The purpose of this letter is to bring you up-to-date on recent developments regarding lunar helium-3:

1. Lunar helium-3 is slowly gaining recognition on the national agenda: It was included in the Synthesis Group report to the National Space Council issued in May. When Lt. Gen. Stafford, Chairman of the Synthesis Group, testified to a Congressional subcommittee a few weeks ago, Prof. Jerry Kulcinski (my colleague at the University of Wisconsin) was also invited to provide additional background on lunar helium-3. And now I hear that Senator Byrd is considering establishing a Lunar Helium-3 Institute (or some-such) in West Virginia.
2. The Lunar Sourcebook has just been published. I am one of the co-authors (see Chapter 9) and am pleased to enclose a copy for you. Helium-3 is discussed in portions of this book.
3. Finally, I am enclosing a recent paper by Edward Teller, A.J. Glass, T.K. Fowler, A. Hasegawa, and J.F. Santarius. The paper is about the potential use of lunar helium-3 to power fusion rockets for inter-planetary travel. For example, a helium-3 fusion rocket could carry people to Mars in just 90 days. As you will note, the paper was presented at an international conference in Moscow in late May.

I would also like to renew our offer: Jack Schmitt, Jerry Kulcinski, and I would be pleased to meet with you to discuss this critically important resource, and what the US needs to do in order to have commercial helium-3 power plants within two decades. Recall that the entire US electricity consumption for one year would require only 30 tons of helium-3: the equivalent of one shuttle payload. And at an equivalent cost of \$7 per barrel oil.
