Dear Dr. Erickson:

Thank you for your letter regarding proposed child care legislation and funding for the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA).

President Bush remains committed to maintaining a pro-family agenda in his administration in favor of policies which will strengthen American families, including meaningful child care provisions.

I appreciate learning of the concern you have regarding the NEA. The President recognizes that Federal funds should not be used to support the production or display of obscene material. Unfortunately, in a few instances in the past, this has happened.

Congress responded to this problem through the fiscal year 1990 Interior and Related Agencies Appropriations Act by creating a special bipartisan Commission to review the grant-making procedures of the NEA and to make recommendations for legislative and administrative changes to tighten the process. The Commission began its deliberations in early June.

President Bush will continue to work with the Congress and its bipartisan Commission on the NEA to find an appropriate policy balance that ensures that needed Federal support for the arts continues, while avoiding activities that clearly do not warrant taxpayer support.
