It was a pleasure seeing you this past week and I enjoyed the opportunity to visit with the President.

I am writing this letter to you at the request of ARCS, a foundation comprised entirely of women who are dedicated to giving exceptional young people an opportunity to receive graduate education in engineering, science and medicine. Each year the Washington Chapter of the ARCS Foundation selects a Person of the Year who is honored at their annual banquet here in Washington, D.C. Their selection committee would like to bestow this honor upon you in 1991 and you would do the members of ARCS a great honor should you agree to accept this recognition. Further, you would be supporting what I believe to be an enormously worthy cause. Prior recipients of the award have included Ross Perot, Hugh Downs, Gil Grosvenor, Bobby Inman, and Jim Abrahamson.

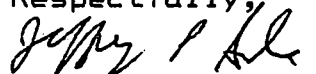

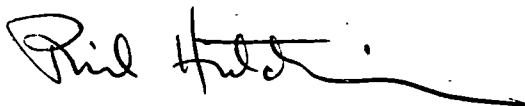

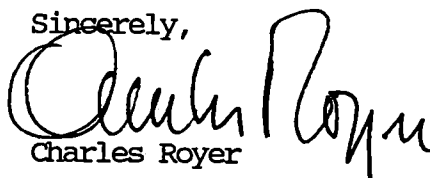
Dear Mr. Sununu:

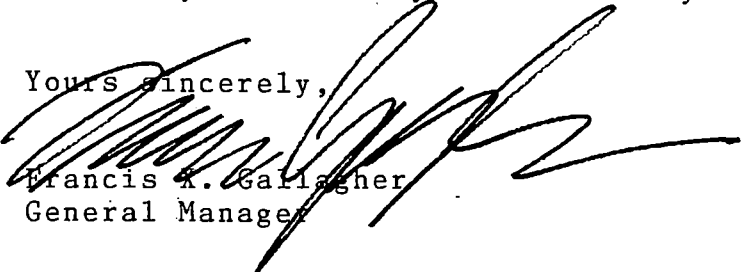

This Conference will emphasize the economic (and some political) facets of this newly-free area....to interest the American businessmen (some 600 expected) to investigate market conditions and investment potential there.

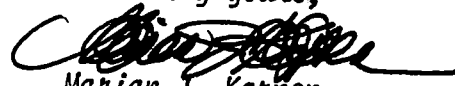
The enclosed photocopy of the letter I sent to the Vice President indicates in greater detail the concepts and objectives of this conference.

It has come to my attention that you have requested polls from the Robert Teeter group, assessing the pulse of constituents with respect to George Bush's reversal on the issue of raising taxes. I thought you might appreciate hearing from me, for it has been my voting experience over the last thirty years that leads me to believe that I am truly the voice of Mrs. America talking across the back fence; in other words, my man (including your boss and with the exception of Mario Cuomo) always wins.

I am very concerned about the enormous health cost to our country caused by cigarette smoking. Approximately 400,000 Americans die each year due to smoking. This is over 40 people per hour.

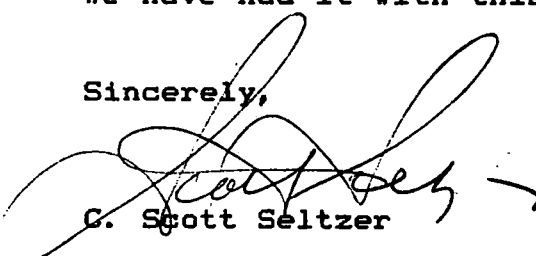

Sometime during the recess, I hope you will agree to see Bob Finch, former Secretary of Health, Education and Welfare in the Nixon Administration and former Lt. Governor of California, Peter Flanigan, former Administrative Assistant to the President from 1969 to 1974 and now managing director of Dillon Read & Company, and me. The purpose of the meeting will be to discuss a proposal of most exciting proportions.

Flanigan will be there to reassure you the proposal can be privately funded. Under current budget circumstances, I can appreciate how much you will need this reassurance since it is conceived as a 30-year program with a \$300 billion price tag.

Finch will describe the proposal which is a transcontinental aqueduct to bring water from Alaska through Canada down to the States and Mexico.

The exciting part of the project is it proposes diversion of water, now draining off into the ocean and becoming salinized, to arid lands and drying rivers.

A side benefit, obviously, is the tie it will give this Continent at a time when Europe and Asia, respectively, are themselves involved in coalitions of staggering proportions.

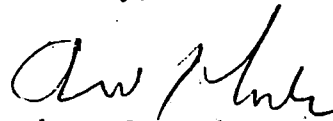

Ours is a trash-based society. Our greatest distinction from other countries is our willingness to discard copious volumes of waste packaging in order to enjoy the conveniences of attendant-less purchasing of a million products from screws to chap-stick, as well as to compensate for the low standards of transportation and handling work that we have come to accept as normal. Add to this the mountains of junk cars we cannot profitably recycle and the scope of our environmental wastes is still only hinted at. Shall I mention the pollution from burning fossil fuels just to keep warm or to buy a quart of milk? Is any of this news to you or to the President? I doubt that; you explained at a republican dinner once in Andover, Mass. (when vying for the senatorial nomination against Warren Rudman) how much thought you had given to nuclear and other wastes.

I believe it is high time for the President to make some bold statements, as a leader, about the direction our economy now must take in order to undo, shuck off, reverse and correct the ecological abuses we have inflicted until now. Right now, however, I feel VERY betrayed by our President, and if events continue on their current path, there is little possibility that I will vote for him again.

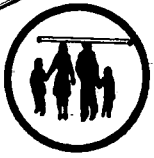

To now, this burden was deductible from our Federal income tax return, but suggestions from your office now indicate this may be limited or repealed.

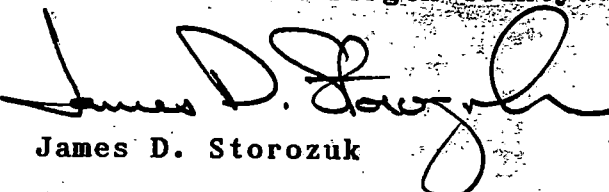
May I suggest that consideration be given to Northern New Jersey's middle and upper income taxpayers, now burdened with a recently-announced host of tax increases via Governor James Florio?

Fate has provided President Bush with a unique opportunity to: a) show himself to be a person of such moral integrity and ethics as to distinguish himself from the squalid personal patterns of many public officials as midday is distinguished from midnight, and b) create a wave of popular approval that has heretofore come to a president only in circumstances comparable to FDR's response to the attack on Pearl Harbor.

He can do this by making a public request to Congress to appoint a Special Counsel to investigate his son's involvement in the notorious Silverado case.

He can do this in such a way that it becomes a vote of confidence in his son's innocence rather than a suspicion of unethical conduct by saying something like this....experts can improve on my wording, but here are the essential ideas.

" I have every confidence that my son has not knowingly done anything unethical in his role in the Silverado case. I therefore request (the appropriate congressional agency) to appoint a Special Counsel, unbiased and of recognized repute, to make an exhaustive investigation of the allegations that have been made, and that the full results of such an investigation be made public. If he is as innocent as I believe him to be he deserves to be cleared of suspicion. If he should be found to have engaged in improper conduct, his position of son of the President should afford him no more protection than is enjoyed by the most deprived American citizen."

I am writing to invite you to a luncheon briefing on a new Cato Institute White Paper that details an appropriate U.S. force structure and military budget in light of the new strategic realities of a post-Cold War era. The luncheon will take place in the main lounge of the National Press Club, 529 14th Street, NW, Washington, DC, beginning at noon on Tuesday, August 7. The study argues for a major reduction of military spending phased in over a five-year period. It includes a recommendation that the savings or "peace dividend" resulting from such a military restructuring be returned to the American people in the form of income tax rate reductions. An econometric analysis conducted by Fiscal Associates, Inc. based on those tax rate reductions is included in the study.

The authors of the study, which is entitled **America's Peace Dividend: Income Tax Reductions from the New Strategic Realities**, are Ted Galen Carpenter, director of foreign policy studies at the Cato Institute, and Cato foreign policy analyst Rosemary Fiscarelli.
