At its last meeting, Friday, 21 June, the members of the Dolley Madison Stamp Club approved unanimously the following letter of invitation, by which we would like to make known to you some of the advantages of membership.

First and foremost is the fact that we are a fairly active club: we meet twice a month (on the first and third Fridays); the monthly stamp auction alternates with the monthly speaker or special feature.

Second, we are situated locally: McLean is easily accessible and our meeting places are not exactly overcrowded. The site of our meetings alternates between the McLean area police station (also known as the 'Government Center' -- about two miles east of Tyson's Corner, near the junction of Highway 123 and Ball's Hill Road,) and the McLean Community Center (a short distance farther east, near the McLean Public Library on Ingleside Avenue, about one block north of its junction with Highway 123).

Although few in number (22 members attended last Friday's meeting), we are a serious group of collectors, and club events include interesting speakers. A founding member and noted publicist, John Hotchner, recently spoke to the club about "Unusual U.S. Postage Due Uses, including Fraudulent Use of Postage Stamps Thereby Requiring Postage Due." Another active member, Carl Troy, has benefitted from unenviable Foreign Service assignments, including behind-the-lines service in UNITA-controlled Angola. His pet subjects relate to legitimate postal services within fraudulent countries, and he was featured in the May issue of The American Philatelist. Another recent speaker, visiting us from the Springfield Stamp Club, lectured from first-hand service on Railway Post Offices, including those operated on Chesapeake Bay steamers and even Baltimore trolley cars. (My own special interest, presented with lantern slides and vintage sound recordings, is "The Postage Stamps of The League of Nations.")

We are writing to you regarding the new Township concept that we had expressed an interest in developing within the Military bases that have been targeted for closing. Our initial inquiry considered the possibility of using Pease Air Force base for the first Township.

In our last letter to you, we indicated that Pease did not lend itself to the type of layout suitable to our Township concept. Also, that the Bechtel Group had already been awarded the contract for the redevelopment of Pease.

Since that time, we have moved into an alternative direction, one that we have been planning for some time, in soliciting the industrial sector to assist us in a joint cooperative effort, to develop the first of several such Townships. We are currently in process of finalizing our marketing portfolio that we intend to submit to some 2,000 companies throughout the country.

It is also our intent to invite appropriate agencies within HEW, EPA, and HUD to participate in this project, and assist in the role of observers to provide the necessary Federal inputs that may be required.

The overall ramifications of this project are such that they can produce immediate and far-reaching beneficial results for our nation well into the next century — restructuring not only our socioeconomic standards but, also, resolving many of our environmental/ecological problems.

I have enclosed for your interest the initial working document from which we plan to form the Township Working Group to develop the first Township. However, in order for you to have a more comprehensive evaluation of what is really involved, I strongly recommend that I be allowed to visit with you and present, in greater detail, the overall scope of the total project.

I feel certain that you will find the results of such a meeting not only quite fascinating but, more so, the precise program that both the President and our nation need at this critical juncture.
