Dear Governor Sununu:

Yesterday Director John Turner indicated that he was prepared to issue a rule in December or January designating something close to seven million acres as Critical Habitat for the Spotted Owl. This represents a reduction from the F&WS first proposal to designate 11.4 million acres. Turner is convinced that if he reduces the acreage significantly below the seven million acre level he will lose in court and the Northwest timber program will remain subject to sweeping injunctions.

It is a very rough estimate that a seven million acre set aside would reduce the Northwest federal timber harvest level to 2.3 billion board feet. This harvest level compares to the 1989 level of 5 billion and the 1990 "compromise" level of 3.9 bbf. When you understand that each billion board feet represents 18,000 jobs -- you understand why Northwest working families will not be happy with a seven million acre set aside.

As you know Senator Packwood and I have argued for a critical habitat designation of no larger than five million acres. We have asked that the Administration issue a critical habitat designation and a recovery plan which encompasses no more than this amount. In addition we have asked that the President ask Congress to ratify and give legal protection to any such action.

I am convinced that Director Turner intends not to move much further in the direction Senator Packwood and I have proposed. I am also persuaded, to my intense regret, that the Endangered Species Act, as presently written, may well prevent significant additional movement on his part.

As a consequence, I suggest that Director Turner be encouraged to reduce the critical habitat designation and Interior be encouraged to reduce the scope of the recovery plan as far as possible, but within his context of presenting a

proposal that will pass legal muster without the aid of Congressional action. Then, as these proposals are made public, the President should announce that his Administration has gone as far as it can go, within the confines of the Endangered Species Act, to achieve a balance that recognizes, people, families and communities but he is still unable to achieve the balance he desires. To achieve the proper balance now requires congressional action. The President should call on Congress immediately to amend the Endangered Species Act. If the administration is unwilling, yet, to take this step the President could, alternatively, request that Congress pass the Packwood Labor-Management bill. This bill has already been endorsed by the administration and provides long-term protection for the forests and working families, and jobs and communities. He should ask Congress for a prompt, but temporary, ratification of the critical habitat designation and of the recovery plan, and should also ask Congress for a statutory reduction of critical habitat to about four million acres and a recovery plan allowing an annual cut of about 3.2 billion board, all in a way as consistent as possible with wildlife values.

I also suggest that he make that announcement in the northwest to an appreciative audience of working people. Creating the knowledge that the President cares will do wonders for their spirits and for his popularity.

All too often, as the only Certified Soil Scientist with an engineering degree (B.S.-Civil) performing wetland scientist services in the state, I am outnumbered and feel out-voiced. My prior knowledge gained as an urban planner/designer combined with many community lectures keep me informed to compassionately assist my clients toward understanding wetlands criteria in development of their lands.

I feel New Hampshire's state and local developmental review boards are striving in good conscience to adopt guidelines and criteria for delineating wetlands they feel will protect the environment. Many times, they adopt guidelines on face value without understanding the implications. All too often, I will confront an inexperienced public official who identifies an 8' x 8' puddle on my clients property as a sensitive wetlands. I will most likely disapprove his claims through documentation and data sheets at additional expense and time to all.

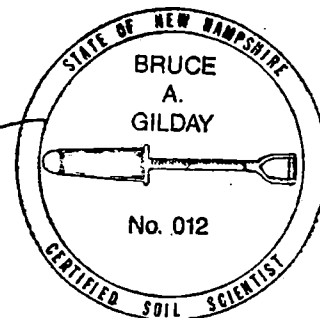

Dear Governor Sununu:

I enjoyed the opportunity of having breakfast with you last Friday in Houston. It is commendable that you were so generous with your time, in spite of the many issues demanding your attention. Realizing the demands on your attention, I want to take this opportunity to reiterate the points I made during our breakfast.

The first point was on the NAFTA negotiation of the financial services. I know that you will agree that U.S. banks need to have the same privileges in Mexico that Mexican banks have in the United States. That is not the case now. Mexican banks are allowed to have operating offices in the United States and are taking business away from American banks. A phase in of United States bank services in Mexico is not acceptable to the United States banking industry.

Further on this point, foreign banks operating in the United States are not subject to the same regulatory requirements that we have. I mentioned at breakfast the specific case of financing trade with Ecuador. United States banks cannot confirm letters of credit from banks in Ecuador to finance exports. Under the present regulations, such letters of credit will be classified substandard. The Ecuadorian banks, knowing that United States banks cannot confirm their letters of credit, send this export business to European banks operating in New York. These European banks are not subject to the substandard classification imposed by the Comptroller of the Currency on the United States banks.

These and other issues on the international competitiveness of United States banks are covered in the results of a task force led by Congressman John La Falce of New York.

The second point that I wanted to make is regarding export incentives. I have recently learned that the Office of Management and Budget has reallocated the subsidy to the loan program of Eximbank to the detriment of the guarantee program. The loan program is normally accessible to large corporations selling

abroad. The guarantee program is used by commercial banks to finance exports for their customers, most of which are small and medium size companies which may not have access to the loan program. Although I am sure that there are good reasons for this reallocation, I see this as another discouragement for the smaller sector of the export community.

These points are brought to your attention in the spirit of constructive criticism. I believe that the reason you dedicated so much time to us Friday was to hear the issues from our point of view. I will be happy to work with your staff in expanding on these issues.

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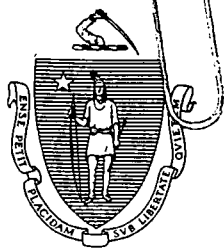

I am remiss in not writing much sooner to thank you for your time and for your hospitality during my visit there earlier this month. It was grand to see you again, and to have that relaxed opportunity to talk with you about various issues relating to higher education and relationships with the Federal Government.

I am writing to urge the Administration to consider accelerating its plans to lift the economic embargo in Vietnam.

Assuming Vietnam signs the Paris accords this week, it seems to me the Administration would be well-served, (along with US companies wishing to renew trade relations with Vietnam) by lifting the embargo on trade in non-strategic commercial activity.

Using our own company as an example, AIG operated in Vietnam for many decades up to the US withdrawal in 1975. While the country remains severely underdeveloped, its people, resources, and market pose significant opportunities for businesses that we serve and that we are now in. Furthermore, entire accounts of many of our East Asian based clients are being lost, particularly in marine insurance, as we are prohibited by US law from providing coverage for that portion of their trade with Vietnam. Needless to say, the only businesses benefitting are our competitors from Europe and Asia who are not bound by the embargo.

It seems to me that the Administration should lift the US embargo between now and early next year, after which time election politics could make relaxation of the embargo difficult for another year. Increased US contact and commercial activity now should be beneficial to those families who have legitimate concerns about MIA cases that remain unresolved.

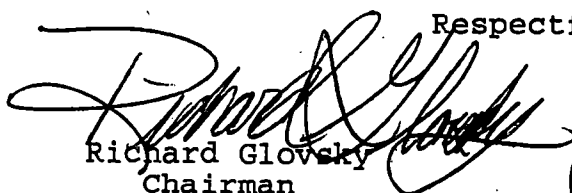

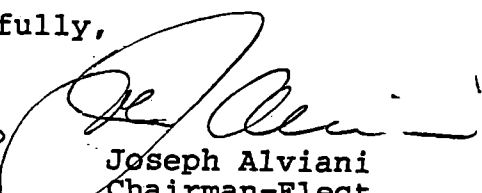

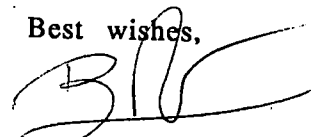

Pursuant to our conversation at the White House reception, permit me to take this opportunity to stress several critical facts regarding Israel's request for United States loan guarantees.

With respect to the notion that Israel was recalcitrant in its unwillingness to yield on the Administrations's request for a 120 day delay, I have been told that the Administration was informed that the 120 day delay was negotiable, provided that there would be some assurance of the approval of the loan guarantees at the end of that period. It is clear to me, from many discussions with Israeli officials, that, contrary to some opinion in the Executive Branch, the issue of a delay of 120 days was not the most critical matter. The Israeli economy can sustain the delay period without much difficulty. However, Israeli officials are most concerned about the perception that the approval of the guarantees will be predicated upon other "peace process" issues.

As you may know, the price tag of fully assimilating one million Soviet immigrants into Israel by 1995 will be about \$25 billion in foreign exchange requirements. The Israelis project that they will have to build about 300,000 housing units, and that they will have to create roughly 450,000 jobs for the Soviet immigrants expected to arrive through 1995. The difficulties in achieving this absorption forced the Israeli government to spend \$3.8 billion on its absorption program in fiscal year 1990, which ended in March 1991. It is obvious that the enormous flow of immigrants will cause an overextension of Israeli resources.

With respect to the issue of Israel's standing as a credit prospect, a study undertaken by Salomon Brothers released in September, 1991 states that Israel is considerably higher in credit quality than is generally surmised. Salomon Brothers believe that while Israel is often placed in a "developing country" category, it should be compared with industrialized democracies. Israel's economy is industrialized and diversified, and as in other developed countries, services make up the largest portion of GDP (53%), while manufacturing and construction account for another 40%. Agriculture, which is the leading sector of most developing countries accounts for only 7%.

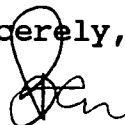
Salomon Brothers also believes that Israel is currently underated as a debtor. They believe that Standard and Poor, which has given Israel a BBB rating, has based its evaluation on the geopolitical risks Israel faces in a very tumultuous part of the world, rather than on real economic indices. Salomon Brothers believes a single A rating would be more appropriate.

From the many conversations I have had, I believe the American Jewish community is increasingly critical of the Administration's handling of our Middle East policy. I believe it is in the Administration's interest to try to alleviate some of the tensions that have emerged during the last two years. The way the issue of the loan guarantees is dealt with at the conclusion of the 120 day period will be an essential element of the healing process.

Opening the door for free Soviet emigration has been a tenet of United States policy for decades. It is obvious that our policies toward the Soviet Union have been successful, and we should be taking credit for lifting the iron curtain of restrictive emigration, rather than limiting emigration by hesitating on loan guarantees. I believe it is essential for you to give consideration to promptly extending these guarantees based on Israel's need, as well as its credit worthiness. It was a pleasure speaking with you two weeks ago.

We want to bring to your attention the House Wednesday Group paper, "Moving Ahead: Expanding Opportunity in America," which will be released this Tuesday, October 22. The paper reflects nearly two years of significant effort by our group with the central theme of finding and addressing causes of poverty and underclass formation.

Twenty-three members of the Wednesday Group have signed on to the paper, which finds that three root causes of long-term poverty are: an increase in single-parent, female-headed families, low commitment to work among the poor, and stagnant or declining wages. We propose a "New Social Covenant" among all levels of government, national and community leaders, parents, and the poor themselves and suggest ways for Congress to fulfill its part of the Covenant.

As you know, the House Wednesday Group is a by-invitation caucus of thirty-seven Republican members of the House, reflecting the geographical and ideological spectrum within our party. Members meet weekly to share information and to discuss ideas and mutual concerns. From time to time, the group holds seminars on topics of mutual interest and undertakes research projects.

We are optimistic that this work can contribute in significant ways to the debate on these issues. In that spirit, we commend it to your attention, and look forward to discussing our findings and proposals with you.

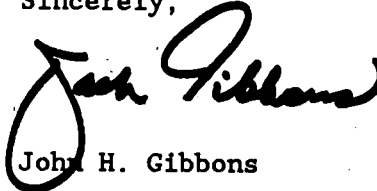

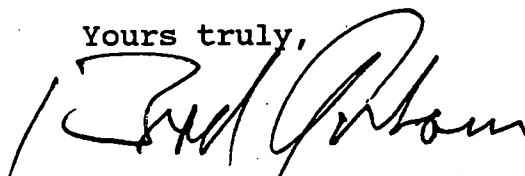

Dear Governor:

I believe it is becoming increasingly clear that the administration must formulate an economic incentive package to restore confidence and give the economy a jump start. An integral part of the package should be a capital gains tax cut.

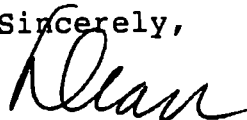
On July 31 I introduced HR 3128, the All Americans Savings and Investment Incentive Act of 1991. I believe my bill, which implements the President's capital gains proposal contained in his February budget submission, and includes a lower- and middle-income interest income exclusion, would be an ideal vehicle for the capital gains component of any package the administration endorses.

My bill is deliberately balanced to blunt the so-called "fairness" issue which the Democrats raise every time we propose pro-growth measures. By making a \$350 interest income exclusion available to all tax filers with an adjusted gross income up to \$50,000 (\$700 for married filing jointly) we would be giving a \$10.4 billion tax break to the 137 million Americans who would be eligible. This would be a tax cut paid for by a tax cut -- that is the sort of tax policy I think we can all support.

My bill has attracted 80 cosponsors to date -- more than any other capital gains proposal in the House. I believe this high level of support reflects the fact that my bill is both good policy and good politics. I urge you to give my proposal your careful consideration.

At this critical juncture in the reauthorization of the nation's transit and highway programs, I want to call your attention to a study just completed which demonstrates the enormous benefit that increased transit investment can have on the nation's economy.

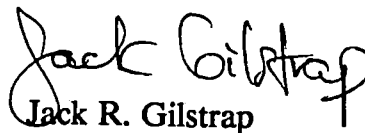
The analysis, carried out by Dr. David Alan Aschauer, indicates that increased transit investment has twice the impact on national productivity growth that comparable levels of increased highway investment would have. A copy of the report, a fact sheet and a recent press release are attached.

As you know, Dr. Aschauer has led the way in the national research effort that has demonstrated the critical importance of public infrastructure investment to the nation's economic growth and productivity. More recent studies by Dr. Aschauer and others have established a similar link between transportation investment, including highway spending.

These most recent findings on the major economic impact of transit investment should be reflected in funding priorities of the reauthorization bill under consideration in Congress, and should be supported by the Administration. In particular, they demonstrate the importance of supporting the increase in transit funding proposed in revisions to the House reauthorization proposal.

I hope you find the study results informative and useful. In conjunction with the already well-established air quality and energy benefits of increased transit investment, it clearly signals the importance of transit to our national economy.

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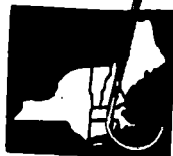

Thank you for once again taking a few moments to speak with me and especially for agreeing to speak at a fund raising event in Quebec for the French Language Foundation during your last visit to Manchester, provided that the State Department and the White House press are in agreement. We presume everyone will be in agreement since raising funds for an educational foundation would fit in perfectly with the President's emphasis on education.

As you know, the foundation has, up to now, sponsored a French language contest in all the grammar and high schools in New England and New York State. We have had as many as 42,000 participants in a given year. The foundations funds have been utilized for conducting the contest, providing prize monies and college scholarships. The foundation has also assisted Franco-American writers and artists and sponsored francophone cultural events. The Board is made up of prominent Francos, French teachers, college professors and representatives from several of the State Education Departments of New England (MA, ME, CT, NH).

Quebec, as you know, pledged \$100,000 at the Quebec Summit and has to date given 1/3 of its commitment. The \$100,000 is contingent to our raising \$300,000. My company has donated approximately \$150,000 and Hydro Quebec has contributed substantial sums to support the annual contests. The foundation has \$215,000 on hand.

After discussing your willingness to participate with individuals in Quebec with whom I had previously been in contact, it has been decided that the event would best be held in Montreal rather than in Quebec City for a host of reasons... Language - central location - larger audience - media access etc.

The Quebec Chamber of Commerce will co-host the event with the Secretariat Permanent Des Peuples Francophones of Quebec City. Pierre Descoteau, the former Hydro Quebec official in charge of the N.Y.C. office, is now the Chamber's Executive Director. We are considering an affair similar to the Manchester banquet in which you would be honored for your major contributions to Quebec/New Hampshire relations during your term as Governor.

The banquet would be preceded by two receptions which would go on simultaneously...one exclusive, one of the general audience.

All of this has been kept limited to the Chamber Board's knowledge and only a few individuals at the top level of the Quebec government have been consulted. Everything will be kept at that level until such time as we've been able to work out all the details. Then, a formal invitation would be sent to you by the Quebec Chamber of Commerce to speak at the Montreal function.

I presume that you will want to name someone from your staff to coordinate things with me and be my contact person so we can make sure everything comes off like clockwork. I can be reached at home (603) 622-9812 - office 800-343-7923 - auto (603) 425-9440.

The Chamber is recommending the following theme for your conference.

Will the new world economic and political order resulting from the recent events in Central and Eastern Europe have an impact on the free trade project between Canada, U.S. and Mexico?

The theme is suggested because it would give you the opportunity to touch on economic (free-trade) and political (the events in USSR and Yugoslavia) considerations which we think will be of interest to your audience.

We feel the banquet should be held in the evening around 7:30p.m. and we expect over 300 guests. The event could be held on the following dates:

November 27 or 28, 1991
December 4, 5 or 11, 1991

Since we will need to quickly reserve a hotel, would you please advise if any of the above dates can fit into your schedule.

Finally, I've been told that the Prime Minister of Quebec has advised that he will personally greet you in Montreal assuming that there is no conflict in schedules even though it will be well understood that this will be a non-governmental, non-political event.

In closing may I once again thank you on behalf of the Board of Directors of the French Language Foundation for your willingness to assist the foundation in a fund-raising event.

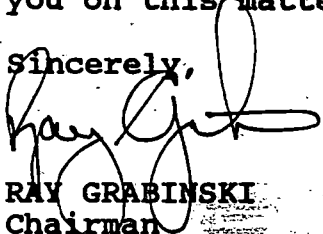

I believe that the session papers and discussions are unusually thoughtful. They are likely to be of interest to those who are concerned with whether and how nuclear power can be broadly acceptable in the future. Because of your evident interest in these questions, I am sending you the enclosed copy of the *Proceedings*.

I hope that you will find this material interesting. If you would like any information about the MIT Program for Advanced Nuclear Power Studies, or if you have any comments concerning the First MIT International Conference on the Next Generation of Nuclear Power Technology, I would enjoy hearing from you.

Finally, I should note that our series of international conferences on future nuclear power technology is intended as a vehicle for stimulation of consensus regarding how to achieve a broadly acceptable technology. It is intended to foster the refinement of ideas and an intellectual community concerning this topic. The Second MIT International Conference on the Next Generation of Nuclear Power Technology is now being organized for October 13 and 14, 1992. Your ideas regarding how to enhance the value of this conference would be greatly appreciated.

Dear Governor Sununu:

Here is an idea for solving a major problem in the Russian economy at minimal cost to US taxpayers while returning potential benefits to American business.

It seems obvious that the Russians have a greater ability to produce than to distribute. The type of distribution infrastructure that exists here is absent there. A first priority, therefore is to help them build multiple distribution systems so that their agricultural and industrial products can get to market.

I would suggest that we (and our West European allies) ask major American and European distribution companies like Federal Express, trucking companies and freight forwarders, wholesalers and distribution experts to begin operations in Russia. The US and the Western governments would subsidize these companies through loans applicable to their costs in Russia only. They would undertake to build organizations in Russia which could carry the goods of the former Soviet Union to market.

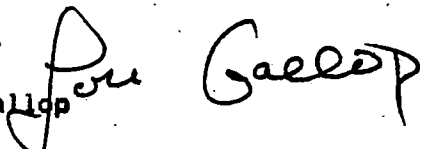
Profits made from these ventures by the western companies would be shared with the governments making the subsidies. Eventually, the Russian divisions of the western companies would be sold to the executives of those companies, Russians, who had been trained to carry on.

I do not want to see lots of money funneled into Russia to disappear into a drain of inefficiency. To the extent that the western companies selected for this scheme are responsible to the US and their own governments for repayment of the funds advanced, the scheme will be successful.

Due to ill health, Congressman D. French Slaughter Jr. of the 7th District of Virginia has resigned his seat effective Nov. 5.

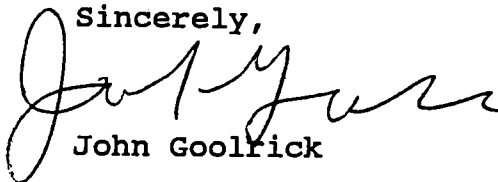
On Nov. 5 an election will be held to choose his successor. It will be one of only several congressional elections in the nation this year.

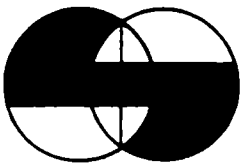

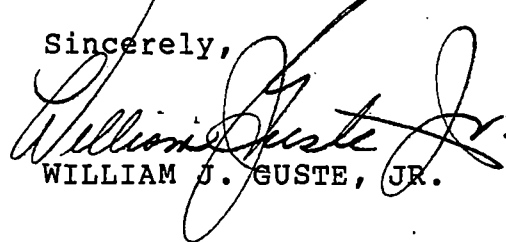

Let me compliment you and the President on a superb Summit meeting in Moscow. History was made with the dramatic signing of the START Treaty and hopefully the Middle East peace conference will commence sometime in October. Everyone in the country is extremely pleased with the positive results achieved by the Administration.

As I mentioned to you on the telephone before you left for the Soviet Union, I strongly suggest that the President consider a short bilateral visit to Switzerland sometime this year. "Close" and "cordial" define very well the relationship between this country and ours. Although there are significant differences between us at times in terms of our respective approaches to world affairs, we generally see the world in the same way and can be considered good friends.

The Swiss recently authorized the purchase of 34 FA-18 fighter planes subject to parliamentary approval. I feel that a visit by the President would be helpful in demonstrating a strong, positive rapport between the two countries and would be meaningful in engendering parliamentary support for this significant plane transaction of over \$2 billion. The timing of the visit would also coincide with Switzerland's celebration of its 700th anniversary, a meaningful accomplishment. Dear John:

The standing of President Bush in the eyes of Pacific Northwest working people is being severely damaged by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. I commend the Bush Administration for its recent decision to completely eliminate private lands from the designation of the northern spotted owl's critical habitat. Actions taken and statements made by the Fish and Wildlife Service since that decision, however, are being linked to the President and are angering the people of the region.

Most citizens assume that the actions and statements of the Fish and Wildlife Service represent President Bush's desired policy and, thus, the President is held accountable when the Fish and Wildlife Service acts and speaks. First, the Service's proposed policies to protect the northern spotted owl threaten the jobs of tens of thousands of working families by putting millions of acres of timberland off limits to productive forestry, causing anger and hostility toward the Administration.

Then, adding outrage to anger, Service employees are engaged in a consistent public relations effort to deny that actions under their cherished Endangered Species Act are responsible for any job losses. Why? Because Service employees seek to protect the Endangered Species Act from any congressional effort to amend it. The result is that the President is seen as implementing spotted owl policies that destroy jobs and then is guilty of failing to admit that the jobs are being destroyed because of those policies.

On August 8, the Seattle Post-Intelligencer reported the Fish and Wildlife Service as explaining that, "log exports and automation are more to blame for the loss of Northwest timber jobs than is protection of the northern spotted owl under the Endangered Species Act." Northwest Regional spokesman David Klinger stated that the majority of jobs lost to owl protection are the result of actions taken by the Forest Service to comply with wildlife laws other than the Endangered Species Act. Another spokesperson, Cindy Barry, is represented as saying that

only a 15 percent decrease in log exports would counteract all impacts caused by listing the owl and designating its critical habitat.

News reporters in the Northwest have been the target of numerous, consistent contacts from Fish and Wildlife Service regional employees. Some reporters have concluded that the agency is attempting to relieve pressure from the upcoming debate over reauthorization of the Endangered Species Act. They believe that this also explains the agency's efforts to minimize reports of job losses resulting from the critical habitat proposal. I expect news reports to this effect soon.

Blaming private log exports and automation for today's job losses is a red herring. In fact, private log export restrictions will result in long-term losses in timber employment. Such restrictions will eliminate markets for private forestland owners, force export customers to buy logs from other countries, and slash the price of domestic logs. Most importantly, such restrictions will eliminate the market options of private landowners and will constitute a taking of private property rights. By closing markets to private landowners, private log export restrictions will eliminate any incentive for private landowners to retain their land as productive forestland and will lead to the wide-spread conversion of millions of acres of private forestland into commercial developments.

Automation of sawmills accounted for some net loss of timber jobs in the early 1980s. This was done so that Northwest mills could remain competitive. But that work is complete. Professor Brian Greber at Oregon State University asserts that there is no more room for automation in Northwest mills; automation has already taken its bite out of the job pie.

And yet, the Fish and Wildlife Service will continue its efforts to deny that locking up millions of acres of timberlands is causing job losses unless a consistent effort is made within the Administration to either lessen the impacts of Fish and Wildlife decisions or confront their reality head-on. I have advocated the former for several years. Most recently, I have suggested that the Administration, to the full extent allowed by the Endangered Species Act, reduce the critical habitat designation.

In order to rest control of this decision-making process from the grip of regional Fish and Wildlife Service employees, I strongly recommend that the Secretary of the Interior withdraw the delegation of authority for this designation. Authority for making the critical habitat designation now rests with John Turner, Director of the Fish and Wildlife Service, and the

Northwest regional office of the Service. The Secretary should withdraw this authority and make the designation himself. This will reduce any further influence that the regional office might have in the decision.

Also, I recommend that the Administration act to put the lie to the "log export and automation" red herrings. The Council of Economic Advisors should be asked to conduct a complete and thorough economic analysis of the results of a ban on private log exports and the impact of automation on timber-related jobs.

Dear Governor Sununu,

I am writing today to request your assistance in bringing a matter to the attention of President Bush. I wrote to him (a copy of the letter is enclosed) on April 30, 1991 but, I haven't received an answer.

Two people that you know, Jon "Ken" Dollard and Attorney John Korbey, know me and will verify that I'm a well meaning and sincere individual.

My background is:

1. Four years in the U.S.A.F. as an air traffic controller.
2. Fourteen years with the F.A.A. as a controller at the New York and Boston Air Route Traffic Control Centers.
3. Four months as an ironworker at the Seabrook Nuclear Powerplant.
4. Almost ten years as owner of Backmann Florist in Derry.
5. I'm active in the community. I am a member and past President of the Derry Rotary Club (we met at a meeting held at the Derry Boy's Club) as well as a member and past President of the local Chamber of Commerce. I've recently entered politics. In March I defeated May Casten (I bet that name rings a bell) for her District Council seat.

The members of PATCO that were fired by President Reagan have been treated too harshly. We were stripped of our profession and cast aside. The vast majority of these people are veterans that served this country well in both war and peacetime.

It is time to restore our dignity with a Presidential pardon and allow us to return to a profession that desperately needs our expertise.

What I propose is opening an Office of Reconciliation to contact as many fired controllers as possible. Of the 11,000+ I feel that roughly one third would want to go back and be able to pass the physical. Over the next few years these people could be fed back into the system saving the tremendous costs that the F.A.A. is now paying for training.

With Labor Day and the election coming up a pardon and rehiring program would also create a positive image on the domestic scene.

I hope that you can find the time to bring this to President Bush's attention. The country sorely needs the men and women that were fired. Quite frankly, many of our people also are in need of good jobs. The stigma of being fired by the President of the United States has had a profound effect on many employment opportunities.
