In late September of last year, we forwarded an Aerospace Brief report describing a high speed (400 knots) heavy lift (1500 ton payload) transoceanic transport called the wingship. We asked at that time for your review of the concept and whether you had found it valid. Since that time DARPA has officially approved funding for Aerospace to proceed with the technical validation of the wingship concept, and of the Aerospace 5000 ton wingship design in particular. Accordingly please find enclosed a copy of the recent briefing developed to illustrate that a mobility system made up of the wingships and a modern intratheater transport such as the C-17 will meet the over 200 million ton miles per day requirement set forth in the Congressionally Mandated Mobility Study, which underpins U.S. Air Force's Air Lift Master Plan (ALMP).

This second phase SBIR contract requires that Aerospace begin to develop and prepare a seven to ten million dollar surface effect propulsion system and engine for DARPA's considered sponsorship. Once this system is ready, we will be in a position that the existing technologies already being developed in the Air Force and Navy Service/NASA funded program will be enough to develop the wingship's propulsion development. These steps are outlined in the last two slides of the briefing.

In addition to addressing the technical issues, we are also planning to address related operational and requirements issues. These issues will be discussed in a meeting to be held by Admiral Rogers.
