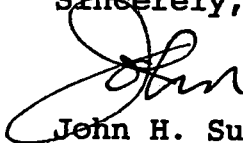
Thank you for your memorandum outlining your concern about the suspension provisions in the President's food safety initiative. I appreciate your frank and candid assessment.
