PREFACE

In 1973 The Honorable George Bush, then Chairman of the Republican National Committee, appointed the committee authorized in the rules adopted by the 1972 Republican National Convention. In compliance with Rule No. 29(b) this committee was broadly representative of the Republican Party, including members of the Republican National Committee, and its purpose was to review, study and work with the states and territories relating to the rules adopted by the 1972 Republican National Convention and the relationship between the Republican National Committee, Republican State Committees, and other Republican organizations.

The Rule 29 Committee met frequently as a committee of the whole and in subcommittees. Hearings were held on the method of selecting a vice presidential candidate and on the selection of delegates to the National Nominating Convention. The committee received advice, opinions and recommendations of Republican Party leaders, academicians, interested citizens and organizations.

As directed in the rule authorizing its existence, the preliminary report of the Rule 29 Committee was submitted to the Republican National Committee by June 30, 1974. The Committee presented the final report by January 1, 1975, and the Republican National Committee received this report and acted upon it at its meeting held in Washington, D.C. on March 5-6, 1975. This document is the result of such action.

The Republican National Nominating Convention, held every four years, is the supreme authority of the Party. The rules adopted by each convention remain in effect until such time as the next convention convenes and adopts its own rules. The changes in the rules proposed by the Rule 29 Committee will first be reviewed and considered by a Rules Committee of the Republican National Committee, appointed by the Chairman. At the final meeting of the National Committee prior to the 1976 Convention, the National Committee will act upon a report of this Rules Committee and refer it to the Convention Committee on Rules and Order of Business.

PROPOSED NEW RULES

RESOLVED, That the Republican Party is the party of the open door. Ours is the party of equality of opportunity for all; favoritism for none.

It is the intent and purpose of these rules to encourage the broadest possible participation of all voters in the Republican Party activities at all levels; to assure that the Republican Party is open and accessible to all, answerable ultimately to the people in the true American tradition.

It is the further purpose of these rules to make certain that the Republican Party stands for the principle that while we are the party open to all, we are also the party of opportunity for all: opportunity for everyone of every race, religion, color, national origin, age or sex. They provide for full participation with equal opportunity for men and women, for minorities and heritage groups; for all Americans regardless of age or social or economic status.

These rules mandate that the Republican Party shall be a nationwide party, purposeful and strong in all sections of the country: North, South, East, and West; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the following be adopted as the rules of business of this convention, the rules for the election and government of the Republican National Committee, the rules under which delegates and alternate delegates shall be allotted to the respective states, ~~the District of Columbia, Guam, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands,~~ in the next convention, and how their election shall be conducted and contests shall be considered. ~~Whenever used in the rules, "state" or "states" shall be taken to include the District of Columbia, Guam, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands, unless the context in which the word "state" or "states" is used clearly makes such inclusion inappropriate.~~

PROCEEDINGS ~~IN~~ OF THE CONVENTION

RULE NO. 1

The convention shall proceed in the order of business prepared and printed by the Republican National Committee.

RULE NO. 2

(a) No person, except members of the several delegations, officers of the convention, and members of

the Republican National Committee, Republican members of the United States Senate and the United States House of Representatives, and Republican Governors shall be admitted to the section of the convention hall apportioned to delegates.

(b) Press and staff shall be admitted to the section(s) of the hall authorized for them.

RULE NO. 3

When the convention shall have assembled and the Committee on Credentials shall have been appointed, the Secretary of the National Committee shall deliver to the said Committee on Credentials all credentials and other papers forwarded under Rule No. 34.

RULE NO. 4

No person on the temporary roll of the convention and whose right to be seated as a delegate or alternate is being contested (except those placed on the temporary roll by affirmative vote of at least two-thirds (2/3rds) of the members of the National Committee), shall be entitled to vote in the convention or in any committee thereof until by vote of the convention the contest as to such person has been finally decided and such person has been permanently seated.

RULE NO. 5

(a) Whenever used in the rules, "state" or "states" shall be taken to include the District of Columbia, Guam, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands, unless the context in which the word "state" or "states" is used clearly makes such inclusion inappropriate.

(b) In the absence of any delegate at large, or delegate from any Congressional district, the roll of alternates for the state or district shall be called in the order in which the names are placed upon the roll of the convention, unless the state or district convention or the law of the state or district electing the absent delegate shall otherwise direct, in which event the alternates from the state or district shall vote in the order established by the state or district convention or the law of the state.

RULE NO. 6

Each delegate in the convention shall be entitled to one (1) vote, which may be cast by his or her alternate in the absence of the delegate.

RULE NO. 7

(a) The Rules of the House of Representatives of the United States shall be the rules of this convention, except that "Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised" shall be the rules for committees and subcommittees of this convention, so far as they are applicable and not inconsistent with the rules herein set forth, provided,

however, the convention may make its own rules concerning the reading of committee reports and resolutions.

(b) Committees and subcommittees may set time limits for speaking on any question by a simple majority vote.

(c) The Rules of the House of Representatives, as modified by the convention rules, shall be promulgated in condensed form by the Republican National Committee and shall be disseminated to all delegates and alternates on the temporary roll at the time of receipt of their credentials and shall be referred to the Committee on Rules of the National Committee.

(d) No votes in the committees or subcommittees of the convention shall be taken by secret ballot.

RULE NO. 8

When the previous question shall be demanded by a majority of the delegates from any state, and the demand is likewise seconded by two (2) or more states, and the call is sustained by a majority of the delegates of the convention, the question shall then be proceeded with and disposed of according to the Rules of the House of Representatives of the United States in similar cases.

RULE NO. 9

A motion to suspend the rules shall be in order only when made by authority of a majority of the delegates from any state and seconded by a majority of the delegates from not less than ~~two (2)~~ five (5) other states, severally.

RULE NO. 10

It shall be in order to lay on the table a proposed amendment to a pending measure and such motion, if adopted, shall not carry with it or prejudice such original measure.

RULE NO. 11

No member shall speak more than once upon the same question or longer than five (5) minutes, unless by leave of the convention, except in the presentation of the name of a candidate for nomination for President or Vice President.

RULE NO. 12

~~Upon all subjects before the Convention the States, the District of Columbia, Guam, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands shall be called in alphabetical order.~~

Upon all subjects before the convention requiring a roll call vote, the states shall be called in alphabetical order, beginning with the first state drawn by lot, which

drawing shall be made by the secretary of the convention.

RULE NO. 13

The report of the Committee on Credentials shall be disposed of before the report of the Committee on Resolutions is acted upon, and the report of the Committee on Resolutions shall be disposed of before the convention proceeds to the nomination of candidates for President and Vice President.

RULE NO. 14

(a) The delegates from each state elected to the national convention, immediately after they are elected, shall select from the delegation their members of the Resolutions, Credentials, Rules and Order of Business, and Permanent Organization Committees of the national convention, *consisting of one (1) man and one (1) woman for each committee, and shall file notice of such selection with the Secretary of the National Committee; provided, however, that no delegate may serve on more than one (1) committee of the national convention.* Alternates may not serve as members of the convention committees.

(b) All resolutions relating to the platform shall be referred to the Committee on Resolutions without reading and without debate.

RULE NO. 15

When a majority of the delegates of any six (6) states severally shall demand that a vote be recorded, the same shall be taken by the states in the order hereinbefore established.

RULE NO. 16

(a) Candidates for the Presidency shall demonstrate majority support from each of ~~three (3)~~ five (5) state delegations.

(b) In making the nominations for President and Vice President and voting thereon, in no case shall the call of the roll be dispensed with. The total time of the nominating speech and seconding speeches for any candidate for President ~~and~~ or Vice President shall not exceed fifteen (15) minutes.

RULE NO. 17

When it appears at the close of the roll call that any candidate for the nomination for President or Vice President has received the majority of the votes entitled to be cast in the convention, the chairman of the convention shall announce the question to be: "Shall the nomination of the candidate be made unanimous?" If no candidate shall have received such majority, the chairman shall direct the vote to be taken again and shall repeat the taking of the vote until some candidate shall have received a majority of votes.

RULE NO. 18

(a) In the balloting, the vote of each state shall be announced by the chairman of the respective delegations; and in case the vote of any state shall be divided, the chairman shall announce the number of votes for each candidate, or for or against any proposition; but if exception is taken by any delegate to the correctness of such announcement by the chairman of ~~his~~ the delegation, the chairman of the convention shall direct the roll of members of such delegation to be called and the result shall be recorded in accordance with the vote of the several delegates in such delegation. No delegate or alternate shall be bound by any attempt of ~~any State or Congressional District, the District of Columbia, Guam, Puerto Rico, or the Virgin Islands~~ to impose the unit rule.

(b) In balloting, if any delegation shall pass when its name is called, then at the conclusion of the roll call all delegations which passed shall be called in alphabetical order; and no delegation will be allowed to change its votes until all delegations which passed shall have been given a second opportunity to vote.

REPUBLICAN NATIONAL COMMITTEE

RULE NO. 19

(a) ~~A National Committee shall be elected by each National Convention, called to nominate candidates for President and Vice President, and shall consist of two (2) members from each State, the District of Columbia, Guam, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands, and an additional member as hereinafter provided. The Committee~~ The Republican National Committee shall have the general management of the affairs of the Republican Party in the United States, the District of Columbia, Guam, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands, subject to direction from time to time of the national convention. ~~The members of the National Committee shall be elected by the various states and shall consist of one man and one woman from each state.~~

(b) The duly elected and acting chairman of each state, ~~the District of Columbia, Guam, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands~~ shall be a member of the National Committee during his or her tenure of in office.

(c) Two (2) members each of the Republican Governors Association, Republican membership of the United States Senate, and the Republican membership of the United States House of Representatives shall be elected by their respective organizations as full voting members of the National Committee.

(d) The chairman or president of the official national Republican auxiliaries (The National Federation of Republican Women, The Young Republican National Federation, The College Republican National Committee, The National Republican Heritage Groups Council, and the National Black Republican Council) and the Chairman of the Republican Finance Committee shall be ex officio full voting members.

(e) Additional auxiliaries of the Republican National Committee may be recognized only by the Republican National Convention.

(f) The Republican National Committee shall operate under a permanent set of bylaws adopted by the Republican National Committee. These bylaws shall enumerate such standing committees as may be deemed necessary by the Republican National Committee.

(g) The chair of each standing committee shall be appointed by the Chair of the Republican National Committee, subject to the approval of the Republican National Committee.

RULE NO. 20

~~The roll shall be called and the Delegation from each State shall nominate, through its Chairman, one (1) man and one (1) woman to act as members of the National Committee.~~

(a) At each Republican national convention called for the purpose of nominating candidates for President and Vice President, the roll shall be called and the delegation from each state shall report through its chair the names of the elected National Committee members whose election shall be ratified by the convention.

(b) The Chair of the Republican National Committee shall set the temporary roll for Republican National Committee meetings.

RULE NO. 21

~~When the law of any State provides a method for the selection of members of the National Committee of political parties, the nomination of the members of the Republican National Committee in accordance with the provisions of such law shall be considered nominations to be carried into effect by the Delegation from such State provided, however, that this rule shall not apply to the membership of the National Committee by the State Chairman.~~

State laws providing a method of election for National Committee members shall be binding on the Republican National Committee.

RULE NO. 22

~~Where the laws of a State do not provide a method for the selection of members of the National Committee of political parties, instructions by State and District Conventions to Delegates to the National Convention as to nominations for membership in the National Committee shall be obeyed by such Delegates; and if not obeyed, may be made operative by a vote of the National Convention or referred to the National Committee with full power to act. It is provided, however, that this rule shall not apply to a State Chairman who is entitled to membership under Rule 19.~~

Where state laws do not provide a method for the election of National Committee members, a national convention delegation shall be bound by the state party

rules. The national convention may enforce these rules if they are not obeyed by the state's national convention delegation. This rule shall not apply to Republican state chairmen.

RULE NO. 23

~~When a majority of the Delegates from each State shall have so nominated a member of the National Committee, the Convention shall thereupon elect the person so nominated to serve as a member of the Committee until the meeting of the National Committee elected by the next National Convention.~~

Republican National Committee members shall serve from the adjournment of the quadrennial national convention until the adjournment of the following quadrennial national convention.

RULE NO. 24

(a) The National Committee shall issue the call for the next national convention to nominate candidates for President and Vice President of the United States at least four (4) months before the time fixed for said Convention; and Delegates and Alternates to such Convention shall be chosen in such manner, and the Call shall be issued and promulgated in such manner, as the National Committee shall provide, but not, however, in a manner inconsistent with these Rules, prior to January 1 of the year in which the convention is to be held. The National Committee shall issue and promulgate the call in a manner consistent with these rules.

(b) National convention delegates and alternates shall be chosen in a manner consistent with these rules unless otherwise provided by state law.

(c) At the time of the issuance of the Call, the Chairman of the Republican National Committee shall appoint from among the members of the National Committee, a Committee on the Call, a Committee on Arrangements, a Committee on Rules, and a Contest Committee consisting. Each committee shall consist of at least seven (7) members. The chairman of the Contest Committee and the chairman of the Committee on Rules shall be members also of the Arrangements Committee. Each member of the Republican National Committee shall be appointed to one of these committees.

(d) Following each Republican national convention, the Chair of the Republican National Committee will designate a seven-member Select Committee on Presidential Campaign Affairs, to be composed of the Chair of the Republican National Committee, the Treasurer of the Republican National Committee, and five other members of the Republican National Committee. The Chair of the Republican National Committee shall be the chair of the Select Committee.

This Select Committee on Presidential Campaign Affairs shall receive from the Republican nominee for President his or her full plan of financial expenditures

during the campaign for President.

This Select Committee on Presidential Campaign Affairs shall receive periodic reports from the campaign committee of the Presidential nominee of the Republican Party in order to insure that all expenditures are in full accordance not only with the law, but with established ethical practices for political campaigns.

The Select Committee on Presidential Campaign Affairs will designate one of the "designated agents" of the Presidential campaign committee prior to any expenditure of any funds by that committee on behalf of the Republican nominee for President of the United States, and said "designated agent" shall be a member of the Republican National Committee and shall report to and confer with the Select Committee on Presidential Campaign Affairs on a regular basis.

This shall include all such committees above the state level which are organized by the candidate.

All Republican candidates for President shall agree in writing to this rule prior to his or her nomination.

(e) The Chair shall appoint a Site Committee no later than two years following the Presidential election.

RULE NO. 25

(a) The officers of the National Committee shall consist of: ~~a Chairman, eight (8) Vice Chairmen, one (1) man and one (1) woman from each region nominated by the Committee members of the four (4) regions as defined by the regional State Conference and who shall be residents of and represent these four (4) regions;~~

(1) a Chair and a Co-Chair of the opposite sex who shall be elected by the members of the Republican National Committee and who shall be full-time, paid employees. The Chair shall be the chief executive officer of the Republican National Committee. The Chair or Co-Chair may be removed from office only by a two-thirds (2/3rds) vote of the entire National Committee.

(2) Eight (8) Vice Chairmen, one man and one woman, from each of the following regions:

The Western States Association: Alaska, Arizona, California, Colorado, Guam, Hawaii, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, Oregon, Utah, Washington, and Wyoming;

The Midwestern States Association: Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, North Dakota, Ohio, South Dakota, West Virginia, and Wisconsin;

The Northeastern States Association: Connecticut, Delaware, the District of Columbia, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, Puerto Rico, Rhode Island, Vermont, and the Virgin Islands;

The Southern States Association: Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Mississippi, North Carolina, Oklahoma, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, and Virginia;

(3) a Secretary, a Treasurer, and such other officers as the Committee shall deem necessary, all to be elected

by the National Committee.

(b) The Chair, Co-Chair, and all other officers except the Vice Chairmen shall be elected for two-year terms. The terms shall run from the first National Committee meeting following the national convention until June of the next even-numbered year and from that June until the termination of the next quadrennial national convention. All officers except the Vice Chairmen shall be nominated from the floor, and candidates must have at least two (2) votes in three (3) states in order to have their names put in nomination. There shall be no nominating committee.

(c) The eight (8) Vice Chairmen shall be elected at regional caucuses by the National Committee members of the four (4) regions and shall be residents and National committee members from their respective regions. The election shall take place at the first meeting after the quadrennial national convention. The election of Vice Chairmen does not need confirmation by the Republican National Committee.

(d) The Chair ~~man~~ shall appoint a general counsel for the Committee and a chairman of the Republican Finance Committee, both of whom shall be confirmed by the Republican National Committee at its next meeting, ~~and a Co-Chairman who shall be of the opposite sex of the Chairman.~~

RULE NO. 26

~~(a) The National Committee is authorized and empowered to select an Executive Committee, to consist of fifteen (15) members; in addition the following shall serve as ex officio members of the Executive Committee: The Chairman, the Co-Chairman, the Vice Chairmen, the Secretary, the Treasurer, the General Counsel, the Chairman of the Republican Finance Committee, the President of the National Federation of Republican Women, the Chairman of the Republican State Chairmen's Advisory Committee, the Chairman of the Young Republican National Federation, the Chairman of the College Republican National Committee, the Chairman of the National Republican Heritage Groups Council, a representative of Black Republican organizations as designated by the Chairman, the Republican Leader of the U.S. Senate, the Republican Leader of the U.S. House of Representatives, and the Chairman of the Republican Governors Association.~~

(a) The Executive Committee of the National Committee shall consist of the following:

(1) the officers of the National Committee

(2) the Chair of the Republican Finance Committee,

(3) the chair or president of the official national Republican auxiliaries, and a representative of the membership of the United States Senate, the United States House of Representatives, the Republican Governors Association (each elected by their respective membership),

(a) The first meeting of the National Committee shall take place within fifteen (15) days after the convening of the National Convention electing such Committee, upon the call of the member senior in time

RULE NO. 28

Vacancies in the National Committee shall be filled by the Committee upon the nomination of the Republican State Committee election by the state Republican party in and for the state in which the vacancy occurs. The National Committee shall however have the power to declare vacant the seat of any member who refuses to support the Republican nominees for President and/or Vice President of the Convention which elected such National Committee, and to fill such vacancy.

RULE NO. 27

- (4) the chair of the Republican State Chairmen's Advisory Committee.
- (5) The general counsel and the chair of the standing committees shall be non-voting members.
- (b) The Executive Committee shall exercise all of the executive and administrative functions required of the National Committee between meetings of the full Committee, with the exception of the following:
 - (1) election of officers of the National Committee,
 - (2) ratification of members of the Republican National Committee or the Executive Committee,
 - (3) issuance of the call and designating the time and place for holding the quadrennial National Convention.
- 4- The Executive Committee shall meet on the call of the Chairmen, and such meetings shall be held at least twice a year at times other than those when the National Committee is meeting in addition to those meetings which shall be held in conjunction with Executive Committee meetings. The minutes of all immediately to all Republican National Committee members.
- (c) The Chairmen, with the consent approval of the National Committee, may appoint such other special committees and assistants as he may deem necessary; whenever such committees are appointed, they shall consist of a chairman, who shall be a member of the Republican National Committee, and an equal number of men and women.
- (d) Upon written petition of at least twenty-five per cent (25%) of the members of the Executive Committee, the Chair within ten (10) days shall call a meeting of the Executive Committee to be held in a city to be designated by the Chair. The date of such meeting shall fall between ten (10) and twenty (20) days from the date of the call.

RULE NO. 29

- (a) "Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised" shall govern in all meetings of the National Committee insofar as they are applicable and not inconsistent with these rules. At its first meeting, the Committee shall make its own rules governing the use of proxies, at any meeting. The Republican National Committee is hereby directed to recommend the adoption of Robert's Rules of Order Revised as the Rules of Order for the 1976 Republican National Convention Committee on Rules and Order of Business for the temporary and permanent committees and subcommittees of that Convention.
- (b) The Chairmen of the Republican National Committee shall appoint a committee broadly representative of the Republican Party, including members and work with the states and territories, the District of Columbia, Guam, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands, relating to the rules adopted by the 1972-1976 Republican National Convention, and the relationship of service upon the previous National Committee; and thereafter upon call of the Chairmen, or, in case of vacancy in the Chairmanship, upon call of the Vice Chairmen senior in time of service on the National Committee; but such call shall be issued at least ten (10) days in advance of the date of the proposed meeting. Provided, however, that if one of the purposes of a meeting of the Republican National Committee is to fill a vacancy in the office of Republican candidate for President or Republican candidate for Vice President, then only five (5) days notice of the purpose, date, and place of said meeting shall be required. Upon written petition of sixteen (16) or more members of the National Committee, representing not less than sixteen (16) states, filed jointly or separately with the Chairmen, asking for a meeting of the National Committee, it shall be the duty of the Chairmen within ten (10) days from receipt of said petition to issue a call for a meeting of the National Committee, to be held in a city to be designated by the Chairmen, the date of such called meeting to be not later than twenty (20) days or earlier than ten (10) days from the date of the call.
- (b) The Republican National Committee shall meet at least twice a year. The agenda for each meeting shall be mailed to the membership at least ten (10) days prior to the meeting. The minutes, including all resolutions and motion, shall be mailed to all members of the Republican National Committee within thirty (30) days after the close of the meeting.
- (c) The annual budget shall be approved at a meeting of the Republican National Committee. The proposed budget, in reasonable detail, shall be mailed to all members of the Republican National Committee at least ten (10) days prior to such meeting.
- (d) All meetings of the Republican National Committee and all of its committees shall be open meetings except as provided for by "Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised."

~~between the Republican National Committee, Republican State Committees, and other Republican organizations. A preliminary report shall be submitted to the Republican National Committee no later than June 30, 1974, and a final report no later than January 1, 1975. The Republican National Committee shall consider and act upon the final recommendations of the Committee within ninety (90) days of receiving same. The appointments to said committee shall be subject to the approval of the Republican National Committee.~~

MEMBERSHIP IN THE NEXT NATIONAL CONVENTION

RULE NO. 30

The membership of the next National Convention shall consist of:

A. DELEGATES

1. Six (6) delegates at large from each of the fifty (50) states.
2. Three (3) district delegates for each Representative in the United States House of Representatives from each state.
3. Fourteen (14) delegates at large for the District of Columbia, four (4) delegates at large for Guam, eight (8) delegates at large for Puerto Rico, and four (4) delegates at large for the Virgin Islands.
4. From each state casting its electoral vote, or a majority thereof, for the Republican nominee for President in the last preceding election: Four and one-half (4½) delegates at large plus the number of the delegates at large equal to 60% of the electoral vote from each such state. In addition, one delegate at large shall be awarded to a state for any and each of the following public officials elected by such state in the year of the last preceding Presidential election or at any subsequent election held prior to January 1, 1976 1980:
 - (a) A Republican United States Senator: Provided, That no such additional delegate at large award to any state shall exceed two;
 - (b) A Republican Governor: Provided, That no such additional delegate at large award to any state shall exceed one; or
 - (c) A Republican membership of at least half of the state's delegation to the United States House of Representatives; Provided, That no such additional delegate at large award to any state shall exceed one.

In the computation of the number of delegates at large, any sum of the four and one-half (4½) plus the 60% representing a fraction shall be increased to the next whole number.

5. If the District of Columbia casts its electoral vote, or a majority thereof, for the Republican nominee for President in the last preceding Presidential election: Four and one-half (4½) delegates at large, plus the number of delegates at large equal to 30% of the

fourteen (14) delegates at large allotted to the District of Columbia. In the computation of the number of delegates at large, any sum of the four and one-half (4½) plus the 30% representing a fraction shall be increased to the next whole number.

6. Any state which would receive fewer delegates under all provisions of this rule than it received to the 1972 Republican National Convention shall have its number of delegates increased to the same number of delegates it received to the 1972 Republican National Convention.

7. In the event this Rule No. 30 is the subject of litigation and is finally adjudicated in the courts to be invalid, then this Rule No. 30 shall be of no force and effect and the Republican National Committee is hereby authorized to adopt the formula which will determine the membership of the next national convention. No new formula may be so drawn by the Republican National Committee after October 31, 1975.

8. Should it become the duty of the Republican National Committee to implement Section 7 of Rule 30 in voting in said Committee, the Committee members representing any state, the District of Columbia, Guam, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands shall be entitled to cast the same number of votes as said state, the District of Columbia, Guam, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands were entitled to cast in the 1972 Republican National Convention.

B. ALTERNATE DELEGATES

One (1) alternate delegate to each delegate to the National Convention.

ELECTION OF DELEGATES TO NATIONAL CONVENTION

RULE NO. 31

Delegates at large to the national convention and their alternates and delegates from Congressional Districts to the national convention and their alternates shall be elected in the following manner:

- (a) By primary election in accordance with the applicable laws of such states as required by law, the election of delegates to the national conventions of political parties by direct primary and in the District of Columbia in accordance with its law; provided that in any of these in which Republican representation upon the board of judges or inspectors of elections for such primary election is denied by law, delegates and alternates shall be elected as hereinafter provided.

- (b) By Congressional District or state conventions, as the case may be, to be called by the Congressional District or state committees respectively. Notice of the call for any such convention shall be published in a newspaper or newspapers of general circulation in the Congressional District or state, as the case may be, not less than fifteen (15) days prior to the date of said convention.

(c) In selecting delegates and alternates to the national convention, no state law shall be observed which hinders, abridges, or denies to any citizen of the United States, eligible under the Constitution of the United States, to the office of President or Vice President, the right or privilege of being a candidate under such state law for the nomination for President or Vice President; or which authorizes the election of a number of delegates or alternates from any state to the national convention different from that fixed in these rules.

(d) By the Republican state committee or governing committee in any state in which the law of such state specifically authorizes the election of delegates or alternates in such manner.

(e) In a Congressional District where there is no Republican Congressional Committee, the Republican State Committee shall issue the call and make said publication.

(f) All delegates from any state may be chosen from the state at large in the event that the laws of the state in which the election occurs so provide.

(g) Alternate delegates shall be elected to said national convention for each unit of representation equal in number to the number of delegates elected therein and shall be chosen in the same manner, at the same time, and under the same rules the delegates are chosen; provided, however, that if the law of any state shall prescribe the method of choosing alternates they shall be chosen in accordance with the provisions of the law of the state in which the election occurs.

(h) The election of delegates and alternates from the District of Columbia, Guam, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands shall be held under the direction of the respective recognized Republican governing committees therein in conformity with the rules of the Republican National Committee or the laws of the District of Columbia, Guam, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands.

(i) Election of delegates and alternates shall be certified in every case where they are elected by conventions, by the chairman and secretary of such conventions, respectively, and forwarded to the Secretary of the Republican National Committee, and in the case of election by primary, they shall be certified by the proper official and all certificates shall be forwarded by said duly elected delegates and alternates in the manner herein provided.

(j) All delegates and alternates shall be elected not later than thirty-five (35) days before the date of the meeting of said national convention, unless otherwise provided by the laws of the state in which the election occurs.

(k) Delegates and alternates at large to the national convention when serving as delegates and alternates shall be duly qualified voters of their respective states. All delegates and alternates allocated as delegates and alternates at large shall be elected at large in the several states unless otherwise provided by state law. *It is the intent of this rule that no person shall be denied the opportunity to be elected as a delegate to any county,*

district or state convention so long as such person shall be a legal and qualified voter of said political subdivision at the time of such convention, unless this be inconsistent with the law of the state.

(l) Delegates and alternates to the national convention representing Congressional Districts shall be residents and qualified voters in said district respectively when serving as delegates and alternates. All delegates and alternates allocated to represent Congressional districts shall be elected by the Congressional district of the several states unless the laws of the state shall otherwise provide. *It is the intent of this rule that no person shall be denied the opportunity to be elected as a delegate to any county, district or state convention so long as such person shall be a legal and qualified voter of said political subdivision at the time of such convention, unless this be inconsistent with the law of the state.*

(m) No delegate or alternate delegate shall be required to pay an assessment or fee in excess of that provided by the law of the state in which the election occurs as a condition of serving as a delegate or alternate delegate to the Republican National Convention.

ELECTION OF DELEGATES TO DISTRICT AND STATE CONVENTIONS

Delegates to Congressional District and state conventions shall be elected under the following rules:

(n) Only legal and qualified voters shall participate in a Republican primary, caucus, mass meeting, or mass convention held for the purpose of selecting delegates to a county, district, or state convention, and only such legal and qualified voters shall be elected as delegates to county, district and state conventions; provided, however, that in addition to the qualifications provided herein the governing Republican committee of each state shall have the authority to prescribe additional qualifications not inconsistent with law. Such additional qualifications shall be adopted and published in at least one daily newspaper having a general circulation throughout the state, such publication to be at least ninety (90) days before such qualifications shall become effective.

(o) No delegates shall be deemed eligible to participate in any convention to elect delegates to the said national convention who were elected prior to the date of issuance of the call of such national convention *unless this rule be inconsistent with the law of the state.*

(p) District conventions shall be composed of delegates who are legal and qualified voters therein, and delegates to state conventions shall be qualified voters of the respective districts which they represent in said state conventions. Such delegates shall be apportioned among the counties, parishes, and cities of the state or district having regard to the Republican vote therein.

(q) There shall be no proxies at a convention held for the purpose of selecting delegates to the Republican National Convention. If alternate delegates to such selection convention are selected, the alternate delegate, and no other, shall vote in the absence of the delegate.

(r) There shall be no automatic delegates at any level of the delegate selection procedures who serve by virtue of party position or elective office.

(s) The Republican National Committee shall assist the states in their efforts to inform all citizens how they may participate in delegate selection procedures. The Republican National Committee, in cooperation with the states, shall prepare instructive material on delegate selection methods and make it available for distribution.

RULE NO. 32

(a) Participation in a Republican primary, caucus, or any meeting or convention held for the purpose of selecting delegates and alternates to a county, district, state or national convention shall in no way be abridged for reasons of sex, race, religion, color, age or national origin. The Republican National Committee and the Republican state committee or governing committee of each state shall take positive action to achieve the broadest possible participation by everyone in party affairs, including such participation by women, young people, minority and heritage groups and senior citizens in the delegate selection process.

(b) Unless otherwise provided by the laws of the state in which the election occurs, in those states where delegates and alternates are elected through the convention system or a combination of convention and primary systems, the precinct, ward, township or county meetings shall be open meetings and all citizens who are qualified shall be urged to participate.

(c) Each state shall endeavor to have equal representation of men and women in its delegation to the Republican National Convention.

(d) *The provisions of Rule 32 are not intended to be the basis of any kind of quota system.*

RULE NO. 33

No state shall elect a greater number of persons to act as delegates and alternates than the actual number of delegates and alternates respectively to which they are entitled under the call for the national convention, and no unit of representation may elect any delegate or delegates; or their alternates, with permission to cast a fractional vote.

RULE NO. 34

Thirty (30) days before the time set for the meeting of the national convention, the credentials of each delegate and alternate shall be filed with the Secretary of the National Committee for use by the Secretary in making up the temporary roll of the convention, except in the case of delegates or alternates elected at a time or times in accordance with the laws of the state in which the election occurs rendering impossible filing of credentials within the time above specified.

RULE NO. 35

(a) At the time of appointing the Arrangements Committee there shall be appointed by the Chairman of

the Republican National Committee a Contest Committee, consisting of at least seven (7) members of the Republican National Committee.

(b) Where more than the authorized number of delegates from any state are reported to the Secretary of the National Committee, a contest shall be deemed to exist and the Secretary shall notify the several claimants so reported and shall submit all such credentials and claims to the whole Republican National Committee for decision as to which claimants reported shall be placed upon the temporary roll of the convention; provided, however, that the names of the delegates and alternates, presenting certificates of election from the canvassing board or officer created or designated by the law of the state in which the election occurs, to canvass the returns and issue certificates of election to delegates or alternates to national conventions of political parties in a primary election, shall be placed upon the temporary roll of the convention by the National Committee.

(c) All contests arising in any state electing district delegates by district conventions shall be decided by its state convention, or if the state convention shall not meet prior to the national convention, then by its state committee; and only contests affecting delegates elected at large shall be presented to the National Committee; provided, however, if the contest regarding a district delegate arises out of the irregular or unlawful action of the state committee or state convention, the National Committee may take jurisdiction thereof and hear and determine the same under the procedure provided in Rule 35.

(d) Notices of contests shall be filed thirty (30) days before the time set for the meeting of the national convention, with the Secretary of the National Committee, except in the case of delegates or alternates elected at a time or times in accordance with the laws of the state in which the election occurs rendering impossible the filing of the notice of contest within the time above specified, stating the grounds of the contest.

(e) Not less than twenty-two (22) days before the convening of the Republican National Convention, each of the contesting persons or groups shall file with the Secretary of the Republican National Committee at least three (3) printed or typewritten copies of the brief in support of their claim to sit as delegates or alternates in the national convention. The Secretary of the Republican National Committee upon receiving the brief of a contesting person or group shall furnish the opposing contesting person or group a copy of said brief.

Each brief shall begin with a summary of not more than one thousand (1,000) words setting forth succinctly a synopsis of the brief and a definite statement of the points relied upon.

(f) The Contest Committee shall make up a report of each contest filed, showing the grounds of contest, the statute and rule, if any, under which the contest is waged, and the contentions of each party thereto. The report shall conclude with a statement of the points of issue in the contest, both of fact and law, and shall be

signed by the chairman. When the Contest Committee has prepared such report stating the issues of law and fact, a copy of the statement of such issues shall be forthwith submitted to a person in the convention city, whom the contestants must appoint at the time of filing the contest, to receive such statement; and a copy shall forthwith be served by the chairman of the Contest Committee upon the contestants by registered mail.

(g) The contestants shall have eight (8) days to file written objections to the Contest Committee's statement of the issues of fact or law or both unless the Republican National Committee acting as a committee of the whole is called to act upon the contest sooner, in which case such objections shall be made before the meeting of the whole committee. In case the contestants reside in the states of Alaska or Hawaii, or in Puerto Rico, the Virgin Islands or Guam, they shall be entitled to ten (10) days to file written objections.

The objections shall contain any additional statement of issue of either law or fact or both, claimed by the contestant submitting the same, to be involved in and necessary to be decided in the contest.

(h) The Contest Committee shall hear and decide the statement of law and fact at once and make its decision as to what issues are involved and submit these issues, either in law or fact, or both, to the National Committee sitting as a committee of the whole, and such issues shall be the sole and only issues passed upon and determined by the committee of the whole, unless the National Committee shall by a majority vote extend or change the same.

If the Contest Committee for any reason shall fail to state the issues either of law or fact, the National Committee shall decide upon what issues the contest shall be tried, and the hearing shall be limited to such issues, unless the National Committee by a majority vote shall decide otherwise.

(i) When the National Committee is called to pass upon any contest that may arise, the members of the Credentials Committee of each state shall also be notified of the time and place of such meeting and shall have the right to attend all hearings of all contests but without the right to participate in the discussion or to vote.

(j) If an appeal is taken from any ruling of the National Committee on any contest, notice of such appeal must be filed with the Secretary of the National Committee within twenty-four (24) hours after the decision and shall specify the grounds upon which the appeal is taken, and only the grounds so specified shall be heard by the Credentials Committee upon such appeal. No evidence other than that taken before the National Committee shall be taken up by the Credentials Committee unless it shall by a majority vote of all of its members so direct.

INTERPRETATION OF RULE 32

We recommend to the Republican National Committee the following procedures to carry out the mandates set forth in the Rules adopted at the 1972 Republican National Convention.

In an effort to be of assistance to the various states in meeting their obligations to take positive action and endeavor to assure greater and more equitable participation of women, young people, minority and heritage groups, and senior citizens in the political process, and to increase their representation at the 1976 Republican National Convention, we recommend the following.

1. Each state committee shall publicize in advance of the event to the widest possible extent the dates, places, rules, officials conducting and eligibility requirements for participation in all party meetings relevant to delegate selection.
 - (a) This information should be printed in all state Republican publications.
 - (b) News releases should be provided for all newspapers, radio stations and TV stations.
 - (c) Special efforts should be made to encourage the media to carry such announcements as public service items.
 - (d) Special efforts should be made to see that all party meetings held for the purpose of delegate selection are located in convenient places and called to order at reasonable hours.
2. Information meetings should be held to acquaint all citizens with the delegate selection process.
 - (a) Out-reach workshops should be held to acquaint persons with the workings of the Republican Party in the state.
 - (b) Speakers' bureaus should be set up to operate the out-reach programs so that a wide range of knowledgeable persons reflecting the diversity of the population of the state are available to disseminate the activities and the beliefs of the Republican Party to those geographical and cultural areas which may not traditionally have appropriate representation in the Republican Party of the state.
3. In conformity with Rule 31(s), the publication of a "How To Become A Delegate" pamphlet or flyer should be completed by January 1, 1976, and made available, free of charge, at public places where the general public has access to the information. The contents of the pamphlet should be specific, easily understood, accurate, and timely.
4. Each state committee should establish a state calendar of events which would include the activities of groups with whom the party is attempting to establish rapport.

5. Steps should be taken to encourage the widest possible participation in platform and rules hearings through sub-hearings in each of the appropriate geographical units of the state in centrally located sites.

6. Special emphasis should be placed on working toward attracting such groups as women, young people, minority groups, heritage groups, and senior citizens.

7. The state should strictly honor the rule prohibiting requirement and/or assessment of fees as a condition of serving as a delegate to the National Convention. Recognizing that finances play an important practical part in limiting the range of representativeness of the National Convention, a state should seek ways to make participation as inexpensive as possible through shared travel and housing and other means that may eliminate hardship.

8. The state party organization shall have established and functioning by July 1, 1975, a Rule 29 Committee broadly representative of Republicans in that state including women, young people, minority and heritage groups, and senior citizens.

The regular party organization shall take positive action to assist in the development of a statewide out-reach program as it regards the delegate selection process and other party affairs.

9. Each state party organization should submit by February 1, 1976, to the Republican National Committee examples of the materials produced and activities undertaken which are designed to create the opportunity for participating in all party activities for all people regardless of race, creed, national origin, religion, sex or age, including a program to educate the citizenry of the delegate selection process. In order to assist the states and at the request of any state, the Republican National Committee shall review and comment on such state's program.

Formulation and reasonable implementation of a state effort substantially in compliance with that recommended above shall be considered by the 1976 Republican National Convention as prima facie evidence of a good faith effort to comply with requirements of Rule 32.

However, the foregoing provisions shall not be deemed to be the exclusive method of endeavoring to reach the broad objectives of Rule 32 or be binding upon any state organization. The fact that a state or political organization has not conformed with the provisions above shall not be deemed to be evidence of failure to comply or to make a good faith effort to comply with the requirements for positive action contained in Rule 32.

Nothing in these recommendations is intended to be, or should be construed as, the basis for any type of a quota system.

ADDITIONAL RECOMMENDATIONS AND RELATED COMMENTARY

ADDITIONAL RECOMMENDATIONS AND COMMENTARY RELATING TO RULES 1 - 18:

PROCEEDINGS IN THE CONVENTION.

It is in the mood of our times that the convention in 1976 be noted for its simplicity and restraint in cost.

The Republican National Committee, at its last meeting, voted by great majority that it did not approve federal financing for Republican national conventions. As a matter of principle, federal financing must inevitably lead to federal domination of the nominative and elective processes, which would be inimical to the best interests of the American people. The Rule 29 Committee wishes to reaffirm the record and strongly endorses the position of the Republican National Committee.

Convention expenditures of 1972 served the need for that year, but in 1976 we believe our party would better reflect Republican philosophy if convention salaries, living costs, decorations, programs, and arrangements were kept to a minimum.

To facilitate implementation of this belief, there should be a sub-committee of the Arrangements Committee whose responsibilities would include convention budget approval, convention expense review and auditing. The committee should provide a detailed final report to the Republican National Committee. (Note: This recommendation will be considered by the Committee on Arrangements for the 1976 Republican National Convention. Prior to the discussion of the report of the Rule 29 Committee, a motion was adopted relating to the financing of the 1976 quadrennial nominating convention, which states that "The Republican National Committee strongly supports the concept and philosophy of the legal action to enjoin the distribution of the funds for all national conventions. However, if the disposition of the pending law suit upholds the present law or the court fails to act, the Executive Committee is empowered by this body to instruct the National Chairman at the appropriate time to utilize the funds provided in the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971 as amended.")

Commentary on Rule 2

In discussion on Rule 2, there were several recommendations the committee considered because of the unanimous desire to reduce the traffic congestion on the floor of the convention, not to mention a concern for general safety in the event of some unforeseen catastrophe within the hall. These recommendations include:

1. Move camera bank to the rear of the hall.
2. Engage a larger auditorium.
3. Provide better news interview facilities.
4. Install floor telephones in each delegation so that the news media can request interviews with people on the floor.

5. Examine the feasibility of combining badges with rigid identification.

(Note: These recommendations will be considered by the Committee on Arrangements for the 1976 Republican National Convention.)

Commentary on Rule 7

The Rules of the House of Representatives, as modified by the convention rules, shall be promulgated in condensed form by the Republican National Committee and shall be disseminated to all delegates and alternates on the temporary roll at the time of receipt of their credentials and shall be referred to the Committee on Rules of the National Committee in advance of the 1976 national convention.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS no lapse of a few hours time between the nomination of the candidate for President and the candidate for Vice President provides an adequate opportunity for serious appraisal of a candidate's potential,

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED, that the Republican National Committee is urged to continue to review proposals and recommendations to improve the process of nominating a candidate for Vice President at the quadrennial Republican national convention.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Rule 29 Committee urges that the proposals and recommendations regarding the Vice Presidential nomination process be considered by the Republican National Committee when it meets to consider the final recommendations of the Rule 29 Committee. (Note: The Rules Committee of the Republican National Committee will consider all recommendations made to the Rule 29 Committee and other proposals that may be submitted.)

RECOMMENDATION

Wherever a male pronoun occurs in the rules, it is recommended that it be accompanied by the appropriate female pronoun, e.g., Rule 6, line 2, "which may be cast by his Alternate," would be changed to read: "which may be cast by his or her Alternate." (Note: To be considered by the Rules Committee of the Republican National Committee.)

RECOMMENDATION

Wherever the word "chairman" appears in the rules, it should be changed to "chair," unless the context in which it appears makes the change inappropriate. (Note: To be considered by the Rules Committee of the Republican National Committee.)

COMMENTARY RELATING TO RULES 19 - 29: REPUBLICAN NATIONAL COMMITTEE

In considering Rules 19 through 29, we have attempted to strengthen the role of both the Chairman of the Republican National Committee and the Committee itself. We have sought to entrust to the National Committee the general management of the Republican Party in the United States between Republican national conventions.

In arriving at our recommendations, we have been near unanimous in our opinions. In those few instances where we differed, we submit to you, the members of the Republican National Committee, for your final disposition, the views of both the majority and minority.

We recommend that the National Committee meet at least twice a year, with the membership receiving the agenda prior to the meeting and the minutes following, and that all meetings be "open" meetings. (Note: This recommendation to be considered by the Chairman of the Republican National Committee for future meetings.)

We further recommend that the annual budget be presented to the Republican National Committee for its approval. (Note: This recommendation to be considered by the Chairman of the Republican National Committee.)

We believe that the Republican National Committee should operate under a permanent set of bylaws. We feel that these bylaws should be written and adopted by the National Committee rather than by the national convention so that the Committee can have flexibility in its daily operations between conventions rather than being locked into specific rules of the convention that can be changed only at the quadrennial national convention.

We suggest that the bylaws enumerate such standing committees as may be deemed necessary by the National Committee. We respectfully submit that these committees include but not necessarily be limited to the following:

- Budget Review
- Party Auxiliaries
- Registration and Election Laws
- Campaign Planning and Evaluation
- State and Local Services
- Communications
- Special Projects
- Party Evaluation
- Presidential Campaign

We believe that every member of the National Committee should be appointed to a subcommittee by the National Chairman. The chairman of each subcommittee should be appointed by the Chairman of the Republican National Committee subject to the approval of the Republican National Committee. (Note: To be considered by the Rules Committee of the Republican National Committee.)

We believe that national Republican auxiliaries should be authorized by and listed in the rules of the Republican national convention. Additions of new auxiliaries or deletions of old should be made only by action of the national convention. We submit that the national auxiliaries should be the:

National Federation of Republican Women
Young Republican National Federation
College Republican National Committee
National Republican Heritage Groups Council
National Black Republican Council

(Note: To be considered by the Rules Committee of the Republican National Committee.)

We recommend that the Executive Committee of the Republican National Committee meet at least twice a year in addition to those meetings which shall be held in conjunction with meetings of the entire National Committee. We suggest that minutes of all Executive Committee meetings be made immediately available to all National Committee members upon the conclusion of each meeting. In this way, we hope that all National Committee members will be kept fully informed and will be better prepared for their own meetings. (Note: Rule 26(b) of the Rules adopted by the 1972 Republican National Convention specifies that the Executive Committee "... shall meet on the call of the Chairman, and such meetings shall be held at least twice a year at times other than those when the National Committee is meeting." The suggested change in this rule will be considered by the Rules Committee of the Republican National Committee. The recommendation will be considered by the Chairman of the Republican National Committee for future meetings.)

We recommend that the states elect their own National Committee members and that this election be ratified by the national convention, rather than the states nominate and the convention elect as is now the case.

We further recommend that when a vacancy exists on the National Committee the state Republican party elect the new member and that the National Committee ratify such election. This differs from the present practice which seeks nomination from the state and election by the Committee.

We have made these proposals because we believe that it should be the right of the state to elect its own representation on the national governing body. (Note: To be considered by the Rules Committee of the Republican National Committee.)

We believe that the Site Committee of the national convention should have a longer time in which to choose the location of the national convention. Therefore, we suggest that such committee be appointed by the National Chairman no later than two years following the Presidential election to begin work immediately. (Note: This recommendation cannot be acted upon in connection with the 1976 Republican National Convention because of the time period in which this report was received, but the suggestion will be considered by the Chairman responsible for the appointment of the Site Committee for the 1980 Convention.)

In order to insure that we cause a hardship to no state and that all may meet the requirements of state election laws, we would have the National Committee issue the call to the national convention prior to

January 1 of the year in which the convention is to be held. (Note: To be considered by the Committee on Call in drafting that document for the approval of the Republican National Committee.)

We support the belief that the Chairman and Co-Chairman of the Republican National Committee each be elected by the Republican National Committee and that they be full-time, paid employees of the Committee. The Chairman should be the chief executive officer of the Committee and may be removed only by a two-thirds (2/3rds) vote of the entire National Committee. (Note: To be considered by the Rules Committee of the Republican National Committee.)

Officers of the National Committee, including the Chairman, Co-Chairman, Secretary, and Treasurer should be elected for two-year terms running from the first National Committee meeting following the national convention until June of the next even-numbered year and from that time until the next quadrennial national convention. (Note: To be considered by the Rules Committee of the Republican National Committee.)

We strongly recommend that officers be nominated for election from the floor of the National Committee. To be nominated, a candidate must have the support of at least two (2) votes in three (3) states. Nominating committees would not exist.

The above suggestion for election of officers would not apply to the eight Vice Chairmen. These eight Vice Chairmen, one man and one woman from each region as defined, would be elected in their regional caucuses by the National Committee members of that caucus. (Note: To be considered by the Rules Committee of the Republican National Committee.)

In order to insure that the Republican Party shall have a role, a voice, an input and some control in the campaign of any person running for national office under the Republican banner, and to insure that no candidate's personal campaign committee shall conduct itself in a manner not in the best interest of the Republican Party, we unanimously, without reservation, recommend and urge that anyone seeking the nomination of the Republican Party as its candidate for President or Vice President agree in advance to the following:

1. That the Chairman of the Republican National Committee be named a designated agent of the candidate in accordance with the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971.
2. That the Chairman of the Republican National Committee designate a seven-member Select Committee on Presidential Campaign Affairs, which shall be chaired by the Chairman of the Republican National Committee, to receive from the Republican nominee for President his or her full plan of financial expenditures and periodic reports during the campaign for President in order to insure that all expenditures are in full accordance not only with the law, but with established ethical practices for political campaigns.
3. These provisions shall include all committees

- organized by the candidate above the state level.
4. All Republican candidates for President shall agree in writing to this rule prior to his or her nomination.

(Note: To be considered by the Rules Committee of the Republican National Committee.)

Majority View of the Rule 29 Committee Concerning Rule 19

The majority suggests that the Republican National Committee should be broadly representative of the party. Since the Republican National Committee is to have general management of the party between conventions, it should have representation from all portions of that party.

The majority believes that the National Committee should consist not only of one man and one woman elected by each state and territory and the party chairman of each state and territory, but an additional eleven persons. These would include the chairman or president of the official national auxiliaries, including the Women's Federation, the Young Republicans, the College Republicans, the Heritage Council, and the Black Caucus. We would also include two Republican Governors, two Republican U.S. Senators, and two Republican members of the U.S. House of Representatives, each elected by their respective caucuses.

It is believed that the auxiliaries, because of the work that they do and the role that they play in the Republican Party, and in an effort to secure a closer liaison between the party and the auxiliaries, should have full membership on the National Committee.

It is further believed that the party and the RNC would be much better served by having a closer relationship with and an input from members of the Governors Association and caucuses of the House and Senate. Their presence can only be helpful to the Committee, and hopefully the Committee's input can be helpful in electing more of their members.

The majority does not believe that increasing the size of the National Committee by seven per cent (7%), from 162 to 173, dilutes the National Committee or the influence of states in it. Rather it is believed that this slight increase in membership will signal the broadening of the horizons of the national party and will show a willingness of the party to listen to and consider suggestions from all areas of the party.

The majority agrees with the minority that the makeup of the Executive Committee should include the chairman or president of the national Republican auxiliaries and a member of the Senate, the House, and the Governors Association, but *only* if these bodies are represented on the full National Committee. The majority could not accept the philosophy of purity on the committee-of-the-whole and at the same time allow non-committee members to be part of the Executive Committee.

The majority feels that the argument that the addition of eleven (11) persons to a body of 162 will dilute the purity of that body is not consistent with the

further argument that eight (8) non-committee members should make up twenty-five per cent (25%) of the Executive Committee.

The majority holds to the doctrine that only members of the National Committee should be members of its Executive Committee.

The majority strongly urges the party to be consistent and grant full membership to the auxiliaries, the Governors, Senators, and Representatives. (Note: To be considered by the Rules Committee of the Republican National Committee.)

Minority View of the Rule 29 Committee Concerning Rule 19

Both the majority and the minority of the Rule 29 Committee are in full agreement that our aim is to make the National Committee a stronger and a more effective body. In respect to the makeup and membership of both the full Republican National Committee and of the Executive Committee, we differ as to *how* best to achieve the goal which we all agree we are seeking.

The minority favors keeping the full Republican National Committee representative of the state (and territorial) Republican organizations. After all, the National Committee is the interim body which carries on the business between quadrennial national conventions, and the national convention is made up of delegations from the various states (and territories). While there certainly is need for liaison with auxiliaries, Senators, Congressmen and Governors, this, in the opinion of the minority, does not mean that the way to achieve such liaison is by making officers of such groups and bodies into full members of the Republican National Committee. The minority is very concerned with the general principle which says "Any time you want to recognize the importance of a group or establish better liaison with that group, make the chief officer a full voting member of your own committee." The majority's proposal would add eleven "non-state" members at the present time. There is no telling how many additional groups and organizations would attempt to follow.

The minority feels that the work of the Republican National Committee can best be accomplished by members from the states duly elected by their states. The minority opposes placing "token" non-Republican National Committee members on the Republican National Committee in order:

1. to make the party look as though it is opening its doors by opening up the Republican National Committee at the top to those who have not been elected by and worked their way up through the state party organization, or
2. to create the impression of "recognition" or "liaison," both of which are better accomplished in other ways.

The minority feels that the overall aim should be for a strong, effective committee, not a conglomerate of token members.

The minority feels strongly that the way into membership on the Republican National Committee is up through the ranks. The only genuine way to open up the party is to open it up at the grass roots level. The opening up at the higher echelons of the party structure will necessarily follow. This process may not be instantaneous, but through building below, instead of superimposing on the top, the progress made will be real, not imaginary. It will be permanent, not temporary.

With regard to membership on the Executive Committee of the Republican National Committee, the minority believes that the present system of liaison between the auxiliaries, the U.S. Senate, the U.S. House of Representatives and the Republican Governors on the one hand, and the Republican National Committee on the other, is the most workable system, even if not perfect. While it may not be altogether consistent from the standpoint of "purity of logic" to permit persons who are not members of the full Republican National Committee to serve on the Executive Committee, nevertheless the minority felt that there are valid reasons for continuing the practice which is already in existence. These reasons include:

1. This method is presently providing reasonable liaison, and it would continue to do so;
2. This method now constitutes a kind of formal recognition of the importance of auxiliaries, Republican members of the Senate, Republican members of the House of Representatives, and Republican Governors; and very importantly,
3. Removal at this time of representatives of the auxiliaries, the Senate, the House, and the Governors from the Executive Committee in order to achieve some theoretical "consistency" would be an obvious step backwards both in image and in substance, and such a step should not be undertaken.

The minority's overall position is not taken because of a fear of change. We have strongly supported the many innovations included in this report. We have supported these innovative changes because we felt that they would add strength and effectiveness to the Republican National Committee itself and to its Chairman. We felt, however, that the majority's proposal on membership of the full Republican National Committee and of the Executive Committee would be a token gesture which would tend to dilute or weaken the RNC rather than strengthen it and make it more effective. (Note: To be considered by the Rules Committee of the Republican National Committee.)

The Rule 29 Committee recommends that the work of the Rule 29 Committee continue after the next national convention and that the appointees to the committee be subject to the approval of the Republican National Committee. (Note: To be considered by the Rules Committee of the Republican National Committee.)

Though not recommended as changes in the rules, we do respectfully ask that the Republican National Committee consider immediately the following suggestions.

SUGGESTIONS FOR CONSIDERATION BY THE REPUBLICAN NATIONAL COMMITTEE

1. A committee to write permanent bylaws for the Republican National Committee should be appointed by the Chairman.
2. A committee to study leadership training, both for youth and adults, should be appointed by the Chairman.
3. Meetings of the Republican National Committee regional organizations should be held at least once every year.
4. Many outstanding Republican workers are denied the opportunity of serving on the Republican National Committee because of the expense of traveling to and attending meetings. The Republican National Committee should strongly urge the state Republican organizations to reimburse their National Committee members for all or part of these expenses.

(Note: Suggestions 1, 2 and 4 were approved by the Republican National Committee with action thereon to be at the discretion of the Chairman of the Republican National Committee and after consultation with the National Committee. Suggestion No. 3 was approved with action thereon to be at the discretion of the respective regional organizations.)

5. For purposes of better cooperation and understanding between the Republican National Committee and the auxiliaries, it is recommended to each auxiliary that where there is no provision in the auxiliary bylaws for a member of the Republican National Committee to serve on the executive committee of the auxiliary, the chairman of such auxiliary should appoint one. It is further recommended that the Rule 29 Committee send a letter to the chairman of each auxiliary to this effect. (Note: This letter has been sent by the Chairman of the Rule 29 Committee to the Chairman of each auxiliary.)

RECOMMENDATION

PREAMBLE TO THE PROPOSED BYLAWS OF THE REPUBLICAN NATIONAL COMMITTEE

The clearest expression of party opinion is the belief that the Republican Party has its origins in the values and experience of the American people. Because its base is in the people, it is organized from the people towards its national organization. All authority, therefore, fundamentally rests in its constituent units consisting, first, of its local organizations, then its state committees and only then in its national committees. Consequently, the work of the party is done by the state and local organizations. The functions of the Republican National Committee and its staff are, therefore, to call for and organize a convention to nominate candidates for President and Vice President once every four years, to oversee the national aspects of the campaigns of these

candidates, and to facilitate communication between state committees, local organizations, and auxiliary groups and to aid them as they shall request assistance. All other functions have been and must be reserved to such state, local and auxiliary organizations. (Note: This recommendation will be referred to a committee to write permanent bylaws for the Republican National Committee and/or the Rules Committee of the Republican National Committee.)

STATEMENT

Subcommittee 5 of the Rule 29 Committee has discussed the relationship between the states and territories and the Republican National Committee and has found that the relationship, although capable of constructive improvement, is satisfactory for the continued growth of the whole Republican Party.

RESOLUTION

This is the time for a new beginning at all levels of politics - and in all political parties. Unless the parties can become more responsive and effective than ever, they will eventually give way to instruments that can do the job the people need to have done.

WHEREAS in the months to come we should devote ourselves intensively to not only strengthening the party organization but providing leadership in many areas involving public policy and the business of government, and

WHEREAS Subcommittee 5 of the Rule 29 Committee of the Republican National Committee is charged with the responsibility to study the relationship between the Republican National Committee, the Republican State Committees and other Republican organizations with a view toward making recommendations to improve the overall quality of the Republican Party, and

WHEREAS the most important function of the Republican National Committee is to assist state and local parties in their organizational efforts and further that the most important function of state parties should be to assist in building local party organizations by providing on-going services and further by providing the impetus and guidance necessary in either maintaining existing organizations or stimulating and training new leadership when a state or local organization has deteriorated to the point that it can no longer rejuvenate itself, and

WHEREAS the circumstances as they exist at this time according to Republican National Committee reports, dramatically underscore the need for Republican National Committee guidance and inspiration, and

WHEREAS Subcommittee 5 has authored various questionnaires which have been answered by most of the state Republican organizations as to their structure and ability to function, the results of which are somewhat helpful but inconclusive, and

WHEREAS Subcommittee 5 through its Co-Chairman Richard M. Rosenbaum has written to the Chair-

man of each State which has a Rule 29 Committee (31 states in all) requesting the findings of said Committee, and in addition has written to many prominent citizens in various professions requesting their written opinion on the subject of what might be done to strengthen the Republican Party and the two-party system and answers to these inquiries are expected within the foreseeable future, and

WHEREAS Subcommittee 5 contemplates holding public hearings in the future to further solicit opinions from various citizens on the aforementioned subject, all with a view toward strengthening the Republican Party at all levels, and

WHEREAS the Republican State Chairmen and Executive Directors are scheduled to have a meeting to discuss the new Campaign Reform Law in January, 1975, and the Republican National Chairman has called a National Leadership Conference in March, 1975, now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED that the Chairman of the Republican National Committee be urged to appoint a special committee to pursue the purposes stated in this resolution. (Note: In response to this resolution, the Chairman of the Republican National Committee, on January 21, 1975, appointed a task force of State Chairmen to assist in a continuing study of the relationship between state parties and the National Committee.)
