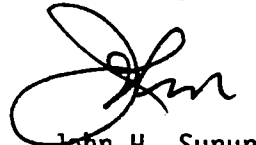

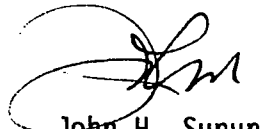

Dear Bernie,

Thank you for your November letter regarding the concerns you have for the impacts of combined sewer overflow requirements on states and localities and the need for EPA to allow for flexibility in meeting these requirements.

EPA advises me that although its national strategy was not issued until 1989, the basic requirements to meet technology-based and water quality standards have been part of the Clean Water Act since the early 1970s. Because combined sewer overflow discharges had been largely unaddressed and Congress had become increasingly interested in finding a legislative remedy to accelerate action, the EPA strategy was issued to address the problem consistent with the requirements of the current statute.

Your letter raises the issue of in-plant bypasses and indicates that EPA requirements force communities to discharge combined sewage upstream of treatment plants. EPA notes that discharges upstream must meet the same basic requirements in the law (technology-based standards and water quality standards) and that any treated flow would violate these requirements, regardless of whether it was located at the facility or upstream of the plant.

EPA believes there may be some misunderstanding about its current requirements for combined sewer overflow. The existing regulations defining secondary treatment apparently do allow for some flexibility in setting secondary treatment percentage removal requirements to take into account the special nature of combined sewer flows. A copy of a letter from EPA's Region 1 office in Boston explaining the flexibility available is attached.

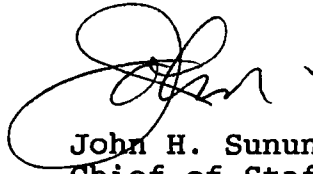
EPA does recognize the economic impacts of combined sewer overflow on states and localities that are not now meeting the statutory requirements. In fact, I am told the agency is presently reviewing its overall approach to wet weather flows, including combined sewer overflow, storm water, urban nonpoint source runoff and water quality standards. EPA is investigating ways to link these various provisions of the law more effectively to reduce the volume of water and harmful pollutants that enter

systems during wet weather flows, thereby reducing the amount of water that must be subjected to expensive treatment processes before it can be discharged in full compliance with state water quality standards.

I would encourage you to contact David Fierra in EPA's Boston office to further discuss the concerns you raised.
