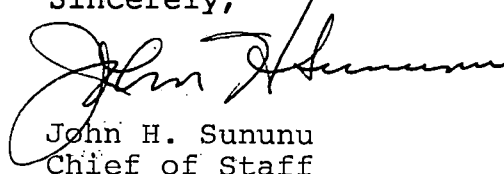
As I indicated to you previously, the Administration strongly opposes any boycott of Salvadoran coffee. This misguided attempt to cripple the Salvadoran economy will hurt peasant farmers, small producers, and other employees in the coffee industry, causing innocent people further hardship. The boycott will do nothing to advance the peace process, democracy, or human rights, which are fundamental aims of this Administration.

The Catholic bishops of El Salvador spoke out against the coffee boycott in an open letter to the U.S. bishops on May 23. The bishops declared that the boycott is unjust and that it is aimed at continuing abroad the economic war against the Salvadoran economy which the FMLN guerrillas have waged for the last 10 years.

The television advertisement implying that your company is responsible for bloodshed in El Salvador is offensive. In any event, I question the right of any government official to second-guess advertising decisions made by Procter & Gamble or anyone else.

Supporting democracy is in the best interest of the Salvadoran people and is a foreign policy objective of the United States.
