Dear Congressman Bow,

Recently in one of our local papers you were quoted as favoring a movement to draft Albert Thomas to run again for re-election. As Chairman of the Harris County Republican Party this statement has caused me a good deal of concern. We have had an excellent candidate run against Albert Thomas upon several occasions. We also are planning to make a real effort to gain this seat. It certainly does not help our cause when a responsible Republican leader like you, whose voting record many of us here admire, is quoted as saying that he would like to see Mr. Thomas, a Democratic leader return to office. Not only that, but that a draft be put into effect to return Mr. Thomas.

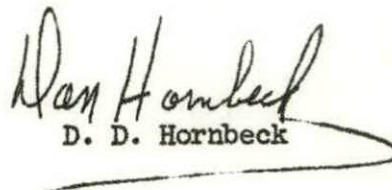

Our collections to date total \$38,300. Compare that with the \$65,000 (preliminary estimate) rock bottom minimum needed to run the Republican Party of Harris County during this fiscal year. Compare it with the \$95,000 collected last year.

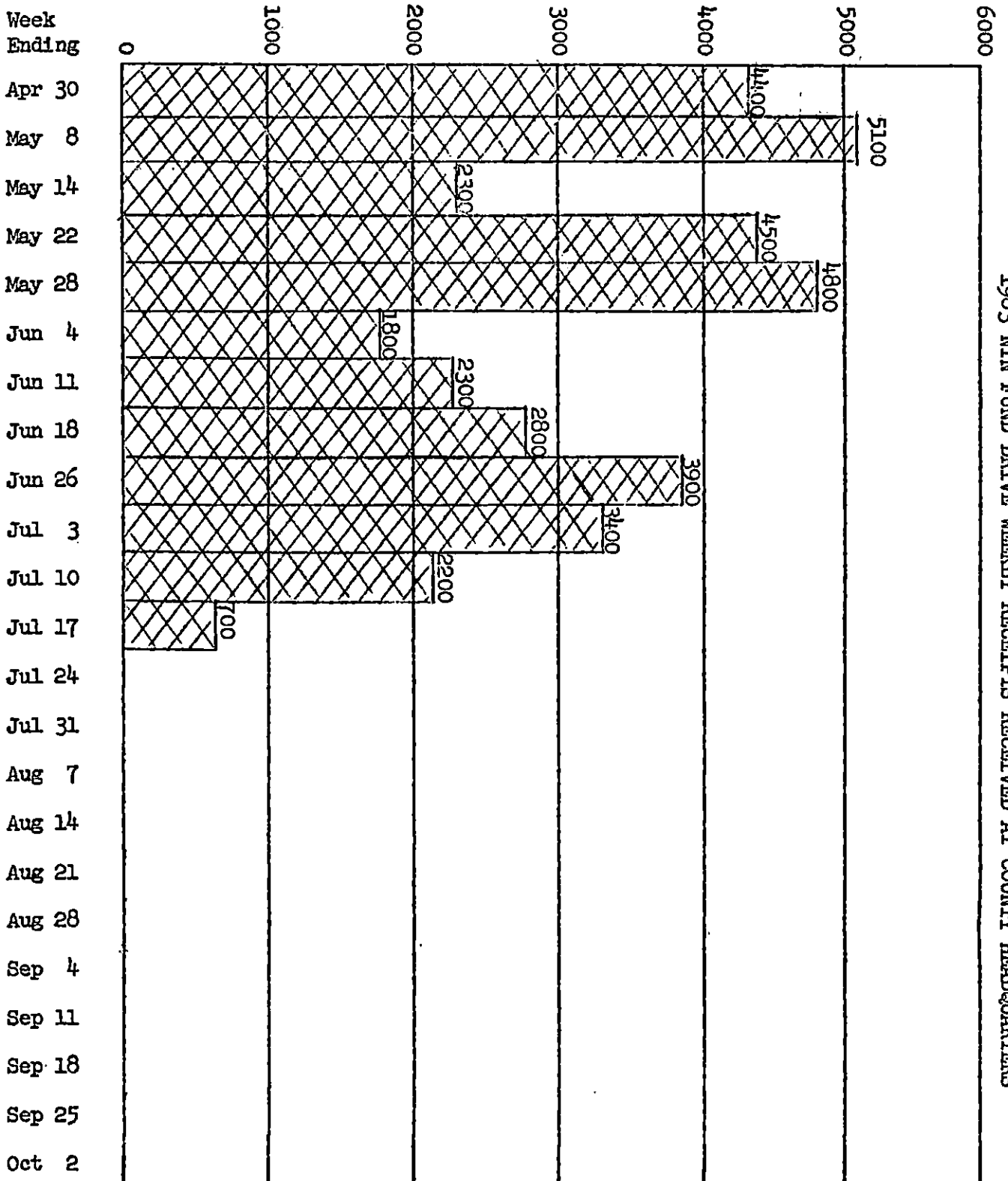

SUBJECT: PAGES, SERGEANTS-AT-ARMS, VISITORS = NATIONAL CONVENTION

On above subject, I got the following information from Helen Healey who has handled these matters for past conventions.

These privileges are dispensed by the National Committeeman and Committeewoman. Helen did the actual handling of the lists at State Headquarters for them.

1. PAGES. These are allocated to states, with consideration given for success in previous elections. (Helen says in past Texas had 5 or 6.)

Pages are not paid, but do go to training school at the convention auditorium prior to opening of convention. Direct traffic and act as runners.

2. SERGEANTS- AT-ARMS. Allocated on same basis as pages. (Helen said Texas had 5 or 6 of these also).

Sergeants-at-Arms are paid (formerly \$150 for Convention.) They also attend training school. Check credentials at convention entrances.

- a. Honorary Get badges which allow them on floor, but Sergeants- have no assigned seat. (Helen said there at-Arms. were a great many more of these than others.)

3. VISITORS' Each state is allotted one gallery seat per GALLERY: delegates. (This takes care of husband or wife accompanying delegate.) In addition, each state has an allotment arrived at on same basis as pages and sergeants-at-arms.

Helen suggested, since we have already had a request on above, that George might ask Albert what Harris County could reasonably expect in the way of the above. She said that in 1960, counties were asked for recommendations rather than have the matter arbitrarily dispensed by National Committeeman and Woman through State Headquarters.

Subject: NTN Fund Drive Collections Report No. 2 (Through June 26, 1963)

Attached is a listing of all collections received through June 26, 1963. As in the last report, Precincts are listed by Areas to permit easier comparison among precincts with similar characteristics. Last month you received a graph on which was plotted the 1962 and 1963 NTN Fund Drive collections; please plot the latest total, \$32,300 at the date of June 26. It will be evident that we have much work to do in order to meet the already-committed expenditures during the fiscal year July 1, 1963 to June 30, 1964.

Quotas were originally set on the basis of our getting 20,000 contributions. All quotas have now been cut in half, and the new quotas for the County, Areas and Precincts are shown in this June 26 listing. Four precincts (16, 176, 177 and 228) already have more than 100% of these new quotas; thirteen precincts are in the 50-100% range. These quotas are based on the number of votes given Republican candidates for the state legislature in the last General Election, a basis we feel is equally fair to all precincts. Will you carry your precinct into the winner's circle with the other precincts who made 100% of their quota?

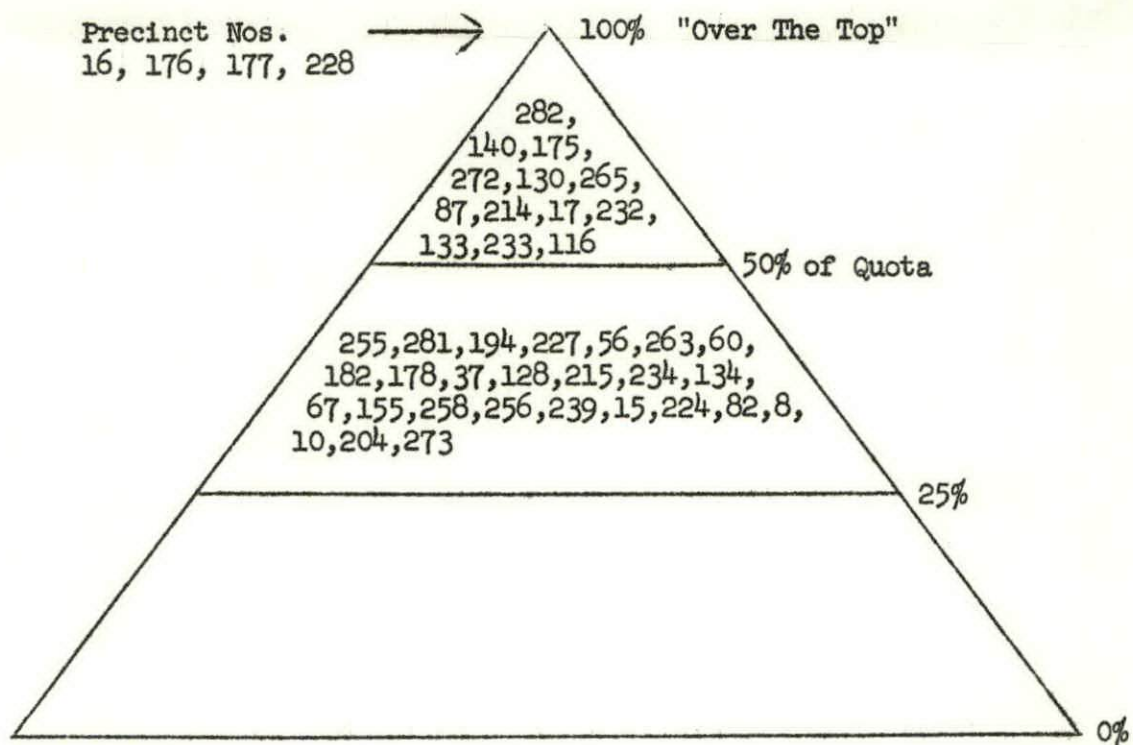
We have obtained the lists of prospective contributors used by the Cox, Barry and Hayes campaign organization. With considerable work, the volunteers at County Headquarters put these lists in order so that they can be used by precinct organizations for NTN solicitations. We expect to have a portion of this list in your hands within the next ten days. Please regard these as "hot prospects" and bend every effort to contact them.

Forty percent of the finance chairmen (Area and Precinct, combined) have made an NTN contribution this year. However, only 28% of the Area and Precinct chairmen have contributed to date. We have twice written to you on this point and George Bush commented on it at the last Executive Committee meeting. During June there was only a modest response to these appeals. Will you please forward your own contribution to County Headquarters if you have not already done so.

Contributions received during the past week have encouraged us to believe the Fund Drive has begun to pick up again. Please examine your record to date and then explore ways and means of helping the County achieve its goal in this Drive.
