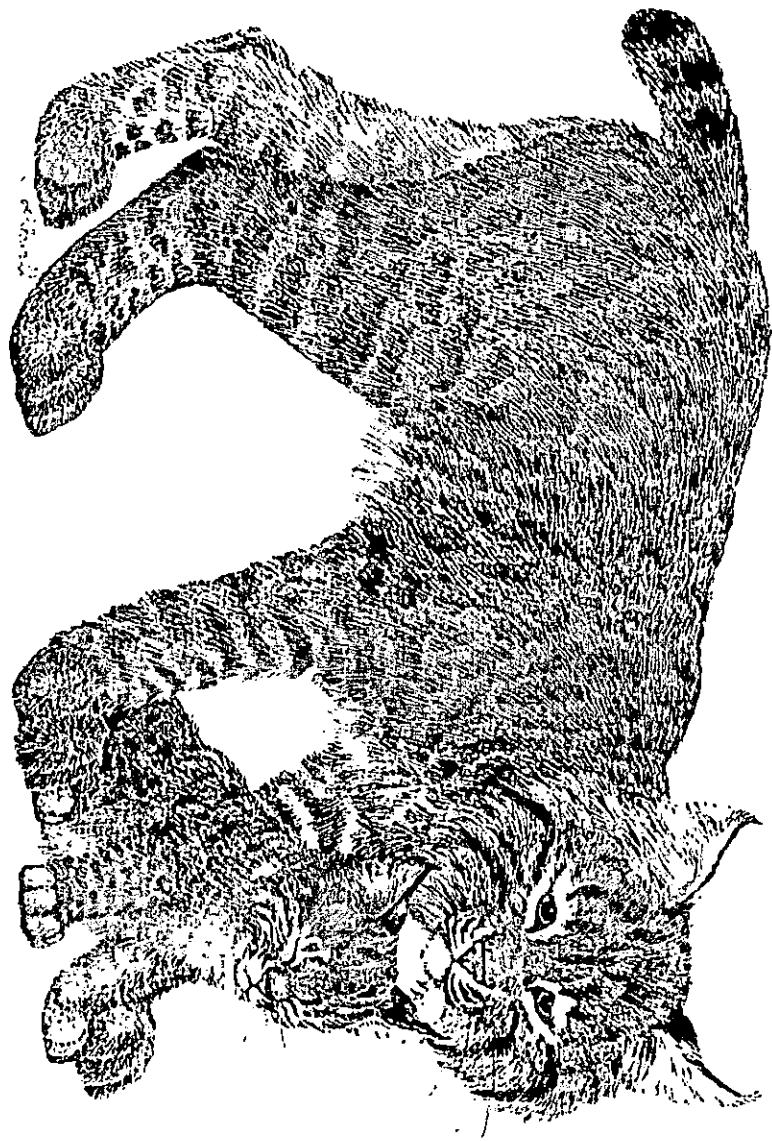


We are extremely happy that you have agreed to address our

office to make travel arrangements.

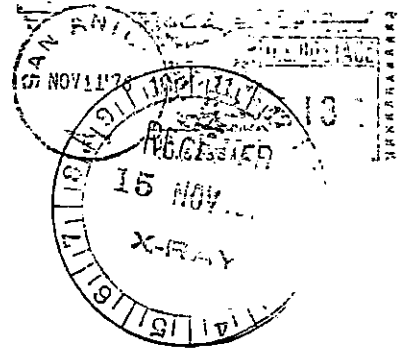
