SUBJECT:WHITE HOUSE DAILY PRESS BRIEFING - NOVEMBER 13, 1975

1. FOLLOWING ARE PORTIONS OF TRANSCRIPT, WHITE HOUSE DAILY PRESS BRIEFING NOVEMBER 13, 1975:

Q. MAY I ASK TWO QUESTIONS ON THE CHINA TRIP? -WHY HAS IT BEEN DECIDED THAT THE PRESIDENT WILL GO TO PEKING ONLY? I KNOW HE HAS VISITED THE GREAT WALL AND OTHER PLACES ON PREVIOUS TRIPS.

SECONDLY, HAS HE HAD ADVANCE GUARANTEE THAT HE WILL SEE CHAIRMAN MAO?

MR. NESSEN: LET ME ANSWER THE LAST PART FIRST. ON THE SUBJECT OF CHAIRMAN MAO, WE TAKE THIS VISIT SERIOUSLY AND WE BELIEVE THAT THE CHINESE DO ALSO. WE HAVE EVERY REASON TO BELIEVE THAT THE PRESIDENT WILL BE RECEIVED WITH COURTESY AND WITH ALL APPROPRIATE PROTOCOL. NATURALLY, WE ASSUME THAT THIS WOULD INCLUDE THE PRESIDENT MEETING AT THE HIGHEST LEVELS.

ON THE SUBJECT OF THE MEETING BEING LIMITED TO PEKING, I THINK ONE THING TO SAY ABOUT THAT IS THAT THE PRESIDENT HAS BEEN TO CHINA BEFORE IN HIS ROLE AS REPUBLICAN LEADER OF THE HOUSE IN 1972. HE HAS BEEN TO A NUMBER OF PLACES OUTSIDE OF THE CHINESE CAPITAL.

THE UNITED STATES AND CHINA AGREED THAT THIS WOULD BE LARGELY A WORKING VISIT AND SO THERE WAS THE FEELING THAT THERE WAS NO NEED FOR EITHER A LONGER STAY OR TRAVELS OUTSIDE OF PEKING; THAT THE FOUR DAYS CONCENTRATED IN PEKING ARE AMPLE TIME FOR SUBSTANTIVE EXCHANGES.

Q. WHEN FORMER PRESIDENT NIXON WENT TO CHINA THERE WAS A CONSIDERABLE AMOUNT OF -- PARDON THE EXPRESSION -- "HOOPLA", A LOT OF PUBLIC CEREMONIES AND THAT SORT OF THING. WOULD YOU EXPECT THIS TO BE A LOWER KEY TRIP WITH MORE EMPHASIS ON DISCUSSIONS AND LESS EMPHASIS ON TRAPPINGS?

MR. NESSEN: I DON'T KNOW IF I WANT TO ACCEPT ALL YOUR DESCRIPTIONS OF PREVIOUS VISITS AND SO ON, BUT, AS I SAID TO RALPH, BOTH THE CHINESE AND THE UNITED STATES HAVE AGREED THIS IS LARGELY A WORKING VISIT AND THE TIME THERE WILL BE SPENT PRIMARILY IN SERIOUS EXCHANGES.

Q. RON, SHOULD I TAKE IT FROM YOUR ANSWER THAT YOU ASSUME HE WILL BE MEETING WITH PEOPLE AT THE HIGHEST LEVELS BUT YOU HAVE NOT BEEN ASSURED HE WILL SEE CHAIRMAN MAO?

MR. NESSEN: WE ASSUME HE WILL BE MEETING WITH PEOPLE AT THE HIGHEST LEVEL, BOB. I JUST DON'T THINK IT IS A NORMAL DIPLOMATIC ENDEAVOR TO DEMAND THAT YOUR HOSTS SIGN SOME KIND OF PROMISE IN ADVANCE.

Q. YOU WOULDN'T PUT OUT A SCHEDULE SAYING 8:00 TO 8:30 HERE, AND 9:30 TO 10:00 MEET WITH CHAIRMAN MAO?

MR. NESSEN: I THINK THE PEOPLE WHO HAVE MADE THE CHINA TRIP BEFORE KNOW THAT IF YOU GET THE SCHEDULE BY 5 A.M. OF THE DAY, YOU ARE LUCKY.

Q. I AM NOT TALKING ABOUT THE PRESS SCHEDULE. I AM TALKING ABOUT THE PRESIDENT'S AGENDA.

MR. NESSEN: I AM TALKING ABOUT THE PRESIDENT'S SCHEDULE, TOO. IF HE GETS THE SCHEDULE BY THE EARLY MORNING HOURS OF THE NEXT DAY --

Q. THERE IS NO SPECIFIC AGENDA OR SPECIFIC SCHEDULE OF WHAT HE WILL BE DOING EACH DAY?

MR. NESSEN: NOT YET. AS YOU KNOW, THE ADVANCE TEAM HASN'T GONE YET.

Q. THEN THERE HAS BEEN NO DIRECT COMMUNIQUE FROM MAO TO THE EFFECT HE IS LOOKING FORWARD TO MEETING WITH THE PRESIDENT DURING HIS TRIP?

MR. NESSEN: WE HAVE OBVIOUSLY HAD COMMUNICATIONS BACK AND FORTH WITH THE CHINESE AND, AS I SAID, WE OBVIOUSLY ASSUME HE WILL BE MEETING AT THE HIGHEST LEVELS.

Q. A DIRECT COMMUNIQUE FROM MAO WAS THE QUESTION.

MR. NESSEN: I DON'T THINK IT IS NORMAL TO SPELL OUT WHO SIGNS THE COMMUNIQUES, RUSS.

Q. BUT THERE IS NO SPECIFIC AGENDA THUS FAR ON WHO HE WILL BE MEETING WITH?

MR. NESSEN: THERE IS NO SPECIFIC SCHEDULE FOR ANY OF THE DAYS IN CHINA BECAUSE THE ADVANCE TEAM HASN'T GONE YET.

Q. HOW ABOUT MRS. FORD? IS SHE GOING TO BE TOURISTING?

MR. NESSEN: I DON'T HAVE A FULL LIST OF WHO IS GOING YET, FRANK.

Q. HAVE YOU SAID WHETHER OR NOT SHE IS GOING?

MR. NESSEN: I HAVEN'T SAID BECAUSE I DON'T KNOW.

Q. RON, WILL AMBASSADOR BUSH COME BACK HERE TO FLY OVER WITH THE PRESIDENT?

MR. NESSEN: THAT IS ONE DETAIL I DON'T KNOW.

Q. SOMEBODY INVOLVED IN THE PLANNING SAID THERE WILL BE PEOPLE DISAPPOINTED BECAUSE THERE WILL BE A REDUCED PRESS ENTOURAGE ON THIS TRIP. CAN YOU GIVE US ANY IDEA IF THERE WILL BE REDUCED PRESS?

MR. NESSEN: WE HAVEN'T REALLY GOTTEN INTO THE QUESTION OF NUMBERS YET. I THINK THERE IS SOME INDICATION THAT THE CHINESE GENERALLY PREFER TO HAVE THE TRIP HANDLED AS IT WAS IN 1972 BY THE FORMER PRESIDENT. I THINK SOME

OF THE CONSIDERATIONS HAVE CHANGED.

AS I UNDERSTAND IT, THE TV NETWORKS, FOR INSTANCE, NO LONGER USE FILM AND WOULD NOT NEED TO HAVE FILM PROCESSORS AND FILM EDITORS. I THINK PROBABLY THE INTEREST BY PEOPLE WHO ASKED TO GO ON THAT TRIP WHO HAVE NEVER BEFORE OR NEVER SINCE GONE A PRESIDENTIAL TRIP WILL BE SOMEWHAT LESSENER. I DON'T ANTICIPATE A MAJOR PROBLEM WHEN IT COMES TO THE NUMBER OF REPORTERS THAT WANT TO GO. KISSINGER

1. WE DO NOT HAVE TRANSCRIPT OF NESSEN STATEMENT BUT UPI CARRIED FOLLOWING ITEM AUGUST 19 DATED LINED PEKING, ILL.:

BEGIN TEXT: PRESIDENT FORD PROBABLY WILL VISIT CHINA IN LATE NOVEMBER OR EARLY DECEMBER, PRESS SECRETARY RON NESSEN SAID TUESDAY.

THE QUESTION OF FORD'S TRAVEL PLANS AROSE WHEN REPORTERS TALKED TO SENATOR CHARLES PERCY, R-ILL., AFTER DEDICATION OF THE NEW EVERETT M. DIRKSEN CONGRESSIONAL RESEARCH CENTER HERE.

PERCY, JUST BACK FROM PEKING, COMPLAINED THAT IT WAS MUCH HOTTER IN PEKING, ILL.

ASKED WHEN THE CHINESE ARE EXPECTING FORD, PERCY SAID HE THOUGHT THE PRESIDENT WOULD GO THERE IN LATE OCTOBER OR EARLY NOVEMBER.

BUT NESSEN SAID LATER THE TRIP WAS MORE LIKELY IN THE LATTER PART OF NOVEMBER OR EARLY IN DECEMBER. END TEXT.

2. IN MEETING WITH THE PRESS AUGUST 20 NESSEN IS REPORTED TO HAVE AMPLIFIED HIS EARLIER REMARKS BY STATING THAT THE PRESIDENT WAS LOOKING FORWARD TO VISITING CHINA THIS YEAR BUT DATES HAVE NOT BEEN SET. PRECEDING THIS STATEMENT, NESSEN IS REPORTED TO HAVE TOLD NEWSMEN THAT THEY MAY BE WORKING UNDER A MISCONCEPTION AS A RESULT OF HIS REMARKS ABOUT A VISIT IN LATE NOVEMBER OR EARLY DECEMBER.

3. WE INTEND TO RESPOND TO QUERIES ALONG THE LINES OF PARAGRAPH 2 ABOVE.

THE PRESIDENTIAL VISIT

PRESIDENT FORD'S WELCOME IN PEKING LACKED THE LAVISHNESS NORMALLY ATTENDANT WITH VISITS BY CHIEFS OF STATE WITH WHOM THE PRC HAS FULL DIPLOMATIC RELATIONS, BUT APPEARED TO BE A STEP UP FROM THE RECEPTION GIVEN FORMER PRESIDENT NIXON IN 1972. AS EXPECTED, SENIOR VICE PREMIER TENG HSIAO-PING HEADED THE WELCOMING DELEGATION ALONG WITH ECONOMIC SPECIALIST AND THIRD-RANKING VICE PREMIER LI HSIEN-NIEN. THE ANTICIPATED MEETING WITH CHAIRMAN MAO WAS HELD ON THE SECOND AFTERNOON OF THE VISIT, AND MADAME MAO SHOWED UP FOR THE PRESIDENT'S PRE-BANQUET MEETING WITH NOMINAL CHIEF OF STATE CHU TEH. PRC-OWNED NEWSPAPERS IN HONG KONG, WHICH HAD DEVOTED VIRTUALLY THEIR ENTIRE FRONT PAGES TO THE FORD VISIT ON DECEMBER 2, ALSO TURNED OVER MOST OF THEIR FRONT PAGES TO REPORTS OF THE PRESIDENT'S ACTIVITIES ON DECEMBER 3, WITH PICTURES OF THE FORD/MAO MEETING PREDICTABLY TOPPING THE PAGE. LOCAL COMMUNIST PRESS COMMENTARIES ON THE VISIT HAVE BEEN LIMITED TO USING TENG HSIAO-PING'S BANQUET TOAST AS A TAKEOFF POINT TO WARN OF THE DANGER OF THE SOVIET THREAT AND SHAM DETENTE. WHILE CAREFULLY REFRAINING FROM ATTACKING US POLICIES, THE LOCAL PRC PRESS HAS CLEARLY REITERATED PEKING'S VIEW OF THE CURRENT WORLD SITUATION. LIMITED OFFICIAL USE

IN OTHER REPORTING ON THE US, NCNA HAS CONTINUED TO PROVIDE HEAVY COVERAGE OF THE CHINESE WOMEN'S BASKETBALL TEAM'S ACTIVITIES IN THE US. THE EMPHASIS HAS BEEN ON THE HIGH-LEVEL ATTENTION THAT THE TEAM HAS BEEN GIVEN, ESPECIALLY THE MEETING WITH PRESIDENT FORD. NCNA HAS ALSO NOTED FAVORABLY SECRETARY BUTZ'S VISIT TO POLAND AND HUNGARY AND THE "FURTHER STRENGTHENING OF AGRICULTURAL COOPERATION" ANTICIPATED FROM THE VISITS (NCNA, NOVEMBER 27-30). UNCLASSIFIED

SOVIETS

THE PRC HAS USED THE CURRENT UNGA SESSION LARGELY AS A FORUM FOR ATTACKING SOVIET POLICIES WORLDWIDE AND, DURING THE PAST WEEK IN SUMMING UP SEVERAL OF THE UN ACTIVITIES, NCNA HAS HIT HARD AT THE SOVIETS FOR SEEKING HEGEMONISM VIA THE UN, BY OPPOSING PEACE ZONES, BY INTRODUCING "SPURIOUS" DISARMAMENT SCHEMES, AND BY OPPOSING CHARTER REVISION. AS USUAL, THE US ALSO COMES IN FOR SOME SHARE OF THE PRC CRITICISM, BUT THE SOVIETS ARE ATTACKED MUCH MORE SEVERELY AND IN MORE STRIDENT TERMS WITH THE ARTICLES INCLUDING PRC UN REPRESENTATIVES' STATEMENTS MADE DURING DEBATES. THESE INCLUDED LAI YA-LI'S ACCUSING THE SOVIETS OF HAVING "SINGLE-HANDEDLY PROVOKED THE CIVIL WAR IN ANGOLA." THE SOUTH CHINA SEA ISLANDS DISPUTE AND MOSCOW

PRC DOMESTIC AND HONG KONG MEDIA ORGANS HAVE HIGHLIGHTED AN ARTICLE STRONGLY REITERATING CHINA'S CLAIM TO THE DISPUTED SOUTH CHINA SEA ISLANDS AND ISSUED A STANDARD WARNING TO ALL AGAINST ENCROACHMENT ON "SACRED" CHINESE TERRITORY THERE. THE CURRENT CHINESE TREATMENT OF THIS ISSUE WAS PROMPTED BY A NOVEMBER 22 PRAVDA ARTICLE REFUTING CHINA'S CLAIM TO THE PARACEL ISLANDS. BUT IT ALSO REPRESENTS A REACTION TO THE APPARENTLY DEVELOPING MOSCOW/HANOI RELATIONSHIP AND A WARNING TO HANOI THAT, REGARDLESS OF SOVIET SUPPORT FOR THE DRV POSITION, THE PRC WILL CONTINUE TO PRESS ITS CLAIMS TO ALL THE DISPUTED ISLANDS. AN ARRAY OF TOP PARTY OFFICIALS, INCLUDING YAO WEN-YUAN, VICE PREMIER LI HSIEN-NIEN, AND NPC VICE CHAIRMAN HSU HSIANG-CHIEN WERE ALSO IN ATTENDANCE. A CULTURAL AND PROPAGANDA DELEGATION FROM THE ALBANIAN MINISTRY OF DEFENSE IS ALSO CURRENTLY VISITING IN CHINA (NCNA, NOVEMBER 29-30). UNCLASSIFIED

TIMOR-INDONESIA AND PORTUGAL

The President and party arrived at the Liaison Office at 12:08 pm, about 15 minutes late. Mrs. Ford and Susan arrived separately more or less on time. In the foyer of the Bush residence, the 16 children of the Liaison Office's staff were lined in a row to greet the President. The oldest appeared to be perhaps 8 years old and there was at least one child in arms.

The President came into the foyer and was greeted by Mrs. Bush, who said, "They're going to tell you their names." The President shook hands with each child in turn, and with a few exceptions each introduced himself or herself and got a "nice to see you, David" etc.

Christine Ogden, the 3 1/2 year old daughter of First Secretary Jerry Ogden, was holding a print of the President's official portrait. When prodded by Mrs. Bush, she asked for an autograph. The President held the picture against his left knee and signed it "To Christine Ogden, best wishes, Jerry Ford". One little girl had to be nudged by her father to stick out her hand for the President to shake, and one shy little boy put his hands over his ears when the President approached.

Then the President walked into the adjoining drawing room, an airy, gaily decorated rectangular room with almost electric yellow walls. Susan and Mrs. Ford were already in the drawing room when the President entered. The three Fords and senior staff -- Cheney, Kissinger, Hartmann, Scowcroft, Nessen, Lynn et al -- mingled with the staffers; their wives and children, for about ten minutes. Barbara Bush was taking pictures for posterity all the while.

Then the President went outside into the inner courtyard to pose for photographers; there was some banter about George Bush being a hot tennis player. Then the President disappeared from view, apparently for a tour of the Liaison Office before lunch.

Back in the drawing room, Secretary Kissinger, who seemed in a very good mood except for a Newsweek article about him this week which he termed "fiction", was asked about the talks. He promised to give us a general rundown of the talks tonight, and reminded the pool, "I told you before we left there would be no spectacular announcements."

"On the other hand, unless you think we and the Chinese are running a big confidence game, you can tell that both sides are satisfied with the results." He then talked briefly about detente; the pool missed a piece of this but the essence of the remarks were that events would prove which assessment of detente was right -- ours or the Chinese. Kissinger also said "You can assume we've discussed every international problem" during the talks. As for the Mao meeting, "this was much more detailed and much warmer (than the Nixon meeting). It's no reflection on Nixon; Nixon was the first American leader to see Mao... now we have got ongoing relations... He described Mao as "very vigorous" much better than when they had met in October, and "extraordinarily acute."

As for a communique, "We didn't even try for a communique...we decided on the first day not to try because it just didn't lend itself..." Then he added in jest, "We did in two days here what it took three days to do," again emphasizing that he was jesting. Between bites of a very tasty springroll, Kissinger said he had tremendous affection for Chou En-lai but that he gets along with Teng."

THE TEMPLE OF HEAVEN

The Temple of Heaven is the most famous temple in all of China. It is not really a temple in the classic sense of the word. It is a triumphal avenue eight hundred yards long with three terraces rising from it: The Temple of Annual Prayer, The Temple of the Universal God, and The Altar of Heaven.

The Temple is a unique and privileged spot. Every year, at the moment of winter solstice, the Emperor came here to make solemn sacrifice. This ceremony dates back to pre-historic days. On his role of "Son of Heaven" the sovereign took upon himself the sins of all the people, offering himself as a kind of sacrifice to his Father. For this he put on a costume of dark blue and quit the imperial palaces on the eve of the holy day, escorted by soldiers and officials, by musicians, and by princes of the royal blood. Every gate and every window overlooking his route had to be closed tight.

The Temple of Annual Prayer is a high building covered with a three-tiered roof, also in blue tile, first built by Yung Lo but rebuilt since 1899. It is the exact replica of what it was over 500 years ago. It was here the Emperor spent a night of fasting and prayer.

The Temple of the Universal God is located to the south at the other end of the Sacred Way. It is a circular pavillion covered with tiles of deep blue. It is here the Emperor burned incense and honored his ancestors.

Nearby is the Altar of Heaven where a ceremony involving sacrificed oxen was performed in elaborate detail. Scrolls of silk were unrolled, and priests recited ancient prayers. Musicians played sacred melodies and the Emperor's ceremonial role was at its peak.

The President will be escorted to view the various exhibits which show the organization, development and progress of Red Banner Communes that have shown exceptional achievement in dealing with the challenges of their land.

Key products from each commune are on display, together with models of the acreage under management showing the raw land before development and land as it presently exists after the commune effort. There are many photographs showing the people at work and the general topography of the commune as well as examples of the primitive tools used in the early stages of the commune projects.

On display are product examples of fruit, grasses, grains, vegetables, animals, herbs and medicinal animal by-products, as well as various handicrafts from each commune.

The degree of mechanization varies, but most of the achievements represent the accomplishment of massive hand labor.

THE SPORTS/GYMNASTIC EVENT

The Chinese have planned a three part sport-and-gymnastic event, to include gymnastics, a traditional Chinese martial arts (Wu Shu) demonstration and a ping pong display.

Sports and athletic programs are very popular with the Chinese, and events are invariably well attended. In addition to organized sports, efforts to maintain physical fitness are attempted by a large portion of the population, often in sizable calisthenics groups. Chairman Mao set the example for this with his early enthusiasm for sports and athletics activities. In the early mornings one often sees people in the parks or in groups in front of their office or apartment buildings engaging in physical exercise.

Ping pong, of course, is the sport for which the Chinese are known throughout the world, fielding teams which are rarely beaten. In recent years their teams have visited many countries and continents, including the United States, Africa, Europe and many parts of Asia. In ping pong, as well as in other sports, the Chinese stress sportsmanship and skill, proclaiming that these are more important than winning or losing. In international meets the Chinese hold that their primary objective is to promote friendship rather than to emerge victorious. Chinese Wu Shu - or martial arts - is a colorful display of swordplay and acrobatics performed with traditional Chinese weapons in which opponents engage in mock combat. Timing and footwork is very intricate and often resembles ballet. Gymnastics is also very popular in China, and troupes of Chinese gymnasts have visited many parts of the world as a part of their cultural exchange programs.

The Capital Gymnasium is a large, modern building. The stadium in which these events will take place has a seating of 17,000. Its main floor can be converted for the use of ice hockey and other athletic events. The Gymnasium was built in 1968.

THE SUMMER PALACE

The Summer Palace is located in the northwestern suburbs of Peking, about seven miles from the Guest House. The first palace was built at this site during the twelfth century A.D., but the present layout of the Summer Palace dates mainly from the seventeenth and eighteenth centuries, when the lake was enlarged. Most of the large pavilions and halls were built, and scenic spots from other areas of China were replicated on the grounds for the Emperor's enjoyment. The Summer Palace has been extensively restored since 1949, and it is now one of Peking's most popular parks, crowded in the winter with skaters and in the Summer with boaters and strollers.

The Summer Palace is historically associated with the Dowager Empress, the actual ruler of China during the last years of the Ching Dynasty (1644-1911). It was her favorite retreat, and she channeled considerable funds from the Imperial revenues into restoration and improvements. She also gave the Summer Palace its present name, which in Chinese means "The Garden Where Peace is Cultivated."

The total area of the Summer Palace is 659 acres, of which three-quarters is occupied by Kunming Lake, and the remainder by Longevity Hill on the northern shore of the lake. This is where most of the temples, pavilions and halls are located. A lakeside covered promenade, about 800 yards long, runs from east to west, at the base of Longevity Hill, linking buildings on the lakefront. Painted on the beams of the covered promenade are hundreds of restored depictions of mythological and historical scenes, as well as landscapes.

Just before reaching the center of the covered promenade from the east a good view can be obtained of the most prominent structure in the Summer Palace, the "Tower for Incense for the Buddha". This pagoda, 150 feet high, was first built during the Ming Dynasty and restored by the Dowager Empress in the late nineteenth century. Below the pagoda stands a collection of buildings reaching almost to the lakeside, the largest of which is known as the "Hall that Dispels the Clouds."

Farther west, near the end of the covered promenade, is the "Pavilion for Listening to Orioles," which the Dowager Empress used as a theater for staging her favorite Chinese operas, but which is now used as a teahouse.

At the western end of the covered promenade the famous Stone Boat, built by the Dowager Empress in 1888, stands in the lake. The Boat is generally considered a symbol for the decadence and corruption of the late Ching Empire since misappropriated funds for Chinese navy were used in its construction.

changing Yuan back into foreign currency. It is against the law to take Chinese currency out of the country. USLO has no facilities for converting Yuan back to U.S. currency. Personal checks may be cashed for Yuan at the Liaison Office by U.S. Government employees after proper identification. The limit is \$200.00 per person per day.

SHOPPING: The Friendship Store has a nearly complete range of local goods, Chinese export products and handicraft items.

PACKAGES: USLO has neither a package wrapping service nor FPO facilities. Local packing and shipping costs are high and cannot be estimated in advance. Please plan to take all purchases with you.

PHOTOGRAPHY IN PEKING: Historic buildings and monuments present no problem, but you should not photograph the airport, bridges, obvious military facilities and equipment, wall posters, soldiers and policemen. Ask permission before taking photographs in which individuals are the obvious primary subject. Taking such pictures without permission is considered discourteous and has been known to lead to embarrassing incidents.

LAUNDRY/DRY CLEANING: The Minzu Hotel provides laundry and dry cleaning services. One day service is available if requested.

SUNDRIES: There will be toiletries in the hotel rooms, also probably cigarettes and candy--all of Chinese manufacture. Chinese soft drinks, beer, etc., will also be readily available. American or third country items of this kind that the preadvance and advance parties might want for consumption at the hotel should be brought along from the U. S. or Japan.
