You are assured it will be perpetually maintained in the same fine condition in which you found it, as it will be the constant effort of the Government to make these cemeteries fitting resting places for the heroes buried there.

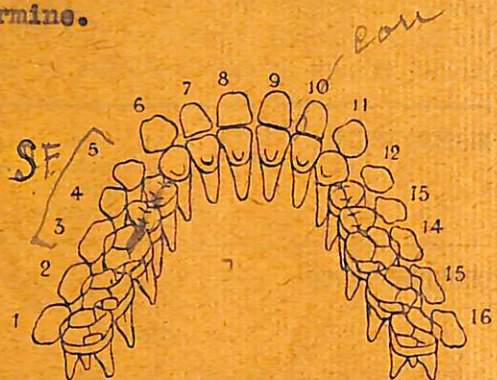
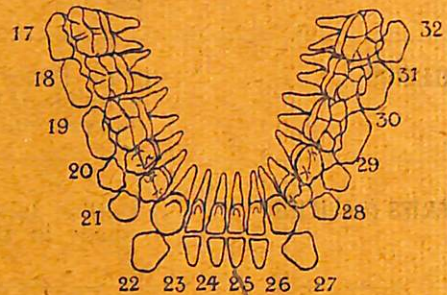


Diagram represents the mouth wide open

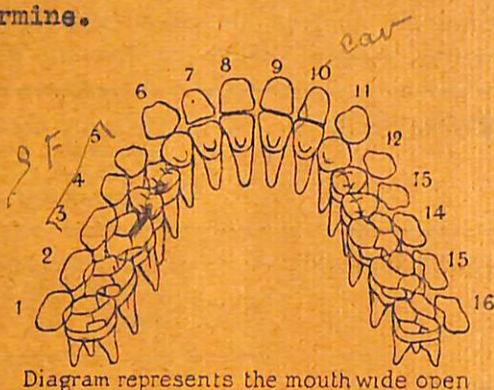
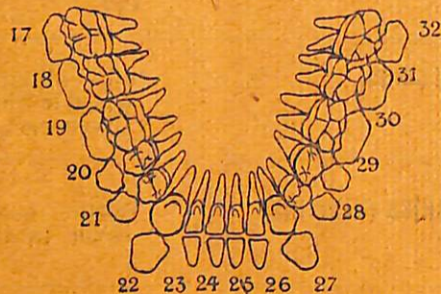


Diagram represents the mouth wide open
