At Tab II is a letter from Wes Posvar, Chairman of the FEMA Advisory Board and President of the University of Pittsburgh, inviting you to meet with the Board at the fall meeting in Washington on Wednesday, December 20th.

This is an invitation you could pass along for Bob Gates or one of us, or simply decline. Your decision should be based, in part, on whether you want to highlight the Administration's commitment to emergency preparedness even though a new FEMA Director has not been appointed. In essence, you may face the choice between attending and catching flak about gaps in FEMA's leadership or declining the invitation and encouraging a decision by the Advisory Board to disband. We recommend you attend.

At Tab III is a package of correspondence between you and Dr. Posvar from last spring. He had asked that the Board be dissolved or reassigned to other national security issues due to the Board's displeasure over the failure to continue Julius Becton as the Director of FEMA. In your April reply, you asked for his patience and penned a note that "We'll get to it soon." Since then, Becton's replacement, National Guard Major General Calvin Franklin, withdrew his nomination from consideration and FEMA remains with a replacement Director yet to be nominated. The Board is committed to emergency preparedness and national security but may question this administration's view of the importance of FEMA outside the area of preparedness for dealing with civil crises.

At Tab I is a letter accepting the invitation.

Dear Brent:

The FEMA Advisory Board will hold its fall meeting December 19-20, 1989. I want to invite you to meet with us for about thirty minutes (or more) at any time convenient for you between 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. on Wednesday, December 20. We shall meet at the FEMA Headquarters in Washington.

In prior years the Advisory Board met with several of your predecessors. As you know, this unusual group of people remain interested in emergency preparedness not for its role in sometimes dramatic civil crises, but because they retain the conviction that the military and strategic aspects of emergency preparedness are sorely neglected and could be beneficially integrated into the whole national security posture—and that perhaps we could someday help in bringing that about.

Aware as I am of the enormous demands on your time, I am hesitant to place before you yet another request. However, the Board would much appreciate your perspective view and, of course, we can rearrange—even at the last minute—our agenda to accommodate your schedule. Of course, we would also welcome one of your associates as a substitute.

Marilyn Quayle has accepted our invitation to serve on the Board, and has taken a very active interest in the FEMA mission. We do not yet know if she will attend the fall meeting.

As always, you have my best wishes and my unqualified support.

I am writing to ask you to meet with the CSIS Northeast Asia Council which will be convening here in Washington on October 2nd and 3rd. The group, composed of Korean legislators -- from all political parties -- will be led by Lee Jong Chan, Secretary General of the Democratic Justice Party, and will include a few Korean businessmen and academics.

The Council last met in Washington in January of this year. Although extremely fruitful talks were held on Capitol Hill, the meeting took place in the days immediately following the inauguration and the group was unable to hear from any administration officials.

I would be extremely grateful if you would spend 10 minutes or so with the Council on the morning of October 2nd at about 9:30 am. We would bring the group to the OEOB for the meeting, and I have written to Karl Jackson separately to ask him to address the group as well; perhaps his remarks could follow a few words of welcome from you.

Dear Dr. Renier:

I share your concerns over the health of the defense industrial base and over our nation's ability to sustain technological leadership. Your offer to develop policy recommendations to strengthen the industrial and technology base is greatly appreciated. To the extent that your recommendations deal with issues outside the traditional Defense arena, they should be evaluated by the Department of the Treasury or the Department of Commerce, rather than my office.

However, I would encourage you to relay recommendations to me or to the Secretary of Defense, who is also receiving recommendations from bodies such as the Defense Science Board and the Defense Manufacturing Board. We will ensure that the recommendations are reviewed by the appropriate agencies.

Due to a pressing schedule, I would prefer not to schedule a meeting at this time. Perhaps we can arrange a meeting to go over the recommendations after they have been coordinated with the agencies.

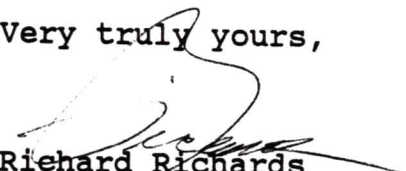

Florence,

Richard tells me you asked about the Iranians who called to see General Scowcroft. One was named Tabatabai and the other, whose name we didn't catch, allegedly is an aide to Rafsanjani. The man who called on their behalf, Bahcman Maalizadad, used to work for Senator Helms as an unpaid staff aide and now works for an Iranian investor in the US. As a general rule, senior US policy officials do not meet with these characters, but previously they were seen by lower level people at State. After talking with State today they do not plan to see them now because of the current state of affairs in Iran.

Tabatabai is associated with Khomeini's household by marriage, but apparently not closely enough so that he carries any authoritative messages. He and Bachman Maalizadad met with Ollie North previously as the Iranian middle men in the "old days". When previous low level State contacts with them were not to their liking, they would publicize the meetings as secret Iranian government contacts with US officials, which was extremely embarrassing for the last Administration. Another problem with contacts with these guys is that we have established proper channels for a dialogue with Iran which the Iran govt is aware of (the Belgian Embassy in Tehran is ours and the UAE Embassy here is theirs). By seeing these guys out of channel, we would send the wrong signal.

Polish-American Meeting with General Scowcroft

The Executive Board of the Polish American Congress has requested a meeting with General Scowcroft between 13 and 17 March. They believe that the meeting has been approved but I can find no record of prior communication with them.

This is an inopportune time for the meeting since our review of policy is still in progress. They intend to bring 6-8 people which is hardly conducive to a substantive discussion in any case.

Nonetheless, this must be handled carefully because this is the largest and most influential Polish-American organization.

Perhaps we can put the meeting off to a later date when we have had time to develop a clear policy toward Poland. At that point, they could be helpful in building domestic consensus.

By the way, Bob Gates is seeing Jan Nowak, one of their national directors, tomorrow.

A Lt. Col. Brown called me yesterday to inquire into your possible availability and interest in observing a mini capabilities exercise of counter-terrorism capabilities at Ft. Bragg on March 27, 28, or 29. The activity would involve a mil air flight from Washington National Airport departing at 12:00 noon and returning to Washington National at about 10:00 pm the same day. CINCSOC is trying to organize this demonstration for high level Washington policy figures -- SECSTATE, DCI, FBI Director, AG. Notionally, this would be followed by a table-top exercise in April to expose the participants to the inter-agency process involved in responding to terrorist incidents. SUBJECT: Your Meeting with the Ghana, Capt. Tsikata

Concerning your tentatively scheduled meeting tomorrow afternoon with Capt. Koj
Tsikata, I recommend that you cancel that appointment. This may be awkward

since it is already tentatively on your schedule, but if you meet with him it would give him much more than the Ghanaian Government deserves at this point in time.

Tsikata is a big hitter in his government (in the cabinet and the party), but was the leading henchman Rawlings sent after our people in 1985, creating bad feelings which continue to sour bilateral relations. It is well known that Tsikata harbors deep anti-American feelings, and maintains personal friendships with Qadhafi and Castro.

He is here to explore the lay of the land with the new Administration, which is fine. Ghana has implemented an economic/financial program which we have applauded, but the Rawlings's regime continues to do other things that we deplore. There may be opportunities for improving relations, but we should explore potential openings at a level lower than National Security Advisor.

I will be having lunch at State with Tsikata. Chet Crocker believes the DAS level is the appropriate level at which we should receive Tsikata; given the state of relations and Ghana's generally bad behavior in foreign policy, I concur with State's view. I will report back to you if there are any interesting developments at lunch.

If you disagree with my recommendation I will, of course, provide background information and prepare talking points for your meeting.
