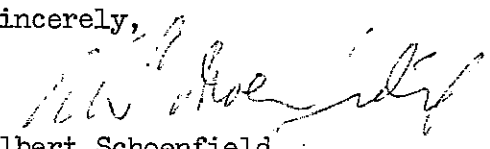

They are beginning to show improvement in world class swimming and diving as outlined in your letter of December 31st.

3. As I have mentioned in previous correspondence, visits by American delegations to Peking and pre-departure receptions for Chinese delegations give us a chance to expand our contacts here and provide opportunities to enhance the goodwill generated by these exchanges. In the case of many of these groups I would like to have a USLO representative at the airport for arrivals or departures. (NCNA frequently reports the arrival or departure of delegations, and the presence of a USLO representative is always noted.)

4. I would like, therefore, to make the following requests:

a) In coordination with NCUSCR and CSCPRC prepare a cabled up-to-date list of projected exchanges both ways with as specific dates as possible; and b) routinely, whenever plans for a visit are finalized, we should receive a cable with dates of arrival and flight numbers if possible along with a namelist of the delegation.

Dear Mr. Liu:

During April and May of this year I was privileged to visit the People's Republic of China as a member of the United States Schistosomiasis Delegation. On 22 April, at the Kiangsu Provincial Schistosomiasis Control and Prevention Institute in Wuhsi, I experienced an acute myocardial infarction that required immediate emergency attention. From that time until my departure from China on 23 May I was under the care of medical personnel from Wuhsi and Shanghai, as arranged by your Association.

I wish to thank the Chinese Medical Association and each of the persons who took part in my care for dedication and generosity, and for the great spirit of international friendship that were so clearly shown at all times. Doctor Ch'en Hao-chu, Doctor Chang Yi-ping, and every other member of the intensive care team should be highly commended. In both their personal and professional relations all doctors, nurses, technicians and other persons displayed the kindness and competence that are so characteristic of all the Chinese people. When my wife arrived in China, and during her stay in your country, the same high degree of friendship and co-operation was extended to her. We thank the staffs of the Kiangsu Provincial Schistosomiasis Control and Prevention Institute and of the Shanghai Municipality Workers' Sanatorium in Wuhsi, and of the Hua Tung Hospital in Shanghai. Comrade Ting Kwan-chun from the Chinese Medical Association was especially helpful to us and we send our thanks and greetings to him.

My entire family expresses its gratitude to you, to your government, and to the great Chinese people for all assistance given to us during our stay in China. We look forward with pleasure to continuing our association over the years, and welcome visits to this University from our Chinese colleagues.

We would appreciate it if the Chinese Medical Association could transmit this message to the Ministries of Public Health and of Foreign Affairs, and to other relevant organs of your government.

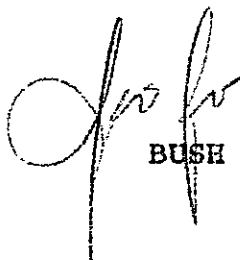

Just prior to departure from Wuhsi Mr. Ding of China Medical Association informed Ogden that Association had conferred and that in view of Basch's status in PRC as their guest at time of heart attack Association desired to cover expenses for his treatment in PRC. 1. JAY TAYLOR'S ACCOUNT OF THE SITUATION IN TELCON WITH DEPARTMENT ABOUT 0900 EDT APRIL 24 WAS THAT CHINESE IN WUHSI,

FACED WITH THE QUESTION OF ANOTHER AMERICAN DOCTOR'S COMING AFTER DELEGATION DOCTOR/S HAD DEPARTED, INDICATED THIS WOULD NOT BE NECESSARY FOR CONSULTATION PURPOSES. HOWEVER, CHINESE APPEARED TO HAVE AN OPEN MIND ON GENERAL UTILITY OF THERE BEING AN AMERICAN DOCTOR ON HAND TO GIVE PSYCHOLOGICAL SUPPORT TO THE BASCHES, CONFIRM CHINESE DECISIONS ON TREATMENT AND WHAT HAVE YOU.

2. IN TELCON WITH MRS. BASCH BEFORE SHE BOARDED LUFTHANSA FLIGHT IN ANCHORAGE, BROOKS BRIEFED HER ON RECENT DEVELOPMENTS. HE SUGGESTED SHE TRY TO ASSESS THE SITUATION IN WUHSI, ESPECIALLY THE SITUATION THAT WOULD OBTAIN AFTER DELEGATION MEMBERS LEAVE. IF SHE FELT IT WOULD BE USEFUL TO HAVE DR. BROWN COME, OR EVEN A CARDIOLOGIST, CSC WOULD

BE ABLE TO TAKE CARE OF EXPENSES AND WE SURMISED CHINESE WOULD BE COOPERATIVE ABOUT A VISA. BROOKS URGED THAT SHE BE IN FREQUENT TOUCH WITH USLO.

3. OUR IMPRESSION OF MRS. BASCH, FROM SEVERAL PHONE CONVERSATIONS, BEARS OUT OPINION EXPRESSED BY TWO DOCTOR FRIENDS AT STANFORD: AN INTELLIGENT AND VERY PRACTICAL AND SELF-RELIANT PERSON WHO CAN MANAGE VERY WELL IN WUHSI, ASSUMING (AS WE DO) THE CHINESE LAY ON ENGLISH SPEAKERS TO ASSIST HER. HOWEVER, BROOKS TOLD HER THAT ONE OR MORE VISITS TO WUHSI BY USLO PERSONNEL WERE AMONG THE POSSIBILITIES SHE WOULD WANT TO HAVE IN MIND AS THE SITUATION EVOLVES.

4. WE BELIEVE DELEGATION IS AWARE THAT MRS. BASCH IS BRINGING DR. BASCH'S MEDICAL RECORDS WITH HER. HE DOES NOT HAVE A PERSONAL PHYSICIAN; RECORDS ARE FROM A GROUP CARE FACILITY AT STANFORD. KISSINGER

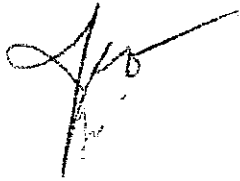

Also, in a significant development favorably affecting Chinese export of frozen shrimp to the U.S., an American group in Canton early in the month successfully ~~negotiated~~ negotiated a difficult problem resulting from the failure of Chinese shipments last year to meet FDA standards (Hong Kong 1392). End Summary.

1. Universal Oil Products (UOP). Negotiations between UOP representatives and the China National Technical Import Corporation (TECHIMPORT) on two possible whole plant projects made steady progress through the third week in February when the four-man UOP group returned to the U.S. to prepare for another round of talks in March. While in Peking, the four men were divided into two teams for parallel talks on a detergent plant and an isomar parax (IP) plant for the production of paraxylene. If both negotiations succeed, it could mean U.S. sales of \$15 million to China, mostly in technology fees.

2. In these negotiations, TECHIMPORT and UOP are pursuing experimental approaches not undertaken by the PRC before.

[ For the detergent plant, UOP would design the plant and ]

provide engineering services and would be responsible for start up and testing, but would not build the plant. Construction would be performed by an outside contractor who would be selected by TECHIMPORT only after negotiations with UOP are concluded. This procedure casts UOP in a role approximating that of consulting engineer and reverses TECHIMPORT's usual practice of negotiating with one overall contractor who would handle both construction and sub-contracting for technology.

3. The IP facility would be part of a larger polyester complex which may also involve Standard Oil of Indiana technology further downstream (see Peking 1850 of 1974). In this case, the Chinese would build most of the major vessels for the plant themselves, while UOP would provide supplemental material support as well as designing the plant, ~~supervising~~ <sup>supervising</sup> construction, and undertaking startup and testing. This ~~experimental~~ experimental approach would save the PRC considerable foreign exchange since the Chinese would be able to build most of the equipment and machinery themselves, using UOP blueprints and designs.

4. UOP is optimistic that both the detergent and IP negotiations will succeed; this is also indicated by TECHIMPORT's unusual insistence on receiving a written promise from both UOP teams that they would return to Peking for further talks no later than March 17. If the IP talks are successful, TECHIMPORT has told UOP it would ~~also~~ like to



a third round of start/negotiations on a larger IP facility for which UOP would provide technology and engineering services but construction would be done by Krupp of Germany.

5. IDC Marketing Inc. Paul Speltz and Donald Altman, President and Vice President of this New York firm, are in Peking in connection with a number of their China trade interests. One relates to the possible expansion of imports of Tsingtao beer into the U.S., which IDC has thus far done only on a small scale. Speltz and Altman were accompanied by Peter Stroh, President of Stroh Brewery Co. (Detroit), who is providing IDC with technical advice, ~~Packaging~~ and Leo Benatar, President of Mead/~~Packaging~~ (Atlanta). The group visited Tsingtao to see the brewery (they were impressed) and had discussions in Peking with the China National Cereals, Oils and Foodstuffs Import and Export Corporation (CEROILFOOD), but the scheme is still in a preliminary stage. Speltz and Altman will also attend the Tientsin Carpet Fair, and then return to Peking to pursue, on behalf of various clients, possible plant and machinery sales to China.

6. Latinasia Limited. Eugenio Gili, a ~~22 2x 2x~~ Chilean employee of this Hong Kong-based import export firm, visited Peking in mid-February on behalf of Franklin International, a California company related to Latinasia. Gili negotiated a purchase of Peking-brewed Yuchuan Beer on Franklin International's behalf at the 1974 Fall

[ Canton Fair. After the contract was signed, CEROILFOOD balked when Gili informed CEROILFOOD that it would have to file beer vendor's registration forms with the State of California in order ~~for~~ <sup>for</sup> Franklin International to receive a permit to land the beer in San Francisco (Peking A-3). The matter was resolved in January when Latinasia arranged to file the forms on CEROILFOOD's behalf. SHipment is going forward, and if test marketing is successful Franklin International hopes to become a regular importer of Yuchuan Beer.

7. Hunting World Incorporated. Robert Lee, President of this New York firm, and an associate visited Peking at the invitation of the China National Textile Import and Export Corporation. The firm sells high fashion sportswear and began importing safari jackets from China last year. Although this was his first trip to ~~the~~ China, Lee said he had already received verbal invitations to attend both of the 1975 Canton Trade Fairs. On this trip, Lee was primarily interested in purchasing knitwear, but also planned to investigate the possibility of importing bamboo products, carpets, jewelry and toys. Hunting World was one of the New York firms visited by the PRC Textile Delegation which is still in the U.S.

8. Burma ~~Import~~ Imports Ltd. Stanley Florea, a buyer for this New York firm, visited Peking and Shanghai early in the

Summary: Although the number of US business visitors declined relative to the flurry of activity noted in our last report, several important US firms were represented in China during the second half of March. Included were two groups engaged in whole plant negotiations (Universal Oil Products and Air Products and Chemicals) and six US manufacturers who are participating -- through UK subsidiaries -- in the British Machine Tools and Scientific Instruments Exhibition in Shanghai. Also in China for buying trips were several importers of musical instruments, shoes, baskets, artificial flowers, pearls and jade. End Summary.

1. The following US companies had representatives in China during the last two weeks of March.
2. Universal Oil Products (UOP) - W. R. Sedlacek and five other UOP men returned to Peking in mid-March to continue their negotiations with the China National Technical Import Corporation (TECHIMPORT) on the sale of technology, engineering and some material support services for construction of a detergent plant and an isomar parex (IP) facility. As previously reported (Peking 342), these talks would result in UOP contracts worth \$15 million, mostly in technology fees, and might lead to further UOP involvement in another TECHIMPORT plant purchase. Sedlacek is optimistic that the current negotiations will succeed and hopes this will be the final round.
3. Air Products and Chemicals (APC) - Carl Fowler, Far East Sales Director for APC's Houdry Division, visited USLO March 31 to tell of his activities in Peking over the preceding month. Fowler is participating in negotiations between TECHIMPORT and a German firm, Linde, A.G., on the sale of a benzene plant to China. The plant would be part of a larger polyester complex which would include UOP's IP facility and a parazylene and terephthalic acid plant for which Standard Oil of Indiana may provide technology (Peking 1850 of 1974). Feedstock for the

--- LIMITED OFFICIAL USE

complex would come from a Toyo Engineering ethylene plant which is already under construction and which uses US (Lummus) technology.

4. APC's role in this project would involve: (a) licensing its process for refining pyrolysis gas into high grade benzene; (b) providing technical services during construction; and (c) supplying catalysts for use in the finished plant (which should lead to later re-orders).

The total package would be worth about \$1 million to the US firm. Fowler added that TECHIMPORT, in order to conserve foreign exchange, has proposed to Linde that the Chinese supply some of the carbon steel and other basic building materials for the plant, and that they also undertake construction of the less complicated vessels themselves. While UOP has accepted a similar arrangement in its IP plant negotiations, Linde is yet to agree to such a "mixed" approach.

5. Another division of APC company will be sending negotiators to China later this year, Fowler said, for whole plant negotiations involving natural gas. He hinted that NG liquefaction could be involved, but did not elaborate.

6. Ideal Musical Merchandise Company - Jack and Kate Loeb, President and Treasurer, respectively, of this New York import firm, are visiting the Peking, Tientsin

and Kwangchow branches of the China National Light Industrial Products Import and Export Corporation. He expects to conclude an agreement while he is here for exclusive US distribution of all western-type musical instruments handled by these three branches. The contract will be for eighteen months, renewable. Loeb hopes it will put his business with China - now three years old - on a secure, long term footing.

7. Zucker Products Corporation (formerly Charles Zucker Inc.) - Leonard Zucker, President, and Bob Borella of this New York company, visited Peking in the fourth week of March on another of their periodic silk flowers buying trips. Like Loeb's firm (above), this company has been dealing with China for several years and no longer has to transact its business at the Canton Fairs. Following their visit to Peking, Zucker and Borella visited Tientsin and Shanghai.

8. S. Berger Imports and Manufacturing - Sandy and Constance Garland of S. Berger, another New York company, were in Peking in late March to buy silk flowers and baskets for floral displays. They too visited Tientsin and Shanghai before going home.

9. Frank Mastoloni and Sons - Francis Mastoloni, ~~OF THE~~  
also of  
~~FOURTH~~/New York ~~IMPORT FIRM~~, visited Peking and Shanghai in mid-March on his first buying trip to China. Although

he was looking for semi-precious stones, high quality jade carvings, and natural and cultured pearls, he found the Light Industrial Products Corporation mainly interested in selling low cost costume jewelry and other items he does not handle. He bought less than \$5,000 in merchandise and left, pleased to have seen China but unsure of future business prospects.

10. Atlas Importing Corporation - Melvin Wessel, President of this Cambridge, Mass. shoe importing company, has just returned to Peking for his second trip in three months. He visited Peking, Tientsin and Tsingtao in early January (Peking 170), and will visit at least Tientsin this time, but we have not yet had time to discuss his current trip in detail.

11. British Exhibition - The following US firms are participating, through their UK subsidiaries, in the British Machine Tools and Scientific Instruments Exhibition being held in Shanghai from March 25 to April 4: (a) Beckman Instruments; (b) Cincinnati Milacron; (c) Bausch and Lomb; (d) Perkin Elmer; (e) Giddings and Lewis Fraser, and (f) Cross International. A USLO officer visited the Fair on March 28 and reported that all of the above firms hope their representatives will be able to visit Peking following the exhibition.

1. TWENTY-ONE MEMBERS OF THE WASHINGTON, D.C., MAYOR'S COMMITTEE ON INTERNATIONAL VISITORS (MCIV) HAVE BEEN GIVEN APPROVAL TO VISIT THE PRC BETWEEN APRIL 9-26. MCIV HAS ASSISTED IN HANDLING PRC DELEGATIONS VISITING WASHINGTON, AND REINFORCED ITS REQUEST FOR CONSIDERATION AT PRCLC WITH THE STATEMENT THAT IT WISHED TO LEARN FROM CHINA TRIP SO AS TO BE BETTER ABLE TO HELP PRC VISITORS TO WASHINGTON IN THE FUTURE. VISIT IS PRIVATELY ARRANGED AND HOST IS CHINA TRAVEL SERVICE. DELEGATES ARE PAYING OWN EXPENSES. MEMBERS OF DELEGATION WERE BRIEFED IN DEPARTMENT MARCH 20 BY OFFICERS OF EA/PRCM AND CU/EA.

2. DELEGATION LEAVES WASHINGTON ON APRIL 3, ARRIVES TOKYO APRIL 5, HONG KONG APRIL 6, AND CROSSES BORDER AT SHUMCHUN APRIL 9. ## **Educator to visit Red China**

SAN MARCOS (Sp1) — Southwest Texas State University President Lee H. Smith begins the first leg of a 21-day tour of the People's Republic of China Thursday.

President Smith will join the other college and university presidents participating in the American Association of States Colleges and Universities (AASCU) tour Thursday afternoon in San Francisco.

After final briefings in that city, the 21-member delegation will fly on to Tokyo Saturday and then to Hong Kong Sunday. The group will take a train from Hong Kong to Shumchun on the Chinese border April 1.

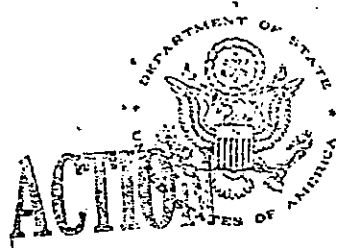
Although its actual in-China itinerary probably will not be revealed before crossing the Chinese border, the delegation is scheduled to visit educational institutions in five cities, including Canton, Shanghai, Wusih, Nanking and Peking.

According to what the SWTSU president has been able to learn about previous delegations to China, the college and university presidents may be the first Americans to visit the city of Wusih.

President Smith will be the only Texan among the AASCU delegation, which will include 20 college and university presidents and AASCU Executive Director Allan W. Ostar.

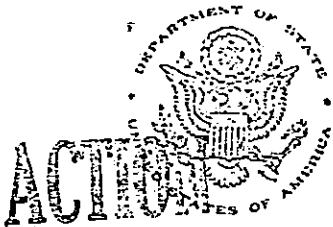

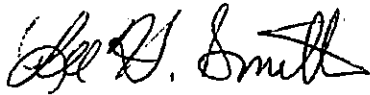
Although we will be in China from April 1 until April 21, 1975, the Chinese government has not provided us with the details of our itinerary. While we have been informed that we will be visiting the

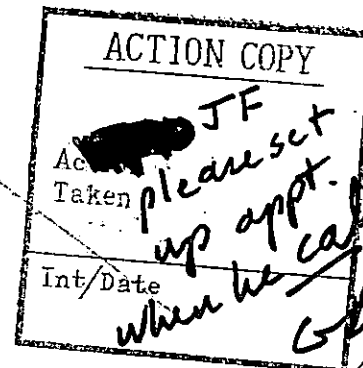

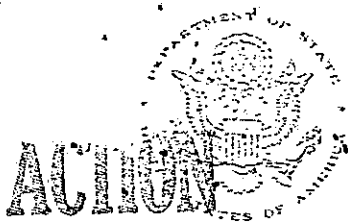

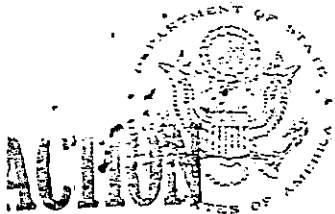

Beth and I have loved your letters and look forward to another firsthand report of how things are in Peking when Gerry and Tenant Bryant return.

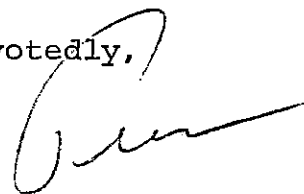
