I've taken the liberty of forwarding a copy of your letter to the Department of Labor for further consideration. But in the interim, here is some of what I've found out about this from the Department of the Treasury.

Benefits under the Social Security system are computed based on wages subject to the FICA. Because employees in many service industries rely primarily on tips for wages, benefits based on their regular wages alone would be far below other employees with similar compensation. To equalize the benefits available to these employees, Congress in 1965 included tips in the definition of wages for purposes of the FICA tax on employees.

Although including tips in the wages increased the benefits for employees, the employers were not funding their share of the benefit costs. The difference resulted in a subsidy from other employers. To eliminate this unfair subsidy, the definition of wages for purposes of the FICA employer tax was expanded in 1977 to include tips included in wages for minimum wage purposes, and again in 1987 to include all tips.

It is not unusual for statutory definitions to be different depending upon the purpose they serve. For example, not all
