Under Budgeted Expenditures you will notice a planned TV expenditure. The committee plans to sponsor a program of spot broadcasts prepared by the Democrats for Eisenhower, consisting of interviews of various Texas voters. These TV spots were reportedly excellent and would not be brought to Midland-Odessa without the financial help of our committee.

You will note also that we are making our first payment to the state and national headquarters.

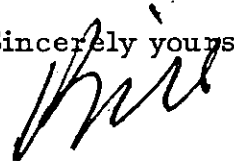

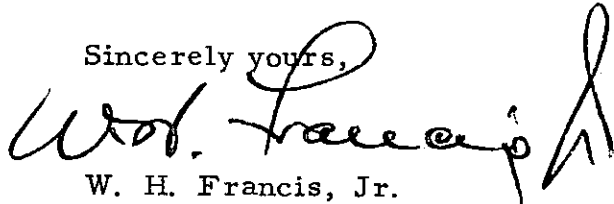

Enclosed find 1956 quotas for District
No. 29 and the counties in your District.

Last year the State and National budget
was \$143,030 (the State Headquarters quota was \$78,030
and the National Committee quota \$65,000). This
year the State budget has been increased substantially
as follows:

Republican National Committee	\$312,790
National Citizens for Eisenhower	50,000
Texas State Headquarters budget	<u>114,960</u>
Total State budget	<u>\$477,750</u>

This budget of \$477,750 is a considerable
increase over last year as you can see. In addition, we
estimate that the November elections will cost a mini-
mum of \$250,000 if we are to carry Texas for President
Eisenhower, and this additional campaign expense would
make the total State and National budget \$727,750. The
additional cost of the November elections will obviously
have to be raised by a special campaign for large
contributions, and we will not add it to the State budget
which we are asking all the counties to help raise.

I know that it is not too easy to raise
money for the Republican Party in many of our rural
counties but, if we are to raise anything like the money
mentioned above, we will have to raise a minimum of
\$100 from every county in the State. You will see
from the attached the quota for your District is \$24,300
and is divided among the counties as indicated. If you
think these quotas should be reallocated and inequities
exist between the counties, please let me know and we
will do our best to make a fair allocation between the
counties. We have tried to be fair about these quotas,
allocating them on the basis of population, income,

votes for Eisenhower in 1952, and estimated ability to contribute. If these quotas are satisfactory to you, please let me know and I will write the various county chairmen directly.
