1. Mr. Bush afternoon November 15 paid initial courtesy call on Minister of Public Health LIU Hsiang-ping. Madame Liu described in familiar terms the Chinese approach to health care. She also remarked that in the past two years some 130 American doctors in 13 groups have visited China and she expressed her hope that such exchanges would continue. Commenting on the unseasonably early snows in Peking this year, she said they would help the winter wheat take root and dampen down infectious diseases by killing germs.

2. Comment: This was a pro forma call, since USLO has minimal business with the Public Health Ministry.

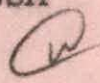

1. Sorry to be late with this suggestion. Last night Dr. John Knowles, President of the Rockefeller Foundation, and I were talking with Dr. George Hatem (Ma Hai-teh) about medical exchanges. Knowles, with Hatem concurring, both agree that one good area for further exchanges is in medicine and health services. Herewith a quote from a letter Knowles handed me today as the delegation left for Harbin:

QTE: We in the US have much to learn from Chinese medicine, acupuncture and the use of herbs while our Chinese friends can learn from Western Science and Technology in Medicine including nutrition and its relation to agriculture. The physiology, biology and psychology of herbs in medical therapy are something US scientists can learn from and bring scientific methods to. There has been less interest here than in acupuncture but

it is equally important. UNQTE. Knowles adds that the Rockefeller Foundation, if wanted, could help in the financing of such exchanges.

2. When Dr. C.P. Li was here he strongly recommended such an exchange feeling that there has been unwarranted prejudice in the US against herbal medicine and that such an offer on our part would be well received by the PRC side. It would show that we take their medicine seriously and indeed the exchange would be a real two-way street.

3. It seems to me by devoting high level exchange to better understanding of their natural medicine we further our own understanding and we help lay to rest one more prejudice from the past.

the correspondents that they were coming to China to cover visit of Secstate. His department would attempt to arrange side activities if requested, but there would be severe limits on what they could do given other demands on their time.

3. Accommodations: Correspondents will again be housed in Mindzu Hotel. Press spokesman Funseth will also be provided office space at the hotel. Correspondents can expect to be billed lump sum for room, meals, and transportation. They should carry adequate cash or travellers checks to cover payment. (Growald and Keatley should be able to provide approximate cost of last year's accommodations.) Press spokesman and USLO accommodations are provided gratis by Chinese.

4. Filing Arrangements: As last year, Mindzu Hotel will be equipped with filing facilities including several telex machines, two telephone booths, and a radio ~~programming~~ programming booth. Correspondents will be able to hand stories or photographs to Chinese technicians for transmission. Each correspondent must have ITU Card with words "press collect" on it to pay for collect telex messages. Telephone messages can be made collect without special arrangements.

5. Shipment of TV Film: Arrangements will be made to ship television film as needed to Tokyo on October 20, 21, 22, and if necessary 23. There are two flights on October 20 (PK at 0830, JL at 1630) and October 21 (CA at 0645, AP at 1240) and one on October 22 (IR at 0930) and October 23 (JL at 1335).

6. Photographs of Correspondents: Suggest Department send three photographs of each Washington-based correspondent with S/S advance team if possible. This would allow press cards to be made up in advance and avoid possible confusion on filing first day stories. It would also be helpful if Hong Kong could send up Elegant and Greenway photos by travelers who might pass them to us in Peking this week.

1. DAVID GREENWAY OF THE WASHINGTON POST AND ROBERT ELEGANT OF THE LOS ANGELES TIMES HAVE BOTH BEEN IN TOUCH WITH CONGEN CONCERNING PLANS TO ACCOMPANY SECRETARY KISSINGER TO PEKING. BOTH HAVE BEEN APPROVED BY THE STATE DEPARTMENT AS MEMBERS OF THE SECRETARY'S OFFICIAL PRESS PARTY AND THEY PLAN TO MEET HIS PLANE IN TOKYO. THEY ARE CONCERNED, HOWEVER, ABOUT THE SHORTNESS OF TIME BETWEEN PRC APPROVAL OF VISAS AND THEIR DEPARTURE FOR TOKYO. AT PRESENT, GREENWAY PLANS TO COLLECT HIS VISA IN TOKYO AND ELEGANT IS UNDECIDED. THEY HAVE ASKED THAT THE DEPARTMENT SEND NOTIFICATION THROUGH OUR CHANNELS AS SOON AS CHINESE APPROVAL IS RECEIVED TO SUPPLEMENT NOTIFICATION BY PRC AUTHORITIES.
