I was not present when William Cromarty was killed, but arrived at the scene of action a few moments afterwards. Cromarty was driving a Sunbeam Touring Car, in which he was taking the Supply Officer of the 307th Inf. to Rear Echelon, 77th Div. Hdqrs. The car which Pvt Cromarty was driving was traveling at about 30 miles an hour, when it was received a direct hit by an H.E. shell. The scene of the accident was on the main road between Fismes and Chehery Chatreuve and about 400 yds east of Chehery Chatreuve on that road. Pvt Cromarty was killed instantly. Cromarty was buried in a small cemetery which was situated near the Chateau in which the Field Hospital was situated. This chateau is approximately 1000 yds south of Chehery Chatreuve on the Maricoul-en-Dole Road.

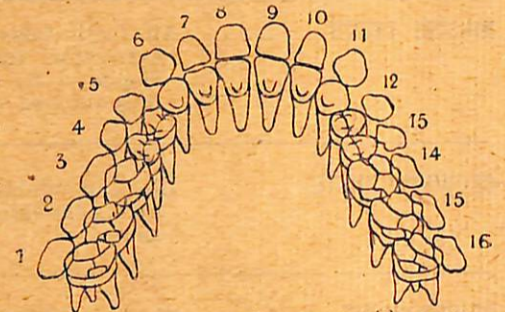
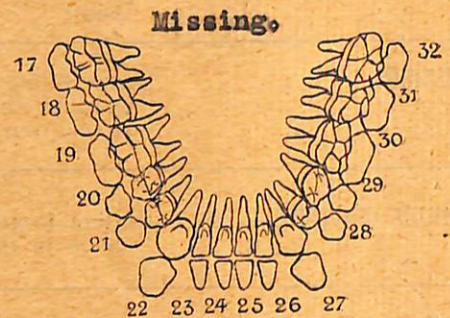


Diagram represents the mouth wide open

Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspids (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found.
