I look forward to working with you to see that a more equitable, fair bill is passed in keeping with the President's goal that all Americans be protected from employment discrimination.

Dear Chuck:

I want to thank you for your letter enclosing copies of your correspondence with Secretary Dole and the Actors Equity Board. Both attachments were very interesting.

I think that you are absolutely right regarding the importance of the Supreme Court's Beck decision and the principles upon which it is based. President Bush took note of the decision last year in announcing his campaign finance reform package. That groundbreaking proposal (which, by the way, would eliminate special interest political action committees subsidized by business or labor groups) features a provision codifying the principles set forth in Beck, and the Administration views that codification as a key element of our package.

Congress has not acted upon the President's proposal. Both Houses, rather, have passed significantly flawed bills that would further reduce true competition in congressional campaigns. Among other problems, the Senate-passed version unfortunately would scale back the protection that Beck provides for working Americans. No campaign finance bill has yet been presented to the President for his signature or veto.

The Bush Administration strongly opposes any weakening of Beck, and believes that workers should not be coerced unfairly into paying agency fees or union dues used to advance political or policy goals outside the collective bargaining context.

Your comments on this issue are helpful, and I do appreciate your writing.

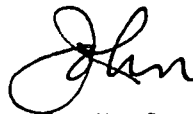

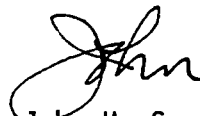

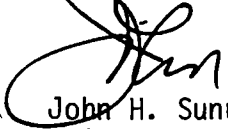
