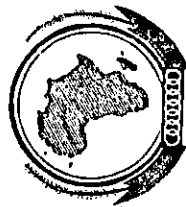

Fur traders, fishermen, ruffians, rivermen, and stump speaking politicians are the subjects of his drawings and paintings. Although this self-taught artist made a living as a skilled portrait painter, his most famous works are of Missourians at work and play. Most of his genre works were completed between 1845 and 1857 on the Missouri frontier. These were the robust years of westward expansion and Missouri was the vortex of movement and excitement. The drawings in the artist's sketchbook are presently being purchased by the citizens of Missouri, under the leadership of Governor Christopher S. Bond, so that this legacy will remain intact in Missouri. A good example is the drawing *Card Player*, on the cover of this invitation, which is a preliminary study for the painting *Raftsmen Playing Cards*.
