Dear Governor:

It was very pleasant talking to you last night--especially after missing you at the campaign and at the Presidential Transition Office.

To be specific and brief, I do have some information which would come under the heading of "priority" on the President's list. Am just back from nearly five weeks in Mexico and Central America. Am writing a rough article or two partly based on my findings there, but have travelled to every country in the Western Hemisphere since I went to Canada at five.

I know how busy you are. But, if I may, I'd like to meet with you face-to-face for five minutes (not for an interview).

Hope you found the article I gave you last night about Defense Department leadership of some interest. I'm trying to provide the President some deserved and needed positive exposure. And I faxed that piece to many points only to have been scooped by him four hours later with his sound choice of Dick Cheney to lead the Pentagon. But have arranged for the article to be printed anyway with some follow-up work.

For background purposes, I enclose an article containing my views of Zimbabwe and a profile which mentions my Bush campaign and Transition work. I was concerned about what I considered lax security regarding the President's threatening and borderline threatening mail and I tried to do something about that. After all, his life comes first.

Before leaving for Mexico, I wrote Secretary Baker indicating I'm ready to go to Haiti to represent him and the President (I've been there 24 times, I think it is) as our Ambassador. I'd be honored to serve in other countries or in a major public affairs or speechwriting position. I speak fluent French and reasonable Spanish. Apparently he never got it.

And if I may share some "classified material" with you, I may have the ultimate security clearance in addition to work with the Nixon and Ford Administrations: I went to Camp Dewitt six miles from Wolfboro, N.H.; and I have an old Texas driver's license! I grew up in Texas, Florida, Maine and Pennsylvania (in the summers) and Connecticut (one reason Sen. Prescott Bush gave a speech in the Senate about some of my work). I lived in Greenwich.

I remain an admirer of the President, and am convinced he'll come out of the next four years with the respect of the American people and the world.

Enclosed please find copies of correspondence that I recently sent to President Bush and to William Bennett regarding military style semiautomatic rifles -- so-called "assault rifles." I am very concerned that Mr. Bennett and others within and close to the Administration seem to have been convinced by recent media reports that the NRA is not speaking for its members and other gun owners on this issue, and that the owners and users of these rifles are a limited number of paramilitary kooks and drug dealers. Any such reports are absolutely false. Millions of Americans, not the thousands reported to Mr. Bennett by the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, and Firearms, own military style semiautomatic rifles and have used them for many years for hunting, target shooting, and other perfectly legitimate activities. The statistics concerning these rifles reported to Mr. Bennett are completely different from figures previously given by BATF to Handgun Control, Inc., and others, and are quite incorrect.

These guns are widely owned, they are not commonly used in crime, and they differ from many traditional rifles only in their appearance. It is their appearance, which offends liberal sensibilities, and the politics of their owners, who are generally conservative, that have led to the one-sided media campaign for their prohibition. A victory for these tactics would represent a triumph of unreason over logic, and would only encourage the use of similar stratagems on other issues.

I know that you are very busy, but I have included copies of letters that I have written to Time Magazine and the Washington Post, one of which was published earlier this month, regarding misinformation that they have printed concerning military style rifles. I hope that you will have time to read them.

Thank you for your previous assistance to the gun owners of New Hampshire. I am extremely pleased to know that there is a voice of reason concerning this issue at the heart of the Administration.

my mother, ROBERT IRWIN, and many of our friends and neighbors, such as James Masiello and Nancy Baybutt, have been active members and supporters of the state Republican Party. I am hoping that as a native of New Hampshire that you might give my request additional consideration among the many other requests and letters received by the White House.

My efforts in this area began when my mother was diagnosed as having a rare liver disease and required a transplant operation to save her life. Her employer did not provide health insurance so she was forced onto Medicaid soon after Oregon changed its policy regarding coverage. Eventually, a California hospital offered to perform my mother's surgery for free and she received her transplant one year ago this March 25th. Unfortunately, two children and one adult have already died in Oregon because they were denied the funding for their transplants. Furthermore, other states have now begun to follow Oregon's lead.

I am seeking Congressional hearings on this issue with the purpose of achieving two objectives. First, insure the fair and equitable distribution of donor organs without regard for ability to pay. Second, a uniform, 50 state Medicaid policy, on coverage for organ transplants. As transplants already include services that are currently mandated under federal Medicaid statutes, it would seem appropriate that medically effective transplants be included for coverage.

April 23-29 is National Organ Donor Awareness Week. I am organizing a meeting of patient advocates to be held during this week on April 25 and 26. I am seeking an opportunity for a

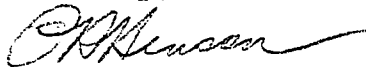

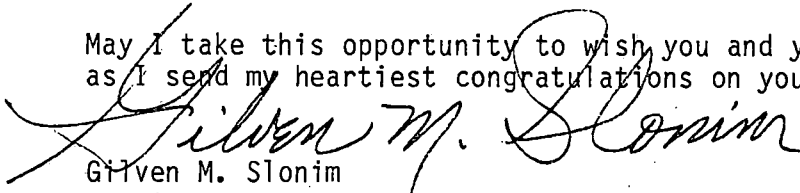

Dear Mr. Nunez:

Thank you for your letter of February 7 and I'm sorry for the delay in response.

You are concerned with an opinion letter issued on April 12, 1988, by the Wage and Hour Division (the Division) of the U.S. Department of Labor (the Department) on the application of the Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA) to State and local government employees who are employed in "administrative" capacities.

Not needed

Fair Labor Standards Act

The (FLSA) which is administered and enforced by the Division, is the Federal law of most general application concerning wages and hours of work. This law requires that all covered and nonexempt employees be paid not less than one and one-half times their regular rates of pay for all hours worked over 40 in a workweek. The provisions of FLSA apply to all employees of State and local governments except to those who are specifically excluded in section 3(e)(2)(C) of FLSA and to those who may qualify for exemption from the minimum wage and/or overtime pay provisions of FLSA. The constitutionality of FLSA as it applies to State and local governments was upheld by the Supreme Court in Garcia v. San Antonio Metropolitan Transit Authority et al. (Garcia), 105 S.Ct. 1005 (February 19, 1985).

Section 13(a)(1) of FLSA provides an exemption from its minimum wage and overtime pay provisions for any employee employed in a bona fide executive, administrative, or professional capacity, as those terms are defined in Regulations, 29 CFR Part 541. An employee may qualify for exemption as a bona fide administrative employee if all of the pertinent tests relating to duties, responsibilities, and salary, as discussed in section 541.2 of the Regulations, are met. Pursuant to 541.2(e)(2), an employee who is paid on a salary or fee basis of at least \$250 per week may qualify for exemption as a bona fide administrative employee if the employee's primary duty consists of the performance of office or nonmanual work directly related to management policies or general business operations of the employer or the employer's customers, and the employee's work requires the exercise of discretion and independent judgment.

In determining whether a public employee's activities are "directly related to management policies or general business operations" of the employer, it is important to consider the nature of the mission and function of the government agency in question. As indicated in the letter to which you refer, where employees of a State or local government agency are performing activities that carry out the ongoing mission and day-to-day functions of the agency rather than its management

policies, such activities are not the type of duties contemplated by the Regulations for exemption. Where such an employee's primary duty consists of such nonexempt work, the employee does not qualify for exemption as a bona fide administrative employee under section 541.2 of the Regulations, and must be paid in accordance with the minimum wage and overtime pay provisions of FLSA.

of Labor has determined
~~It is the opinion of The Department~~ that the interpretation in this letter is consistent with the existing section 541.2 of the Regulations. It should be noted *also* that the Department *of Labor* published in the Federal Register (50 FR 47696) an advance notice of proposed rulemaking requesting the views of the public on any changes they felt were necessary to the Regulations. I have been advised by the ~~Department~~ *Agency* that the review of policy options concerning these Regulations should be concluded this summer, and ~~that they~~ *the Department* hope *to* publish a proposed rule for public comment later this year. In this regard, if there are particular ~~fact situations~~ *them* you would like ~~the Department~~ to consider, please feel free to submit them to the Administrator of the Wage and Hour Division, U.S. Department of Labor, 200 Constitution Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20210.

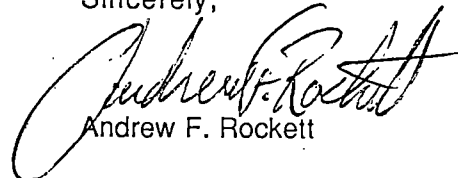

We were delighted to learn from Richard Torykian of Lazard Freres that you are willing to address the Council of Institutional Investors on Tuesday, April 4, if your schedule permits. The Council will be meeting in Ballroom A of the Vista International Hotel at 1400 M Street, N.W.

The Council is an organization of 60 of the nation's largest and most active pension funds representing over eight million American employees and retirees and holding over \$300 billion in assets. Institutional investors like our members hold over 40 percent of the equities markets (projected to be 50 percent in ten years) and thus hold private sector power that could be harnessed to achieve many of the economic goals of importance to the Administration and the country. In light of this power, the failure of policymakers generally to reach out to the institutional investors would seem to be a failure to use one of the most effective tools available for achieving meaningful economic and other policy reforms. As a science policy assistant for a U.S. Congressman, I found that I agreed wholeheartedly with your views on research funding, competitiveness, interagency coordination, and other science policy issues. For this reason, I am writing to you to explore the possibility of working on science, energy, and environmental issues as a member of your staff.

As you stated in your interview, much of this work will require active involvement by the President's science adviser and White House staff. I believe that I have the experience and abilities to serve effectively at this level. For over two years and a half years I have covered science, energy and environmental issues for Congressman Harris W. Fawell (R-IL), a member of the House Science, Space and Technology Committee and the representative for Argonne National Laboratory. During this time I have tracked legislation, participated actively in the congressional budget process, and worked closely with federal, state, and private organizations in Illinois' effort to win the Superconducting Super Collider. More recently I organized a congressional field hearing in Illinois on collaborative research initiatives in the Midwest region. 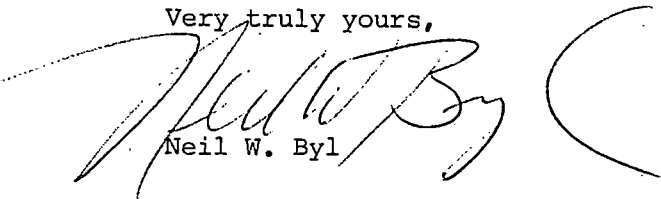

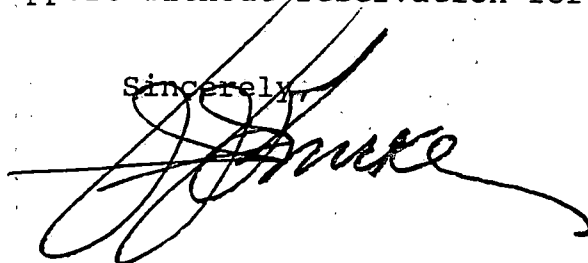

Dear Gov Sununu:

I wish to commend President Bush for a first small step in injecting some rationality into the control of military-type guns. He showed you don't have to be a "ban the guns" freak to be seriously disturbed by the proliferation of weapons that have no logical or proper sporting use and can easily be diverted into the hands of the drug trade and used to kill policemen. In spite of the screams of protest that he hears from the NRA, I am sure his action has the full support of responsible sportsmen who hope that in the near future he will continue to provide leadership by moving even further away from the extreme positions that the NRA leadership has espoused.

No one can legitimately argue that I have an anti-gun orientation:

1. I qualified expert on just about every personal weapon in the army (rifle, pistol, submachine gun etc.)
2. I owned my first rifle when I was 12 years old. (And I couldn't shoot it until I was properly trained to do so.)
3. My family attitude toward guns is well-shown by the fact that one of my daughters was a four-year letterman in riflery in college.

I am totally turned off and fighting mad at the radical extremism of the NRA leaders and their knee-jerk support of extremists who demand carte-blanche to endanger the lives of others by having uncontrolled access to and no regulations to prevent the abuse of assault weapons. There is no legitimate excuse to use automatically-cocked (e.g. recoil, blow-back, or gas-operated) weapons in hunting. The abuse is particular extreme when the gun is a full automatic or can be illegally converted from semi-automatic status. There is no sportsmanship in being a lead-sprayer. Manually-cocked weapons (e.g. bolt-action, lever-action or pump-action) can fully meet all legitimate the needs of any hunter. And they are much less subject to misuse either by pseudo-sportsmen or drug dealers.

Anyone who has to go hunting with an assault-rifle no more deserves to be described as a sportsman than someone who shoots animals mesmerized by automobile headlights or who fishes using dynamite.

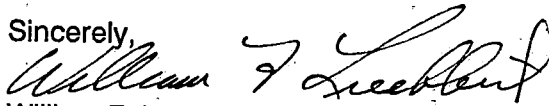
All too often the kind of so-called hunter who needs a semi-automatic weapon is likely to be the same kind of unsportsmanlike jerk who holes up in a camp drinking beer for a couple of days, then staggers out half-loaded to spray lead indiscriminately -- lead that is just as likely to hit a farmer's cow or another hunter as it is to hit a deer.

We need legitimate standards of gun safety. An untrained person with an repeating weapon is at least as dangerous as an untrained person driving an eighteen-wheeler. The sooner those of us who favor legitimate use of guns rebel against extremism in the NRA and clean up our act and do something about the current disgraceful situation the better.

The current leadership of the NRA pays minimum lip service to, but fights legitimate standards tooth and nail. We must distance ourselves from the know-nothing radicals who have won control of the NRA, just as firmly as we distance ourselves from those who would ban all guns. The next time I hear someone spout the obnoxious slogan "Guns don't kill people; people kill people" I'm going to puke. Let's not stick our heads in the sand. **Guns, high-powered muscle cars and other devices can be dangerous. They do create opportunities to kill. In the wrong hands they do kill people. Whenever those who use such devices are not properly trained or are under the influence of alcohol or drugs, there is a significant risk that they will kill people, including innocent people. Law-enforcement officers will be killed, and other hunters or other people on the road will be killed. You can be killed; I can be killed; innocent children can be killed.** This is too high a price for kow-towing to unreasonable demands from the NRA lobby.

Once again, President Bush is to be commended for taking a first step, albeit a very small and tentative one, toward rationality in our national policy toward guns.

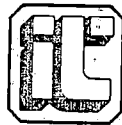

I would like to offer my services to the administration of President George Bush, in any capacity which might be useful. The attached curriculum vitae (rather informal; I use it on the college lecture circuit), covers my assorted career experiences.

In addition to 30 years government service, roughly split between the Navy and the CIA, I now have almost 17 years of writing a four-times weekly op-ed column on foreign and national affairs. This has involved extensive travel, with innumerable official and private contacts.

My major field of foreign expertise is, perhaps, southern Africa, with about 20 extended visits since 1962. I have also visited Namibia a half-dozen times, meeting with virtually all leading politicians in all the ethnic groups, and in 1987 spent three days in Jamba for briefings on UNITA. I have also interviewed ANC leaders in Lusaka. I have a host of close contacts in South Africa, not only in government (including the military, the intelligence community, the police, the media and the academic community) but in black and white opposition groups as well. (Chief Mangosuthu Buthelezi has been a personal friend since 1962.)

I am, essentially, a word-smith; my work for 17 years has consisted of taking on complex material in a wide variety of fields, finding a bottom line and reducing it to 16.3 column inches. I am also, if I say so myself, a cracking good briefer and lecturer.

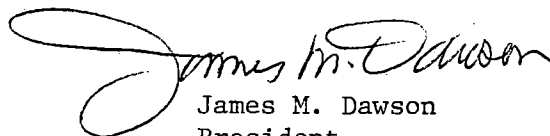

I am writing to recommend Dr. Judy Schrag, State Director of Special Education in Washington, who is a candidate for the position of Assistant Secretary for Special Education and Rehabilitative Services in the Department of Education.

I have known Dr. Schrag for a number of years as one of the nation's leading special educators during her service in the States of Idaho and Washington. She has served as President of the National Association of State Directors of Special Education and was a consultant and reviewer for our federal grant programs.

I had the privilege of serving as Director of the federal Bureau of Education for the Handicapped under Presidents Nixon and Ford, and was appointed as the first Assistant Secretary for Special Education and Rehabilitative Services by President Carter and so have had the chance to understand the job's requirements.

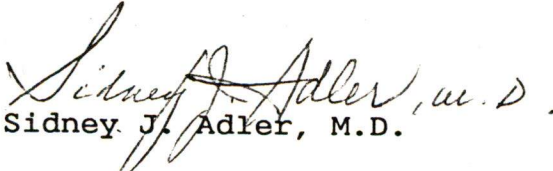

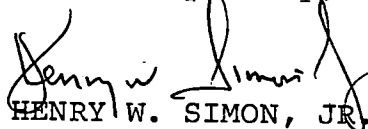

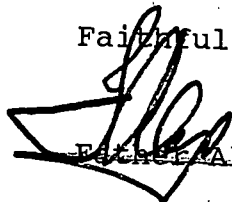
