1. Replying to your letter of _____, it is regretted that no requests for the transfer of the bodies of our dead can be favourably considered at the present time. This decision has been jointly made, for urgent reasons, by the Secretary of the Navy and the Secretary of War.

2. Our present instructions are to the effect that nothing will be done until the matter of removal shall have been taken up as an entire project with a view to its execution as an entire project; and that the bodies will remain in the custody of the G.R.S., until the policy shall have been determined and announced.

3. Notation has been made concerning your request, and action will be taken as nearly in accordance therewith as may be possible under the instructions received from Washington relative to the complete procedure governing the disposition of bodies after the War.

4. There is enclosed herewith G.R.S. Bulletin #15-B entitled, "Information for the Friends of Our Dead", which will answer some of the questions that are likely to arise in your mind.

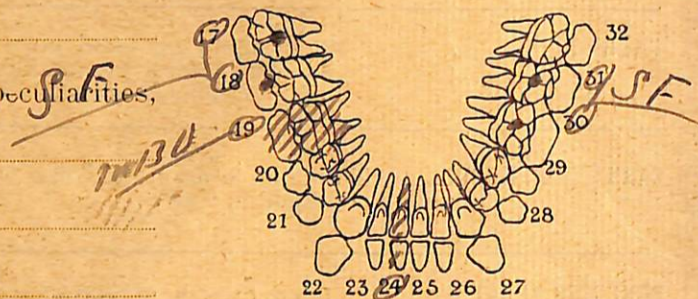
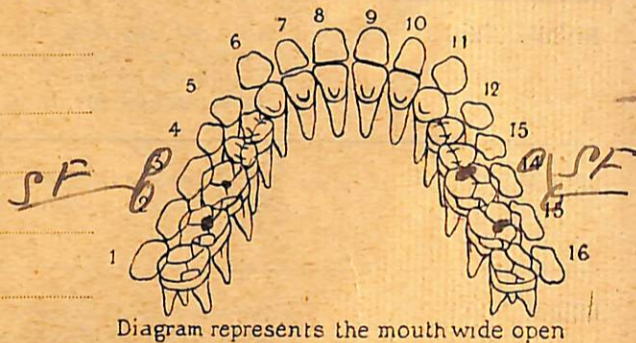

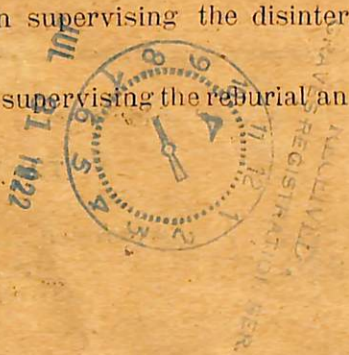
