Dear Mr. Sununu,

It has come to our attention that the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is attempting to avoid the compromise reached very recently by the Council on Competitiveness on wetlands delineation.

When the compromise was announced by the Vice President, it was our understanding that the benchmark of "surface saturation" to 21 inches was to be defined as fully saturated from the surface to a depth of 21 inches. EPA now suggests that the compromise actually provided for the existence of "wetness" at any stratum below the surface, notwithstanding the possibility that the surface might actually be dry. This EPA interpretation defies common sense and the Vice President's compromise.

IADC represents virtually the entire contract drilling industry, active throughout the United States in the search for this country's vital oil and gas energy resources. If EPA is allowed to abrogate this hard-won compromise, not only are the activities of our mostly small businesses seriously threatened, but so also is the credibility of the Administration. I urge you to insist upon the wet surface-to-21 inches depth definition accepted by a majority of the Council, and to communicate your understanding of same directly to the Vice President.

Dear Governor John Sununu:

Although I am sure you are acutely aware of the current economic problems facing the northwest and more specifically southern Oregon, I feel it imperative to let you know some of the effects of the spotted owl issue on law enforcement in Douglas County, Oregon.

The Douglas County Sheriff's Office is entirely funded through O & C funding. Until fiscal year 91-92, we were a 135 member department consisting of 37 patrol deputies, 31 corrections officers (jail) and 68 support personnel including detectives, booking clerks, records clerks etc... which serve a population of 94,649 people.

Our 91-92 budget received a 10% cut reducing the Department by 12 members; next year we are anticipating at least another 10% or larger budget cut for fiscal year 93-94. In the 91-92 budget cut, not only did we lose twelve people, but we also lost funding for our five man summer marijuana eradication team which locates and destroys marijuana on the national forest lands. We have been made aware that in the next few years we could conceivably reach a worst case scenario of no patrol officers at all. Although this may seem exaggerated there are already a few counties in Oregon where this has happened. This year's cuts were taken out of all divisions of the Department, however being cut severely this year means that next year all cuts will have to come from the deputy who is on patrol as everything else has been cut. Even with our current level of patrol being at 34 deputies, we are trying to service a patrol area of 5,071 square miles, which is around 149 square mile area per deputy.

Historically, the counties in Oregon have always been jointly patrolled by both county deputies and the Oregon State police. If one agency suffered a bad budget year and reduction of personnel, the other agency was able to supplement with more patrol. Unfortunately, this year the voters in Oregon passed Ballot Measure 5 which is forcing a reduction of 98 positions in the State Police which equates to even less law enforcement for Douglas County.

Douglas County faces some very unique problems in law enforcement. Although we are basically a rural, timber dependent community and don't face the problems of major urban cities with street gangs, cocaine, crack cocaine and marijuana being sold openly on every corner, we face another danger. I-5 runs 100 miles through Douglas County and large amounts of drugs and money are transported through the county. Douglas County produces more marijuana than any other county in Oregon. Also a very large amount of the methamphetamine sold on the west coast is manufactured in portable labs in the Umpqua National forest along with the marijuana being

grown there. In the past loggers have always been supportive in giving us information to help us locate and "bust" these operations. Very few of the Federal "drug war" dollars ever reach the rural areas other than from Forest Service which is for helicopter marijuana observation and some DEA funds for eradication. Currently the Federal money going to Oregon is spent mostly on prevention programs and in the northern Portland metropolitan area. With the lack of people in the forest and with diminishing law enforcement, the "dopers" will have more and more freedom for their illegal operations.

Although Douglas County government and the entire community are trying to be aggressive and innovative in securing a diversified economy for us all, without full support from our leaders in Washington DC, we will see some drastic changes for the worse in our County. This letter is being written not just to show the loss of jobs for our citizens and county employees, but because it means a breakdown in law enforcement, which equates to making Douglas County no longer a safe, desirable place for people to come to and make their homes.

Governor Sununu, I strongly urge you to assist us all in obtaining the support of President Bush, the Administration and Congress to develop a fair and equitable plan to protect both the endangered owl and the endangered citizens of the northwest.

The National School Boards Association (NSBA) is pleased to enclose a copy of a statement recently submitted to the U.S. House of Representatives Subcommittee considering the reauthorization of the Office of Educational Research and Improvement within the U.S. Department of Education.

The statement focuses on assessment and testing issues. School board members believe that national assessment issues are critically linked to school districts' policy responsibilities. National assessment should identify (1) standards that should be met; (2) the current level of achievement; and (3) strategies for moving from the current level to accomplishment of the standards. This analysis is precisely the analytical framework used at the local level as school boards set goals for their own students and develop budgets and allocate resources to accomplish their goals.

Key components of NSBA's statement include the following:

- A. NSBA continues to believe that the National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP) has value as a national information baseline on America's student performance. NSBA also supports the current experiment in reporting NAEP data by state. This limited, carefully monitored, and independently evaluated experiment has only just begun.

However, NSBA believes it is premature to consider local use of NAEP data before completion and analysis of the experimental state reporting. Furthermore, while broad generalizations can be derived from national and perhaps even state level testing, it is not clear that NAEP data can be extrapolated to have meaning at the local level.

- B. Proceeding with local reporting is out of sequence with the national standard setting process. Setting performance standards, as the National Education Goals Panel is currently doing, must precede further narrowing of data results to the local level.



A properly sequenced local report would prove greater assurance that the test will be beneficial and complement the ten-year plan for educational improvement now being developed within the context of the National Education Goals.

C.

Certain criteria are essential for any testing program that contemplates reporting of test results at the local level. Interpretive input data is an essential component that should be given prominence in local-level reporting.

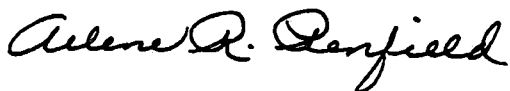
Specifically, a localized test should be tied to students' mastery of skills rather than specific subject matter. Student performance should be reported in terms of ranges of mastery, not specific test scores, and in a format that avoids generalized conclusions implying inherent differences in ability on the basis of race, national origin, or gender.

Care must be taken to assure that localization is used to assist local school districts in identifying strengths and weaknesses as they strive for educational improvement, not to mandate a national curriculum. The testing program must reflect the diversity of schools and not be yet another pointless ranking of schools and school districts.

Local test results reporting must occur in context: educational resources, community context issues, and education program information should accompany test results if assessment is to be complete.

The issue of assessment and testing is a complex one. We applaud the initiative of the National Education Goals Panel and the Council on Standards and Testing in seeking and heeding the advice of experts on the development of standards and instruments to evaluate progress toward meeting those standards.

Dear Governor:

I am writing to follow up on our discussion last month about the benefits of compressed natural gas as a transportation fuel alternative to imported crude oil.

As I said during the meeting, compressed natural gas is a win-win fuel for the Administration. Natural gas is an abundant, clean-burning and economical fuel that can significantly reduce America's reliance on foreign energy.

During our meeting, you asked me to provide you with an initiative the Administration could enact to expedite America's conversion to natural gas vehicles.

It has been brought to my attention that the Environmental Protection Agency is considering the adoption of unrealistic and unnecessary total hydrocarbon (THC) emission standards that will prevent the natural gas vehicle industry from getting off the ground. This proposal, aimed at controlling methane emissions, is apparently a new effort by the EPA to also solve global warming by reducing so-called greenhouse gasses.

For natural gas vehicles, such a standard is both unattainable and unnecessary. The end result will be that automobile manufacturers and others will not develop or invest in natural gas vehicles.

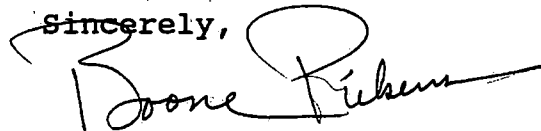

While I have been advised that EPA is on shaky legal ground in attempting to impose such an emissions standard on natural gas vehicles in the first place, I'm more concerned about its narrow focus on methane emissions in tackling the global warming phenomenon. If the EPA is truly concerned about global warming, they should take a total greenhouse gas approach and not focus solely on methane emissions. Using a broad emissions standards -- rather than a narrow and arbitrary THC requirement -- would benefit natural gas vehicles which have lower carbon dioxide and total greenhouse gas contributions than gasoline vehicles.

As I have said before, I believe the entire federal fleet should be converted to operate on compressed natural gas, and that the federal government should limit its purchase of new vehicles to CNG cars and trucks starting in 1993. If you are interested in converting the White House fleet to compressed natural gas, let me know and I'll make it happen.

Governor, your help with these administrative issues would be a tremendous boost to the critical development of natural gas-powered vehicles. Perhaps the best way to go about this would be to direct someone on your staff to work with me directly. I enjoyed our meeting, and I look forward to hearing from you soon.

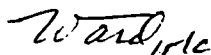

Dear Governor Sununu:

When we met with you as an industry earlier this year, we raised a number of concerns about Clean Air Act implementation. At that time, you asked that we forward a list of industry priorities.

Attached is the industry list, which has been discussed with EPA Administrator Reilly. EPA did take account of most of the industry's concerns in its final rule on Tier I car and truck emission standards.

I would like to highlight three areas of particular interest to the industry that presently are under agency review -- regulations for onboard diagnostic systems, evaporative emissions test procedures, and onboard vapor recovery systems.

Unfortunately, it appears that EPA and the California Air Resources Board (CARB) may be taking different approaches to implementation of onboard diagnostic (OBD) requirements. Meeting these requirements would be an extremely difficult technical challenge in any event, as manufacturers would be required to develop sophisticated sensors to monitor critical emission control components and signal the driver if components are not functioning properly. However, if EPA requires systems different than CARB, we do not believe we have the engineering resources to meet the mid-1990s schedule set forth in the law. The Clean Air Act refers specifically to the California OBD requirements. It makes no sense to pursue two different approaches to the same goal, and manufacturers have invested considerable resources in developing systems in an effort to comply with the technology-forcing California requirements. EPA is aware of our concerns and has indicated that it intends to consider these crucial issues during the course of the rulemaking. We encourage your support for EPA to evaluate the federal need for each of the diagnostic functions required by California, to allow manufacturers to use common systems in California and federal vehicles, and to phase in such requirements no earlier than required by California.

A situation similar to OBD exists with new evaporative emissions rules. The CARB adopted new test procedures and standards last summer that are tough and will require extensive modification to vehicles. Implementation begins with the 1995 model year and our engineers are already designing to meet these new requirements. EPA has not yet finalized rules (in fact they have never proposed standards or an implementation schedule) nor have they given us any assurance that the California approach will be acceptable. Again, it makes no sense to pursue two different approaches to the same goal and we encourage your support for an EPA rule common with California.

With respect to the onboard vapor recovery requirements, DOT continues to state its concerns over the safety of these systems. However, EPA is proceeding to develop an onboard vapor recovery rule -- at a time when the industry can ill afford non-essential expenditures. If this situation is not resolved promptly, we soon will begin incurring substantial costs to gear up for production of these systems.

EPA should publish promptly a rule that does not require onboard vapor recovery systems because of the safety risks already identified with current system designs. This will not result in any degradation in air quality because the areas of the country that need or desire refueling vapor controls are either required or permitted to impose these controls at the fueling stations. The quicker the decision, the fewer the resources that will be wasted.

Regarding stationary source issues, EPA has recognized some of our concerns in its proposal for permitting regulations under Title V. However, we remain concerned that parts of the proposal will unnecessarily restrict our operational flexibility and thereby impede our ability to compete in the world marketplace.

The process of establishing rules to implement the Clean Air Act has just begun. We were greatly encouraged by EPA's response in the Tier I rulemaking, but less encouraged on the major issues we have identified here. If we are to successfully complete this process and meet our mutual goal of clean air efficiently, it will require constant vigilance by all involved to assure that correct decisions are made in a timely manner.

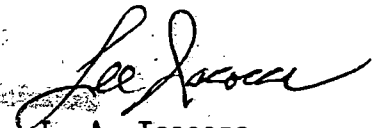

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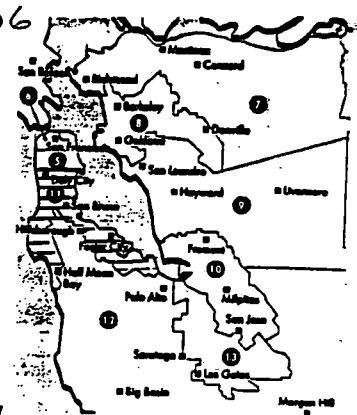

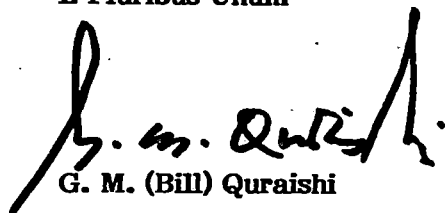

I am enclosing for your information and use an article that I just had published in several black newspapers in North Carolina in support of the Thomas nomination. It is my understanding that you played a key role in getting the president to nominate Judge Thomas; thus this letter to you.

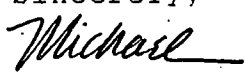

On behalf of the 97,000 local school board members across the nation, we are pleased to enclose the comments and views of local school board leaders on the development of an annual report to measure progress in attaining the national education goals. As you know, school board members are locally elected or appointed to govern the nation's school systems. As such, their views on the goals process, represented by the enclosed publication, reflect educational needs and priorities developed through representative government in the nation's 16,000 local school districts.

NSBA has followed with interest the progress of the National Education Goals Panel. This publication focuses on the proceedings of a special hearing of the panel at NSBA's annual convention last April. Nineteen school board witnesses from across the states, typically the president of a state school boards association or a representative of one of NSBA's constituent groups, such as the Council of Urban Boards of Education (CUBE), discussed their priorities and positions.

Two important themes are evident from the comments of witnesses at the hearing:

Accountability: School boards enthusiastically support the national education goals and are already working toward their accomplishment, but the problems facing children today mean that school districts alone cannot achieve the goals.

Financial Resources: To accomplish the goals, adequate financial resources must be allocated for schools and other agencies responsible for realizing the goals.

Also included in this booklet are school board members' written comments to the goals panel, NSBA's review of the recommendations of the resource groups on each goal, and the discussion document summarizing the interim resource group reports.

The booklet has been annotated so that you can easily find comments from school board members in your state.

We hope that, as a member of the Goals Panel, you find this resource helpful. If you would like additional information, please feel free to contact Michael A. Resnick, Associate Executive Director, or Martharose Laffey, Assistant Executive Director.

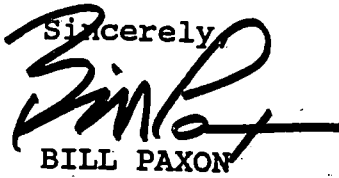

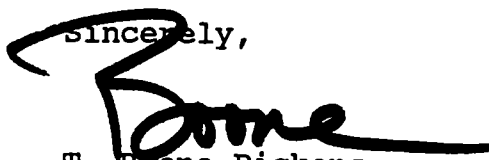

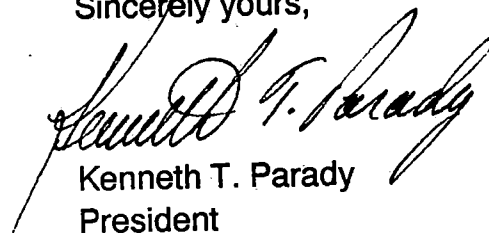
Your travel habits have caught the attention of the free loading press, who in my experienced have never paid for anything. Envy has more to do with your problem than anything else.

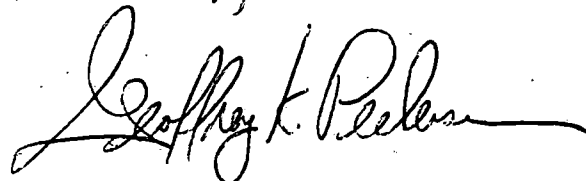

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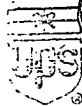

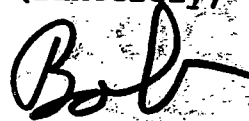

There were one or two staff members in attendance, my campaign manager, and the general chairman, Tim Lee. Tim is a fellow who worked on my staff in the late 1970s. 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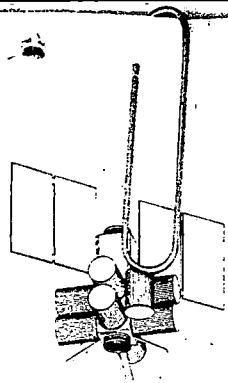

My dear John:

Your already awesome responsibilities have been extended again as a result of the current concern about, and attention being given to, the health status of our great President. As a result, I hesitate to write, but in view of the profound import of this international communications matter, I feel impelled to do so.

John, may I kindly bring to your attention three letters that were sent recently by my colleague Christopher Vizas, Vice Chairman of Orion Network Systems, to General Scowcroft, Secretary Mosbacher and Secretary Baker, urging a more open and participatory process in the current policy review regarding the restrictions that are imposed on U.S. separate satellite systems. This matter was the subject of the lead editorial in the May 8 Wall Street Journal.

I have been associated with Orion since its founding eight years ago, and have watched the company successfully overcome numerous and very difficult obstacles to the implementation of its transatlantic communications satellite venture. As you know, entry into the international communications marketplace by U.S. entrepreneurs such as the founders of Orion was made possible by the visionary policy adopted in the last administration under the leadership of President Ronald Reagan, with the unflinching support of Senator Barry Goldwater. In fact, I met with President

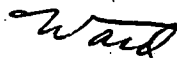
Reagan on this important area on three different occasions. He was dedicated to our concept because he felt we had planned well, offered an outstanding service, and in the spirit of American free enterprise, we would come forward with competition in great strength in the international marketplace.

While the policy of the Reagan Administration allowed the introduction of competition in international satellite communications, major restrictions were imposed on the new entrants regarding the type of traffic they could carry. Now, seven years later, the premises for those restrictions have lost most of their original force, and there is currently under review a proposal to eliminate those restrictions. As explained by Mr. Vizas in his letters to General Scowcroft, Secretary Baker and Secretary Mosbacher, Orion believes the Executive Branch review process ought to be more open and participatory, in the fashion of the procedure that was employed in 1983-84 when the present policy was debated and adopted.

John, anything you can do to ensure that the ongoing policy review process is fair, open and accessible to all interested parties would be greatly appreciated and so very much in the public interest!

As always, John, my everlasting gratitude and my warmest wishes to you and Nancy!

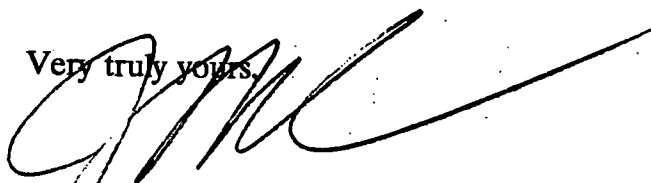
