Dear Ed,

I am sorry for the delay in getting back to you regarding Lars-Erik Nelson's allegations.

I asked our national security staff to look into the issues you addressed. They have informed me that while it is true that Amnesty International reversed its earlier determination on the incubator reports in Kuwait, you may recall a number of eye witnesses testified before the United Nations and the Congress on this specific subject and the other atrocities committed by Iraqi forces inside Kuwait. Some of the witnesses subsequently met with the President, who was deeply distressed in hearing their reports and had no reason to question their veracity of these accounts.

Regardless of whether the stories about babies in incubators can be verified, the fact remains that Iraqi troops inside Kuwait committed scores of atrocities against the Kuwaiti people, actions that were documented and have since been verified. Moreover, we and other governments are helping the government of Kuwait gather additional evidence as to what occurred under Iraqi occupation. Until this process is complete, no reasonable charge or claim ought to be dismissed.

I have made others here aware of your concerns regarding these allegations and they are carefully monitoring the ongoing investigations.
