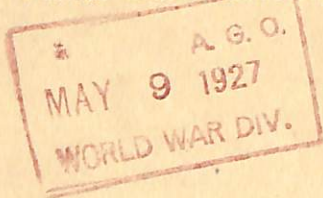

On the night of July 14-15 1918, I was with Pvt Curran. We were billeted in a barn near the town of Dompton, Northwest of Chateau-Thierry. The shelling started at 10 p.m. and did not get very heavy until 11.30, at that time shells were landing close to our billet. The gas alarm was sounded and as I was the only one awake, I woke the rest of the up by hollering, and at the same time told them of the gas. It seems that as soon as they all were awake and just putting on their masks, a gas shell struck the building bursting inside and spreading a liquid. We got out of the building as quick as possible, but the gas had burned them severely and they were evacuated shortly after in an ambulance and later reporter as having died in the hospital.

Priv. Curran was also hit by a piece of shrapnel in the leg.

Dear Sir:

Your attention is invited to the enclosed copy of an Act of Congress approved March 2, 1929, entitled an Act "To enable the mothers and widows of the deceased soldiers, sailors and marines of the American forces now interred in the cemeteries of Europe to make a pilgrimage to these cemeteries".

The records of this office show that you are the brother of the late Private Patrick Curran, Hq. Co., 101st Inf. whose remains are now interred in the Aisne Marne American Cemetery, Belleau, Aisne, France.

Will you please advise this office whether or not he is survived by a mother or widow who is entitled under the provisions of the above quoted Act, to make the pilgrimage, and if so, will you please furnish the full names and addresses of the mother and widow in order that action may be taken to extend invitations to them to make the pilgrimage. Both mothers and widows are entitled to make the pilgrimage.

Your attention is particularly invited to Section 4 of the enclosed Act, which defines the terms "mother" and "widow". If the relative is a stepmother, mother through adoption, or any woman who stood in loco parentis to the decedent, a statement as to her relationship is requested. If he was survived by a widow who has since remarried it is also requested that a statement to that effect be made.

For your reply, you may use the enclosed envelope which requires no postage.

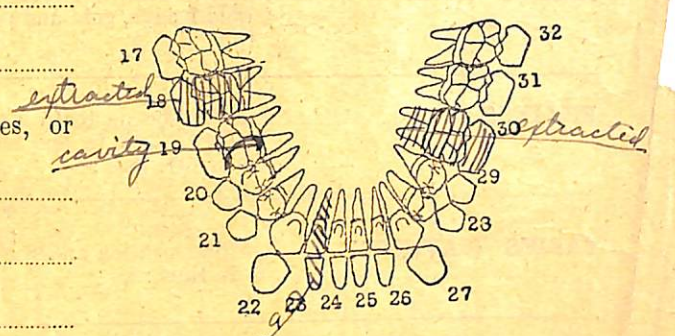
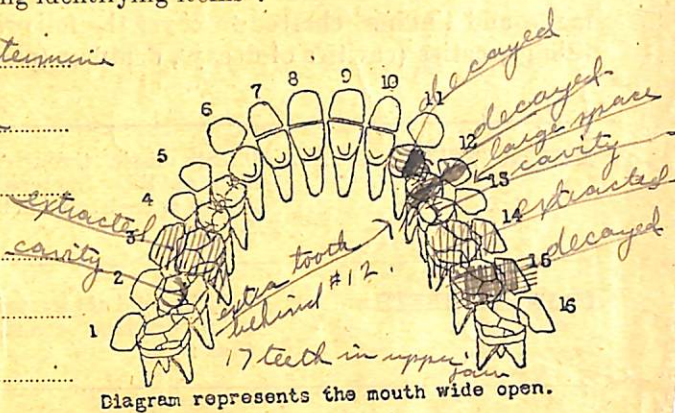


