INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE PROPER COMPLETION OF G. R. S. FORM NO. 16-A

Enter information, as noted below, on reverse side of sheet in the *corresponding numbered space*. This form is supplemental to and is to be forwarded with G. R. S. Form 1-a, reporting reburial locations. To be used in answer to Question 26, Form 114, in case no means of identification on body.

1. Show soldier's name, serial number, rank and organization, and by whom disinterred and reburied.
2. Give date and accurate information as to location from which the body was disinterred and the group and unit which made disinterment.
3. Give date and accurate information as to location of reburial and the group and unit which made reburial, and how reburial was made—in casket, wooden box, etc.
4. State to what degree decomposition has progressed, whether recognition is possible, and how the body was originally buried—in a casket, box, burlap, etc. This statement should be as complete as possible.
5. (a) State whether identification tags were found buried with body and on grave marker by reporting "Yes" or "No".



DENTURES (PLATES).....Draw diagram of relative size and shape of plate, block in teeth attached and indicate retaining clasps on natural teeth with the word "clasp."

or request on the part of relatives.

3. In effecting removal, the utmost care and reverence were
exacted and more than willingly accorded by those performing this
sacred duty. The grave of the deceased will be perpetually main-
tained by this Government in a manner befitting the last resting
place of our heroes.

Receipt is acknowledged of your letter of January 9th, relative to the desire of Mrs. Annie Crowley to have her daughter-in-law accompany her when she makes the pilgrimage to the grave of her stepson, the late Private James M. Crowley, sailing May 17th on the PRESIDENT HARDING.

Under the law governing the pilgrimage the Government can bear no part of the expense of relatives or friends accompanying pilgrims on their journey, nor can it make any arrangements for them. It is possible, however, for Mrs. Vandyne to accompany Mrs. Crowley at personal expense and be with her for the greater part of the journey, that is, on the trains to and from Havre and Paris, on the steamer both going and returning and at hotels in New York and Europe.

Sightseeing trips in and around Paris and transportation between Paris and the cemeteries are accomplished by busses which are chartered by the Government for official use only, and this office therefore could not authorize Mrs. Vandyne's transportation in these busses.

If Mrs. Vandyne wishes to accompany your wife at her own expense under the above conditions she should immediately communicate with the Roosevelt Steamship Company, #1 Broadway, New York City, for reservation for the ocean voyage between New York and France, advising them the name of the steamship on which she desires to sail, the date of sailing, and Mrs. Crowley's name. The steamship company will furnish full information as to the cost of ocean transportation. On receipt of definite advice that Mrs. Vandyne is accompanying Mrs. Crowley arrangements will be made for them to occupy the same rooms at the hotels and on the steamers, provided Mrs. Vandyne secures first class accommodations.



Your Government has provided an opportunity for all Mothers and Widows of deceased members of the American Forces who were lost, buried at sea, or whose remains are now interred in Europe, to make a pilgrimage to the cemeteries in Europe. This was done in the hope that all who may make the pilgrimage will derive a measure of comfort and solace from the visit.

You are numbered among those who are privileged to make this pilgrimage.

During July and September of this year, inquiries were addressed to you as to whether or not you desire to make the pilgrimage to Europe. To these inquiries no reply has been received from you.

You probably do not realize how important it is that a reply be received from you. If we do not receive replies, it becomes very difficult to make the necessary and proper arrangements for those who are to make the trip, as everything must be arranged in advance. Consequently, it is just as important for the Government to know the names of those who do not desire to take advantage of its offer as it is to know the names of those who do.




