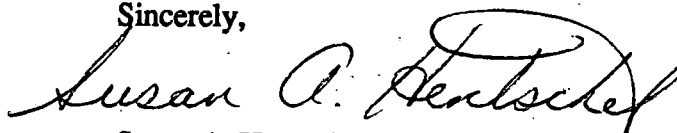
Dear Chief of Staff Sununu:

In follow-up of previous correspondence I have had with you, I enclose for your review a medical statement from the physician who is currently attending to my medical needs (the same doctor who performed my May 1991 back surgery) as a result of my serious automobile accident of August 10, 1990. The only conclusion one can come to after reading this statement is that I am entitled to Social Security Disability Benefits (as well as Supplemental Social Security Benefits for my children) and that the Social Security Administration (SSA) office must overturn their decision to deny my original request for assistance.

I most gratefully appreciate the attention you have paid to this matter and urge you to contact the SSA office on my behalf to see to it that my claim is processed posthaste and that a check for 12 months will be forthcoming.

On another note, I would like to comment that had the SSA office properly reviewed my case, the government would have saved administrative fees that are being wasted in the appeal process. As I mentioned in my first piece of correspondence with you, the SSA office **never** sought an independent medical opinion of my condition nor did they **ever** converse directly with me about my condition. Had the SSA office been more thorough in their review of my case, I believe that an appeal would have been avoided, thus saving the government untold numbers of dollars, not to speak of the mental anguish it would have saved me. There must be something our legislators can do to avoid mistakes like this in the future!

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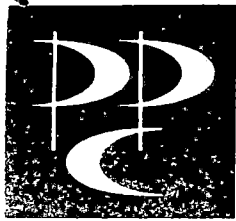

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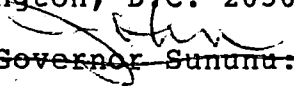

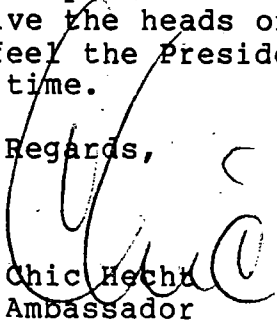

I was glad to have been able to talk to you about climate change and other matters when I was in Washington. It was very useful to hear the US position set out with such vigour and clarity. My further round of meetings with your colleagues was equally useful. We have now both been briefed on the latest round of Climate Change negotiations. I was glad to hear that an East/West confrontation was avoided and that real progress was made on many fronts. Whilst I am confident a convention will be ready for signing in June 1992, formidable obstacles remain.

First, I fear that your problem with the language of targets transcends any of the difficulties we discussed on which gases should be included in those targets. Here, you are alone among the leading OECD countries. Furthermore, the US has already agreed to demanding targets on CFC's, including a latest phase-out date for HCFC's where there are presently no substitutes. Even more recently, the US has signed the ECE NOx Protocol which sets an indefinite freeze on national NOx emissions. It seems that you have a unique problem with the language of targets for greenhouse gases. If so, it falls to the US to develop language which surmounts your difficulty without diminishing the effectiveness of the convention. Otherwise US reluctance to embrace the language of targets will readily be interpreted, not as an aversion to the inefficiencies of command and control, but a simple reluctance to impose the same self-discipline on national greenhouse gas emissions.

The second difficulty I see is winning full participation by the developing countries. Aside from the issues of technical transfer and associated financial mechanisms, you know that I am convinced that they look to the developed world for leadership on the measures that can be taken.

We share a common recognition that the science is uncertain and that it will take at least a decade to reduce the uncertainty. My concern is to address what we can do in the interim that will make any future response less dramatic. There appears a recognition in most of the developing world that they have a part to play, but look to us to set them an example of what can be done. On the basis of what we have heard from the negotiations, key developing countries such as India and China are only going to be willing to sign up to a convention requiring eventual action by them if that convention also requires substantial action by the developed world.

In Europe we have begun to flesh out the first phases of our action plans that follow from the targets that we announced last year. I was alarmed to find how little was known in the US of these plans, which in many cases feature ideas that have figured in your own national debate. On my return from the US I impressed on Hans Alders, the Dutch Environment Minister who is current President of the Community's Environment Council, the importance of our getting across the message of what Europe is setting about. I understand that an invitation was extended to Boyden Gray by the Dutch, German and UK Delegations at the Chantilly negotiations to visit Europe and see for himself. I hope he will take up this offer soon.

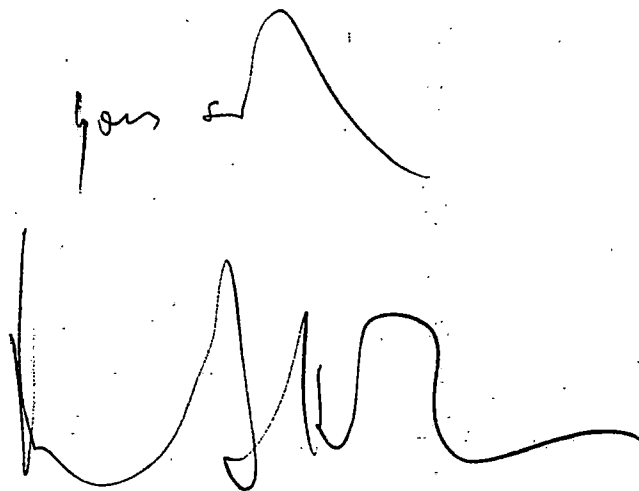
When I visited Washington I learnt a great deal about the US National Energy Strategy. Its willingness to look far into the future and set the R&D agenda for the next generation's possible future energy needs, should continued greenhouse gas control prove necessary, is very impressive. But the very thoroughness of your work makes it even more difficult for outside observers to understand why it is impossible for the US to accept a language involving targets in the negotiations. My only reservation was that it does not address the timescale of the next decade which features strongly in the negotiations. I hope that in the future debate on the US energy strategy there is an opportunity to look more closely at what can be achieved in the shorter term.

Finally I was very concerned at what you said about your personal assessment of the science. It will be difficult enough to gain international agreement on how to share out the burden of the insurance premium against possible climate change. It may prove impossible if there is to be a dispute as to whether any premium is due at all. The US and the UK take the lead in insisting that international environment policy be based on the best evidence available. I assume that is why the US has taken such an active part in the IPCC process. Indeed I understand that US scientists were the majority contributors to the IPCC scientific assessment. If there are dissenting voices in your scientific community, I urge you to ensure that they take a full part in the rigorously reviewed preparations for the IPCC's 1992 re-assessment of the science.

You will know that I am very grateful for the time you and your colleagues spent discussing this and other issues. We are continuing our own efforts and, in that respect, you might be interested to see a copy of a speech made today by our Prime

Minister, a copy of which is attached. I came to listen and I gained a very good impression of the US position on the issues which will command our attention in Rio in June 1992. There is clearly a great deal of work to be done, but I believe my visit has provided a foundation for the bridges that will in due course need to be built.

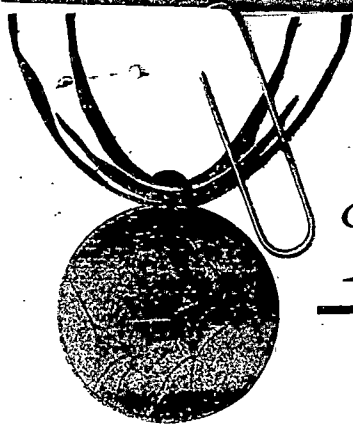

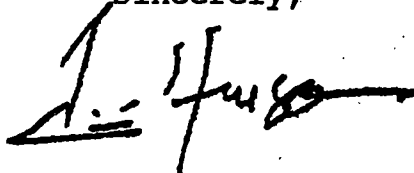

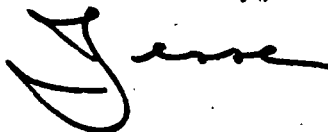

Frank Carlucci and I regret you were not able to join us at the release of CED's newest policy statement, The Economy and National Defense: Adjusting to Military Cutbacks in the Post-Cold War Era. Enclosed is a copy of the statement which you may find helpful.

We were joined by Chairman Panetta of House Budget, along with Members Bateman, Frank, Livingston and Lowry; a large number of senior staff members; officials from the Administration; and others; in a lively and well focused discussion on the issue of the economic consequences of cutting defense spending at both the national and regional level.

This CED statement argues that, with respect to the nation as a whole, the economic consequences of the reduction in defense spending should be small, and that savings derived from reduced military outlays should go directly into reducing the nation's huge federal budget deficit.

At the same time CED recommends ways that current adjustment programs can be redesigned to help ameliorate the economic and human consequences of reduced defense spending in those communities that are adversely affected.

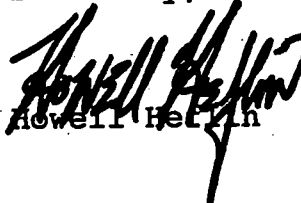

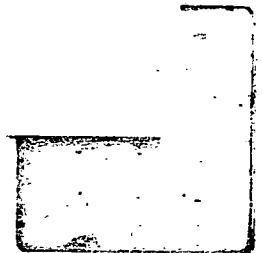
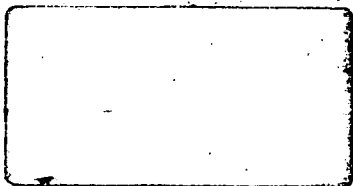

I hope you will recall my previous correspondence with you regarding our cocaine treatment research.

Word has reached us in Minnesota of great political and bureaucratic upheavals at ADAMHA, resulting in the creation of a new addictions services agency. Since the Executive Branch will be directly involved in designing the new agency, I would like to respectfully submit some suggestions and a proposed organizational charge for this agency to your attention. I hope the enclosed outline is useful to you in your work.

As you may recall, when I was not funded by NIDA, I was unable to proceed with a large scale double blind project. Instead, with local Minnesota state funding support, I was able to proceed with a rather small scale double blind study which included some innovative twists. That study will be published in mid July. The University of Minnesota has scheduled a press conference associated with its release. I have enclosed a copy of the final galley for your perusal. By studying unmotivated crack users in a nontreatment setting, and demonstrating pharmacologic effectiveness, this work sets a new standard for pharmacotherapy research.

Thank you for your ongoing support of those of us in the drug treatment research field.

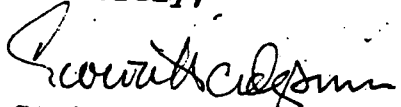

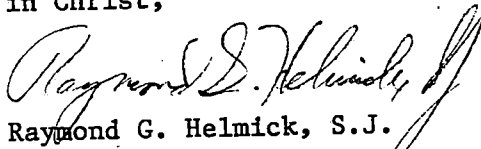
Once again I've written off to Prime Minister Shamir. A copy of the letter is enclosed for your own information and that of anyone in the Administration you think should see it.

After I had to call off that visit to Shamir in the first week of March, when you were being so helpful to see that I saw him and not merely Mr. Justus Weiner, who had replied to my October letter for Shamir, I thought I should certainly send another serious letter, and postponed it while I waited for the right time and circumstances. I do think I should keep out of the way while the Baker shuttle is going on. Visits to the likes of Mr. Shamir by the likes of me can be useful, I think, in times of stalemate -- that's how I first got into the long communication with Arafat, or with Raymond Edde -- but not when this level of diplomacy is going on. A letter is better right now.

You have certainly been in a lot of people's line of fire since I last wrote or spoke to you. I can only say: Corragio! It's plain enough that none of this is about how you travel. I spotted the enclosed cartoon in this morning's Boston Herald, and thought it would amuse you.

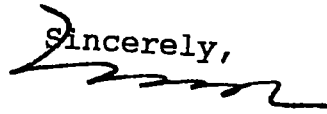

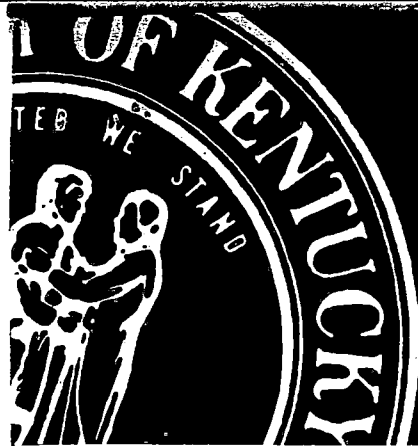

Dear John:

I would like to call your attention to a proposed EPA hazardous waste regulation which could have a devastating impact on the wood preserving industry.

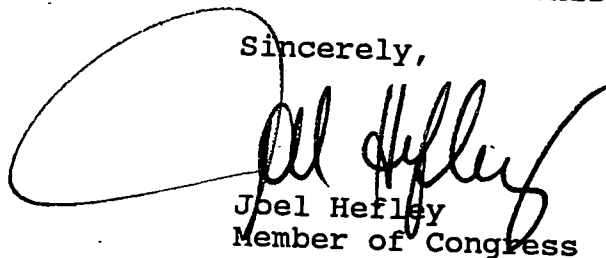
On Dec. 6, 1990, the Environmental Protection Agency promulgated a final rule for the wood-preserving industry. This proposed regulation was the object of severe criticism in a Nov. 15 letter by the Office of Management and Budget. The budget office said the proposed regulation carries a cost of \$5.7 trillion per premature death averted and criticized the EPA for failing to consider alternative or innovative regulatory approaches.

The EPA and the wood preserving industry are currently discussing implementation issues raised by the final rule including unreasonable compliance deadlines. However, it will be impossible for most wood preserving facilities to meet a June 6 deadline.

I would ask that you discuss this problem with EPA Administrator Reilly and ask that his agency continue discussions with the wood preserving industry on this regulation. The costs of this regulation are estimated at more than twice the estimated net value of the industry and a final rule by the EPA could force a significant number of plant closings within the industry, some within my own congressional district.

I appreciate your immediate attention to this issue.

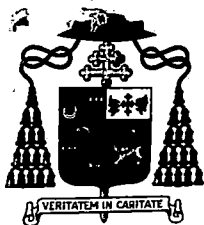

It has recently been brought to my attention that a unique opportunity may exist for the federal government to save considerable sums of money by converting existing operating real estate leases into capital leases. I would greatly appreciate it if you would ask the General Services Administration and the Office of Management and Budget to look into this opportunity.

Typically when GSA leases a building for the federal government, they enter into a standard operating lease agreement whereby the real estate developer retains ownership of the building. In some cases, the length of the lease and the desirability of the property may make it in the government's interest to own the building. However, given today's budgetary constraints funds are frequently not available for such a purchase.

With interest rates currently at relatively low levels and developers searching for liquidity, a unique situation is created whereby many of these operating leases may be able to be converted to capital leases resulting in federal ownership of desirable real estate. Ownership is a worthy goal in itself. But there may also be the possibility for substantial savings. In many circumstances, the monthly payments under a capital lease may be lower than under the current operating lease. Using conservative assumptions, the economic analysis I have seen shows that the savings on a typical 100,000 square foot building may be as high as \$400,000. This assumes no residual value to the building at the end of the lease. If the building appreciates at a 4% annual rate, the savings to the government may be more on the order of an additional \$5 million in current 1991 dollars.

John, while I know that OMB has reservations about lease-purchases in general, a program that allows lease conversions in circumstances where there is a long-term operating lease could be structured to ensure that capital leases will be used only for real estate that the government would like to own. I would appreciate it if you would have OMB and GSA explore this possibility. It sounds intriguing to me.

Dear John:

Thank you for taking my call yesterday, May 29, 1991, concerning the Church of Jesus Christ Latter-Day Saint's (the Mormon church) problem in Thailand. I hope the following will be of help in bringing the influence of our government to their attention.

1. The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints is a Christian church with nearly eight million members worldwide. All are taught by Church leaders to be loyal and faithful citizens of their country, and to be ethical and self-reliant. Over 5,000 of the members reside in Thailand. The work of the Church in Thailand is directed at present by Anan Eldredge, a U.S. Citizen of Thai heritage. For some time, the Church has sought formal recognition and acceptance by the Government of Thailand. Although as Vice-President President Bush wrote to the then Prime Minister of Thailand on June 6, 1984, supporting the application for recognition, it has still not been granted.
2. The Church has a worldwide missionary program in dozens of nations wherein 45,000 young men and women voluntarily give 1-1/2 to 2 years of their lives to assist in the programs of the Church. These programs are designed to promote stronger families, provide humanitarian service, and teach principles of integrity and high moral character. Approximately 85 of these young people now are serving in Thailand of whom approximately 45 are U.S. citizens. They learn the Thai language, develop an appreciation of Thai culture, and leave with a deep love of the people.

3. The Church has come to Thailand with only pure motives. It would appear, however, that there is a concerted effort on the part of some Thai bureaucrats and others, to persecute and harass the Church. For example, the Mission President, Mr. Anan Eldredge, is currently being prosecuted on charges of printing a newspaper without the appropriate license and supposed derogatory remarks about Buddhist monks printed in a Church magazine. The alleged offence occurred nearly two years ago, but court proceedings began only late in April, 1991, after numerous delays. Eldredge has pleaded not guilty on all counts. Prosecution witnesses have failed to appear several times, and the judge and prosecuting attorney have been changed. Eldredge was jailed for two days. A Thai government minister reportedly has called on Thai citizens to physically assault Eldredge if they have a chance. The most recent charge is that the Church is operating a mission office in Thailand without work permits.

The Church in Thailand is most anxious to comply with every law of the country. Foreign representatives of the Church provide for their own financial support and over the years have contributed millions of dollars to the Thai economy. During the period 1985-1990, over 107 million Baht (approximately \$4 million) were contributed to the economy of Thailand by the Church with over 18 million Baht (\$700,000) being infused into Thailand last year alone.

In the past several years, another 63 million Baht (approximately \$2.5 million) has been expended by the Church on humanitarian projects in Thailand. Among such projects is an English Language and American Culturalization Training Program for Asian refugees carried out under contract with the U.N. High Commission on Refugees. This project alone has resulted in the expenditure in Thailand of more than \$2 million in the last decade.

Other projects, funded at hundreds of thousands of dollars, have included one project on support of a Freedom From Hunger project and several others dealing with child health. A Dental Services Feasibility Study recently has been funded.

Many years ago two young representatives of the Church offended members of the Buddhist faith by not showing appropriate respect for a holy shrine in Thailand. These young men were naive and ignorant of the Buddhist faith and unaware of the nature of their transgression. They served prison sentences and long ago made formal apology to those who were offended.

The Church also made formal apology for the unfortunate incident many years ago and has been very careful to instruct its representatives as to appropriate conduct while in Thailand.

In recent years, the Church has invited representatives of the Thai Royal Family and of the Government to Church headquarters in the United States in an attempt to demonstrate its good faith. In 1989, for example, 15 members of various government departments traveled at Church expense to meet with Church officials in Salt Lake City. It is a measure of the attitude of some that those demonstrations of good faith have been interpreted by them as an attempt to subvert government officials in Thailand. Nothing could be further from the truth.

The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints is well respected in American and nearly 100 nations around the world. I respectfully request that you use your good offices to help ensure the Church is afforded the same rights, protection, and legal status enjoyed by other Churches in Thailand.

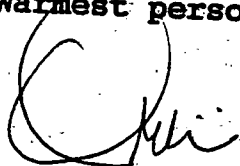
I have been informed that if the King of Thailand will give formal recognition to the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints (the Mormon church) as an official church entitled to practice their faith in Thailand, the bureaucracy will accept that decision and help to put an end to the persecution of the LDS Church.

General Sundhara Kongsompong ("Big George"), Supreme Commander, Supreme Command Headquarters, Rachini Road, Bangkok, 10200, Thailand, could also help resolve this problem if he chooses to do so but, we have indications that he will not help.

I would really appreciate having this matter favorably resolved.

I am faxing a similar letter to James Baker as well. I think Jim will be willing to help.

Dear John:

Gordon Humphrey has talked with me several times, before and after he left the Senate, about the problem confronting Oakwood Child Care Center out in California. (I feel that Gordon was pushed around by HHS. He has a right to resent it.)

In my judgment, HHS doesn't have a right to get by with (1) its treatment of Senator Humphrey, nor (2) what appears to be a disregard by HHS for the taxpayers' money.

Let me emphasize at this point that I am demonstrably no fan of federal funding of day care centers. I cannot imagine that I would have advocated funding Oakwood Child Care Center -- or any other such center.

But the fact is, the Department of Health and Human Services did, in February 1987, make a \$1.5 million grant to Oakwood to purchase a building for a non-sectarian child care center. (An additional \$300,000 grant was provided for renovating the building.)

Oakwood was unable to complete acquisition and/or renovation of the facility within the one-year time period specified in the grant, whereupon HHS took the unprecedented position of refusing a no-cost extension -- instead demanding that Oakwood sell the property and return the \$300,000 grant. At no time, to my or Senator Humphrey's knowledge, has HHS informed Congress of any wrongdoing by Oakwood justifying the HHS demand that the grant be repaid.

The problem, John, is that the declining real-estate market has resulted in a reduction in the Oakwood property's value. If HHS proceeds to foreclose, the taxpayers will not recoup their investment, and the intended benefit to the children will be lost.

Here's the point: Near the end of the 101st Congress, Senator Humphrey tells me that the White House promised him that the relevant officials at HHS would meet with him and representatives of Oakwood. The meeting was to be held in Washington.

However, on the day of the scheduled meeting, HHS officials announced that they would not meet with the Senator and the Oakwood representatives. The Oakwood representatives had come here for the meeting, at considerable expense.

Governor, I am confident that you agree that nobody should be treated in this fashion by federal bureaucrats, HHS or otherwise.

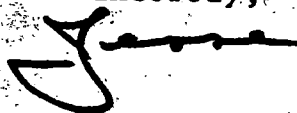
I acknowledge that the Oakwood case may be a bit complicated, but that doesn't justify what seems to me to be petty arrogance on the part of any federal official.

John, I know you are burdened with a thousand different matters, but could I impose upon you to have this matter independently investigated? For HHS to jerk the rug out from under the kids in California just doesn't seem right.

I suggest that the cancelled meeting be rescheduled, that Senator Humphrey and the Oakwood representatives be invited -- and that the meeting be attended and monitored by one of your designees.

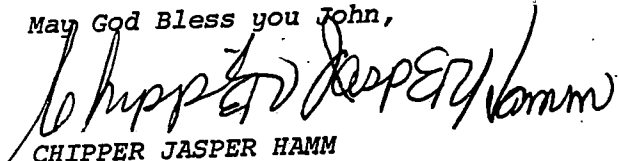

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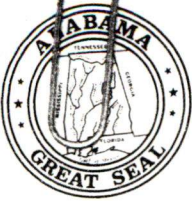

I am writing to call your attention to a matter that is of great concern to the State of Alabama and also to many other state government officials and organizations, including the National Governors' Association, the National Association of State Budget Officers, the National Association of State Auditors, Comptrollers and Treasurers and other organizations. For more than a year, state officials have been recommending that the US Fish and Wildlife Service amend the definition of license revenues in 50 CFR 80.22(a) to exclude interest on state hunting and fishing licenses. The State of Alabama has written twice to the Fish and Wildlife Service on this matter. I now understand that the Fish and Wildlife Service has not changed the regulation, and has recently sent it to the Office of Management and Budget for clearance.

I am enclosing copies of our letters of June 29, 1990, and November 27, 1990, which explain Alabama's position on this matter. Our position remains just as it was described in the letters. I hope that the Office of Management and Budget will act to revise the regulation to remedy the states' objections. Thank you for your attention to this matter.

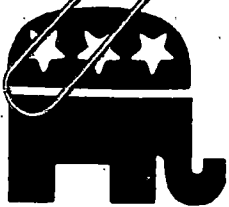

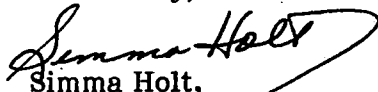

Dear Chief of Staff Sununu:

You might recall that I sent you a letter with enclosures last week regarding my situation with Social Security. In follow-up of that I enclose for your review the most recent doctor's report I have received concerning my condition. Of particular interest and highlighted is page two, paragraphs six and seven. As I stated in my letter and further concurred with by Dr. Wing, Social Security's basis on which they denied my claim is completely erroneous.

Of further interest, I am currently hospitalized and have been since May 8th, 1991. I was hospitalized because Dr. Lord discovered that one of the two Harrington rods I have in my back had come unscrewed. I was supposed to be in the hospital for a day or two, but now do not expect to be released for at least several more days. When Dr. Lord performed my most recent surgery he discovered that I not only had one but that both of my rods had come unscrewed. The second rod was imbedded in my spine and ruptured my spinal fluid sac (which is a very serious condition). Dr. Lord has advised me that should the patch he put on the ruptured spinal sac rip for any reason that I can be paralyzed in no time at all! I have not been able to discuss with Dr. Lord what he foresees for my future as far as disability due to the spinal sac rupture because of my drug induced state of mind and body, however I will discuss this with him soon and will forward all communications to you. I wish to further reiterate that I am not able to work nor will I be able to work for quite some time to come and that I am entitled to Social Security benefits and would appreciate everything you can or may do to see that this is accomplished.

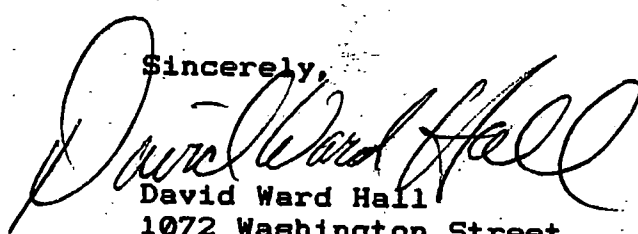

You'll recall our phone call a week or two ago when I outlined my meeting with the President on the Beck decision. You agreed with me, as had he, that, aside from the simple justice involved, any implementation of Beck would be a powerful tool in the '92 elections. It would seriously cripple the capacity of the AFL-CIO to spend, as they do now, more money on campaigns than any group but the two major parties...all of it to elect Democrats.

Using Beck would be a particularly potent tactic, since the AFL-CIO and the liberal media have dealt with the decision by pretending it doesn't exist, so they dare not debate it publicly.

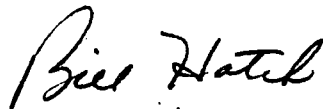
In 1990, when we lost the Second Congressional District in New Hampshire, we lost one of the most solidly Republican seats in the U.S. House of Representatives. Obviously, we have to win it back. Over the past few months friends in New Hampshire have encouraged me to run and, in fact, I have been thinking about it. But before I make any final decision, I would welcome the opportunity to speak to you about my plans and solicit your advice.

The national political climate does not encourage people to become candidates. The price, as you well know, can be extraordinarily high. To be serious about becoming a candidate, a person has to be "mad as hell" about something specific and determined to do something about it. Only then do the potentially benefits of winning outweigh the definite costs of running.

There are a great many people, and I am certainly one of them, who are "mad as hell" about how Congress usurps power from both the Executive Branch and the States and then, to suit its own purposes and avoid making the hard policy decisions, abrogates its legislative responsibilities to the courts. In my case, as a former member of the New Hampshire Legislature and as a political appointee, I have the credibility to at least think about doing something about it. To run for Congress, to participate in a debate on Federalism and the proper role of Congress is, as Dan Folgelberg said in a song about the Kentucky Derby, "a chance of a lifetime in a lifetime of chance." If I run, it will be because I want to seize this chance.

Attached, for your information, is a thematic statement about the general focus of my campaign if I were to run. I would welcome the opportunity to talk to you about that possibility. I will call Jackie Kennedy next week to follow up and arrange for a convenient time and date for a meeting.

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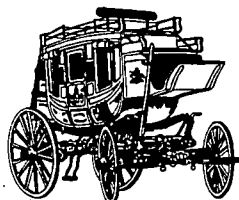

We are in the process of a feasibility study to withdraw from the Governor Wentworth Regional School District (a six-town district). Our town voted to proceed with the withdrawal study on January 30, 1991 and it should be completed by May 24th. At that time our town will decide whether or not to pursue going through the approval process to educate all of our students from kindergarten to grade 12 in our hometown.

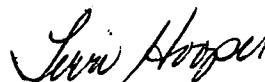
Although financially we will remain in the same "ballpark" if we withdraw, some people are concerned that we will not be able to provide the quality of education or quantity of courses that we have now with the regional high school because of the smaller student population. Dear Chief of Staff Sununu:

I am writing to you and President Bush to call your attention to what I consider to be unfair treatment of my claim for Social Security disability and supplemental Social Security income for my children.

On August 10, 1990 I was involved in a very serious car accident. I was a passenger in the car at the time and the extent of my injuries was and continues to be immense. At the time of the accident I broke my back, severely fractured my right leg, fractured my left leg up near the pelvis, punctured a lung, bruised my heart, obtained several lacerations and contusions throughout my entire body, had a closed head injury, and fractured my pelvis (various hospital, doctor and surgery reports are enclosed (I do not have a complete medical file as of yet because of delays in receiving same from various providers.)) I was hospitalized for 53 days and had numerous surgeries on my right leg and back. I have rods and hooks in my back, and a steel shank in my right leg. I lost a quarter of the flesh, tissues, nerves, etc. in my right leg from above my knee cap down. I had numerous plastic surgeries to replace the flesh that was lost.

My recovery from this accident has been above average but only due to the fact, as a divorced mother of four I had to get home to care for my children as much as was possible in my limited capacity. I was going through a divorce at this time as well and the threat of losing custody of my children was looming over my head. While at home I was treated by Visiting Nurses regularly as well as a physical therapist. My family aided me and stayed with me and the children, performed all housework, shopping, etc. duties as I was unable to care for myself or for my children until a minimum of four weeks after my
