Dear Em,

Thanks for your warm note of November 1st. I enjoyed being there with you and I appreciated your gracious introduction.

Let me clarify my concern about the media. In the first place, I do not believe in broadside attacks on the media. My concerns are rather related to a handful of people who are grossly irresponsible in the field of muckracking and in the field of investigative journalism. I hasten to add that CBS News is totally immune from my concern and indeed, I am somewhat embarrassed that in commenting on the "excesses," I did not make clear that CBS News, as far as I'm concerned and based on my experience here at CIA, has played it very straight. I hope there was no misunderstanding on this.

Thanks for my Kansas City stockyard "48" tab. If I can't find an appropriate rump to pin it on, I will use it for a key chain.

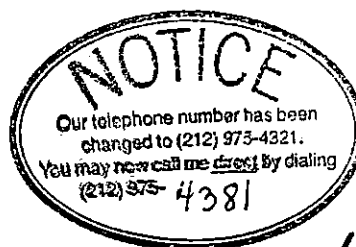

Dear George:

Personally and professionally, as one responsible for a major journalistic enterprise, I know we journalists benefit from hearing critical views of the profession. It's fallen to this member of the Yale Class of '48 Executive Committee to write you with an invitation -- and, I must admit, solely because my path has by chance crossed yours perhaps as recently as anyone's on the Committee. Because of my news position, I had the opportunity to talk with you for a few moments in the unlikely setting of the Peking airport, as you may recall, on the occasion of the end of President Ford's visit there; you also were about to end your tour in China. I later had the pleasure of hearing your persuasive address at the Overseas Press Club on the subject of journalist employees of the CIA.

A number of us recall your talking to (and with) us at a similar dinner a few years back; that recollection of your capabilities as a speaker spurred our interest in persuading you to update us.

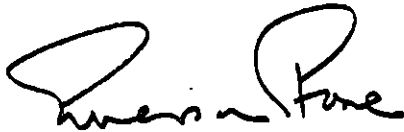

As to the time, we hope he will join us for cocktails at 6:30 p.m.; dinner will be at 7:45, and he would speak by 9:00.

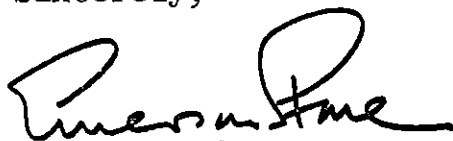
The evening is Thursday, October 28th.
