10. In 1976, the Governor will be elected to a two-year term according to the transition schedule of the 1970 Illinois Constitution. Thereafter, it will be a 4-year term to be elected in off-presidential years.

11. State Senators' terms follow a 10 year cycle. The 59 state senatorial districts are divided into thirds with set number of term years per legislative district. This is so all senators will end their terms in time for redistricting corresponding to the census. One third receive terms of 2 yrs.-4 yrs.-4 yrs., one third receives terms of 4 yrs.-2 yrs.-4 yrs. and one third have terms of 4 yrs.-4 yrs.-2 yrs.

12. After June 30, the effective date of legislation passed by a

simple majority cannot go into effect until July 1 of the following year. Bills passed prior to June 30 go into effect Oct. 1 of the same year. The result imposes a natural limitation on the session.

13. Montana Legislature was re-districted in 1974. All Senators stood for election. One-half will face re-election in 2 years and one-half in four years; thereafter, all terms will be four years again until they re-district again.

14. Vacancy created with death, Jan. 27, of Rep. John C. Klucynski, (D), 5th District. Special election will be held in May.

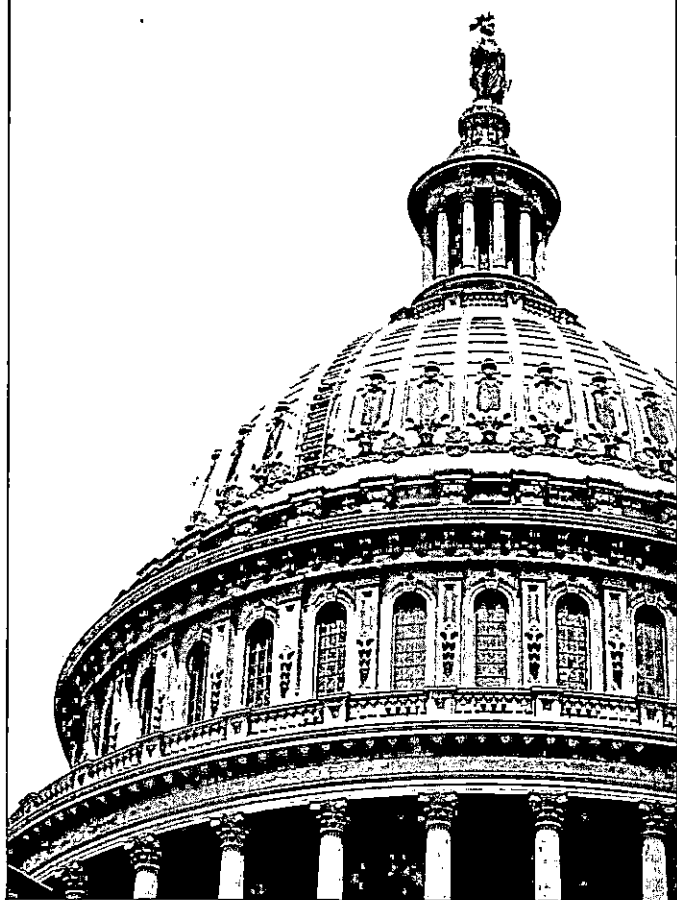

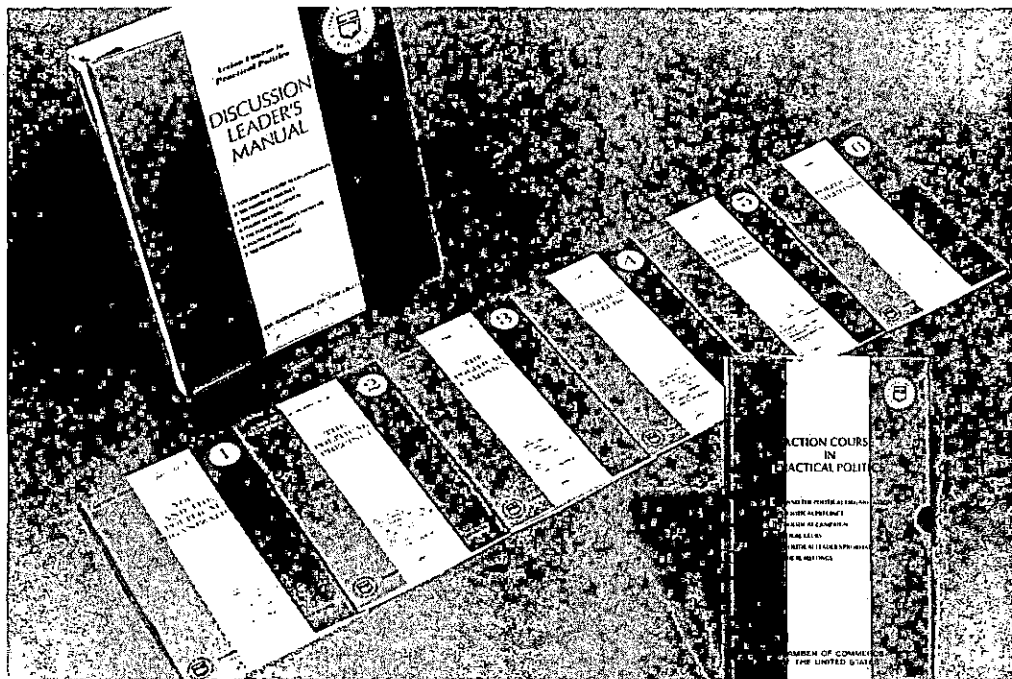
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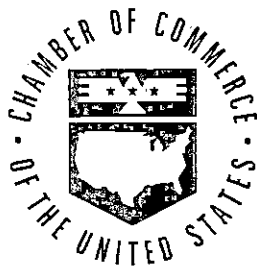

INTRODUCTION

The attached tables highlight much of the information obtained in the national study commissioned by the Republican National Committee in late 1974.

A total of 2010 personal interviews were taken in scientifically selected areas in forty-two states. The average interview length was eighty-two minutes, an indication of the complexity of the questionnaire.

The tables highlighted in this briefing concentrate on (1) problems and issues; (2) voter cynicism and alienation; and (3) party affiliation trends.

Summarizing the results of the study, overcoming the growing cynicism and alienation Americans feel toward institutions of government as well as the two major parties is perhaps the biggest challenge the Republican Party and its leadership faces in the months and years ahead.

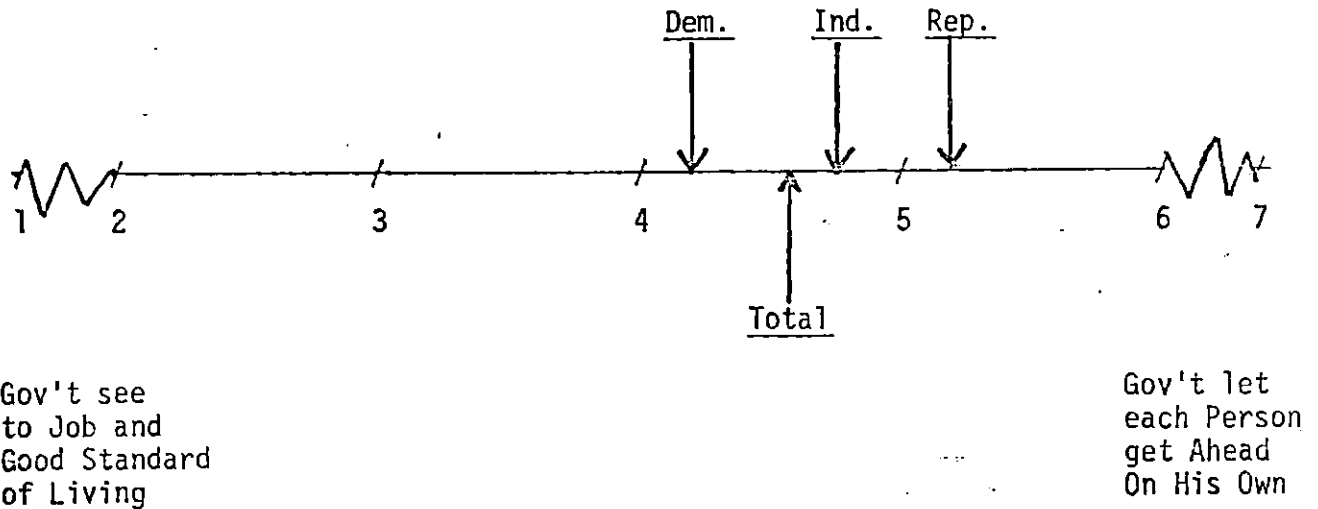

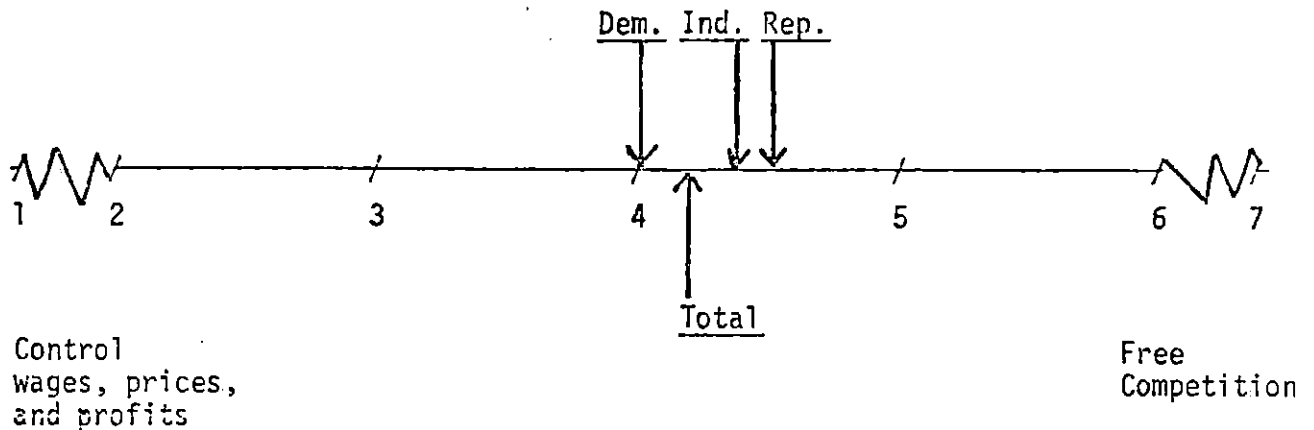

Where would you place yourself on this scale or haven't you thought much about this?

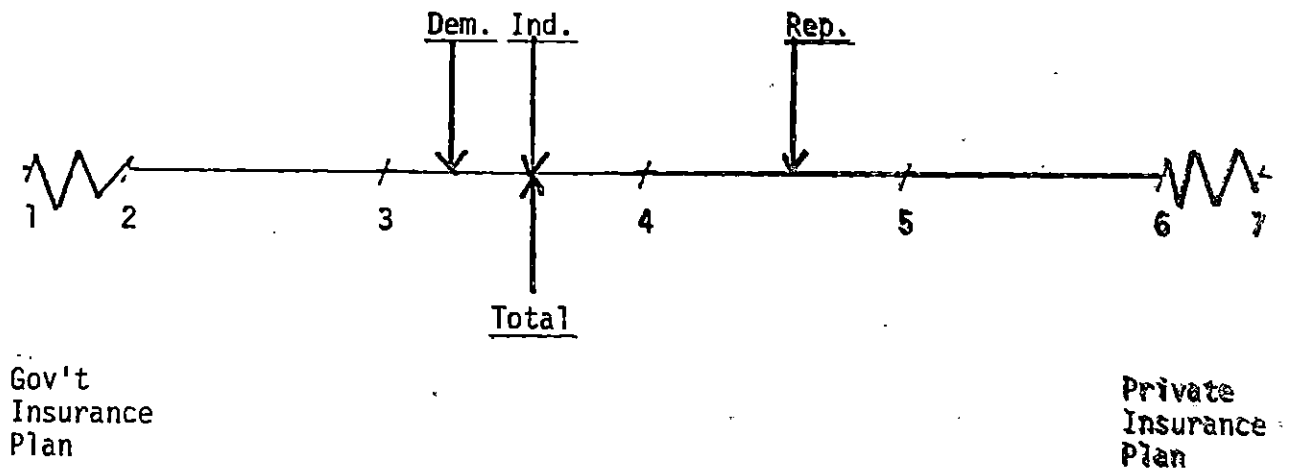

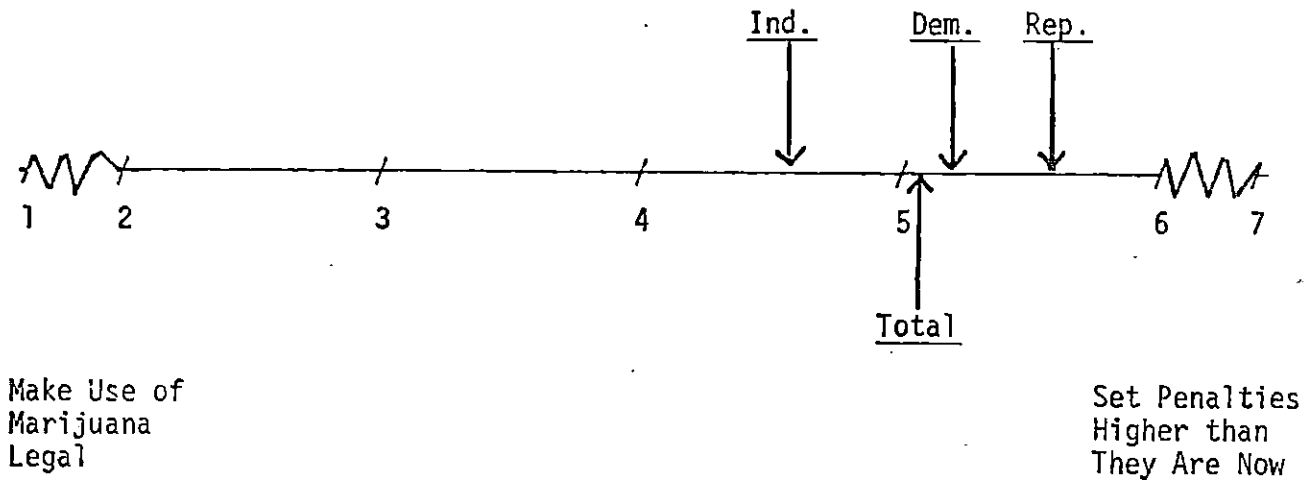

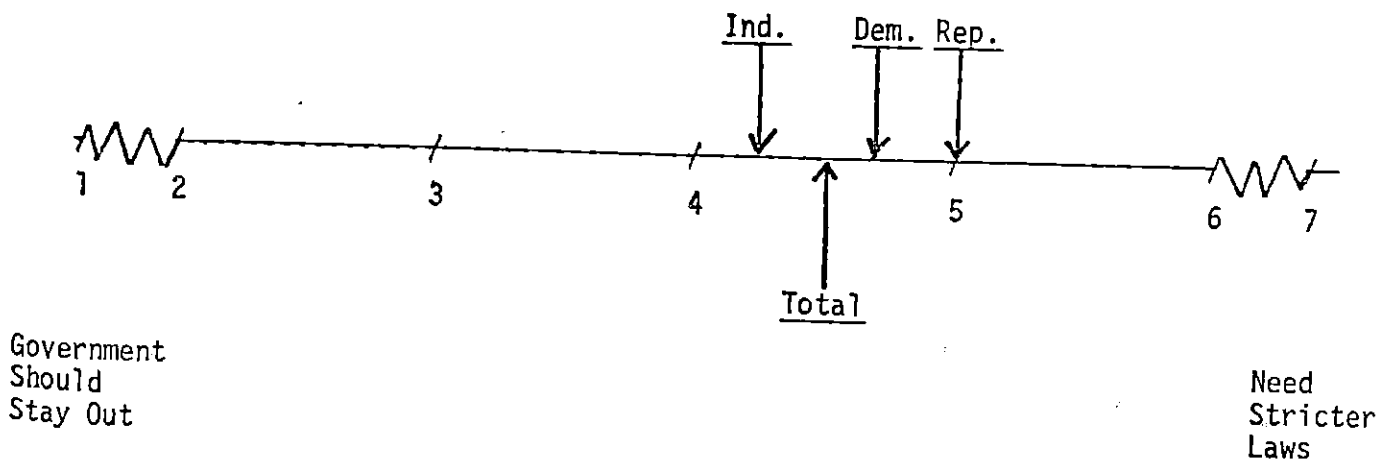

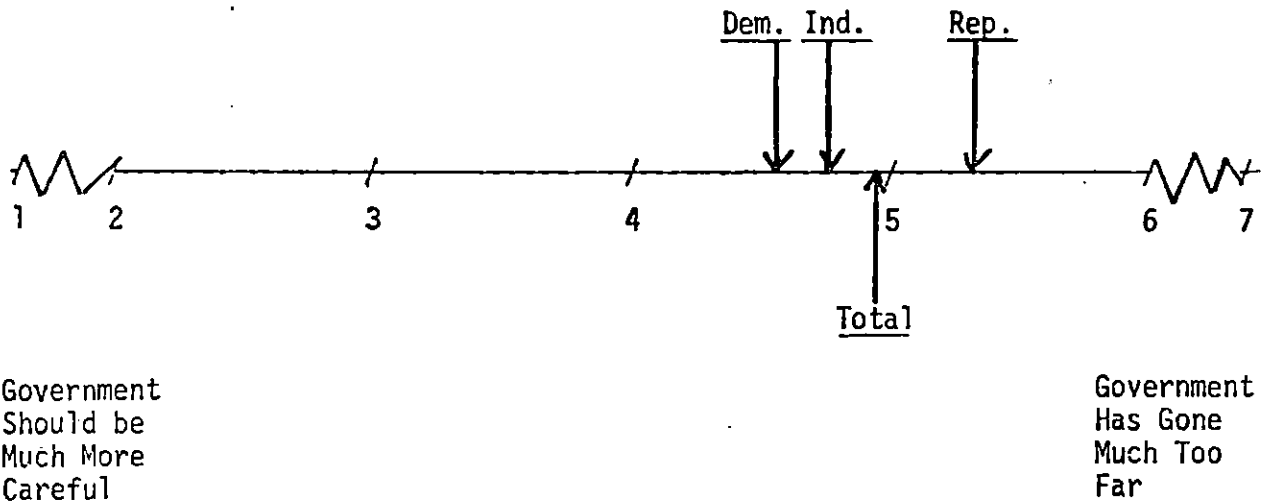

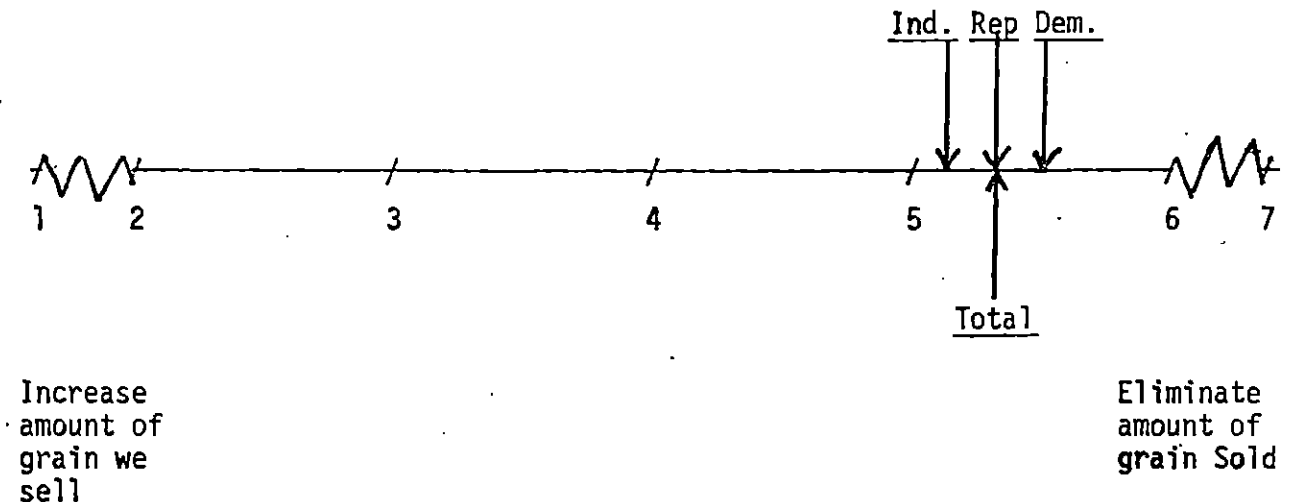

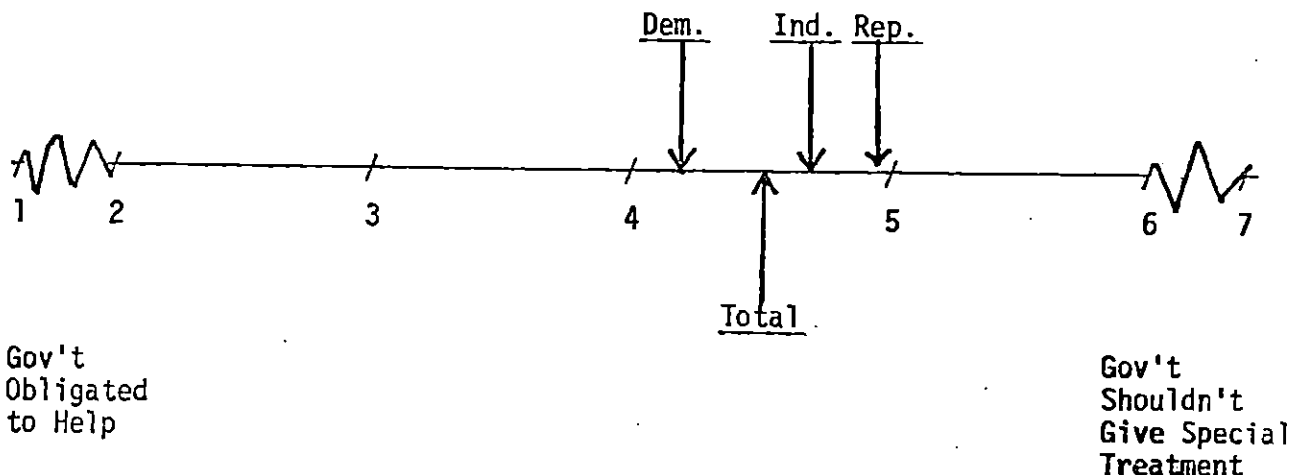

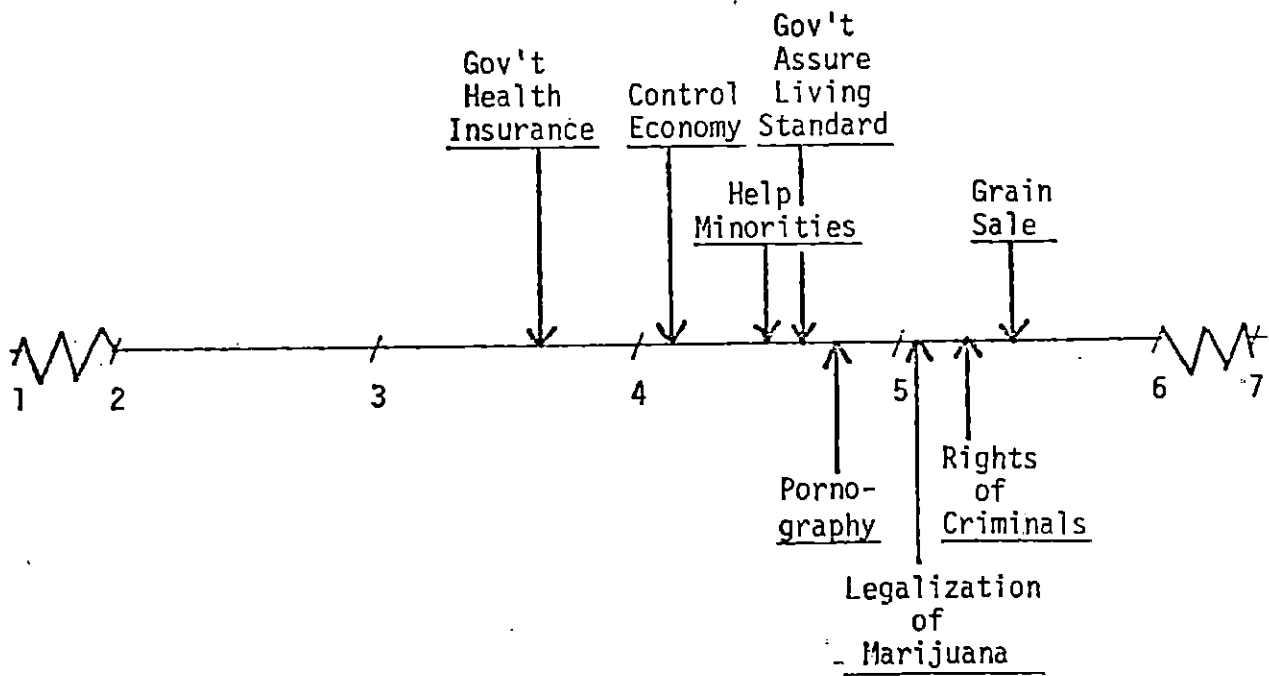

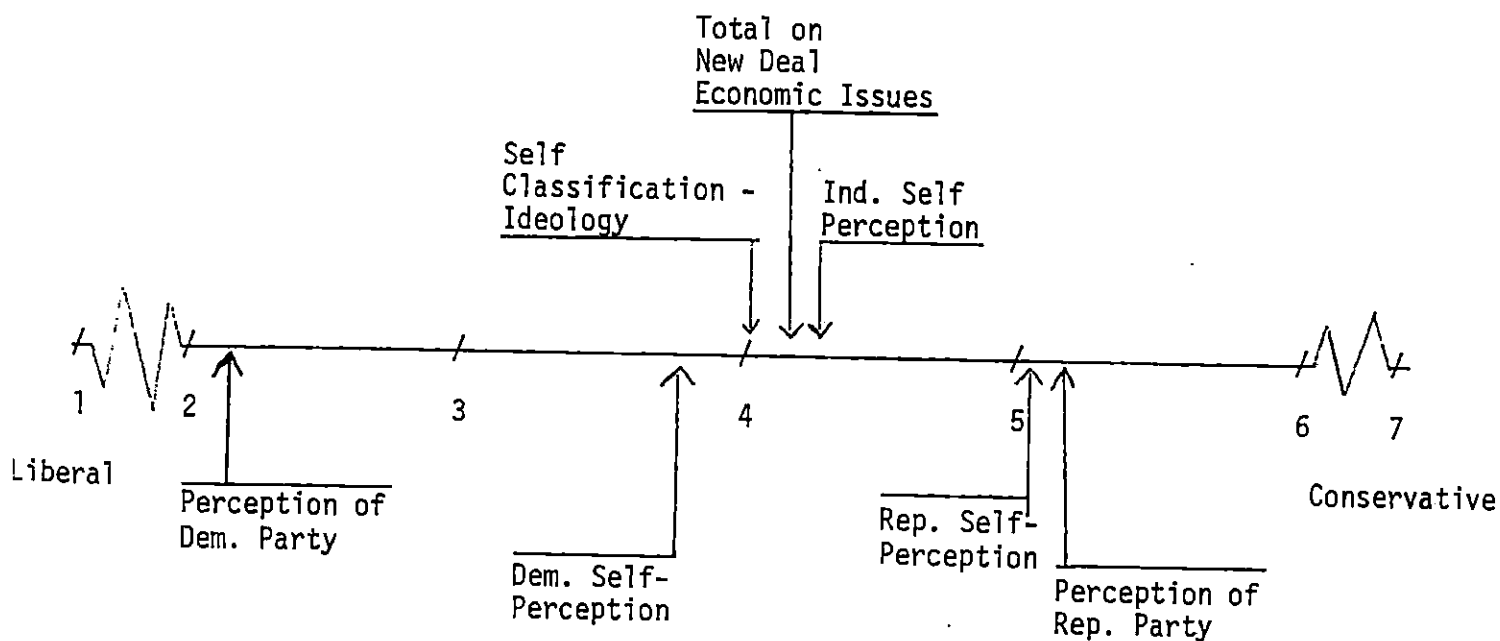

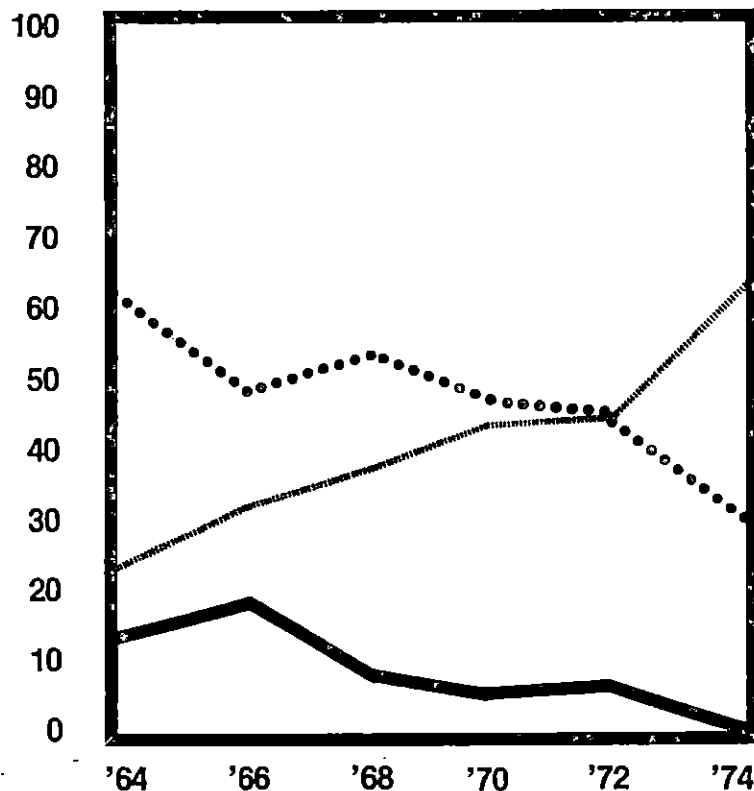

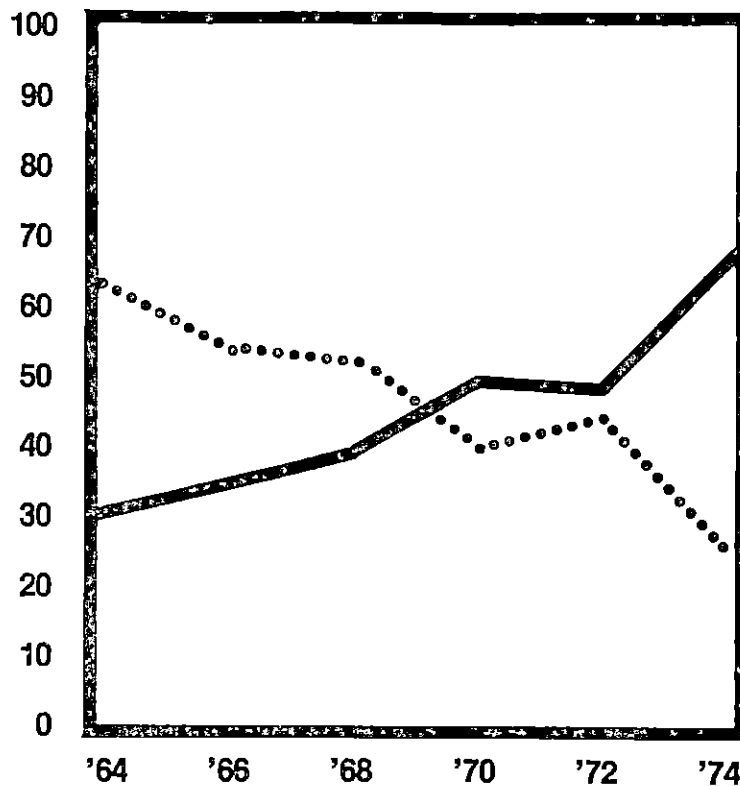

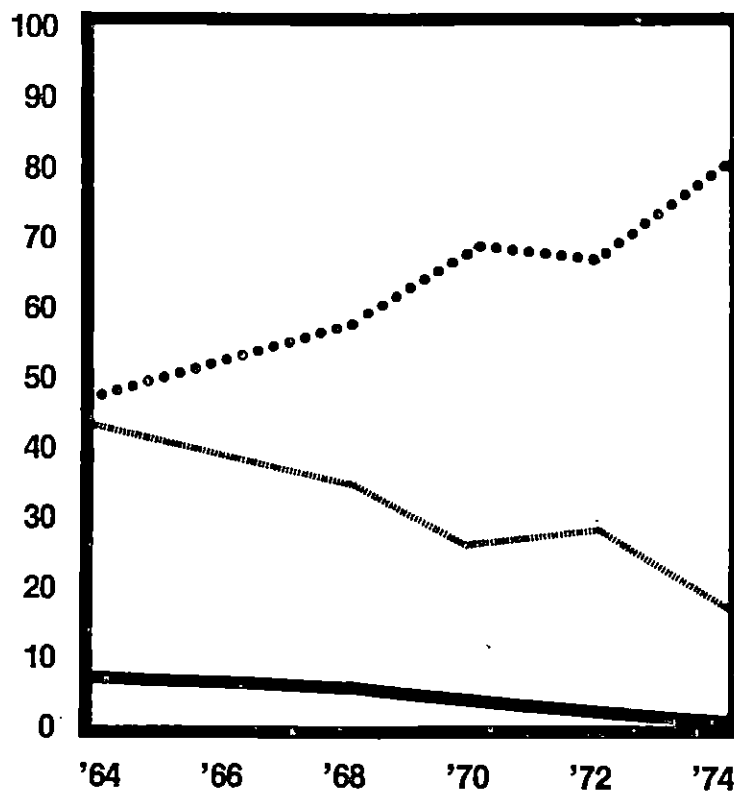

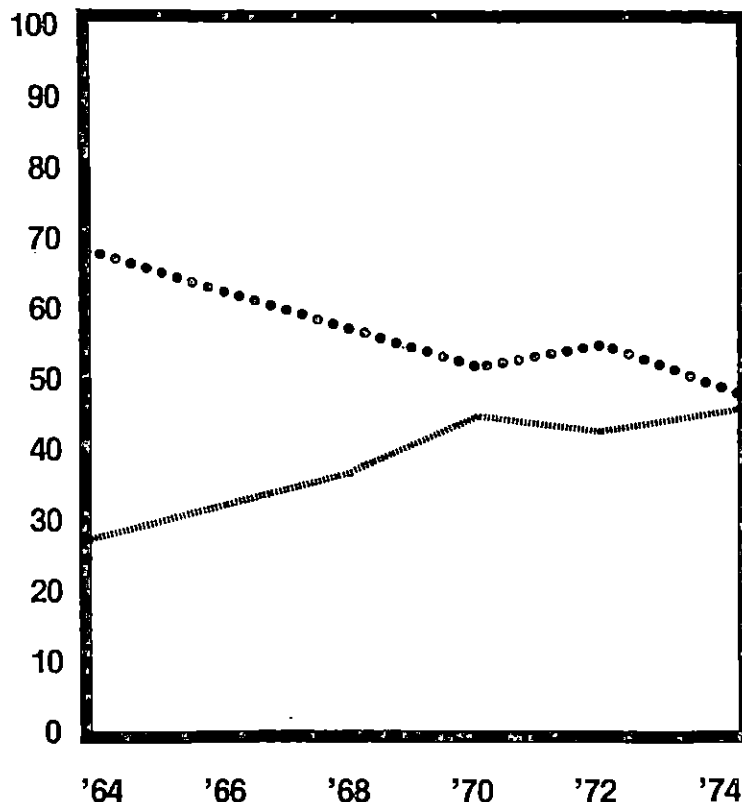

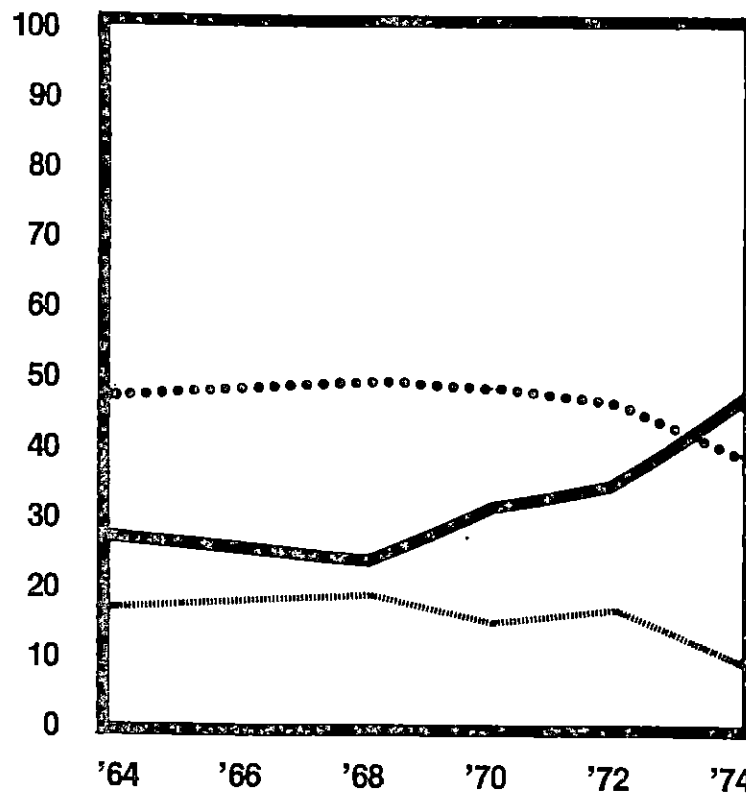

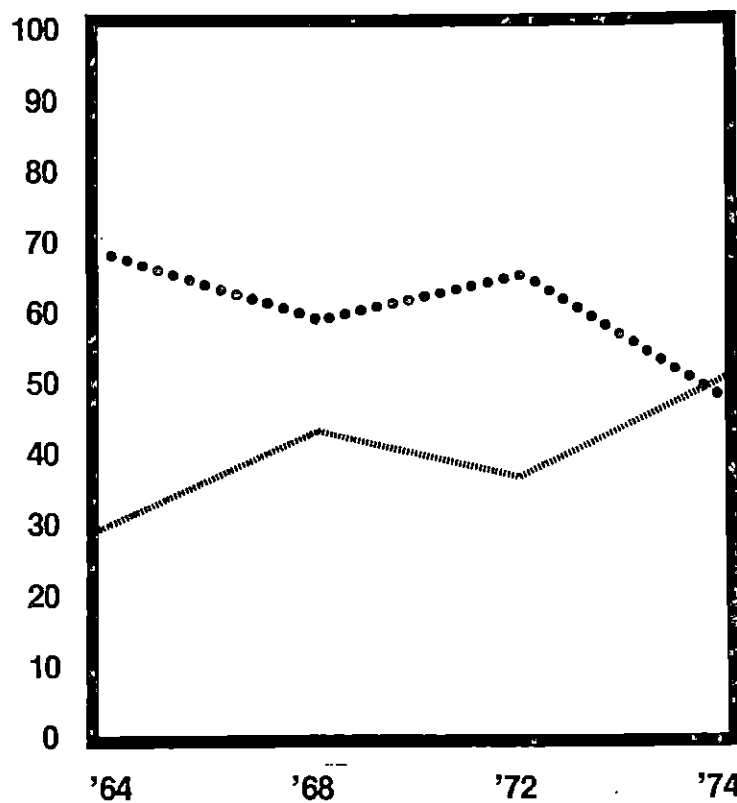

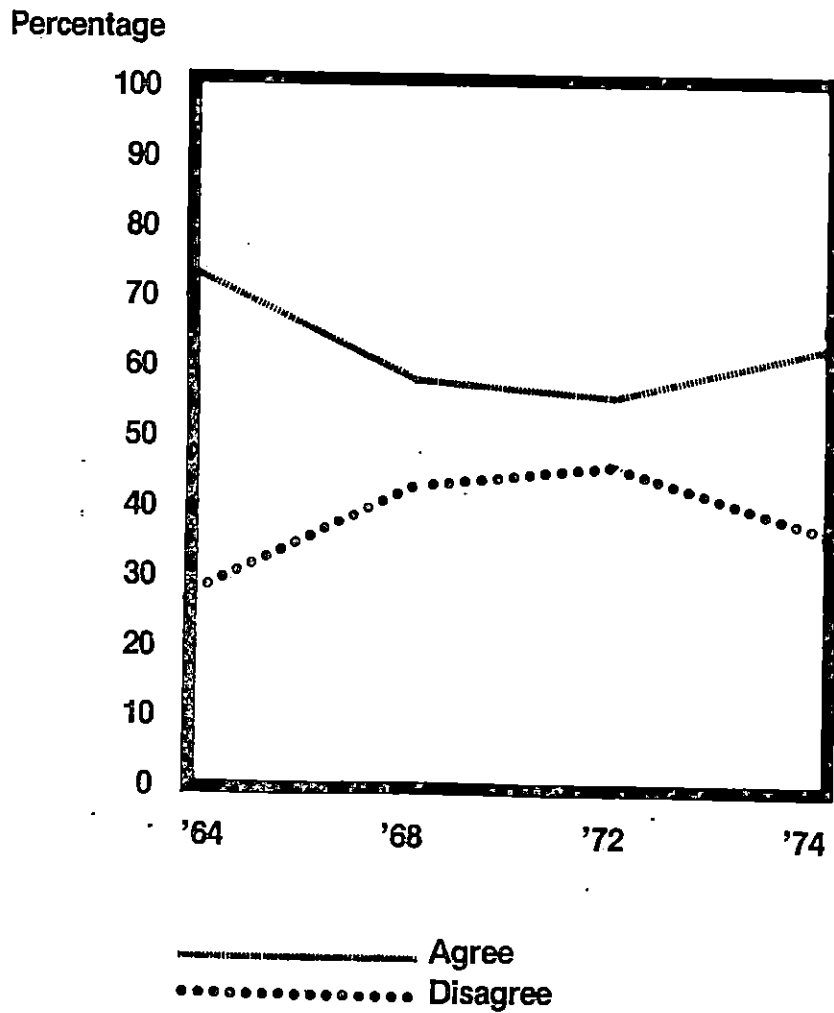

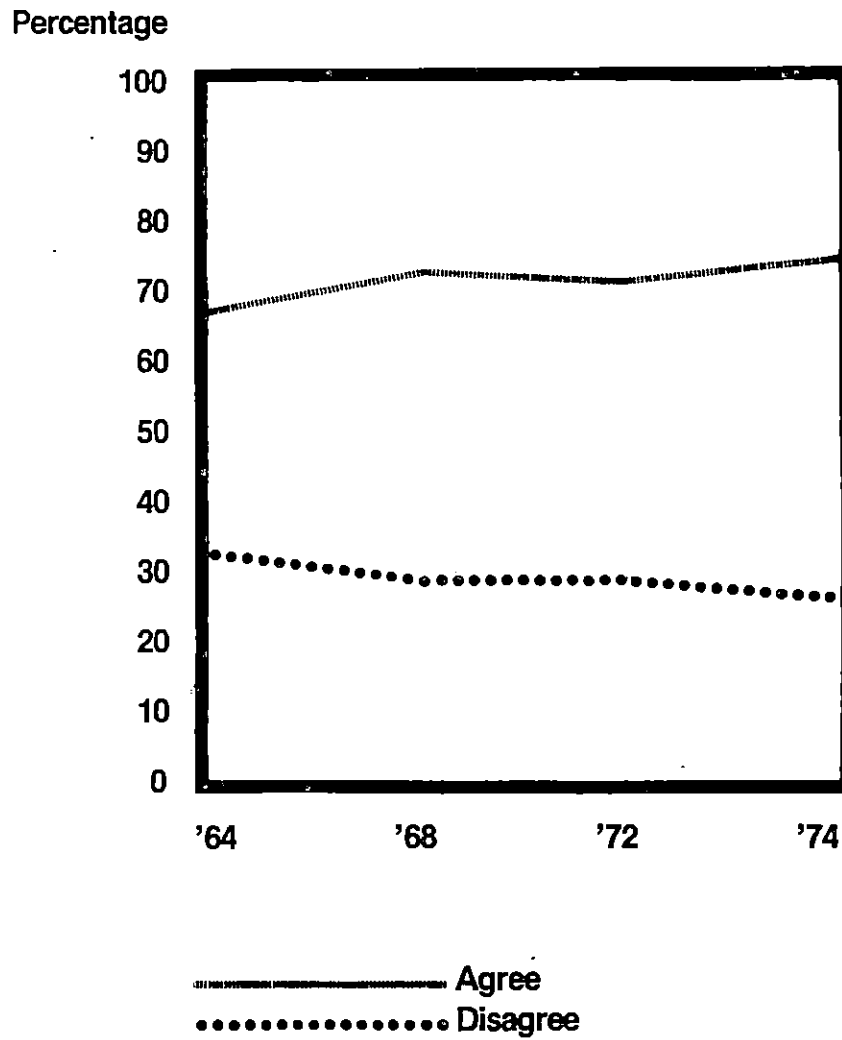

PARTY IDENTIFICATION 1952-1974

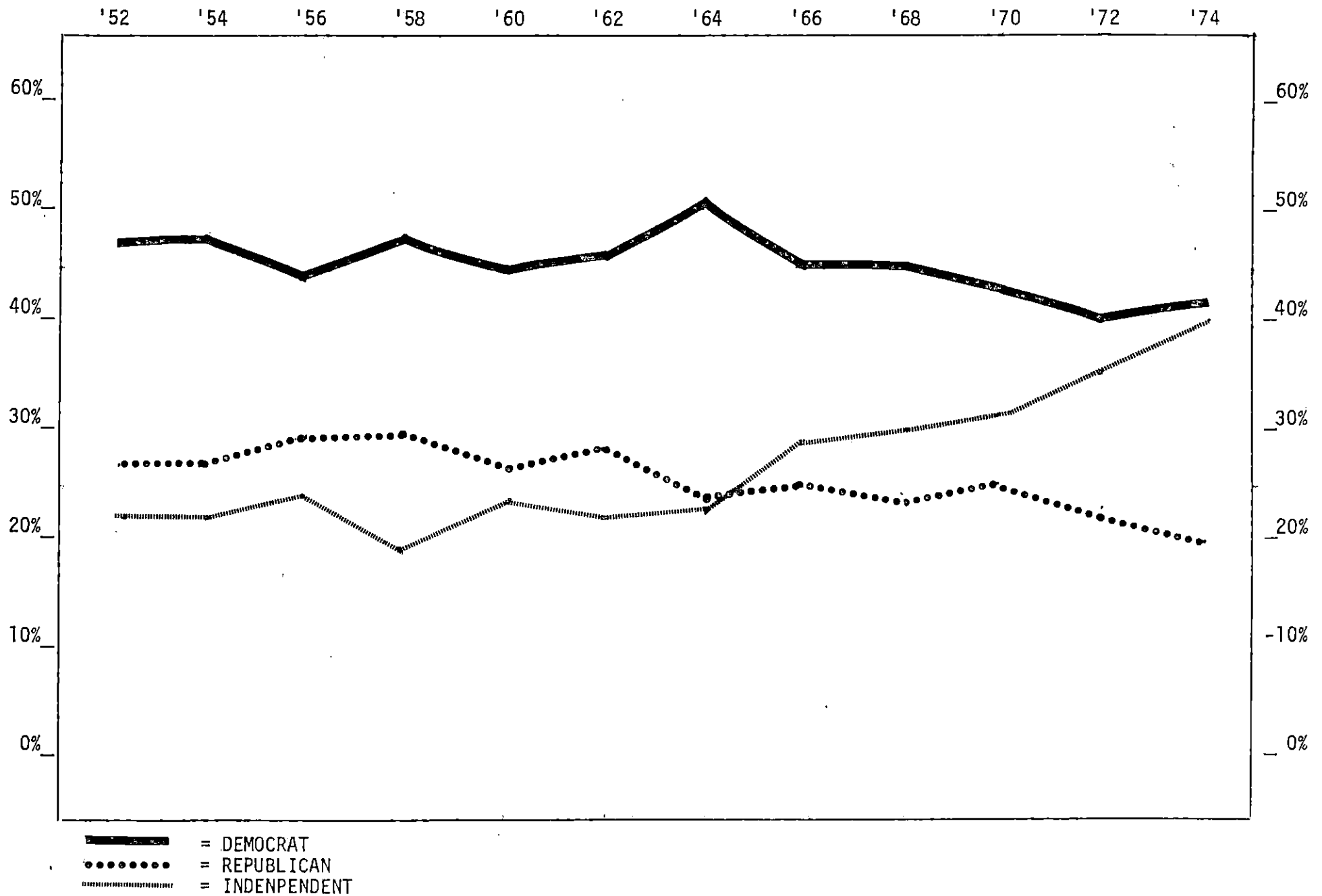
