Dear Bill:

I read with interest your editorial Sunday, May 23rd, titled "Fore"! Certainly, I agree with your conclusion that full and careful consideration should be given the question of a public golf course.

In your editorial there was a statement that "baseball fields have been provided". From personal experience, I know there are not sufficient baseball fields. This problem is more acute this year than last because our Junior Baseball Association has grown from twenty-six teams to thirty-six teams.

The big gap is the area lying west of our Latin American section to the Andrews Highway and north of Wall Avenue. In that section of our City live approximately the following number of children:

Ages to 5 years	2200
6 thru 12	2000
13 thru 15	800
16 thru 18	500
Grand Total	5500

In that same area the City is maintaining a small but very attractive playground on "A" Street east of the Country Club. There may also be a swing or two in Crier Park. There are two baseball diamonds at Sam Houston School and two at Crockett School. These are adequate for boys up to 12 but we have sixteen teams using these fields. Little League in this area needs four more diamonds for next year if we are to continue our policy of a "constantly expanding opportunity for boys to play".

Now, what about our boys over 12 in this area? At present many are not playing because of the distance from their homes to the fields we use. In that age group we have Pony League for 13 and 14 year olds, and Major League for 15 through 18 years. Pony League uses one field at Carter and Johnson Street and one field at Ulmer Park, both on the southwest edge of town. Next year, if we are to operate properly, ^{two} must have another League playing at some point north of Wall and equal distance between Andrews Highway and the east city limits.

The last few years our Major League has been playing at the so-called "Borden Field". One diamond is inadequate for a six team League. After a search, it was decided that Hogan Park was the only place where two diamonds could be developed on a permanent basis and the City hopes to have these ready by May 31st, when this League's season opens.

There will be enough sites for Little League in the area south of T&P by next year when the City park site at Travis School develops with two Little League diamonds. In the area west of Andrews Highway we feel that when the Major League moves to Hogan Park and their practice field is converted to Little League, that will be enough in that area. In the area south of Wall and north of the T&P when the Major League moves off Borden, it should be converted to Little League.

Hogan Park's usefulness is limited because of location to adults or older youths with their own cars. As our City grows and the area around it is populated, it will serve and be of great value to us.

Your Sunday paper had one story about a ten team Jaycee softball League and another story on a seventeen team Church softball League. As best we can tell, they have practically no City facilities available. They should have a number of properly located sites designated as softball fields. Now many of these teams are forced to practice at dusk after our games are over.

We have only one adult baseball team and there is no space for them to practice. Possibly, they could divide use of the Major League fields at Hogan.

Summarizing, in the area west of Latin American section and north of Wall, the city needs two or three parks properly located and big enough to provide space for a total of six baseball diamonds. With those sites it will be possible to meet the needs of our City's Junior Baseball Association. The softball league requirements should be investigated and a long range plan adopted.

In conclusion, may I say that the City and Schools have been most cooperative in working with us on those sites that they own. We have, or will have shortly, a master park plan which will recommend a number of future sites. What our City will need is the foresight to acquire sites and develop them as the needs and finances of the City allow.

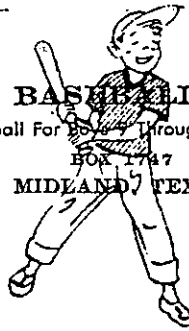

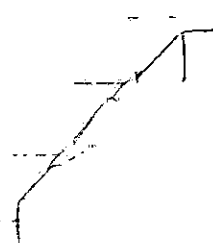

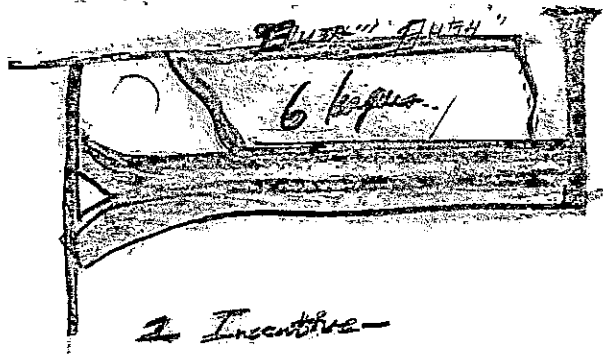

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR LEAGUE OFFICERS

I. Conduct of League Officers:

- (a) All officers must at all times keep in mind the ideals and objectives which are summarized as follows: Junior Baseball is designed for the local community. It must never be commercialized. It is completely amateur and non profit. Its first objective is for the good of the boys who play in the Junior Baseball Leagues. While good ball players may and will come out of the ranks of these Leagues, this is no part of the main objective. It is to build good citizens and good Americans.

In the Junior Baseball program each boy learns some of the lessons of fair play, of discipline, of team work. He finds that the other boy, regardless of race, creed or color, is a pretty nice fellow after all, and this kind of thinking spreads from the boys to their families and thus to the communities.

The officers must keep the Junior Baseball program clean. It must not be used for personal profit or advancement. Any attempt by an officer, a sponsor, or anyone else to capitalize on the Junior Baseball program by tying it in with a heavy advertising program or using it as a drawing card for some other profitable attraction, should be put out of the Baseball program at once.

- (b) Officers should always endeavor to maintain a completely non-partisan attitude.
- (c) Officers should always endeavor to avoid criticizing other officers, managers and umpires in public places. All criticism should be confined to official channels.
- (d) Officers should endeavor to avoid acting as a substitute umpire, particularly in their own League.
- (e) At least one officer should endeavor to attend each game of the League.
- * (f) The President should call meetings (one or more) before tryouts and auction to be certain that everyone is familiar with procedure. Meetings should be called at regular intervals (at least monthly) throughout the season to discuss League problems.

II. Election of Junior Baseball Officers:

- (a) A nominating committee is recommended. It is recommended that this committee be composed of the Presidents of all operating Leagues of the previous season and the Commissioner. The duty of this committee would be to propose or suggest the League officers for the approaching season.
- (b) It is recommended that the term of office for all officers, except the commissioner and treasurer, be set at one (1) year and that they cannot succeed themselves. It is recommended that the term of office for the commissioner and treasurer be for two (2) years.
- (c) It is recommended that all officers be elected by February 1st of each year except for the commissioner and treasurer who shall be elected as follows:
- (1) Each League shall be allowed one vote toward the election of the commissioner and treasurer. This League vote is to be determined by all officers and each team manager of that League. That League vote to be cast by the President or his duly appointed representative.
- (2) It is recommended that the commissioner and treasurer be elected by November 1st of the same year that their two year term of office is due to expire on December 31st.

III. Executive Committee:

It is recommended that an Executive Committee be formed to work with and assist the commissioner in his duties. This Executive Committee is to be composed of the Presidents (or an officially designated substitute) of all Leagues and the Commissioner.

It is recommended that this Executive Committee comprise the managers screening committee for each season. This committee to function as outlined in the 1953 Little League Booklet.

IV. Powers and Duties of the Commissioner:

- (b) To oversee the treasurer and all League personel.

- (d) The commissioner may, with concurrence of the Executive Committee as defined above,
 - (1) Remove any official or player from any League,
 - (2) Direct all fund raising projects,
 - (3) Shall approve all expenditures.

TENTATIVE LITTLE LEAGUE SCHEDULE - 1954

TRYOUTS: Start Wednesday, April 7, continue thru Wed. April 14th. Two sessions for each candidate except 1 only for 3rd grade (9 year olds).

AUCTION: Friday, April 16, or Saturday, April 17.
All managers to prepare enough lists for all schools.

TEAM PRACTICE: April 20, thru May 8th. (Enough for 10 practices if 2 fields are available). No manager shall cut his roster till after the 3rd practice.

PRACTICE ROUND: 3 games to be set under regular game conditions during May 10th thru 21st, about 2 games per day.

SEASON: Starts Monday, May 24th and ends Tuesday, July 20th. Three games during first week and 2 games each week thereafter.

LEAGUE PLAYOFFS: July 21 thru 23rd. Best 2 out of three.

TOURNAMENT TEAM: Selected at latest possible date. Not announced till last possible moment. No practice allowed till Friday, July 16th.

TOURNAMENT: Begins week of July 26th.

BIRTH CERTIFICATES: Each league will request all 12 year olds to submit birth certificates during early part of season.

IV. COMMISSIONERS AND ASSISTANT COMMISSIONERS

The Midland Junior Baseball Association shall be governed by a Commissioner and as many Assistant Commissioners as is necessary to properly conduct the Association. One of the Assistant Commissioners shall be the Treasurer. All of the Assistant Commissioners shall have the same powers as the Commissioner except that the Commissioner and his assistants shall only have one vote on matters being decided by the executive committee.

V. DUTIES AND POWERS OF THE COMMISSIONERS AND ASSISTANT COMMISSIONERS

- (a) Uphold the ideals and objectives of the Junior Baseball Association.
- (b) Approve procedure for actions, schedules and tournament team selections.
- (c) Direct all fund raising projects and approve all expenditures.
- (d) The Commissioner with concurrence of the executive committee remove any official or player from any leagues.
