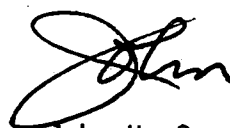
I had our staff in Presidential Personnel look into your request that Philip English be appointed to a position at GSA.

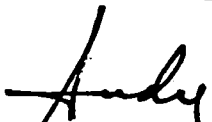
Governor Sununu asked me to look into your concerns regarding the disposition of Pease Air Force Base which is slated for closure under the Base Closure and Realignment Act of 1988.

There is no legal impediment that the Defense Department is not allowed to transfer the land without compensation. This is consistent with the opinion the Congressional Research Service obtained at your request.

The Defense Department will review the situation, but no decision has been made. Recognize that even if a decision is made to transfer the land, DOD is required under the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) to conduct an environmental impact study. The NEPA process, however, is very time consuming and is not expected to be completed until next June.

Please know that we appreciate your concerns and have shared them with the appropriate officials as well.
