Energy: In FRANCE one sees SAFE, efficient, profitable nuclear energy.

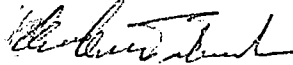

Thank you for your note of January 6. I write now to extend a formal invitation to the President to address the nation's newspaper editors during the ASNE convention, April 12-14, at the J. W. Marriott Hotel here in Washington.

ASNE is a professional association of 1,000 directing editors of daily newspapers. President Bush may be familiar with ASNE, since he addressed the convention as a candidate last April, and in earlier years of his career.

All of the presidents of the United States have addressed ASNE since the Society was founded in 1922. In fact, President Warren Harding, who was a newspaper editor before becoming president, was a member of ASNE. Many presidents have addressed the Society on an annual basis. President Reagan spoke at the last Washington convention, as he had in several other years during his administration.

We would welcome President Bush at any time he chooses during the convention, but let me list the opportunities in the order of our own preference. My recommendations are intended to spotlight the most prominent spots on our convention program.

1. The banquet on Friday evening April 14. This is a black-tie event, though the President, of course, sets his own dress code. The event begins with a reception at 6:30 p.m. (Capitol Ballroom), followed by dinner at 7:30 p.m. The banquet speaker usually is introduced to speak at about 9:00 p.m. We would, of course, be delighted if the President could make an evening of it and join the other dignitaries at the headtable for dinner. But let me emphasize that we will arrange to hear him if he decides to come after dinner -- or, for that matter, before dinner.

2. Luncheons on April 12, 13 or 14. The luncheons are occasions in which ASNE spotlights national and international figures as speakers. Last year's luncheon speakers were President Reagan, President Oscar Arias of Costa Rico, and a joint appearance by veteran journalists Walter Cronkite of CBS and James Reston of The New York Times.

speeches usually begin at about 1:30 p.m. We would expect the President to speak about 20-30 minutes, and take about 15-20 minutes of questions from ASNE members. If it is not possible for the President to spend the luncheon hour with us, we would be glad to present him immediately after lunch.

3. We would open up a spot for President Bush during any of the general sessions of the convention. These are Wednesday, April 12 from 9:00 a.m. until noon and from 2:30 until 5:00 p.m.; Thursday, April 13 during the morning hours; and Friday, April 14 during the same hours as April 12. Again, we would expect about 20-30 minutes for a speech, and 15-20 minutes for questions, for a total of 45 minutes. Needless to say, we would be happy to accommodate a more generous period of time.

At any appearance we would anticipate a crowd of 1,000 or more.

As I said on the day we visited your office, the banquet speech in the past has been reserved, most often, for a media speaker. Should the President accept that banquet invitation it would be precedent-setting and might be the opportunity for a major speech on his thoughts about media relations or First Amendment values. Since our meetings are open to the working news media, both print and broadcast journalists would be present to report on all sessions. We obviously are excited about the prospect of the President's appearance.

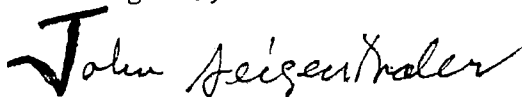
I also write to extend a specific invitation to you to address one of the general sessions of our convention. The newspaper editors of America are keen to hear about your vision of the job you hold. Senator Howard Baker came to San Francisco during the early months of his White House tenure to speak to the ASNE convention, and his was one of the best-received appearances of that meeting. We hope we can welcome you to a similar forum. Again, we would hold for 30 to 45 minutes of speaking and questions and answers. Obviously, we would be happy to have an affirmative answer from you now and work out the scheduling later.

As you suggested, we are pursuing independently the approaches to some other key members of the Administration about their appearances before the convention.

We look forward to hearing from you as soon as you are able to make a decision regarding your own appearance and whenever the matter of the President's schedule is clearer. 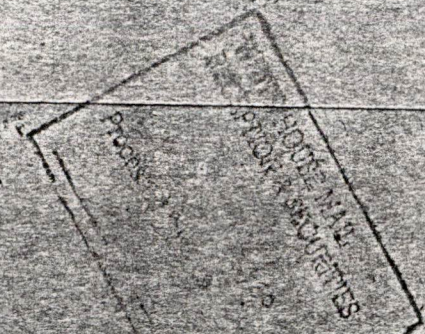
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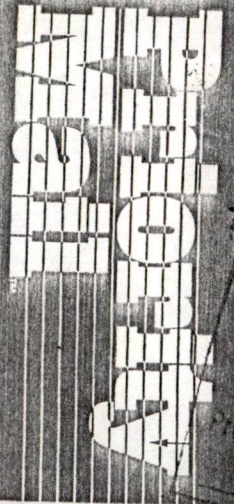
