It was a pleasure to hear you and see you during the briefings of the Inner Circle. I still have not received a response to my previous letter to you on 9/7/88 which was sent to you in New Hampshire, as well as the picture you recently promised.

I am concerned about Islamic Radicalism in the Middle East, taking hostages and improving relationships and the hope that we can market and export American ideas and free enterprise to the countries of the Middle East.

I would like to be considered for the job of Ambassador to Egypt to fulfill the above hopes with Egypt as a first choice or to other countries in the Middle East where some actions and improvement in the relationships are needed.

In the meantime I am volunteering, at my expense, to go to the Middle East as an envoy to try to get our hostages released, especially after the new Bush Administration request and the new tone President Bush is conveying. I believe that we can approach the hostage release as an Arab problem rather than an American problem. We should put the monkey on the Arab countries back individually and on the Arab League now before their expected meeting in March. Keeping the hostages will not benefit anybody now and has and will harm the American perception of the Arab countries. The continuation of this criminal and coward act has lost its benefit to them, with the new administration, and its new tone there is now a golden opportunity to accomplish their release through Moderate Arab Countries (Saudi Arabia, Egypt, Jordan, Morocco, Tunisia) and invite Syria and Libya to intervene as a test of their desire to deal with terrorism.

I also believe there is a good opportunity to improve relations with Libya since they have asked on many occasions to have a dialogue with the Bush Administration. I volunteer at my expense to be an envoy to the Libyan Leader to communicate with him how the terrorists are so nauseating and disgusting to the American people.

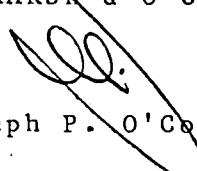

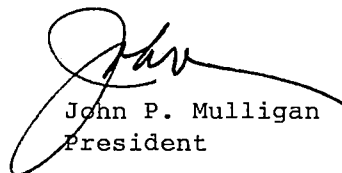

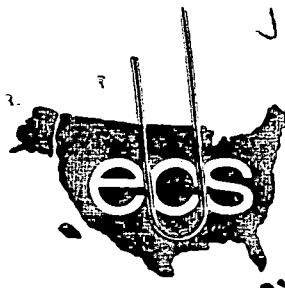

On behalf of the Education Commission of the States and the Minnesota Department of Education, I invite you to participate in a national invitational conference on Public School Choice, convening in Minneapolis, February 23-24, 1989 at the Radisson Hotel South. The purpose of this conference is to discuss different types of public school choice plans and provide a series of workshops where participants can work with other experienced professionals involved in existing choice programs from several states.

My experience in Minnesota suggests that the importance of public school choice as a policy tool for school restructuring cannot be underestimated. One of the most important steps we can take to improve the academic skills and attitudes of our students and lower the drop-out rate is to expand the choices families have to select among our public schools. By embracing public school choice, we have created an atmosphere where everyone is taking a closer look at what makes a good school and what accounts for quality education. Those who have taken a closer look are suggesting we couple other strategies with schools of choice--such as, moving toward site-based management, promoting diversity among our schools and improving our systems of accountability. Many of these ideas will be debated during this conference.

I urge your attendance at this conference. In each state I have also invited the chairs of the legislative education committees, chief state school officer and the ECS state education policy seminar coordinator. By having a team of policymakers from each state, a dialogue about the issues surrounding public school choice and school restructuring can be maintained.

For your information I have included a preliminary conference program and registration information. Although many of the presenters will be from my state of Minnesota, we plan to make public schools of choice a truly national education issue by inviting experts from several other states as well.

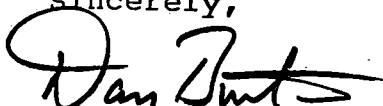

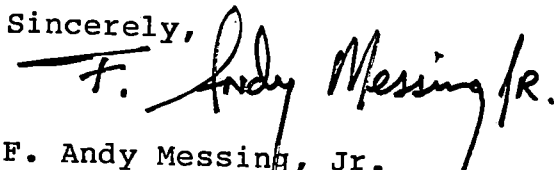

1. A one-time ^{1%} fee to be deducted from all accounts based on their balance on 1/1/89 or 1/31/89. It wouldn't solve the entire problem, but would yield at least \$24 to \$28 billion.
2. CD's through brokerage firms shouldn't be exempted (although I have several).
3. Although politically very difficult, this could be more acceptable than a $\frac{1}{4}\%$ fee annually, which could be derided each year.

I think this is a very small one-time premium for depositors (the insureds) to pay to help preserve our entire banking system. Thanks for your six years as Governor.

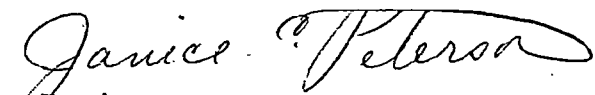

On a TV recast, just before you referred to yourself as a quick learner I remarked to my wife that you are a quick study. As a Republican, I am writing this letter on my personal letterhead. Enclosed are the just revised Policy Program of The Middle Income Lobby and as reference a 1966 letter from the Governor-elect of California.

Respected authorities have for some time believed that the Federal government could not again become fiscally responsible without enacting a value added tax. To date, this tax has not been officially proposed due to fear of a showdown with the politics of taxing the rich and the corporations. An important reason for founding the Lobby was the absence of an authoritative voice from the middle to confront those illbegotten politics. Some two-thirds of a trillion dollars in publically held Federal debt has piled up since the no tax increase stance was taken.

It is extremely doubtful that inflation can be staved off by small or incremental steps or that a better balance between investment and current consumption can be achieved in this manner.

Even before the 1966 tax legislation, private capital and corporate profits were overtaxed. That legislation substantially increased the taxation of private capital and increased the average taxation of corporate profits. There is no economic difference between taxing capital gains and destroying private savings. Nor did the legislation deal with the major means for overtaxing profits, that is, the lack of provision for deducting dividend payments.

Posturing a whole solution for the interacting problems of the shortage of capital, the underspending for investment/overspending for consumption and the too high interest rates may be a startling idea. But whole solutions tend to overwhelm while partial solutions tend to generate controversy.

The whole solution is: Substitute a VAT for payroll taxation beyond the requirements of pay-as-you-go Social Security, for all but modest transfer taxation of capital gains and for taxing income paid out in dividends. All but the matter of untaxing dividend payments are dealt with in the Lobby's program. I do hope that you personally will read the entire writing but especially urge that at the minimum you read the policy objectives under A and then B4 and C5 on taxing capital gains. The facts that capital gains are not included in the national income accounts and that taxing gains reduces dollar for dollar the nation's stock of capital never appears in the media.

Realizing that you are a very busy man, particularly now, as the new term begins, I hesitate to write you to solicit your support. However, friends in New Orleans who had the opportunity to discuss my situation with Mr. Wilson P. Abraham advised me, upon his suggestion, to contact you directly for help.

I graduated from Georgetown University's School of Foreign Service this past May and am currently working as an executive assistant at Save Lebanon, Inc., a small, non-profit organization which raises money to aid the victims of war in Lebanon. As a former student of Arab Studies who spent one year in the Middle East and who is proficient in Arabic, I very much would like to continue my Arabic and utilize all my skills, particularly my research and writing ones. Unfortunately, although my current position gives me the chance to work with the Arab American community and to serve the Lebanese people, it does not provide the opportunity, nor will it in the future, to put my abilities to full use.

Over the last two years, I have interviewed with several of the Defense Department agencies and have been waiting approximately one year and three months for a position with the National Security Agency. I feel I have done as much as I can, have been as cooperative as possible, and have pursued the bureaucratic system with as much patience and forbearance imaginable. Yet, my efforts have proven futile, and I have once again been told to wait for the current hiring freeze to lift.

My Congressman, Bob Livingston, was unable to help me with this particular problem. As a final effort to determine the truth in this situation, I am appealing to you for your counsel. Is a hiring freeze currently in effect within the Defense Department, particularly within the NSA? Secondly, do you have any recommendations as to people or agencies that I should contact to further my interests?

Dear Honorable Sununu:

Yesterday, January 22, 1989 was the seventy-first anniversary of Ukraine's declaration of independence and the seventieth anniversary of the unification of the Western Ukrainian National Republic with the Ukrainian National Republic. Despite almost seventy years of Soviet Russian domination, the dream of freedom and independence is still alive as evidenced by recent activities in Ukraine.

On January 22, 1918, the Ukrainian Central Rada (Council) issued the Fourth Universal, an unconditional declaration of independence for Ukraine. The Third Universal of the Ukrainian National Republic, issued on November 7, 1917, was its forerunner and outlined the rights of all Ukrainian citizens including the freedoms of speech, press, religion, assembly, and minorities. This document is most appropriate today in that its proclamation of autonomy within the Russian Empire is similar to the calls for autonomy being made by national groups in the Soviet Union today from the Baltic States to Ukraine to Armenia. We are enclosing a replica of the Third Universal and a brochure explaining its significance.

You will notice that the Third Universal, as the other three, was written in the four languages in wide use in Ukraine at the time: Ukrainian, Russian, Polish, and Yiddish. The currency issued by the Ukrainian National Republic (on permanent exhibit at the Smithsonian Institution) was also in those four languages. Throughout the period 1917 to 1922, efforts were made to unite all the residents of Ukraine, to outline and protect their rights, and to create a unified government.

This historic document is an important part of Ukrainian and world history. We hope that during this week you will reflect on both the historic events of seventy-one years ago as well as the ongoing struggle for freedom and independence still taking place in Ukraine.

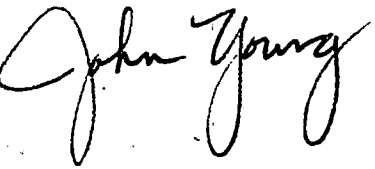

Dear John,

Congratulations on your new job - what an opportunity to help establish a responsible and productive government.

I am writing to make a few suggestions in my area of expertise, the U. S. Military. I know from 47 years of experience that we could cut military expenditures in half and still have a stronger military. The problem with direct action, even if achievable, is the adverse impact on the economy. However, a reduction of 5% per year for 10 years would achieve this goal and still permit an orderly economic transition for the defense industry.

The latest approach to closing military bases (accept or reject the entire package) is a good experiment. However, the major bases that need closing and would provide some real dollar savings were carefully excluded. Over 1,000 bases could be closed without impairing military operations. One way to achieve closure of major military bases is to make the award of a major government funded facility such as the Super Collider dependent upon the closure of a major military base in the same political domain.

Israel is able to provide battle ready divisions at a quarter of the cost of U. S. divisions. Israel achieves this by having a military composed almost entirely of reserves who receive effective training. The U. S. military force is largely composed of full time personnel with the reserves denigrated and considered competition for the budget. As a result, our reserves are uninspired, poorly trained and little more than a source of weekend income and pension protection for people with nothing better to do. We would be better off to follow the Israeli pattern or seriously consider abolishing the reserves.

The Hedrick Smith TV series on the Power Game did a very factual job on the Pentagon. The military need one civilian procurement agency for all the services instead of the many independent agencies we have today. The British military procurement agency is far more efficient, competent, and innovative than their splintered U.S. counterparts despite, or more likely because of, their shortage of funds. A purple suit military academy could do wonders for military cooperation.
