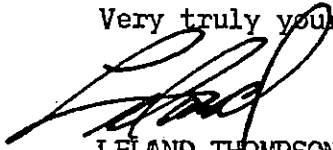

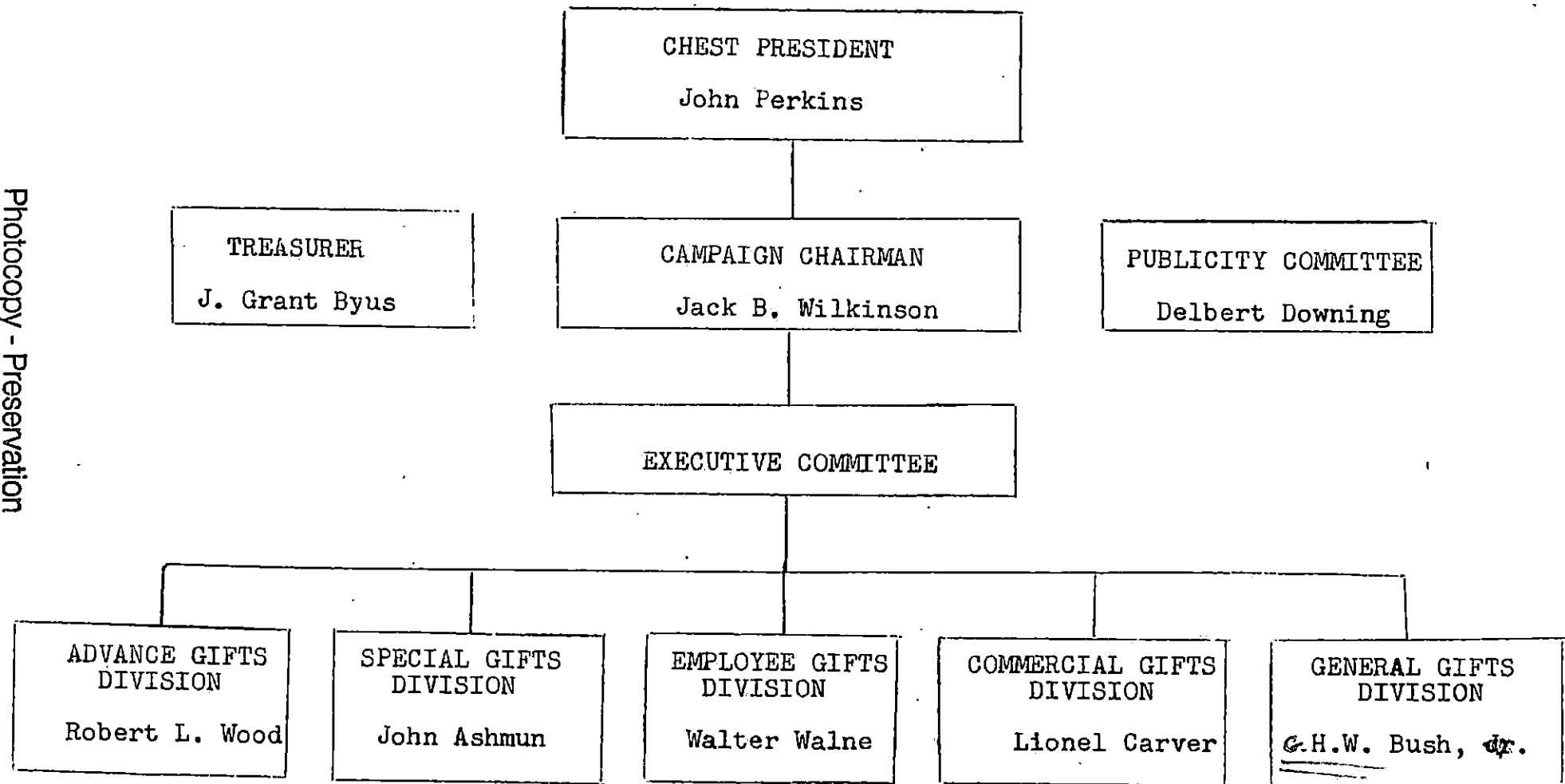

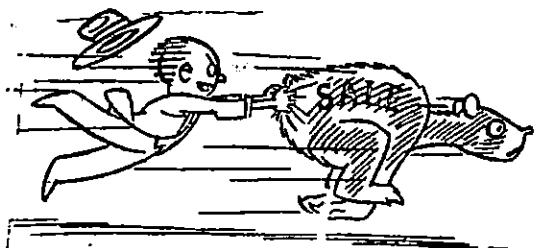

MEMORANDUM

TO : All Members of the Executive Committee
FROM : L. H. Shelton, Campaign Director
SUBJECT : Analysis of attached list of Companies and Employees

As you will recall in our executive committee meeting this morning, I suggested that every effort be made to pull in as many representatives of top management for our employer's dinner as is possible. I further recommended that personal contact be made to insure as many as possible in attendance.

There is attached a list of those firms with 25 or more employees. The analysis of the list indicates there are 713 employees represented in the group having 35 to 50 employees. There are 3,978 employees employed by those firms having 50 employees or more. The overall total of employees represented on the attached list is 5,335 which is 53% of the total employees in Midland County.

Since the 78 firms represented in this list control this large percentage of employees, it is apparent that having these men present will be the most effective means of obtaining co-operation in this year's campaign.

I am maintaining a master list in the campaign office and it will be appreciated if you will contact me, indicating those individuals that you will contact. In this manner duplication will be eliminated to a great extent.

I cannot emphasize too strongly the importance of this project in helping to have a successful campaign.

The Executive Committee of the Midland Community Chest Campaign met at the Chamber of Commerce on Thursday, August 26th.

Jack Wilkinson called the meeting to order and turned it over to Mr. Shelton, Director of the Campaign. It was stated that the enlistment of the Campaign workers was coming along satisfactorily.

The plan that Mr. Shelton was asked to make up for firm collections was presented for the approval of the committee and the following recommendations were made:

That each of the Executive Committee call the heads of the major companies in which they have the most influence to explain the plan of firm collections. A personal call would be the most desirable.

It is not sufficient to appoint a clerk or secretary to do the actual soliciting of employees, but that a company official of management rank should direct all solicitation.

It would be well to alert management to the fact that since it is desirable to eliminate as much administrative expense as possible that the firm chairman should be utilized as agent collectors for the Community Chest during the coming year. Such a plan would not entail any great inconvenience to any company. The firm chairman of each company would maintain a list of the employees within the firm and the amount of their pledge; and that during the first 10 days of the month that employee should bring his contribution to the firm chairman acting as an agent collector and on the 10th of the month the firm collector should remit to the Chest office the total funds collected.

It might be well to suggest that in those extremely large companies that an assistant agent collector be appointed for each working group within the company, to effect collection and turn it over to the central agency collector for transmission to the Community Chest.

A list of the major companies were to be on the desk of each of the Executive Committee immediately.

The Executive Committee was also asked to call several of the heads of these companies and urge them to be at the dinner for employers that is to be at the Scharbauer Ballroom on August 27th where General Robert J. Smith will speak.

The dinner meeting will be the only one that the workers will not be given the opportunity to pay for their meals if they desire. This will be handled by putting an ice cream carton on the tables for them to drop the amount they would normally spend for a lunch into these containers. This is a normal procedure in most communities.

The Executive Committee was invited to meet in Jack Wilkinson's office on Friday at 11:00 to meet the General and also to have luncheon at the Petroleum Club.

It was announced that the spot announcements on the radio stations and T.V. will start on Tuesday morning. The intensive part of the publicity will start on September 3rd.

The Advance Gifts, Special and Employees Divisions will be the only divisions that will have the opportunity to select their workers. The Special Division cards will be selected at the kick-off breakfast meeting. The other two divisions, Commercial and General will be assigned on a geographical or business basis, according to the wishes of the people involved.

The Executive Committee of the Midland Community Chest Campaign met at a Breakfast on Tuesday, August 24th in Parlor D of the Scharbauer Hotel to begin the preliminary planning of the dinner on Friday, August 27th and to discuss the possibility of having the firm chairman make collections throughout the year.

Mr. Jack Wilkinson called the meeting to order and asked for a report from Mr. Shelton as to the progress being made on the Campaign. It was stated that we were enlisting our workers pretty well on schedule except on the Special Gifts Division, which was not quite up to schedule.

Mr. Shelton suggested that Terminal be worked early this year to beat Odessa on the larger gifts such as Pioneer and American Airlines.

It was announced that Brigadier General Robert J. Smith, President of Pioneer Airlines of Dallas is to be here as the principal speaker for the Employers' Dinner on August 27 at the Scharbauer Hotel in the Ballroom. The time will be 7:30 P.M. The purpose of this dinner meeting is to acquaint the employer with the business of the Campaign and the budget, and to create enthusiasm.

Mr. Shelton pointed out that even though the payroll deduction plan had been given up here due to the action of the Board of Directors of the Chest, it was still important to get the firm chairman to act as a collection agent for the Chest on a year-round basis. It would be the duty of the agent to make the collections each month. "It will increase the employee giving considerably." (Shelton) This could be handled by the firm chairman of each company. (Cards were sent out to all companies of 7 or more/ to have them name a firm chairman. It would be the duty of the Executive Secretary to check with this agent each month if he does not send in these collections. Robert L. Wood stated that Midlanders should and would have to begin to realize that since Midland is growing so fast, we are going to have to adopt the payroll deduction plan eventually to help finance these agencies of the Community Chest. John Perkins said that the plan of a collector from each firm seemed to be the solution, and that the employer should be made to realize their responsibility of seeing that in order to be assured of a steady income from the Chest this plan is necessary. It is up to management to do this.

The two places that the extra \$13,000.00 that we must raise this year during the Campaign will have to come from the source that has the greatest potential, and that is the Employee Division and the Advance Gifts, which are both below what they should be. Mr. Shelton was asked to make up a plan for the committee to pass on for firm collections.

It was announced that a meeting would be held at 3:30 P.M. today at the Midland National Bank of the Rating Committee on the Advance gifts and Special.

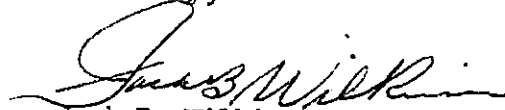
