During the campaign we had him booked twice but unanticipated emergencies caused him to have to cancel both times.

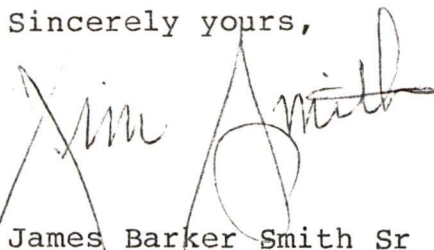

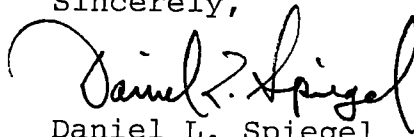
Dear Ms. Kennedy:

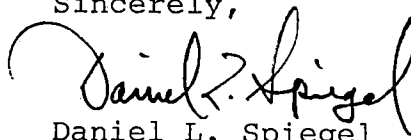

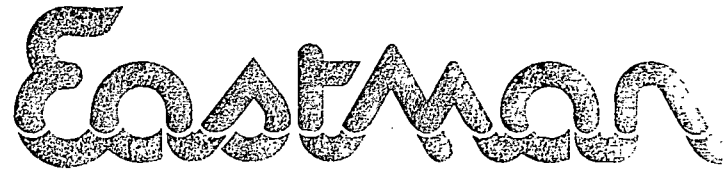
