If you can do anything to reduce the costs of United States participation, it will be a worthy achievement. As you well know, we get the bill in Congress for America's participation but we do not have a voice in the extent of that participation. I am confident that you, with your fresh look at the U.N., can be an important factor in giving it a better image.
