As you probably know, your resignation has caused widespread and varied speculation as to your future plans and location. I am no exception. However, my thoughts go far beyond any vague wonderings. I have a specific question to pose to you, as follows:

First of all, I am writing you strictly as an old friend and supporter, with no official overtones or aspects. As you probably know, Dr. Claire Van Ummer-son has resigned as Chancellor of the University System of New Hampshire and will retire from the position at the end of the current school year, June 30, 1992.

The Board of Trustees has not, as yet, instituted a search for her successor, and little action has occurred in that direction. A report from a sub-committee has not yet been acted on, and until it is, and the structure and mission of the System has been determined, probably nothing will be done. However, that there will be a new Chancellor is not the question, and hence this letter.

In short, would you be interested in that position if offered to you? You know the job's requirements, you know most, if not all of the System's problems, and you well know that you are eminently and uniquely qualified for it.

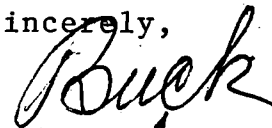

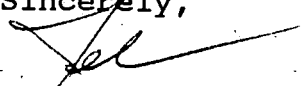

While in Kenya I had the wonderful opportunity to meet this man and learn about the work he is doing. I found him to be a man of integrity who not only loves the Lord but loves and truly cares for the country and people of Kenya; so much that he views Kenya as his home.

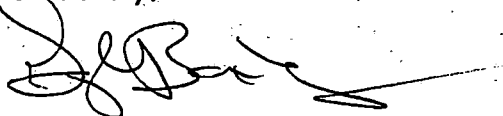
I have enclosed a copy of his letter. I do hope that you will take the time to read it closely and with an open mind.

I truly believe that President Moi and Kenya as a whole is not opposed to democracy as they are being said to be. From my contacts in Kenya I am lead to believe that they are afraid of the results that a two-party democracy could bring about when it is forced upon a people not ready for it. A simple review of other African countries shows this as well. In the November 11, 1991, issue of the U. S. News and World Report magazine an article on Russia also backs this up. One Soviet politician was quoted as saying, "The democratic experiment has failed." Another added, "It may prove to have been nothing more than a transition from totalitarianism to authoritarianism."

Corruption in the government? Yes. But it seems that all corruption is not from just Kenyans. It looks as if the United States could set the example by cleaning up its own leadership in that country before expecting great changes to come about. And suppose my thoughts are wrong, what harm could an investigation do then?

In short, why not take the time and put the effort into helping this country grow and develop so that a two-party democratic system will work effectively and Kenya could set the example for other African nations to follow.

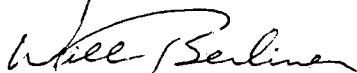

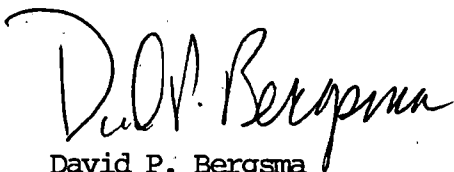

Dear Mr. Sununu:

I am writing you today regarding a very serious problem developing in California and an opportunity for the Bush Administration to take a very positive step which shows leadership and concerns about our domestic agenda.

The issue is water and the prolonged drought in California, now in its fifth year. Drought conditions are particularly severe in California (both in the North and the South) where major Federal and State water supply agencies have reduced deliveries to many users throughout the State.

Though late spring rains helped this past year, California may enter next year with water supplies at very dangerous levels.

Within the Department of Interior, the Bureau of Reclamation is the major water supplier for the Western United States. It has been called upon to assist local water agencies in meeting critical water needs.

The various interests include: 1) cities which have water deliveries for their citizens, business and industry, 2) agriculture interests which consume some 82% of the State's water; and, 3) environmental interests protecting existing fish and wildlife resources.

Unless heavy rains come within the next 150 days, California may be brought to its knees over lack of adequate rainfall.

I recommend the President use his office to lead out on this issue and offer the following recommendations:

1. Hold a special news conference.
2. Announce the creation of a special Water Commission, Office or Presidential Task Force to direct Federal Government Agencies to assist and help coordinate water management activities in the California and the affected States in the West. The future management of the Colorado River can be a key topic here.

ation of such an office will score big points in
California and other Western States.

3. Note, while the Department of Interior has their
own Drought Office, this issue needs Presidential involvement.

Should the President act now, he also has the option to
criticize the Congress for sitting on an Emergency Drought Relief
Act, H.R. 355, which has passed (in different forms) both Houses
of Congress. The bill has failed to pass due to congressional
infighting.

As a footnote, related to this whole issue is the competing
needs between the agriculture interests and the urban/suburban
interests. The urban/suburban interests are growing so quickly
in California and their water needs so basic--that the extensive
water amounts consumed by agriculture interests are now being
challenged.

I work with the Bureau of Reclamation and water users on a
daily basis. I have great confidence in Dennis Underwood, the
Commissioner of the Bureau of Reclamation. He is extremely
competent. But the agency needs help and the President's
involvement will help all parties concerned and complement what
the Department of Interior is doing.

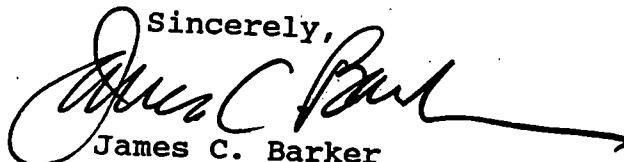
The Presidential Commission on Western Water is good public
policy. This is a method for the President to send a message
that he is "concerned" and offering leadership. If the Congress
doesn't take action swiftly on drought or other issues--he'll set
up his own "Administrative fix", to move forward with
resolutions.

Should the Congress pass a drought bill in the final days of
the session, there is still strong justification to move ahead
with a Presidential Task Force on Water Management in the West
that deals with California's growth and environmental challenges.

Dear John:

I am writing regarding the ASSIST (American Stop Smoking Intervention Study) program recently launched by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS).

On October 4, 1991, HHS Secretary Louis Sullivan announced a program to be conducted jointly by the National Cancer Institute and the American Cancer Society to promote anti-tobacco campaigns. Although I have no problem with private funds being raised and spent to promote their own special interests, I oppose spending \$135 million in federal funds on these anti-tobacco activities.

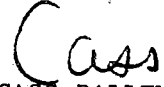
The Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) has selected 17 states to participate in ASSIST. Secretary Sullivan states that "ASSIST will empower them (local communities) by providing the information and help that they need to change attitudes about smoking and counter the sinister marketing strategies of the tobacco industry."

I would like to point out that the tobacco industry plays a significant role in the economy of North Carolina. In 1990, the tobacco industry employed 280,000 North Carolinians who earned more than \$5.7 billion in compensation. Taking into account personal and corporate income taxes, and excise, sales and property taxes, the federal government received \$1.5 billion in total tobacco tax revenues.

In light of the current budgetary problems, I doubt that this expenditure of \$135 million is the most appropriate use of scarce federal dollars considering that there are many private health organizations such as the American Cancer Society, the American Lung Association, the American Heart Association, and others at the local level that have spent millions to spread the anti-smoking message.

I appreciate your consideration of my views. Please share your thoughts on this matter with me.

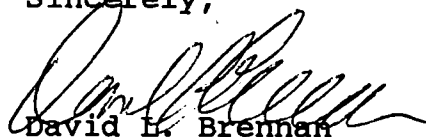

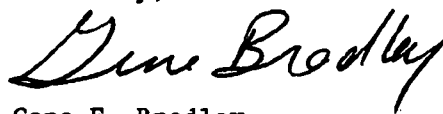

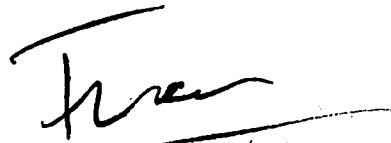

Dear Mr. Sununu:

My letter of November 8 to the president, copy of which was sent to you, stressed my fear that a collapse of the stock market could have dire consequences, and I therefore included the following paragraph:

If there is any way your team can forestall the collapse of the stock market, this would give time for stabilization of the economy.

I of course noted the recent administration proposals to revive the capital-gains tax legislation.

I respectfully suggest that such legislation at this time could cause collapse of the market. Why? Countless investors have delayed the sale of securities because of the huge gains taxes that would now accrue. Lowering of such taxes at this time could cause a deluge of selling. Is this the time to take such risks? See the attached article and note the marked paragraphs.

Incidentally, I have long been a strong supporter concerning the absolute need for lowering gains taxes, as is reflected in the attached article.

Indeed, I was among the leading causes for the substantial reduction legislated in 1978 when the gains tax was lowered from 49% to 28%. I then appeared before three Congressional committees--and was instrumental in convincing them to lower the taxes, even though President Carter had then threatened to veto such legislation. So, as you can see, very few have worked harder to achieve lower gains.

However, this definitely is not the time to change the laws. It could boomerang.

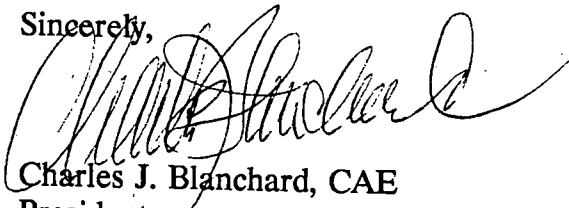

Needless to say, the business community of small and medium sized companies are outraged at the "closed door compromise" process and the resulting Civil Rights Act! The reality is that this community was frozen out of the final process. As a result an anti-business civil rights bill is now law. President Bush's change of position reflects, at best, ignorance of business' central issue - jury trials, and compensatory and punitive damages - and at worst represents a significant decline in his credibility.

The so-called compromise bill is not only bad for business, it's bad for complainants, who will suffer even longer delays in the courts; and it is bad for the general public for two reasons: (1) the court system will become even more clogged, and (2) damages are not free - costs will increase, the ability to compete worldwide will be endangered further, and some businesses will close and jobs lost. All this when a compromise of this nature was not needed.

Worst of all, with the conflicting legislative history that's been created, the final Act's meaning is anything but clear and predictable. Only the lawyers will gain from this open invitation to litigation incited by the lure of jury trials and expanded damages.

Dear Governor Sununu:

The Real Estate Council represents the public affairs interests of more than 500 of the Dallas area's leading commercial real estate owners, developers and associated professionals. As such, it is vitally interested in any legislative initiative which will impact its membership. The Intermodal Surface Transportation Infrastructure Act of 1991 (H.R. 2950) is one such initiative.

As currently proposed, H.R. 2950 fails to eliminate state regulation of rates and routes of interstate motor carriers; thereby, retaining an unnecessary regulatory regime for the trucking industry that inhibits productivity. This failure to eliminate state regulation further perpetuates resultant inequities and inefficiencies currently experienced in several economic sectors, especially the warehouse and distribution industry.

The Real Estate Council strongly recommends that language comparable to that found in Section 508(a) of your Administration's surface transportation reauthorization proposal (H.R. 1351) be included in the Intermodal Surface Transportation Infrastructure Act of 1991. Further, the Council would recommend and strongly support the veto of this or any highway transportation bill which does not include such a provision eliminating state regulation of rates, routes or services of interstate motor carriers.

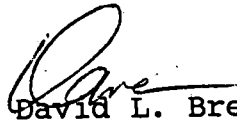
Dear John:

Thanks for taking my call today.

I learned through John Fund of the WSJ that David Duke has contacted a ballot access attorney regarding procedures for getting on state presidential ballots next year.

He wants details on GOP primary ballot position and on independent ballot position in November.

It's logical for Duke to run. Matching funds will subsidize a nationwide direct mail operation and create a truly massive list of donors. This list will be a giant cash cow for Duke to milk for the rest of his life.

In the current environment, an independent Duke campaign in November would draw in the range of 10% to 20% of the votes, quite possibly enough to elect a Democrat. And recent presidential elections have shown it's not too hard to get on the ballot everywhere.

George Wallace got 13% of the popular vote in 1968. John B. Anderson ran in the 1980 primaries, dropped out in April and still got on the November ballot.

Duke is a skilled opportunist and can be expected to do whatever is in his interest. He was pro-abortion, even pro sterilization, when the issue was framed as limiting the number of welfare babies (read blacks).

But in the gubernatorial race, with Edwards and Roemer antagonizing Louisiana's powerful pro-life forces, Duke saw his opportunity and switched. He now sounds like Henry Hyde on the issue.

If we let him, he could capture the leading-edge position on most issues central to the winning coalition of 1980, 1984 and 1988. One can easily imagine him describing the current civil rights legislation as a quota bill,

citing the Chamber of Commerce as an expert witness.

I can hear him arguing next year that both parties have failed miserably to deploy a strategic defense system at a time when a dozen third world regimes are developing nuclear weapons and no one knows who will be in control tomorrow of missiles scattered all over the old Soviet Union.

There's no way for Duke to win the election, of course. But all he has to do to defeat President Bush is to convince enough people that their interests will be served by a vote for him. A repeat of 1912.

The moderate Republican instinct will be to run from any issue Duke espouses. A fatal mistake which will enable Duke to steal our legitimate issues and drive a wedge between major elements of our winning coalition.

Right now a great many California grassroots conservatives, for example, believe that the White House is in cahoots with Gov. Wilson to destroy them. They are already angry. Can the President carry California without them if they find some place else to go in the privacy of the voting booth?

From this point on, a kinder and gentler, apparently compromising Administration would play into Duke's hands.

The only way to cope successfully with Duke, if he behaves as I expect, would be for the Administration to become much more confrontational with the liberals.

If the President were to emerge over the next few months as the intransigent leader of the conservative position on the wide range of issues which he so forcefully espoused in the summer and fall of 1988, Duke would be reduced to a "me too" role and lose his potency as a protest candidate.

If the President actually captures the enthusiasm of conservatives, he will be the only realistic alternative to a liberal takeover. He can reassemble the coalition, even with somewhat damaged credibility over the "no new taxes" pledge.

President Nixon was called "Tricky Dick" by his foes as well as by many who voted for him. Still he crushed McGovern because he really was in stark contrast against McGovern.

President Bush is still likely to have a wacko Democratic opponent.

Democratic nomination rules prevent them from responding credibly to majority opinion on limited government, national defense and traditional values.

Baring some unexpected crisis like Watergate, President Bush is still able to do as he did in 1988, solidify the winning coalition put together first for Ronald Reagan.

Assuming the Duke problem is solved, I'd like to discuss a further question. Will another landslide presidential election mean a successful second term for President Bush? Not necessarily.

Let me suggest to you the real measure of success for a 1992 Bush campaign victory.

1992 is roughly analogous to 1972 and 1984, in that an incumbent Republican president may win a landslide re-election.

The natural tendency of those who manage a president's re-election campaign is to think their success will be measured by the percentage of the popular vote the president receives, state by state and nationally.

Many of us active politically in the GOP in 1972 still gnash our teeth at the counter-productive "survey and get-out-the-vote" effort at CREEP.

In states where Nixon was already getting, say, 58 percent of the vote, his organization systematically dragged to the polls Nixon supporters whom they knew would vote against the rest of the GOP ticket. The completely predictable result: a useless, bigger victory for Nixon in that state, but the defeat of other GOP candidates.

There was, I'm sad to say, no indication in 1984 that the Reagan re-election managers missed any opportunity to pile votes on a winning margin rather than expend any political capital trying to help Republican congressional candidates.

The true measure of the success of the Bush managers in 1992 will be how they contribute to a successful second term for President Bush.

It hardly matters at all for the Bush second term whether

he wins re-election by 56 or 61 percent of the vote.

What really matters is whether or not he gets chewed up later by a hostile Congress.

Given the behavior of past Republican presidential re-election campaign managers, it's no coincidence that Republican presidential second terms are less successful than first terms.

The congressional election results, far more than the percentage of his re-election victory, determine the history of a president's second term.

If the liberals get a veto proof congress, the second term will be Hell for President Bush.

But, in fact, on some issues there's almost a veto proof Senate already. Jade West head of the Senate Steering Committee staff (and former Arlington Republican chairman) could tell you about this month's shocking weakness of the putative Bush forces in the Senate on the parental leave measure.

Already, GOP prospects appear grim in the 1992 Senate races. Poor recruitment of candidates and many incumbents now very weak in the polls.

President Bush and his White House Staff have the power to direct firmly the state and national campaign staff and the RNC staff. But, without firm guidance, the national party and the national presidential campaign staff will give congressional candidates only lip service and often treat them with loathing and contempt.

And I mean firmness. The GOP national chairman and each state Bush chairman should be given a sheet of written instructions, with an order to re-read the instructions weekly. The instructions for state Bush chairmen and all Bush fieldmen and RNC field staff could read as follows:

"Your job is to carry your state(s) for the President and to win all the Senate and U.S. House seats you can in your state(s). If you win a state by a landslide but narrowly lose any House or Senate races, you will have failed.

"We don't need a landslide. We want to win politically. And that means the president's campaign must be willing to bleed as necessary for congressional candidates. We need and want the electoral votes and the House and Senate votes."

Reports of RNC staff and Bush campaign staff should be required to include the status of relevant congressional races and what the presidential campaign and RNC are doing to insure as many House and Senate victories as possible.

In past presidential re-election years, the presidential campaign staff and the RNC staff have treated local Senate and U.S. House candidates, particularly non-incumbent GOP candidates, as ugly ducklings. Or as uninvited guests to the party.

Without going through a state by state analysis, right now, absent the firm campaign strategy I've just described for the congressional campaigns, I'd say the GOP will approximately break even in the U.S. House of Representatives, primarily due to the inevitable gains through reapportionment of seats to GOP areas.

But the Senate races look bad, very bad. I predict a loss of five to seven seats.

It doesn't have to be that bad. A thoroughly confrontational presidential campaign, a mass-based youth effort and a purposeful plan to elect Republicans to the Congress could retain the White House, net us a few U.S. Senate seats and net us twenty-five or thirty seats in the House.

Enclosed for your review and retention is a copy of Bethlehem's Report for Third Quarter 1991. Bethlehem had a net loss of \$61 million for the third quarter compared to net income of \$10 million for the third quarter of 1990. Year-to-date losses total \$129 million compared with profits of \$53 million through three quarters of 1990. Bethlehem continues to be a company in transition. Certain sections of the Report are marked to indicate areas of progress and concern.

1. Lower Prices.

Realized prices were lower in all major product lines and, on average, were at the severely depressed levels of the early 1980s.

2. Higher and Unusual Costs.

Employment costs were higher in 1991 compared to the year earlier period. Unusual costs of about \$50 million for the third quarter and \$100 million for the first nine months of 1991 were incurred in connection with a blast furnace reline at Burns Harbor and the modernization and start-up of the Sparrows Point hot strip mill.

3. Unfavorable Product Mix and Lower Shipments.

Operating results were also adversely affected by an unfavorable change in product mix due to a higher proportion of shipments of semifinished steel. Shipments

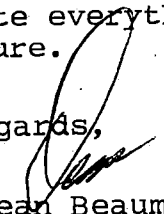

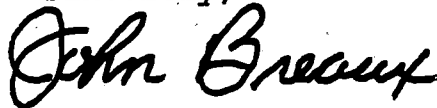

Dear Governor:

As you know, when the House takes up consideration of the Family and Medical Leave Act (H.R. 2), Congressman Charlie Stenholm of Texas is planning to offer a substitute which would give preference in re-hiring to workers who cease employment to care for young children.

The Family Research Council strongly supports the Stenholm substitute and we join the U.S. Chamber of Commerce in urging the President to endorse this family-friendly alternative to the Family and Medical Leave Act. Indeed, White House support is needed to ensure that the Stenholm proposal garners the maximum number of votes possible.

As the enclosed fact sheets indicate, we believe the Stenholm substitute avoids the major problems associated with the Family and Medical Leave Act. It facilitates -- rather than hinders -- long-term parent-child interaction. It minimizes "burden shifting" to other workers and their families. It promotes flexible employment policies rather than one-size-fits-all mandated benefits.

Governor, we believe the Stenholm proposal gives the President an opportunity to reclaim the moral high ground on work and family issues. We urge the White House to endorse publicly this important legislation which makes it easier for parents to devote greater time and attention to childrearing.

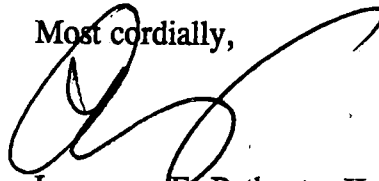
