3. Paragraph 2 will be accomplished by Area Supervisor from data on file in his office.

4. If data is entered on Form 114-B from Form 1, Form 16, Form 1-A or Form 16-A, statement to this effect will be made on Form 114-B STATING WHICH G.R.S. form data is taken from. If data concerning co-ordinates is approximate and NOT accurate, statement to this effect will be made on these forms.

I was about thirty feet from Pvt. Crow when he was wounded by a high explosive shell November 4, 1918. His right foot was badly mashed and also his right hip. I had two men carry him back on a litter to the 1st aid station and he was conscious when I last saw him but suffering much pain. He died later of wounds while in the hospital.





There is no provision of the law which would permit the Government to make a money allowance to any mother or widow who is unable or does not desire to make the pilgrimage.


