Thank you for your letter expressing your concern about an amendment relating to natural gas imports adopted by the Senate Energy Committee during its consideration of S. 341. Among other things, this amendment would require that approval of natural gas imports be conditioned to "redress any anti-competitive impacts" on U.S. producers, including "competitive disparities resulting from different rate designs applied to the transportation of domestic gas and imported supplies."

The United States Trade Representative (USTR) has determined that this amendment raises a number of concerns in our trade relations, including issues related to the United States-Canada Free Trade Agreement. The Independent Petroleum Association of American (IPAA), a chief supporter of the amendment, has agreed that the concerns noted by the USTR should be addressed in the language of the amendment. Accordingly, this Administration is working with the sponsors and supporters of this amendment to address their concerns regarding differences in Canadian and U.S. natural gas pipeline rate designs in a manner that does not entail any actions violative of the Canadian Free Trade Agreement.

You may be assured that this Administration will not support any legislation which violates the obligations of the United States to the Free Trade Agreement.

Dear Mr. Chairman,

I appreciate your recent letter and your interest in the Administration's efforts to stop illegal drug use. As you know, President Bush has moved forward quickly on this matter by adding substantial resources to law enforcement, treatment, prevention, and international initiatives. In addition, the President has worked closely with former Drug Policy Director William Bennett and current Drug Policy Director Bob Martinez. We believe we have a good strategy; one that integrates effectively all parts of the federal government and one that is working. Thus far, the response is encouraging since drug use numbers appear to be dropping in many of the major urban areas.

In response to your inquiry as to who is responsible for the day-to-day direction of the nation's war on drugs, I would suggest that you work with the person the President works with, Bob Martinez. I do not believe there is any doubt within the Administration as to who is in charge of coordinating and implementing our Federal Drug Control Strategy.

The Administration forged a sound strategy; it has provided record amounts of resources; and the President has made sure that the Office of National Drug Control Policy has the strong leadership necessary to get the job done. In the next few weeks, we will be forwarding to Congress a package of legislative amendments needed to strengthen existing drug laws and implement our National Strategy. Several of these amendments are ones which Congress has failed to act on in the past, amendments which would assist us in more effectively fighting the war on drugs. We certainly hope that we can count on your help in seeing that no effort is spared to get these amendments passed into law and that the President's drug control budget request is fully funded.

Thank you for your letter last month conveying your government's concerns regarding a pending investigation under the Generalized System of Preferences (GSP) program of El Salvador's worker rights practices.

By law, the United States Trade Representative (USTR) must investigate allegations that a government has failed to respect internationally accepted worker rights and thus is not entitled to GSP benefits. After petitions were filed by Americas Watch, the AFL-CIO, and other private organizations, USTR was required to initiate and conduct a review.

I appreciate your belief that the allegations are unfounded. I have given a copy of your letter to Ambassador Hills, who is responsible for administering the GSP program. I understand that USTR recently announced that the investigation would be continued for another year to allow the collection of more information.
