Chief of Staff John Sununu asked me to respond to your recent letter regarding his background and current responsibilities at the White House.

The primary responsibility of the Chief of Staff is to manage the President's agenda and the day-to-day operation of the White House. He oversees the development of domestic policy, communications, staff, budget, and relations with the press, the Congress, and State and local governments. He accompanies the President to most meetings and events worldwide and is often called upon to speak on the President's behalf.

John Henry Sununu was born in 1939 and spent most of his childhood in New York City attending parochial elementary school and, later, the La Salle Military Academy in Oakdale, Long Island. He went on to study engineering at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology and earned his Ph.D. in 1966. While he proceeded to distinguish himself as an educator, engineer, small businessman, and community leader, he is most often remembered for his work as Governor of the State of New Hampshire. He was elected in 1983 and served for three terms until 1989, when he was asked by President Bush to serve as his Chief of Staff at the White House.

He and his wife, Nancy, have eight children. In his spare time he enjoys skiing, golfing, reading, and collecting baseball cards.

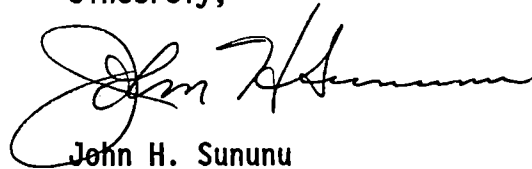

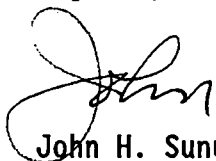
